There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines: Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date, inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

This report is written by Police Officer Gilbert Gwinn, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 08/18/07 at 1:42 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 49th/North Avenue for a Shots Fired complaint. While squads checking the area, officers were flagged down for fight possibly related to the shots fired complaint. Officers spoke to a woman who stated she was beat up in front of 4009 W North Avenue. The victim stated she was inside Connie's Nite Life Lounge when a known female approached her and began yelling at her causing a disturbance. Many patrons were escorted out of the tavern because of this and a fight erupted in front of the tavern with shots being fired by an unknown subject. Officers located five casings on the sidewalk in front of the tavern and an arrest was made regarding the battery. The suspect was charged with Substantial Battery.
- 2. On 11/16/07 at 1:48 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4001 W North Avenue for a Battery complaint. Officers spoke to the caller/licensee, Connie Leland, who stated three men hit one of her security guards in the head. Leland stated she was closing the bar and the men were asked to leave. The men became upset when security demanded them to leave. An argument began with all three men throwing glasses, ashtrays and a stool at the security guard. The guard sustained a one-inch laceration on the left side of his head. He was treated and released at a nearby hospital. The guard wished not to prosecute.

4. On 02/15/09 at 1:49 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4001 W North Avenue for a Threat complaint. Officers spoke to the owner Connie Leland who stated a patron tried entering the tavern without paying the cover charge and security refused to let the patron in however the patron pushed his way past security. The patron was escorted out and as he left in an auto, he made a gun hand gesture pointing at Leland. Leland stated she would like the police to watch the premises. The call was advised.

- 5. On 11/11/10 at 12:32 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4001 W North Avenue for a Fight complaint. Police spoke to the victim who stated a known female struck her on the head with a glass beer bottle causing a laceration. The victim stated the she and this female had been arguing for the last few months over a male subject. Police spoke to Connie Leland who stated a female entered the tavern and made one lap around the premise when she grabbed a glass beer bottle off of a table and struck another patron in the head. Leland stated she does not have a functioning surveillance system, and that a camera that is inside the tavern did not cover the area of where the incident occurred. The subject was later found and cited for Assault and Battery.
- 6. On 03/16/11 at 11:11 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4001 W North Avenue for a Trouble With Subject complaint. Upon arrival, officers observed a large group of patrons fighting inside the bar near the front door with security attempting to remove the combative patrons. Police conducted an investigation into a battery complaint made by one of the patrons, which resulted in a battery ticket being issued. While investigating, more fights were breaking out from outside the tavern in which officers had to call for additional squads. The licensee, Connie Leland, was informed in person regarding this incident and a citation was issued for disorderly premises.

7. On 04/03/11 at 2:00 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4001 W North Avenue for a Fight complaint. Police spoke with Connie Leland who stated a group of females started fighting in the bar and that one of them threw a glass at the security guard, identified as Ricky Trotter, striking him in the head. Leland stated the patron is a frequent customer at the bar, but that she didn't know her name. Police obtained other witness statements regarding this incident. Trotter was conveyed to an area hospital where he was treated for cut to this forehead and the interior part of his right eye. Trotter received an undetermined amount of sutures. A copy of video surveillance was obtained and inventoried.

- 8. On 12/20/12 at 3:00 am, Milwaukee police investigated an Armed Robbery that took place just outside of Connie's Nite Life bar. Investigation revealed that the two suspects were outside the tavern near closing time with the intent to rob patrons within. The suspects were armed with guns and wearing masks and when the security guard exited the bar from the rear door; the two men approached the guard and attempted to force him back inside the tavern, but the rear open faced security door had locked after the guard walked out so he and the suspects could not get back inside to the bar. While outside, the one suspect demand and removed money from the guard as the other discharged his handgun several times, striking Williams in the knee. A pit-bull that had come running down the stairs from an upper apartment above the bar was also shot 5 times by one of the suspects. A second security guard, who was still inside the bar, opened the tavern exit door and was shot at by one of the suspects, with the round striking the women's bathroom door. Both suspects then fled on foot through an alley. Surveillance video was obtained and placed on police inventory. The licensee, Connie Leland, was notified of the incident.
- 9. On 01/24/13 at 1:35 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4001 W. North Avenue for a Trouble With Subject complaint. While police were en-route, the call was upgraded to a Shots Fired. Officers arrived on scene and spoke to Connie Leland who stated that she originally called the police because she and her security were having trouble controlling a known patron, who was in a verbal altercation with another patron in the bar. Security was escorting the subject out of the bar when the subject grabbed a glass and threw it at the known patron. Once the subject was outside, security locked the front door, however, the subject began banging on the front door calling for the known patron to come outside. Leland stated she kept the known patron inside and called police. Leland stated the subject left the area in an auto and approximately 10 minutes later, the subject returned and stood outside the front door area of the bar, where he shot a firearm into the air one time. Leland has a functioning surveillance system, which did capture the incident on tape. A copy was provided and placed on police inventory. Reports were filed.
- 10.On 02/28/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a battery cutting at 4001 West North Avenue (Connie's Nite Life Lounge). Investigation revealed a patron was injured while inside the business when her ex-boyfriend threw a glass at her. Milwaukee police incident report #140590003 filed.
- 11. On 04/17/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a recklessly endangering safety complaint at 4001 West North Avenue (Connie's Nite Life Lounge). Investigation revealed that around 12:00am two subjects approached the business together, one of these subjects was denied entry because during a pat down it was discovered that he was carrying a handgun on his person. This subject went to an auto, placed the handgun inside and returned to the business. He was then allowed entry. Around 1:00am, these same subjects left the business together. Minutes later, one of these subjects returned to the bar and told security to call 911 because he had been shot. The victim, who was treated at Foredtert Hospital for a gunshot wound to the face, reported that the subject he had been at the business with earlier had shot him. Milwaukee police incident report #141070019 filed.

- 12. On 04/21/2014 a meeting attended by members of the Milwaukee police department, the applicant and one of the applicant's security guards was held at Milwaukee police district #3 regarding the shooting described in item #11. During this meeting, the business's security practices were discussed. Officers suggested that if a weapon was discovered on someone attempting to gain entry, that person should be banned from the property. The applicant discussed current security arrangements with officers and agreed to take steps to make some corrections.
- 13. On 06/21/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a battery complaint at 2466 North Teutonia Avenue. The victim, Latrice Peoples, told police she had been at 4001 West North Avenue (Connie's Nite Life Lounge) earlier when she overheard a male "cussing out" a female. Peoples attempted to intervene to help the female. A short time later, Peoples was approached by a couple outside of the bar. The female argued with Peoples and then struck her several times in the head with an unknown object. Peoples was later treated at Froedtert Hospital where she received two stitches to her right ear. The applicant told police she was aware of a disagreement inside the bar, but that it didn't seem too serious. Additionally, the applicant stated that when she became aware of the fight outside, Peoples told her she did not want to involve the police. The establishment's video wasn't working at the time of the incident. Milwaukee police incident report #141720035 filed.
- 14. On 10/30/2014 Milwaukee police, while on patrol, heard a gunshot in the 2200 block of North 40th Street. Security and citizen's from Connie's Nite Life Lounge told officers that the person who fired the shot had fled southbound in a dark color SUV. Security and witness's from the business told officers they had observed a fight in the middle of the street, and that one of the combatant's had fired at least one shot from a handgun into the ground. Neither the person who fired the shot, nor the other party involved was located by police. The establishment's video cameras were not operational during this incident. Milwaukee police incident report #143030012 filed.
- 15. On 11/06/2014 Milwaukee police observed a fight outside of 4001 West North Avenue (Connie's Nite Life Lounge). Investigation revealed there had been a fight inside the business and that the involved parties continued outside. The establishment's video cameras were not operation during this incident. The applicant stated they have been waiting on a part for the cameras for approximately 8 months. Four patrons were cited for disorderly conduct.
- 16. On 11/06/2014 Milwaukee police observed that there was no Maximum Occupancy Placard visible inside Connie's Nite Life Lounge (4001 West North Avenue). The applicant was cited.

- 17. On 02/12/2015 Milwaukee police were flagged down by a security guard, Steven Thompson, at Connie's Nite Life Lounge (4001 West North Avenue) regarding a fight. Thompson told officers that he barred entry to 4 males who appeared to be under the age of 25. One of the males returned a short time later, pointed at Thompson and said "he's the one from Wal-Mart get the gun". No weapons were recovered and no one was arrested.
- 18. On 03/06/2015 at 1:20am officers responded to several calls of shots fired at 4001 W. North Av. The investigation revealed the victim was inside Connie's Nite Life Lounge since about 11:00pm. He had an argument with other patrons and at about 1:15am was kicked out by security, at which point a fight with security and other patrons occurred. The fight ranged from 10-20 individuals. After the fight the victim was walking to his car and several shots were fired. At his car he was approached by an unknown subject who asked if he was okay. While talking with this person another subject walked up and shot him in the chest. The victim stated the subject who shot him was not one of the security guards he had been fighting with inside. There were casings recovered from two different caliber guns.
- 19. On 03/11/2015 the applicant attended a meeting at Milwaukee police district #3 regarding a shooting incident involving Connie's Nite Life Lounge (4001 West North Avenue). The applicant stated on the night in question, 80% of the patrons were new people. Additionally, she stated she does not have complete trust in her staff and that they do not always know the best way to talk to people to keep a situation from escalating. It was suggested that she should start with an employee she can trust, train her staff to know what her expectations are and add an ID reader.
- 20. On 10/18/2015 Milwaukee police responded to the subject with a gun complaint at 4001 West North Avenue (Connie's Nite Life). The call came from a patron of the business who stated a subject had threatened her and was in possession of a gun. Investigation revealed the subject had come to the business and was outside yelling that he wanted to get his wife prior to pushing his way past security to gain entry to the premise. This subject was ultimately apprehended by police and issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct. No firearm was discovered.

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PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by P.O. Michael FASULO, District #3, Power Shift.

On Wednesday, March 11, 2015 at 11:00am at District #3 a meeting was held with Connie M. LELAND (b/f, 05-04-65), regarding a shooting incident regarding patrons of the premise at 4001 W. North Ave., Connie's Nite Life Lounge (IR #15-065-0009) and what actions she was taking to prevent further incidents.

LELAND stated that evening the premise had approximately 80% new people inside the premise. LELAND also stated that she usually has 4 security guards working with 1 stationed at the door to conduct pat downs and check Identification. LELAND stated that males are physically patted down and females are check with a metal detector. P.O. Scott LESNIEWSKI informed LELEND that the evening of the shooting, 2 of the female patrons that were in the company of the shooting victim had entered the premise were under the age of 25, which is a violation of the Class B Tavern license restriction establish by the City for LELAND'S premise. LELAND then stated that she does not have complete trust in her security personnel or her bartenders. LELAND also stated there has been instances in the past where she has had to recheck the identification of female patrons and found they were under the age of 25 that security person had allowed into the tavern. LELAND also stated that her personal does not always know the best way to talk with people and sometimes situations inside the premise can escalate, which may have contributed to the fight inside the premise.

Suggestions that were brought up to LELAND to help with the problems she was start with an employee she can trust so she is not responsible for everything: bartending, cooking, checking ID's and cleaning. LELAND was also advised that if there incidents that have not reached a 911 level she can call the non-emergency number for assistance. Taking her security personal and training them with what she expects from them and how they are to act with patrons. Adding an Identification reader. Having security advise patrons they need to leave the premise surrounding property at closing and not congregate. To go with her security camera system is to display a monitor patrons would be able to see inside the premise so they would know they are being recorded and to see that both the inside and outside of the premise is being recorded.

PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by P.O. Michael FASULO, District #3, Late Power Shift.

On October 18, 2015 at 1:10am, Squad 3460, 3440 and 3465 were dispatched to a subject with gun call at Connie's Nite Life Tavern, 4001 W. North Ave. The call came in from a patron of the premise stating Alan MCNEIL was threatening her and he was in possession of a firearm.

When Officers arrived on scene the subject was pointed out by patrons and took flight. MCNEIL was taken into custody in the 2200 block of N. 40th St., no firearm was located.

Officers returned to the premise to speak with the licensee, Connie M. LELAND (b/f, 05-04-65), who stated that a male subject (MCNEIL) had come to the premise and was outside yelling loudly that he wanted to be let in to get his wife. Security told MCNEIL that he had to leave several times. MCNEIL then pushed his way past security into the premise and tried to fight other patrons. Security escorted MCNEIL out of the premise. MCNEIL continued to yell obscenities and for his wife to get outside. LELAND stated she did not observe a firearm in MCNEIL'S possession. LELAND allowed Officers to view video and MCNEIL could be seen appearing to being highly agitated and yelling, though the video had no audio.

The original callers for Police were no longer on scene when Officers returned to the premise and were unable to be located by investigating Officers.

l asked LELAND why she had not called the Police regarding MCNEIL and she stated that it was not her problem most of what happened had occurred outside. LELAND also stated she knew someone from inside the premise had already called Police. LELAND did state she told MCNEIL to call the police if he wanted to.

MCNEIL was cited for Disorderly Conduct.

The above application has been made by the above named applicant(s). This requires approval from the Licenses Committee and the Common Council of the City of Milwaukee. The hearing before the Licenses Committee will take place on 4/6/2016 at 3:30 PM, in Room 301-B, Third Floor, City Hall. If you wish, you may provide testimony at the hearing regarding the request; see below for further information. You are not required to attend the hearing. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing. Please review the information below and if you have further questions regarding this process, please contact the License Division at (414) 286-2238.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.

3. On 12/29/14 at 11:12 pm, Milwaukee police responded to 2624 W Lisbon Avenue for a Shotspotter that occurred at 1843 N 30th Street. Investigation revealed a vehicle left N 30th Street at a high rate of speed and entered the parking lot of 2624 W Lisbon. The driver exited the auto and walked into the store, despite officers ordering the driver to stay in the car. This report is a summary of reports filed by investigating Officers.

On Tuesday, December 29th, 2015 at 12:26 AM, Squad 3450, P.O. Larry LEIBLSE and P.O. Andrew KEMPEN, along with Squad 3411, Sgt Raymond HEWITT, were dispatched to premise at 2624 W Lisbon Ave for a report of shotspotter, which had detected 8 gunshots in the parking lot of the premise. The premise also called reporting 3-4 gunshots in the parking lot.

Upon arriving on scene Officers located 9 spent brass .40 caliber S&W easings and 3 bullet fragments in the south west corner of the gas station parking lot.

Officers spoke to the clerk at the gas station Aftah SULTAN, who stated that a fight started at the door of the gas station and then he heard several gunshots. SULTAN was able to show Officers the video of the incident where Officers observed a newer silver vehicle park at the southern most gas pump and three subjects got out of the vehicle. Two black males and a black female. The first black male was wearing a green winter jacket and the other black male was wearing a white winter jacket. The subjects entered the building and were talking for a while when a tan older Buick Lesabre pulled up the gas pump on the other side of the silver vehicle. A subject got out of the passenger side door of the Buick and walked up to the door of the building. As the subject in the white winter jacket goes to exit an altercation occurs between the white winter jacket subject and the subject from the Buick. The subject in the green winter jacket approached the subject from the Buick from behind and begins to strike him. The fight between the subjects moves back toward the driver side of the Buick. One of the 2 subjects runs back to the silver vehicle casings were located near where this subject was observed holding something in a pointing fashion towards the subjects of the Buick. The Buick speeds out of the parking lot and get stuck across the street and the passenger goes running northbound on N 27th St. The occupants of the other vehicle stand around for a few minutes and then leave out the south east exit of the parking lot. An anynmous citizen approached Sgt. HEWITT and stated he saw the suspect from the silver vehicle discharging a firearm. SULTAN was able to provide me with a copy of the video for inside and outside the gas station of the incident.
