As you know, Harris & Harris, Ltd. ("H&H") currently operates as a collection agent for the City's EMS accounts under the above referenced contract. Please allow this letter to confirm that Harris & Harris, Ltd. takes no issue with the City allowing private ambulance companies to utilize the Wisconsin Department of Revenue's Tax Refund Intercept Program ("TRIP") pursuant to recent changes to Wis. Stat. 71.935, and without utilization of H&H. As mentioned to Assistant City Attorney La Keisha Butler, H&H wants to accommodate the City and its EMS servicers in the most cooperative way possible. Accordingly, H&H will not exercise any challenge or intervene legally with the City's initiative to assist the private ambulance companies with TRIP recovery without placing those specific accounts with H&H.
