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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Final item of the
3	afternoon agenda is for Terry Heinemeier, Agent
4	for "Terry Lee's Corp.", Class "B" Tavern
5	application as Terry Lee's Corp. for "Terry
6	Lee's" at 5516 West Center Street.
7	Good afternoon.
8	THE APPLICANT: Good afternoon.
9	CHAIRMAN BOHL: And I recognize you,
10	Mr. Lee. Are you represented by counsel, if
11	if you could at least identify yourself for
12	for the committee, please?
13	MR. RANDALL: I'm Jerome Randall, your
14	Honor, or Mr. Chair.
15	CHAIRMAN BOHL: R-A-N-D-A-L-L?
16	MR. RANDALL: Yes. And Terry
17	Heinemeier is to my left, and to his left is his
18	wife, Sandra.
19	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Thank you. And we'll -
20	- we'll swear in each of you, and you're already
21	under – – under oath. So, Mr. and Mrs.
22	Heinemeier, we'll swear you in.
23	(Whereupon the applicants were sworn.)
24	MR. RANDALL: Mr. Chairman, before we
25	get started, I'd like to explain something to the

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1	committee, if I could.
2	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Please.
3	MR. RANDALL: Terry was denied a
4	license to renewal in in the year 2005 for
5	Terry Lee's, based on the police report and non-
6	appearance of Terry at the committee hearing.
7	The And notice was held by the Post Office.
8	It wasn't received by Terry until two days after
9	the hearing. And Terry re-applied on, I believe,
10	it was April 4th of '06 and heard nothing from
11	the application. We checked the file together on
12	June 20th of this year, and discovered a note in
13	the file that was dated May 5th of '06 that said
14	Alderman Murphy wanted to meet with Terry. And
15	Terry hadn't been notified of that request. So
16	we had a meeting with Alderman Murphy on July 1st
17	in Mister in Alderman Murphy's office. And
18	at the meeting we were informed that Alderman
19	Alderman Murphy was inclined to oppose Terry's
20	application, based on the past record and
21	neighborhood complaints. And that a committee
22	meeting would be set for today's date, and that a
23	neighborhood meeting would be set for July 8th at
24	seven o'clock. On July 7th Terry requested I try
25	to get this hearing adjourned, so that he'd have

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1	more time to prepare, adequately prepare for this
2	hearing. Alderman Murphy initially opposed the
3	adjournment because notices had gone out and the
4	neighbors would be inconvenienced. The
5	neighborhood meeting was held on July 8th. It
6	was supposed to be at St. Catherine's Church at
7	5501 West Center. But the meeting place was
8	changed. Terry was not informed of the change.
9	So he went to the St. Catherine's Church and
10	missed the meeting. We spoke to Alderman Murphy
11	yesterday, yesterday afternoon, and we were
12	informed that he would not oppose our request for
13	an adjournment of this hearing. And And we,
14	therefore, do request that this hearing be
15	adjourned until the next regular hearing date of
16	this committee. And since we weren't confident
17	that our request would be considered today, Terry
18	did ask some neighbors of the tavern to come here
19	and speak, and if possible, we'd like them to
20	make their appearances today, so they don't have
21	to come back to the next committee hearing if
22	it's rescheduled.
23	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Just let me ask, in
24	tarma of these who are here in the audience to

terms of those who are here in the audience to provide testimony, how many of you are opposed to

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00005 1 the license? Are there any neighbors who are 2 opposed to the license? Everyone who is here is 3 in support of the license. If I could see a show 4 of hands for those who are in support of the 5 license. All right. Will of the committee? 6 ALDERMAN HAMILTON: They're here. 7 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. Here's what - -8 Here's what I'm going to do, though. I'm going 9 to ask that the testimony be very brief, because we're - - we're holding this at your behest. 10 11 This isn't the Alderman's behest. 12 MR. RANDALL: Yes. 13 CHAIRMAN BOHL: So if you're going to 14 have, you know, and what I'll just say is - - is 15 we get name, address, and we get very brief 16 comment, and we get to the point where if 17 somebody is - - agrees, first two people say 18 Terry is a great guy and they always were a help 19 in the community and they always did a great job 20 and had the cleanest bar in town, and everybody else agrees, their name, and their address, and 21 22 we agree with what has been said, would be 23 appreciated. But I need to get you on the record here. Mr. Heinemeier, name and address for the 24 25 record, please, first.

00006 THE APPLICANT: Terry Heinemeier, 3810 1 2 Corral Lane, Richfield, Wisconsin. 3 CHAIRMAN BOHL: And I just want to see, P.O. Box 203, Hubertus, 53033 is the mailing 4 5 address? 6 THE APPLICANT: Yes, sir. 7 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. Do you acknowledge receiving notice of today's meeting 8 9 with the possibility your application could be 10 denied? There is an attached - -11 THE APPLICANT: Yes, sir. 12 CHAIRMAN BOHL: - - police report, as 13 well as an assortment of neighborhood objections 14 that - - that were outlined in the notice you 15 received. 16 THE APPLICANT: Yes, sir. 17 CHAIRMAN BOHL: All right. Ms. - - Ms. 18 Grill? 19 MS. GRILL: Department of Neighborhood 20 Services has a hold for occupancy. CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. That would have 21 to be rectified, although you'll have plenty of 22 23 time on that. Unless the committee members 24 request otherwise, we can dispense of the reading 25 of the police report, because if we hold this

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1	matter, we can read it in full next time, and
2	that way Because, otherwise otherwise,
3	we're not going to meet until the beginning of
4	September. It's not going to be fresh before us
5	anyway, so if you prefer, we'll – – we'll just
6	move forward. We'll save that portion of that.
7	We'll take neighborhood testimony, and then we'll
8	read the police report next time, and what I will
9	request is that a copy of the transcript be
10	included, as well, too, in when this item
11	does come up in the future meeting here.
12	MR. WEILAND: I would just like to get
13	some clarification from the applicants. It
14	appears that there was some there as some
15	court work being done, I think. Were you
16	appealing a previous, the non-renewal during that
17	time period? Have you appealed the non-renewal
18	by the committee? Yeah.
19	MR. RANDALL: Yes, we did.
20	MR. WEILAND: Okay. And what was the
21	time period? When was that decided?
22	MR. RANDALL: We started certain court
23	action on this this on the denial, and the
24	Judge found that it was only a requirement that
25	notice be sent.

00008 1 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Yeah. 2 MR. RANDALL: By the - - By the court, 3 and no provision that the notice actually be 4 received by the applicant. 5 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Let me - - Let me just 6 preempt this. It was - - This was in our notice, 7 you know, the committee members hopefully read 8 this. Mr. Heinemeier had a license. He was not 9 present. I - - And I hear what you said here 10 earlier. He was not present. There was a police 11 report, and based on the police report and - -12 Because I made the motion at the time. I 13 motioned to deny. The committee denied the 14 application. I assume you - - you appealed it in 15 Circuit Court, and you failed in your appeal. 16 And that is why there's been a period of time and 17 you are applying for a new license at the same 18 location. I mean, that's the summary of it. 19 Correct? 20 MR. RANDALL: Yeah, but - - that's the 21 substance of it. 22 CHAIRMAN BOHL: And I don't - - You 23 know what? You - - Because I'll hold it right 24 now, and we can redo it. That's a quick summary. 25 Okay? The Reader Digest version?

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1	MR. RANDALL: That's correct.
2	CHAIRMAN BOHL: But, you know, and as I
3	said, the police report will become pertinent.
4	The fact is, is that Mr. Heinemeier was operator
5	of of this establishment at this location
6	here for a number of years, and is now reapplying
7	for a license.
8	MR. RANDALL: That's correct.
9	CHAIRMAN BOHL: What we'll do is we
10	will ask individuals who can if we can
11	continue to keep the line moving, we'll ask
12	individuals to take the front seat. Because I
13	don't want people to come in and sit down. So
14	everyone here is We did swear them in.
15	Correct? Okay. What we're going to do is once
16	you start taking the front here, we're going to
17	have you all sworn in. So anybody who intends to
18	provide testimony, we'll ask you to raise your
19	right hand right now. And if you If I don't
20	see your hand up and you decide to come later on,
21	you're out of luck, because this is the one and
22	only time here. For those of you who are raising
23	your left right hand, it's your right right hand,
24	SO.
25	(Whereupon the witnesses were sworn.)

00010 1 CHAIRMAN BOHL: All right. We'll need 2 your name and your address for - - for the 3 record. If you have an unusual spelling, if it's 4 not as simple as Jones, if you could spell your -5 - your name, and then your very brief testimony. 6 And, you know, we know that you're here in - - in 7 support. So we'll start with you, and if we can keep kind of like shuffling, at least to get 8 9 folks in the front row, we'd appreciate it. 10 THE WITNESS: Yes. My name is David 11 Williams. I live at 2863 North 29th Street. I 12 frequent the bar regularly, and I have no 13 objections on him getting his license back. It 14 was a real nice place to go to. 15 CHAIRMAN BOHL: And you're a little bit 16 aways down - - down the path. 17 THE WITNESS: Yeah, it's a few blocks 18 yeah. 19 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. But you were a 20 patron of the establishment. 21 THE WITNESS: Yes. 22 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Thank you, sir. Sir. 23 And if you could, when you're done, if you could 24 relinquish your seat, thank you. That'd be 25 great.

00011 THE WITNESS: My name is Jan Williams. 1 2 My address is 2701 South 10th Street. I also 3 frequent the bar. It's a place to go. A place for a older crowd to get and enjoy themself. 4 5 We're not - - We can't be responsible for the 6 thugs that run around within the community just 7 as long as, you know, like the police department 8 can. We can't, you know, pick out and choose, you know, who do what, you know. But the 9 10 establishment, it's - - it's a great place. It's 11 a place that I can go, a place for my - - a 12 person my age can be and have a good time, you 13 know, and be responsible, you know. We cannot, 14 no one in here, cannot dictate and tell what any 15 individual would do, so we can't hold him 16 responsible for once of what a individual would 17 do. 18 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. Thank you. Any 19 questions by committee? 20 ALDERMAN KOVAC: When was the last time 21 this bar was open? 22 MR. RANDALL: It expired, the license 23 expired the 6th of February, 2005. 24 ALDERMAN KOVAC: So the people who are

25 regulars there were regulars three years ago is

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1	what they're referring to, okay. Thank you.
2	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Ma'am.
3	THE WITNESS: Hi. My name is Regina
4	Henderson, and I reside at 5520 West Center
5	Street, which is attached to the tavern
6	tavern of which we are speaking of. And to keep
7	this short, simple and to the point, I feel that
8	it's unfair and unjust to deprive Mr. Heinemeier
9	of being able to open his place of business.
10	It's true that people can spoil things for
11	others. This bar to him is income just as your
12	job provide income for your families. I'm
13	disabled, and I see no reason why he shouldn't be
14	allowed to open his place of business. As far as
15	this business affecting the peacefulness and
16	enjoyment of our neighborhood, it's no different
17	from the every day noise that we hear from cars,
18	buses, et cetera, driving down this busy street
19	every day. This bar will be closed at ten
20	o'clock every night, which is considered a decent
21	hour, especially for those who live directly
22	above the tavern. So I'm saying please just take
23	into consideration my testimony supporting the
24	opening of Mr. Heinemeier's bar.
25	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. Thank you. Do

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1	you want to hold on one second? Any questions by
2	committee? Thank you, ma'am, for your – – your
3	testimony.
4	THE WITNESS: Thank you.
5	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Sir.
6	THE WITNESS: My name is Bill
7	Napierkowski, N-A-P-I-E-R-K-O-W-S-K-I. I worked
8	for Terry Heinemeier for the last five years. I
9	just go to that establishment all the time, and
10	he runs a very good business. Thank you.
11	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Thank you. Did we get
12	an address from you?
13	MR. RANDALL: No.
14	CHAIRMAN BOHL: If you could provide
15	your address, please.
16	THE WITNESS: My address is 2966 North
17	1st Street.
18	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Thank you, sir. Hi,
19	there.
20	THE WITNESS: Mike Uebersohn, U-E-B-E-
21	R-S-O-H-N. 6514 North 56th Street. I've known
22	Terry for over 30 years, and I worked for him.
23	He's my friend, and I know that he did everything
24	possible, like the lady before me, closing at ten
25	o'clock, just to keep the place straight.

00014 CHAIRMAN BOHL: One moment. Are there 1 2 any questions by committee from this witness? 3 Thank you, sir. Hi, there. THE WITNESS: My name's Michael Frick. 4 5 5747 North 36th Street, Milwaukee. I've worked 6 for Terry for almost nine years now. We've done 7 a lot of renovations for him, and I think he would be very good yet there. The place would be 8 9 completely fixed up. And like he said, it would 10 be closing at ten o'clock. 11 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Do you - - Are you 12 currently working for Mr. Heinemeier? 13 THE WITNESS: Yes, I am. 14 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Because he does - - You 15 do own another liquor establishment on the 16 - - the city's north side here, on Silver Spring 17 or Villard or? 18 THE APPLICANT: Right. Yeah, I also 19 own the - - the store right next door to the 20 tavern. 21 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. 22 THE APPLICANT: Yes. CHAIRMAN BOHL: All right. I just - -23 24 Because I - - You've appeared before the 25 committee before, have you not?

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1	THE WITNESS: No, I have not.
2	CHAIRMAN BOHL: You have not. You look
3	familiar. Maybe it was a previous life.
4	Anyways, questions by committee for of this
5	applicant or this witness, I should say.
6	
0 7	Thank you, sir. Appreciate it. Good afternoon.
8	THE WITNESS: My name is Carl Gresen.
o 9	My address is 5514 West Center Street.
9 10	CHAIRMAN BOHL: I'm sorry. You said
- •	what? Gresen?
11	THE WITNESS: Gresen, G-R-E-S-E-N.
12	I've lived there for 23 years. So it can't be
13	very bad. It must be pretty good.
14	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. Thank you, Mr.
15	Gresen. And that was 5514
16	THE WITNESS: 5514 West Center Street.
17	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. Thank you, sir.
18	Sir?
19	THE WITNESS: Hi. My name is Roger
20	Gordon. Terry's son.
21	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Roger.
22	THE WITNESS: Roger Gordon. As far as
23	the bar being open. I have worked at that bar,
24	and when he buy another bar, I worked at both.
25	So I run between both bars, and when I work it's

00016 1 pretty calm when I'm working there, because I 2 like to make people laugh and feel comfortable 3 and relax when they come out and have a drink. 4 CHAIRMAN BOHL: And how - - How long 5 were you - - were you working at the 6 establishment here? THE WITNESS: Well, I still work there 7 8 now. 9 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. And - - So 10 you're a biased witness, though. Right? See? 11 You said you like to joke a lot. Any questions 12 for this witness here? Otherwise, thank you. 13 Ma'am, how are you? 14 THE WITNESS: Hi. My name is Yvette 15 Harris. My address is 2701 South 10th Street. 16 And I've been knowing Terry for a while, and I go 17 to both bars, and I think it should stay open. I 18 mean, re-open. 19 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Thank you. Any 20 questions for this witness? Thank you. Sir? 21 THE WITNESS: I'm Daniel Schultz, U-L-22 T-Z. I live at 3755 East Martin. That's in 23 Cudahy. Zipcode is 53110. I work security for 24 Terry. That started about a year ago actually 25 for him. He has now, has the high tech security

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1	system in there, which he hasn't had before.
2	I've heard, just working there, a lot of the
3	older crowd feels more comfortable coming back.
4	We weeded out a lot of the the troublemakers.
5	We card everybody. It doesn't matter if they're
6	80. I now check everyone's ID. So if there's a
7	problem, we know that person at least has it on
8	them at that time. And I've heard a lot about
9	the other bar, and I'd like to see it open.
10	CHAIRMAN BOHL: And to clarify, you
11	work for him at his current establishment
12	THE WITNESS: Right.
13	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Yeah, on And is
14	that on Silver Spring Drive? Is that
15	THE APPLICANT: Yes.
16	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. On Silver Spring
17	Drive.
18	THE APPLICANT: 2615.
19	CHAIRMAN BOHL: All right.
20	THE APPLICANT: I just do security
21	guards, and we'll probably even get another one
22	then when it comes to it for the other bars.
23	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Thank you. Any
24	questions by committee of this witness? Thank
25	you, sir. Good afternoon.

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1	THE WITNESS: Dennis Merkel, 4810
2	CHAIRMAN BOHL: I'm sorry. Start again
3	here.
4	THE WITNESS: Dennis Merkel. 4810
5	CHAIRMAN BOHL: M-E-R-C-K-L-E?
6	THE WITNESS: M-E-R-K-E-L.
7	CHAIRMAN BOHL: K-E-L, okay.
8	THE WITNESS: Um-hnh. I also work for
9	Terry on at the other establishment. What
10	Dan, the security guard, forgot to mention is we
11	don't allow anyone without IDs at night. So
12	that's a big plus for that, as far as that goes.
13	I worked for Terry for a number of years. We
14	never had any problems.
15	CHAIRMAN BOHL: His current
16	establishment that he has.
17	THE WITNESS: 2615 West Silver Spring.
18	CHAIRMAN BOHL: And the the crowd
19	he has there.
20	THE WITNESS: It's a daytime crowd. I
21	work mostly days. It's a older, older crowd, you
22	know, people in their 50s, 40s.
23	CHAIRMAN BOHL: How late is he open at
24	night at that location?
25	THE WITNESS: At that location, we

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1	start closing down at 1:30 in the morning.
2	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. And I don't
3	I haven't I don't I don't remember if the
4	applications here, maybe somebody made a comment
5	about ten o'clock. That may not hold true
6	THE APPLICANT: That's for the bar
7	that's closed. September 17th, we had a
8	shooting. I said that's it. I was as sick of it
9	as the neighbors. I closed at ten o'clock every
10	night, seven days a week. Then I get that letter
11	after closing for five months.
12	MR. RANDALL: Yeah, there were no
13	incidents during the five months after they
14	closed at ten. Evidently, there were two
15	different crowds.
16	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Right.
17	THE APPLICANT: Like I said, we're
18	going to that next one, because this is the
19	next meeting
20	CHAIRMAN BOHL: I've seen, because I've
21	had a bar in my district that had a old timer
22	working retiree crowd during the daytime, and
23	and somehow like after 11 o'clock, midnight, it
24	just it turned and there was a very young
25	croud, there were problems. And I had the

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1	the old timers come in and and support the
2	renewal of the license, and, you know, you would
3	have believed that that the place never had
4	problems. But the neighbors were telling me that
5	there were baseball bats and chains that were -
6	- that were being pounded on people's heads at
7	one o'clock in the morning. I mean, it it
8	happens. So.
9	ALDERMAN HAMILTON: And, Mr. Chair,
10	since you brought up the other establishment,
11	that's actually in my district, and and we
12	haven't had any issues out of there out of
13	there.
14	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Yeah, I I know that
15	they you appeared like within the last year
16	here, as well, too, for a minor incident or two.
17	I I do recall the police report was
18	substantially lesser than what it is at this
19	location here, as well.
20	ALDERMAN HAMILTON: Exactly.
21	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Hi there.
22	THE WITNESS: Hi, my name is Valerie
23	Murrell. I stay at 5514 West Center.
24	CHAIRMAN BOHL: And if you could spell
25	Murrell here, please.

00021 THE WITNESS: M-U-R-R-E-L-L. 1 2 CHAIRMAN BOHL: And - -3 THE WITNESS: I stay in apartment two. 4 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Ms. Murrell, could you 5 - - Could you say your address again one more 6 time? 7 THE WITNESS: 5514 West Center, 8 apartment two. I stay directly above the tavern, 9 and I'm all for him opening up the tavern. 10 CHAIRMAN BOHL: Okay. Thank you, 11 ma'am. Good afternoon, sir. 12 THE WITNESS: Good afternoon. My name 13 is Don Welch. Excuse me. I live at 5326 North 14 38th Street. I've been knowing the gentleman and 15 his son and his wife for like 16 years. I don't 16 too much visit bars, though, but I stopped that. 17 And like the gentlemen spoke, I mean, it's - - I 18 go into the bar once in a while, but I don't sit 19 too long. I have a water or something like that, 20 but I noticed the crowd ain't too - - too young and mixed and, you know. But it's my experience 21 22 with bars, I mean, you could be sitting in one 23 anytime and anything could go wrong at that time. 24 But I agree. I ain't going to make a long story, 25 but I would say he deserve a chance.

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1	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Thank you, Mr. Welch.
2	One question. Any questions by committee members
3	of this witness? Alderman Zielinski?
4	ALDERMAN ZIELINSKI: No.
5	CHAIRMAN BOHL: All right. Thank you,
6	sir. Any other Any other takers at this
7	time? Going once, going twice, sold. Okay.
8	ALDERMAN ZIELINSKI: Mr. Chairman.
9	CHAIRMAN BOHL: Alderman Zielinski.
10	ALDERMAN ZIELINSKI: I have a couple of
11	questions of Mr. Heinemeier. Mr. Heinemeier, you
12	had expressed a desire to hold this matter today.
13	Is that Is that accurate?
14	THE APPLICANT: We originally did, yes.
15	ALDERMAN ZIELINSKI: Is there a reason
16	as to why you want this matter hold today
17	held today as opposed to attempting to get the
18	matter approved?
19	THE APPLICANT: The main reason is I
20	didn't get a chance to meet with the neighbors,
21	and I think that's one of the most important
22	things. And the letter Ben says the letter
23	was sent to 5516 West Center. That's the tavern
24	that's been closed for over a year.
25	ALDERMAN ZIELINSKI: Okay. But that -

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1	- that's why you
2	MR. RANDALL: I want to be able to meet
3	with the neighbors.
4	ALDERMAN ZIELINSKI: Okay. But the
5	neighbors were did receive the notice in the
6	mail. Correct?
7	THE APPLICANT: Yeah, but besides that
8	besides that, we did speak to Alderman Murphy
9	yesterday afternoon. We had originally asked for
10	<ul> <li>- for an adjournment, and he was originally</li> </ul>
11	opposed to it, and as of yesterday afternoon he
12	was for it. So I'm not sure it would be fair to
13	have the hearing today, to the Alderman, the
14	Alderman thinking that it's going to be adjourned
15	and there would be another hearing. He hasn't
16	mobilized any of his neighbors to come to this,
17	evidently.
18	ALDERMAN ZIELINSKI: Can Can the
19	representative from Alderman Murphy's office
20	articulate in a little bit more detail as to what
21	the thinking is of the Alderman?
22	MR. WEILAND: Yes. Alderman Murphy
23	sent out a mailing, I believe around July 8th to
24	neighbors. Terry was Originally it was going
25	to be held at St. Catherine's Parish. St.

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1	Catherine's cancelled on us, and we changed
