This report is written by Police Officer Gilbert Gwinn, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 09/08/06 at 8:43 am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 2526 W Hopkins for a Hit and Run Accident. Investigation revealed that the owner of Warrens Lounge, Warren Harper, was backing out of the tavern parking lot after closing up the bar and struck the wall to the Sparkles Foods building located at 2526 W Hopkins. Warren never called police to report the accident. Further investigation revealed Warrens auto damage was consistent to the damage and paint transfer that was left on the building wall. When asked by police if Warren had to much to drink he answered, "I guess so.. you can say that." Warren received a citation for Duty Upon Striking Property and an accident report was filed.
- 2. On 06/30/2014 at 12:07am officers were dispatched to 2534 W. Hopkins to investigate a battery complaint. The investigation revealed that the victims was inside the bar drinking. She got into an argument with an unknown male patron. The argument escalated and the victim swung a bottle at the suspect who then hit the victim one time to the head with a closed fist. The suspect fled when the police were called. The victim was treated at St Mary's Hospital for bruising. The bartender was cooperative and gave a statement to the police with the suspects first name and description. There are no cameras in the bar. Milwaukee Police Department incident report #14-181-0007 was filed.

3. On 01/20/2016 Milwaukee police responded to a trouble with a subject complaint at 2534 West Hopkins Street (Warren's Lounge). The caller, who identified herself as an off duty Milwaukee police officer, stated she was involved in a verbal dispute with another patron while inside the business. The argument continued outside of the establishment and the caller was struck in the face. While investigating this incident, a vehicle traveling westbound on West Hopkins Street struck parked vehicles, including marked squad cars. This incident resulted in injuries to two police officers. The operator of the vehicle, Kenneth Taylor, was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated. Investigation revealed Taylor had been a patron of Warren's Lounge. Milwaukee police incident report #160200013 filed.

PA-33E	Narrative

This report is written by PO Robert WATTS, assigned to District Five, Late Power Shift.

On Wednesday, January 20, 2016, at 12:57AM Squad 5469 (PO David LETTEER and I) responded to a trouble with subject complaint at 2534 W Hopkins St (Warren's Lounge). The caller/complainant, Ebony N. MARTIN. (B/F, 02-05-79) notified the dispatcher that she was an Off-Duty Milwaukee Police Officer from District 3 and asked for an officer assist.

Upon arrival we spoke to MARTIN who stated she was inside Warren's Lounge and was involved in a verbal dispute with an unknown black female subject. MARTIN stated the argument led outside of the establishment where she was struck by the unknown actor with an opened hand causing pain. While officers on scene were investigating that complaint, a vehicle traveling westbound on W Hopkins St, struck parked vehicles including two marked squad cars that were parked on the north side of W Hopkins St. The manner of the collision caused one of our parked squad cars to strike PO LETTEER causing injuries. PO LETTER was conveyed to Froedtert Hospital by Med 7 where he was treated. The operator of the striking vehicle was intoxicated and was arrested for OWI.

The operator of the vehicle was identified as Kenneth L. TAYLOR. He was traveling westbound on W.

Hopkins St. at a high rate of speed in a 2003 Cadillac CTS, collided with the rear of a legally parked, marked Milwaukee Police Department squad car, causing the MPD squad to impact another legally parked MPD squad car. The Cadillac continued westbound and struck a legally parked Saturn Vue, then collided with the front of a third MPD squad car, causing this MPD squad to impact a pedestrian. The pedestrain victim was an MPD police officer working in his official capacity, investigating a call at 2534 W. Hopkins Street. PO LETTEER sustained a broken left wrist, contusion to his right knee, and pain to his jaw.

I interviewed the bartender at Warren's, who identified herself as Leomia STAPLES, B/F, 11-20-53, of 4175 N.

35th St. #1. (208-1208). STAPLES stated prior to the accident there was a verbal altercation between two groups of people. STAPLES stated that 'MARTIN and some other patrons were arguing.

STAPLES stated the argument became physical and occurred after a group of women were dancing together.

STAPLES stated she heard the accident which occurred outside of the bar. STAPLES stated that she noticed that the driver of the black vehicle was just inside of the bar. The subject STAPLES was referring to, was Kenneth TAYLOR.

STAPLES stated that she is positive TAYLOR was in the bar, because she served him multiple times throughout the night. STAPLES stated that TAYLOR was drinking hard liquor and beer. STAPLES stated that TAYLOR spent approximately \$90.00, as he was buying drinks for himself and some women at the bar.

STAPLES stated that TAYLOR had purchased his last drinks of the night with a credit card. STAPLES stated that as the fight was going on, he and the females he was with left out of the back door of the bar, as they were not involved in the fight.

STAPLES stated she recalled TAYLOR, had actually came back inside the bar to retrieve his credit card from behind the bar, prior to the accident. STAPLES provided a receipt for the transactions with TAYLOR dated 01-20-16, at 1:54 am.

Riverworks Development Corporation, Safe and Sound and the Milwaukee Police Department and the Assistance District Attorney. We mostly concentrate on crime and safety, nuisance and other quality of life issues.

It has come to our attention that The Fox tavern, located at 421 W. Keefe Avenue, has applied for a renewal of their alcohol license.

We are concerned with this renewal and have continually tried to reach out to the applicant, Daria Morse, regarding the problems we encounter from the The Fox's patrons. Throughout the last 11 or so months there have been shootings, very loud customers outside smoking, neighbor's driveways blocked with patron's vehicles among other nuisance type behaviors. We invited Daria to a meeting and she brought her son(s), who are not on the license, to answer most of the questions. They agreed to work with us on a few issues, take some business classes and create a more respectable environment for our neighborhood.

We do not feel at this time that they have kept their word and do not support the renewal. To our knowledge there haven't been any business classes taken, we had a free offer through WWBIC (Wisconsin Women's Business Initiative Corporation), only Daria is on the license renewal application, even though her sons seem to be the people actually running it. They continue to keep their drapes closed as if they are hiding something. For example, they had strippers there before, which they are not licensed for.

- 3. On 10/09/2015 a Milwaukee police officer attended the Keefe avenue safety task force meeting at Riverworks Lofts (3372 North Holton Street). The applicant, along with her two sons, also attended the meeting as did various other members of the community. During the meeting, the group raised various concerns with regards to the business. Specifically, issues with loitering, trespassing in yards, parking on the grass and shots fired. The applicant agreed to post no loitering signs, to ask patrons to smoke at the side of the business and to come up with a plan to address the parking issues.
- 4. On 11/15/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a shots fired complaint at North 4th Street and West Keefe Avenue. An update indicated that people were shooting across from the Fox Night Club. Officers discovered a vehicle parked east of 407 West Keefe Avenue with damage to its windows that appeared to be the result of a projectile. Officers also discovered two spent 9mm shell casings just south of the damaged vehicle. Officers spoke to the caller who stated she had observed a large group of people on the corner, and heard what she believed were gunshots. She further stated several people were yelling and arguing and that this is an ongoing problem with the bar.
- 5. On 01/01/2016 Milwaukee police conducted a tavern check at 421 West Keefe Avenue (The Fox). A subject who was standing near the front door of the business possessed both a green leafy substance that tested positive for THC and a handgun and was arrested. When officers attempted to enter the business, they discovered the front door was locked. Once the door was unlocked, a subject began pushing his way to the rear of the bar into a common hallway that leads to the rear of the building and a stairway that leads to two upper residential units. At that moment, a gunshot was fired inside the building. The same subject that had pushed his way toward the rear of the building when officers entered the business walked out the rear door. The subject turned around when he saw police and pushed his way up the stairs toward the upper residences, while yelling "close the door, close the door". Subjects standing in the rear of the business then closed and locked the back door. The officer then heard two gunshots coming from inside the back hallway, near the stairs. The officer discovered a shortbarreled shotgun under a cardboard box on top of a shelf at the top of the stairs. A shot had been fired from this gun that went through the floor and into the common hallway near where the officer had been standing. The subject that had pushed his way to the upper level had fled through a separate door leading out to the front of the building. A security guard at the front door of the establishment told officers he locks the front door to do checks, but does not know

6. On 01/10/2016 Milwaukee police met with the applicant and her son at the applicant's home. Officers discussed their concerns regarding incidents of shots fired on 11/15/2015 and on 01/01/2016, when shots were fired while officers were inside the business. Officers pointed out that there had been an individual who possessed both marijuana and a handgun standing between the two entrance doors to the business, and that the doors remained locked until a patron opened them because the security guard was not there. Additionally, the security guard had missed two people who were armed with guns, even though he told officers he patted people down. The applicant's son, Jonathan Morse, stated they hired the security guard because he was a childhood friend, and he had been fired when officers left following the incident with the shotgun. Mr. Morse told officers he believes people around the bar are doing whatever they can to shut them down and are not allowing them to run their business. He further stated they were looking into contracting for armed security and he would contact police once they have a plan of action regarding the bar and security.

This report is written by PO Shawn HUMITZ assigned to District 5, late shift, Sq 5321. On Saturday, September 19, 2015, myself, along with several other squads, responded to the area of N 5<sup>th</sup> St and W Keefe Av for multiple shots fired complaints

While on scene, I observed that the time was 2:30am. The bar known as "The Fox" is located at 421 W Keefe Av. Through the window I noticed what appeared to be several people still inside the bar even though closing time is 2:30am. I knocked on the front door and windows to the bar for a period of approximately 5 minutes until someone finally answered the door. While waiting for the door to be answered, I observed approximately 10 people run out the back door of the bar.

A black male subject wearing a white t-shirt answered the door but refused to open the door stating that we needed a warrant to enter the bar. We informed him we didn't need a warrant to enter a licensed premises. He then told us that he would get the bartender.

A short time later, Ashley JOHNSON answered the door and again refused to open the door without a warrant. I again informed them that we did not need a warrant. She finally reluctantly opened the door and allowed us entry to the front vestibule. She argued with us again about making full entry to the bar. We explained that she had to allow us in. When she opened the inner door, I observed approximately 15 people still inside the bar. I began to ask people if they were employed by the bar. A few said that they were but 10 people said that they were not. I had those subjects exit the bar.

PO Russell MACRAE obtained names of two of the subjects: Brittney FLUETTE (B/F 08/29/91) and Terrance WILLIAMS (B/M 02/19/92). Both subjects were under the 25 year old age limit for the tavern's license.

Citations were issued to the tavern's owner, Daria MORSE, but we were unable to locate a good phone number for her and were forced to mail the citations to her.

On Saturday, September 26, 2015, PO Russell MACRAE and I went to The Fox bar located at 421 W Keefe Av in order to deliver citations to the tavern owner, Daria MORSE. We had previously been to her house but were unable to locate her and thought she may be at the tavern.

Upon entering the tavern, it immediately appeared as though the bar was over capacity. From previous interactions, we knew that the bar's capacity was 70 people. PO MACRAE began to count the patrons of the bar. He counted a total of 90 people. PO MACRAE also observed that the subject acting as a bartender behind the bar was not a licensed bartender. He knew this from a previous interaction.

I went and spoke to the subject, Paul FAIR, and asked him if he had a bartenders license. He stated that he did not. I asked him if there was anyone else on the premises that did. He stated that there had been another bartender with him earlier in the night but that there was currently no other licensed bartender there. He also stated that there was no manager or owner on scene.

The bar was shut down for the night. FAIR was issued a citation for not having a bartender's license. MORSE was issued citations for being 20 over capacity and for failing to have a responsible person on the premises.

PO MACRAE attempted to serve the new citations along with the old citations a second time, on October 6, at MORSE's address, but again, no one answered the door. The citations for MORSE were left at her address and will constitute her notification of the incidents that occurred at the bar.

This supplemental report is written by P.O. Laure Lammers, assigned to District Five, early shift, as the Community Liaison Officer.

On Friday, October 9<sup>th</sup>, 2015 at 4:30 pm, I attended the Keefe avenue safety task force meeting which was held at the Riverworks Lofts, located at 3372 N Holton St. Adrian Spencer, who is a community organizer for Safe & Sound, did invite the licensee from The Fox tavern, Daria Morse, to attend the meeting so that members of the group could address issues directly to the licensee. I was also invited to attend the meeting, as I am every month. In addition to Mrs. Morse, her two sons Leon (unknown last name) and Kenneth Morse did attend along with 9 other community members.

During the meeting, Daria stated tha she works at the tavern from 4 pm - 9 pm, and that when she is unable to be at the tavern due to her other job, her son, Kenneth, manages the tavern. When asked about the tavern having any issues with being over capacity, Kenneth did state that he knows the capacity to be set at 70, and that he was unaware of any issues with being overcapacity. When asked about the tavern being open after hours, Leon stated that they had had only one occurance and asked what the requirement is. I informed them that they can only have employees at the location who are working and/or cleaning at the location after closing hours and that they should not be socializing or drinking after closing hours. The group did ask about the loitering from patrons. Kenneth stated that since there is a law that does not allow smoking inside of buildings, that people outside of the tavern are out there smoking. The group did advise that there has been a much larger issue, and stated that patrons are loitering, talking loudly, trespassing in neighbors yards, and parking on the grass of the vacant lot, as well as shots being fired. Kenneth did state that he was aware of two incidents of shots being fired but was not aware of any link to patrons of the tavern. The group did ask if they had considered hiring security to address the loitering at bar close. Kenneth stated that they had discussed that as a future goal but they did not have the money to do so right now. Kenneth did add that they do have one person employed as security and his role is to search people and to check identification. Kenneth stated that that person is self employed, not licensed, and not armed; and that his name is Algie Williams. The group then asked if Kenneth had any previous tavern experience, which he stated that he did not. Kenneth stated that his experience is from management of a cleaning company.

To close, the group did ask for some follow up items to be completed. They did ask if no loitering signs could be posted by next month. Daria and Kennth did agree that they would post the no loitering signs. The group asked that they come up with a plan to address parking issues, they agrred that they would come up with a plan in the next 60 days. Lastly, the group asked that they designate a smoking area to help reduce the issue of loitering. Kenneth stated that for now, they will ask patrons to smoke on the side of the building where the vacant lot currently is.

The group concluded by thanking Mrs. Morse for hearing their concerns and did invite them to be part of future saftey meetings.

On 11-15-15 at 2:19 a.m., Sq. 5469 (PO WATTS and PO LETTEER) was dispatched to the area of N. 4th St. and W. Keefe Ave., for a report of shots fired. Upon arrival, we received an update that people were shooting across from the Fox Night Club, located on the southeast corner of N. 5th St. and W. Keefe Ave.

PO WATTS and myself exited our marked squad car and in full police uniform and walked the area around the bar. As we approached W. Keefe Ave and N. 4th St., we located a white 2006 Pontiac Torrence, 4-dr bearing WI plate 639-WGJ. The vehicle was parked just to the east of 407 W. Keefe Ave. The vehicle had a spidered out passenger rear door window and a rear hatch window. It appeared that a projectile had entered one window and exited the other window.

PO WATTS and myself walked the area between the alley and W. Keefe St., on N. 4th St. As we were checking, PO WATTS located a spent 9mm RP casing gold in color, laying on the sidewalk and a gold in color 9mm FC spent casing in the curb line grass. Both casings were just east of 407 W. Keefe Ave. and just south of the vehicle. It appears that the person shooting the gun shots was standing facing north, when the shots were fired, with at least one gun shot entering the passenger rear door window and exiting the rear hatch. We inspected the vehicle and found not other signs of entrance or exit bullet holes in the vehicle.

I then attempted to contact the owner of the vehicle, Talitah N. SCOTT (12-14-80), who resides at 407 A W. Keefe Ave. I knocked on the door to the residence several times, ringing the doorbell, with no answer. I checked RMS and B of I for any further information on SCOTT, but there was no information in the system. I then left the PV-17 in the vehicle and will follow up with the owner regarding this.

The casings were photographed, recovered and placed on inventory 15040921.

On 11-15-15, at 7:30 p.m., I conducted follow up with the callers of this incident, via the telephone from District 5.

I first contacted the caller, Melody WILLIAMS (414-837-7111) who stated she is a 3rd shift worker and was up when she heard the gunshots. She stated she had heard numerous gunshots and looked out her window. She stated she is on the corner of N. 4th St. and W. Keefe Ave. and observed a large group of people. She stated initially she heard what she believed to be fireworks and then realized they were gunshots.

She stated while looking out her window, she observed a red car driving fast, going east on W. Keefe Ave., from N. 4th St. She stated she then observed another vehicle going the wrong way on N. 4th St., from W. Keefe Ave. She stated just before the gunshots, she heard people yelling and arguing about something. She stated this is an ongoing thing with the bar, which she identified as The Fox Bar.

She stated the bar opened sometime in June and every weekend, there are cars parked everywhere and lots of people leaving the bar and area at closing. WILLIAMS stated there are always people arguing and sometimes she hears gunshots during this time. WILLIAMS believes that this bar is owned by an older lady, but has her younger sons running the bar. She stated it is mostly younger people that she observes. WILLIAMS stated the bar has been nothing but a nuisance since opening and that something needs to be done with this establishment. WILLIAMS stated she observed PO WATTS and myself, walking around the area checking for casings and such, but that she did not want to come outside and talk to us, due to someone from the bar or neighborhood seeing her speaking to the police.

I then called Evelyn MARSHALL (414-458-2291). She stated she also lives near the intersection of N. 4th St. and W. Keefe Ave. Evelyn stated she is getting sick and tired of the bar, which she identified as The Fox Bar.

She stated ever since the bar opened, there has been nothing but people arguing, numerous vehicles parked in the area when they are open and that when open Thursday thru Saturday, the bar is nothing but a pain to the neighborhood. She stated cars race out of the area and even gunshots at times. She believes it is all people who occupy the bar and leave.

I asked her if she had heard anything from last night. She stated she was in her home and hear what she believed to be 10 to 20 gunshots. She stated the gunshots mainly came from the alley north of her residence and a few from the south side of W. Keefe Ave. She stated they were so close, that she fell to the floor, until the gunshots stopped.

Evelyn stated she was awake at bar closing and heard the normal thing of people arguing and cars leaving the bar. She stated she heard females yelling and arguing with each other from what she believed to be west of her, near N. 5th St. She stated the arguing and possibly fighting moved east to N. 4th St., then the gun shots. She stated she believed the fighting started at the bar initially. Evelyn stated the bar has been open since spring and something needs to be done with the bar, so it can get shut down. She stated she has been trying to get in contact with Alderwoman COGGS and discuss this establishment with her, but that the Alderwoman had not called her back. Evelyn stated she is sick and tired of this and has to look out for her kids. She stated she would be a willing participant in any investigation regarding The Fox. I asked Evelyn where she lived and she stated 330 W. Keefe Ave #3 and can be contacted at the number she gave in the text.

We then went to the address of 407 #A W. Keefe Ave. and spoke to the owner of the vehicle that was struck the night before, SCOTT. When we first spoke to SCOTT, she asked what are going to do with The Fox. She stated the bar is nothing but a nuisance and when the bar is open, people argue and fight when the bar closes. She also stated there are gunshots that do come from the area of the bar as well. She stated when people leave; there is a mess on W. Keefe Ave. She stated a couple months ago there was a problem at the bar and people were running to leave the bar. She stated her car was parked and struck by a vehicle that was leaving the area, related to the bar.

We left the SCOTT residence and walked around the apartment building, 330 W. Keefe Ave., in order to locate any more casings or evidence of the shots fired, but located none. We then walked W. Keefe Ave, between N. 4th and N. 5th St. again. As we did this, there was a gentleman on the top porch of his address, 420 W. Keefe Ave., who asked if were looking for more casings. We asked him if he had observed or heard anything from the shots fired from last night. The man, who did not give me his name, stated the bar was letting out around 2:10 a.m. to 2:15 a.m. when people who were coming out of the bar, started to argue. He stated as the arguing was going on, someone went to the field, just west of The Fox and began shooting at something. He stated the gunshots started in the field, went to the rear of the bar and then east in the alley and stopped on N. 4th St. The man did say the bar is a pain and needs to be taken care of, so the arguing and gun shots stop.

We then went to the bar. It is located at 421 W. Keefe Ave., with a door to the west, 423 W. Keefe Ave., which leads to an upper apartment. We began to check the field and as we entered the field, the man we were speaking to guided us to the area where the shots were being fired. We located 6 more casings in the grass. We found a silver 40 caliber Winchester spent casing, Brass 9mm Luger WIN spend casing, 2 brass 9mm Luger spent casings, silver 9mm Luger FC spent casing and a brass. 40 caliber S&W GFL spent casing.

We attempted to speak to someone in The Fox, but they were closed tonight. The casings were photographed and placed on inventory 15040998.

On 11-19-15 at 7:58 p.m., we returned to the bar in order to speak with someone regarding this incident. Upon arrival, it appeared that this establishiment was open, the interior lights were on, but the front door was locked. We looked in the front windows of the bar, which had a few blinds missing. We could see into the bar, but did not oberved anyone inside the bar.

We again returned to the bar on 11-20-15 at 10:48 p.m. Upon arrival, we found the door to the bar to be open, with the interior door locked. There was a security guard sitting between the bar and the locked door. The security guard had to open the door to let us in. Upon entering the bar, we were greeted by Kenneth MORSE (b/m 02-28-83). We informed him that we were there to speak to him about this incident from the previous day. MORSE stated he and his brother, Loendre MORSE, are in charge of the bar, in place of his mother Daria MORSE, who is the licensee of the bar. He stated on the day of this incident, they were busy, but that everything inside the bar was normal, no one was fighting or arguing. He stated he did not know of anyone shooting and was under the belief that what happened outside the bar, was not the bar's concern. I informed him that as a business owner he is still repsonsible for the patrons while outside the bar. I stated to him that we were there to just talk to him and adress these concerns with him. I informed him that due to speaking to neighbors and through investigation, that a tavern report would be written, documenting the previous incident. MOSRSE then asked me if I really had to write a tavern report about this and if there was anything that could be done so that one could not be written. I informed him that the nature of the situation and stated that I had to write a report on this. I then stated that we (PO WATTS and myself) were here to work with the bar if needed. After speaking more with MORSE he understood why this was being done. He then showed me the license of the establishment and stated the bar would do what they could to work with the police department.

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### PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by P.O. Robert WATTS, assigned to District 5, Late Power Shift.

On Friday, January 01, 2016, Squads 5469 (PO David LETTEER and I) along with Squads 5465 (PO Russell MACRAE and PO Anthony MILONE) Squad 5481 (PO Ismar KULENOVIC and PO Jesse BUSSHARDT) Squad 5483 (PO Daniel SUTYAK and PO Zachary KWIATKOWSKI) and Squad 5414 (Sgt. Robert CRAWLEY) were assigned to "The District 5 New Years Eve Tavern SSI".

On 01-01-16 at approximately 1:25am all squads assigned to the New Years Eve Tavern SSI arrived at 421 W Keefe Av "The Fox" to conduct a tavern check of the premises. Upon arrival officers attempted to walk into the front entrance door and observed a subject, later identified as Dante D. SMITH (B/M, 11-21-77) move to the side to attempt to let us pass him so that we could gain entry into the interior entrance door. As officers passed him, PO's MACRAE, MILONE and LETTEER observed a clear-plastic baggie containing a green-leaf plant like material in smaller individually wrapped plastic-baggies that later tested positive for THC sticking out of his rear-left pants pocket in plain view. SMITH was taken into custody and PO's MACRAE and LETTEER walked SMITH outside to a squad car. While searching SMITH incident to arrest, PO MACRAE located a loaded, small .38 caliber, silver revolver with 5 unspent cartridges/bullets located in SMITH's front-right pants pocket. It was later determined that the handgun in SMITH'S possession was reported stolen (IR#15-230-0147) and that SMITH is a convicted felon under Case# 2001CF003638. SMITH has already been convicted of "Felon in Possession of a Firearm", Case# 2007CF000429.

While SMITH was being conveyed to a squad car additional officers attempted to gain access into the bar but the interior front door was locked in order to keep the police from entering. PO BUSSHARDT and PO KWIATKOWSKI walked to the rear of the bar, where the rear door is located, to intercept any subjects attempting to flee the establishment. Once the interior front door was unlocked and officers were able to gain entry into the establishment, PO MILONE observed a black male, approximately 6'00" to 6'02", weighing approximately 200 to 220 pounds, and wearing a light colored cream or white jacket with fur around the hood of the jacket. Upon sight of PO MILONE, this subject immediately began pushing his way towards the rear of the bar and into a common hallway where patrons of the bar were standing. The common hallway leads to the rear door of the establishment and two upper residential units. At that moment, a gunshot was fired inside the building. The other officers on-scene notified dispatch for assistance and more District 5 officers arrived on-scene.

As PO BUSSHARDT approached the rear door of the bar, which is located at the southwest corner of the building, he observed the same subject that PO MILONE was attempting to stop, walking out of the rear door. Upon sight of police, the subject immediately turned around and pushed his way past four other subjects and up the rear stairs of the building, towards the upper apartments. As he turned to flee upstairs, PO BUSSHARDT could hear the subject yell, "close the door, close the door". At which point, the subjects that were standing just inside the rear door of the building, closed and locked the rear door just as PO BUSSHARDT was reaching for the door handle. After PO BUSSHARDT attempted to open the door twice and yelled, "Open the door", he heard two loud gunshots coming from inside the back hallway of the bar, near the stairs where he had last seen the subject PO MILONE was attempting to stop.

As soon as it was safe to do so, officers opened the rear door of the building, allowing PO BUSSHARDT to gain entry. Upon entering the building, PO BUSSHARDT walked up the stairs to the common hallway of the two separate apartments in the upper of the building. Upon reaching the top of the stairs he observed a black Maverick 12-gauge pump action short-barreled shotgun (Ser No. MV47327B) tucked under a cardboard box on top of a shelving unit. The gun was recovered and placed on inventory. The shot that was fired from the gun went through the floor and into the common hallway of the bar, nearly striking PO MILONE. The subject PO MILONE was in pursuit of fled through a separate door leading out the front of the building.

PO LETTEER interviewed the security guard, Aljie WILLIAMS (B/M, 01-16-87) who was guarding the front door at the time of the incident. WILLIAMS stated he conducts pat-downs of patrons for weapons before they enter the tavern. WILLIAMS stated he locks the front door of the establishment to do monitary checks of the bar and opens the door by the use of a buzzer to allow patrons into the establishment. He stated the buzzer is located behind the bar underneath the cash register. WILLIAMS stated he locked the door prior to the incident but doesn't know why the door was locked as officers were attempting to gain entry. When asked, WILLIAMS could not provide a Wisconsin identification card but stated he is registered with the state of Wisconsin as a security guard. WILLIAMS could not provide any form of registration for being a security guard with the state of Wisconsin.

### PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by PO David Lot Tarrent, assigned to District 5, late power shift, tavern squad.

On 01-10-15 at about 8:30 p.m., Sq. 5469 (PO WATTS and PO LETTEER) met with Daria MORSE (b/f 10-02-61) the licensee of The Fox Night Club, located at 421 W. Keefe Ave. We called her and asked if it was ok to meet with her in person and she agreed. We met at her residence, 2855 N. 33rd St., in the city and county of Milwaukee.

Upon arrival, MORSE was there, as well as her son, Jonathan T. MORSE (b/m 06-15-81), who runs the bar in place of his mother who has the license. I explained to Daria that we came to the bar, when we were first assigned to the squad in the beginning of November 2015 and explained then that we wanted to work with the bar regarding any concerns or problems that were happening. I explained we responded to a shots fired (11-15-15) that was associated with the bar and that we spoke to neighbors who had concerns over the noise, the amount of people and those persons making noise outside the bar, in the residential neighborhood and gunshots. I stated that if we could help resolve those problems, we would help and work with the bar.

I then asked Daria if there was a recent citation that was issued for an under age violation and Jonathan stated there was. A minor was in a car, waiting for someone in the bar to be picked up. He stated instead of having the minor sit in the car, he had the minor come into the bar and sit in a far corner, until the person that was to be picked up was ready to go. He stated the police arrived and observed the minor in the bar and cited them for it.

I then asked Daria if she knew what had happened on New Years (01-01-16) at the bar. She stated she knew what happened. I then explained to her the circumstances of the tavern check, finding the b/m standing between the two entrance doors with a clear plastic baggie of marijuana sticking out of his pocket and eventually finding a revolver in his pocket. I then explained that after finding this individual, we attempted to enter the bar, but the door to get into the bar was locked and that it took a patron to open the door for us, the security guard was not there to open the door. I explained to her that once we were in the bar, someone from inside the bar ran to the rear door, entered the common hallway to the basement and upper apartments and attempted to exit the building via the back door. When that person observed a police officer at the back door, the door was locked and that person ran to the upper apartments and fired off one shot from a shot gun, that penetrated the floor and came through the ceiling into the common hallway downstairs, in the area of a police officer.

I stated the concern from New Years was that there was one person standing near the security guard with a loaded gun and marijuana. There was another person in the bar with a shotgun. I also explained that the security guard told me that he is patting people down, but he missed those two people armed with guns. Also the fact that the security guard did not have his id on him that night, or a valid WI Security license, as he stated he had. The security guard also stated he was using a clicker to count occupancy, but when asked if he had the clicker, he could not locate it.

Jonathan stated he and his mother had talked at great length about the bar and that Daria wanted to shut the bar down, but that there was money invested into the bar and that shutting it down may not be an option. Jonathan stated the security guard was a child hood friend and that they gave him a job because of being a friend. He stated on New Years Eve, prior to us coming to the bar, there was a fight in the bar with several females and he felt that he could break the fight up and handle things on his own, without involving the police. He stated he was able to get one half of the people fighting out of the bar, believing that his problems were done.

He went on to tell me that after we (the police) left the bar, regarding the shotgun incident, the security guard was fired and a replacement was being looked in to. I asked him if he was looking at armed or unarmed security. Jonathan stated he was looking at armed security and having two security guards at the door. Jonathan stated the bar has been shut down as of late due to not having a security guard. He is meeting on Wednesday with someone who does security at another bar, in order to see if they can do security at The Fox.

Jonathan stated he believes the people around the bar are doing what ever they can to shut them down and not allow them to run their business. I informed Daria and Jonathan that the community has a legitimate concern, especially with a bar in a residential neighborhood. I informed them that I had spoken to the building owner, Jewell CURRIE via the telephone, about this incident and that CURRIE did not have any knowledge of this incident or any other incidents at the bar. CURRIE sounded surprised while I was speaking to him. CURRIE stated he has a reputation to uphold about being a business owner and building owner and was looking into his options. I also explained that CURRIE has a stake in this as well, regarding his building and his tenants in the upper apartments.

Jonathan stated he knows about the building owner and spoke to him on January 9th, about all of this and all the guy wants is money for rent and is not concerned about anything else regarding the building. I informed Daria that they would need to meet with the building owner and discuss how they are going to have a business relationship. Jonathan stated he would speak with the building owner and come up with an agreement.

While meeting with the two, Daria barely spoke and Jonathan appeared to be the spokesperson for Daria and the bar. I tried to address these concerns with Daria, being the licensee. I also informed her of the citation that I sent her regarding the locked door on New Years. Daria stated she understood the citation, then Jonathan stated he has or security has the door locked so not just anyone can come into the bar. He was concerned for a large group of people coming in, going over occupancy or fear of a crime happening at the bar. With the door locked, this type of stuff can be controlled. We stated that there is a city ordinance about having the door to the bar open during normal business hours so that those who wish to come to the bar can enter, as well as the police if they conduct a check of the tavern.

Jonathan stated he understood where we were coming from and our concerns. I informed him that if he gets armed security, pay for licensed security and inform them to have the front door open, accessible to those who wish to come to the bar. I also informed him to come to the district and speak to us regarding the hiring of new security and a plan of action they will impose to help reduce the neighborhood concerns, as well as the police concerns of the bar. Jonathan asked for our card and stated he would contact us, once he had a plan of action in place regarding the bar and security.

It should be noted this bar has been cited in the past, on 09-26-15 for exceeding occupancy and responsible person on premise. On 09-19-15 citations were issued for liquor license required and for license premise accessible.
