Community-Wide Mental Health Redesign

- ▶ Leadership
- ► Key Community Partnerships
 - Law enforcement, Private hospitals, Community-based Organizations, advocacy groups, Policy makers, Persons with lived experience
- ► Over \$20 million in investments



Investments Over \$20 million

- Crisis Services
- ► Recovery Oriented Services
- ▶ Peer run services
- ▶ Housing



Progress 2011-2015

- ▶ 50% reduction in inpatient admissions
- ▶ 34% reduction in emergency room detentions
- ▶ 24% reduction in emergency room visits
- ▶ 30% reduction in hospital readmissions after 30 days
- ► 84% diversion in emergency room detentions when CART intervenes

Additional Services

- ▶ Q1 2016 number of people served:
 - ► Community Support Program: 1,308
 - ▶ Detoxification: 688
 - ► CCS: 285
 - ► Crisis Case Management: 77



VISION 20/20

- ➤ Vision: National Best-Practice Leader in Behavioral Health
- ► Integrating services
 - ► More nimble to address crisis
 - ► Assessment & referrals
 - Access



Community based Facilities

- ► Northside / Southside "Hubs"
 - ► Community feedback
 - ► Community based locations that promote health and wellness
 - ► Convenient access / "FRONT DOOR"
 - ►MPD outlet



Wraparound Milwaukee

- ► <u>Goal</u>: Help children and families stay together safely in their homes and community by getting them what they need in the right way at the right time
- Creates a team around the child seen weekly or more often
- ► More than 1,200 youth enrolled
 - ▶ Nearly 50% come in through the court system
 - ► No wait list
- Overall juvenile justice recidivism rate was 10.1% during 2014-2015 for youth enrolling in Wraparound within that period
 - ► Recidivism most likely to occur during the first three months
 - Youth with the most serious offenses or otherwise determined high risk through a clinical review have lower recidivism rates than other youth
