Pursuant to sec. 125.12 and 134.65(6) to 134.65(8) of the Wisconsin Statutes, and §§ 68-21, 84-43, 85-3 to 85-5, and 90-12, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Milwaukee, you are hereby commanded to appear on September 6, 2016 at 3:15 p.m. at a hearing before the City's Licenses Committee to be held in Room 301-B, City Hall, 200 East Wells Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin to show cause why the Class "A" Fermented Malt Beverage Retailer, Food Dealer Retail, and Cigarette and Tobacco licenses should not be revoked or suspended. The hearing is being initiated because of the City of Milwaukee's receipt of a signed and sworn complaint filed by Captain Timothy Heier, Commander of the Milwaukee Police Department, District Five. A copy of the above-referenced complaint is attached hereto as well as copies of §§ 68-21, 84-43, 85-3 to 85-5, and 90-12 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, and Chapters 125.12 and 134.65(6) to 134.65(8) of the Wisconsin Statutes.

On September 6, 2016 at 3:15 p.m. you will be given an opportunity to speak on your own behalf, and to respond to and challenge any charges or reasons given by witnesses at the aforementioned hearing in support of a revocation or suspension of your licenses. You may present your own supporting witnesses, under oath, at this hearing, and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses. If you wish to do so, and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney or interpreter of your own choosing to represent you at this hearing.

If you, Varinder Singh, fail to appear in person before the Committee on September 6, 2016 at 3:15 p.m. in Room 301-B, of City Hall, as required by the summons, the Committee will proceed to consider the allegations of the complaint which shall be taken as true. If the Committee determines that the allegations are sufficient and the circumstances warrant, the law permits your licenses be revoked or suspended.

SWORN CHARGES BY CHIEF OF POLICE FOR REVOCATION OF LICENSES

Pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes Section 125.12 and Sections 68-21, 84-43, 85-4 and 90-12 of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances ("MCO"), Chief of Police Edward Flynn, a City of Milwaukee resident and interested party, by Captain Timothy Heier, Commander of Police District 5, City of Milwaukee resident and interested party, being first duly sworn and upon his oath, respectfully charges the following based upon review of official Milwaukee Police Department ("MPD") reports drafted in the ordinary course of business, including those attached as part of this Sworn Charges, review of documents received by MPD District 5 and communication with police, law enforcement, community members and municipal officials:

OWNERSHIP AND EMPLOYEES

- 1. JJ Food & Beer, Inc., by its agent Varinder Singh, (hereinafter, the "Licensee") is the holder of a Class "A" Fermented Malt Beverage Retailer's license, Food Dealer Retail license and Cigarette and Tobacco license for the licensed premises known as All Star Food (a/k/a All Star Foods) located at 3100 N. 27th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The licenses were issued on September 23, 2015.
- 2. Upon information and belief, the building or structure located at 3100 N. 27th Street has been owned by A & W Holding Group LLC, registered agent Wajeeh Shana'a, since

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approximately May 11, 2015. Prior to A & Holding Group LLC, the building or structure located at 3100 N. 27th Street was owned by Ahmad H. Ahmad and Wajeeh Shana'a since approximately September 26, 2000.

3. Upon information and belief, the following licensees have been issued licenses at 3100 N. 27th Street since June 2008:

4. Pursuant to MCO 90-5-1.5, MPD conducted a Crime Prevention Survey on August 20, 2015. Varinder Singh identified himself as the owner and Ali Aldarorah identified himself as the manager. However, Aldarorah answered MPD's questions, including questions about managing the business and public safety efforts. Upon information and belief, Ali Aldarorah has worked at All Star Food since at least 2013 and in a collusive manner. In different occasions, he has stated to MPD that he attended to the store in the owner's absence (see June 12, 2013 incidents below), was the manager (see above), and was the owner (see March 5, 2015 and March 19, 2015 incidents below). The only City of Milwaukee license Aldarorah has been issued is a Class "D" Operator's license issued on November 25, 2014.

TRAFFICKING AND SEXUAL ASSAULT OF A CHILD

- 5. On March 21, 2016, during business hours a 14 year old female "AH" was prostituted in the basement of All Star Food. Investigation revealed that AH met Angela Sweet for the first time that day. Sweet walked with AH from Sweet's residence to nearby All Star Foods. When Sweet and AH entered All Star Food, they walked to the back of the store and talked to a guy known as "LA" (later identified as Layith Sadeq). LA asked AH if she wanted to make some money. After AH stated, "Sure," LA grabbed her hand and escorted her to the basement. When they arrived in the basement, AH pulled her pants down and LA exposed his penis. AH then performed mouth to penis (oral sex) on LA, during which LA told AH she could "make an easy \$300 if he made a call to his uncle." After 2-5 minutes, LA pulled his penis out of AH's mouth and took out a Magnum gold package condom and opened it. After putting the condom on, LA inserted his penis into AH's vagina while she was lying on her back on black crates. AH told MPD that both the condom wrapper and the condom were thrown on the ground by LA near the black crates. After performing penis to vagina sex, LA gave AH a bag of marijuana. A second male, later identified as Jovonta Martin, approached AH, unzipped his pants, pulled his penis out and put it in AH's mouth. After performing penis to mouth sex, AH and LA walked up the stairs. AH observed LA give Sweet \$15. While walking back to Sweet's residence, Sweet told AH, "see how easy it is to make money?" Martin is a previous employee of All Star Food (see March 12, 2015 incident referenced below).
- 6. AH later identified Angela Sweet, "LA" (Layith Sadeq) and Jovonta Martin via a photo array. Angela Sweet has been charged with Trafficking of a Child (2016CF001319). Layith Sadeq (a/k/a "LA") has been charged with Trafficking of a Child, 2nd Degree Sexual Assault of a Child (2 counts) and Child Enticement-Sexual Contact (2016CF001318). Jovonta

Martin has been charged with 2nd Degree Sexual Assault of Child and Exposing Genitals/Public Area/Intimate Parts to a Child (2016CF001317).

- 7. On March 23, 2016, Sadeq messaged AH via Facebook stating, "Hey boo that's L.A [sic] from the store 27th wyd love" and "Txt me boo."
- 8. On March 25, 2016, MPD investigated the basement of All Star Food. There, MPD found a Magnum condom wrapper which was gold with black letters, a used condom and a small piece of condom wrapper consistent with statements made by AH.
- 9. On March 26, 2016, MPD interviewed Layith Sadeq. Sadeq admitted that a family member of his used to own All Star Food. He initially denied having sex with a girl, but admitted he did get "sucked off at the store." He later admitted to paying \$14 for the sexual act, that the "other girl" (Sweet) asked for the money in order for him to have sex with the girl (AH) and that he used a yellow Magnum condom. He stated his nickname is LA. He also admitted that the girl who "sucked his penis sucked JoJo's penis." JoJo was identified as Jovonta Martin. In addition, Sadeq stated there was a guy named "Trell" who worked at the store that night. According to Sadeq, Trell kept telling Sadeq to "hurry up let's go." Sadeq responded by telling Trell to smoke some of his weed from his blunt.

ILLEGAL TOBACCO AND DRUG ACTIVITY

- 10. All Star Food has been the source of congregation for and engagement in illegal tobacco and drug activity in and around the premises. Despite the change in licensees, the same or related actors from All Star Food engaged in or permitted this activity since at least 2013.
- 11. On June 12, 2013, at 10:15 am, MPD and the State of Wisconsin Department of Revenue ("DOR") conducted its *first business check* of All Star Food that day. Ali Aldarorah was the only person on premises and he did not have a valid Class "D" Operators License

although fermented malt beverages were sold at the location, which is in violation of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances. He stated that he was only alone in the store for a short time while the owner went to obtain supplies. He was advised he cannot be alone in the store at any time if the agent/owner is not present because it was a Class "A" establishment. The agent, Ibrahim Amer eventually arrived on scene and indicated he was only away for a short time and that he would be leaving again. MPD advised that the store would need to be closed during that time since Ali Aldarorah did not have a Class "D" Operators License. Ibrahim Amer stated he would comply.

- 12. On June 12, 2013, at 9:55 pm, MPD and DOC conducted its *second business check* of All Star Food that day due to ongoing complaints that All Star Food had been selling single cigarettes. Ali Aldarorah was *again* the only person on premises. He *again* stated he was watching the store while the owner, Ibrahim Amer was gone. DOR checked invoices for tobacco products and confiscated several boxes of tobacco products that were not on any invoices. Ibrahim Amer was cited and convicted of responsible person on premises (MCO 90-8-1) (case #13066790).
- Office of Inspector General, DOR and the City of Milwaukee Department of Neighborhood Services responded to All Star Food due to an ongoing investigation. That investigation involved several undercover operations involving the illegal purchasing and/or selling of WIC checks. Ali Aldarorah was taken into custody for WIC fraud. Belkasim Moftah, who works as the main clerk at the location, was also taken into custody for WIC fraud. DOR confiscated multiple boxes of undocumented tobacco products from within the store for not having proof of invoice or not having invoices specifically addressed to All Star Food. Officers also located a loaded firearm in

the cash register area. Both Ali Aldarorah and Belkasim Moftah were convicted of WIC – Provide Cash for Drafts (felony) (2014CF001477 and 2014CF001476, respectively).

- 14. On March 5, 2015, MPD responded to All Star Food for a subject with gun complaint. Upon arrival, MPD spoke with Ali Aldarorah, who stated he was the owner of All Star Food. He told MPD there were several subjects inside the store selling drugs and had guns on them. MPD reviewed the video surveillance of the subjects in question and located those subjects less than a block east of All Star Food. One of the subjects, Darius Dolenshek, had on his person 6 clear corner cut baggies and 1 large sandwich bag containing a green leafy plantlike substance believed to marijuana. That substance tested positive for the presence of THC and weighed 5.94 grams. Dolenshek was charged with Possession of THC (2015CM000788). As a condition of Dolenshek's bail, he was to have no contact with any store owner or employee at All Star Food. As part of a plea negotiation due a subsequent violation on March 25, 2015, as referenced below, this case was dismissed but read in.
- dealing. According to the caller, Almuntasser Abu-Naaj, he just bought the store and is the new owner of All Star Food. Upon information and belief, Almuntasser Abu-Naaj did not apply for any license affiliated with All Star Food until April 7, 2015 and no licenses were ever granted. Mr. Abu-Naaj also stated he had just fired Jovonta Martin (who was later involved in the trafficking of a child discussed above) after he observed him sell drugs in the middle of All Star Food. Martin responded by telling Abu-Naaj, "I will come back and shoot you." After Abu-Naaj ran inside the front office by the cash register and locked the door due to its bullet proof windows. According to Abu-Naaj, Martin then said, "If the police come in here, I promise you on my son you are dead, we will come back every night until you are dead. We will come burn

down the store with you in it." While Abu-Naaj did not see a gun on Martin during this altercation, he told MPD he has seen Martin with a gun in the past. Jovonta Martin is a felon and may not possess a firearm due to a previous possession with intent- THC (~200 grams) conviction (2010CF004766). While on scene, Abu-Naaj approached MPD and identified Jovonta Martin starting to walk into the front office. MPD observed Martin place a small clear plastic baggie on the counter, which contained a green leafy substance. Martin admitted to MPD it was his marijuana and that he planned on smoking it. MPD confiscated the suspected marijuana, which tested positive for the presence of THC and weigh .57 grams. Jovonta Martin was convicted of both Possession of THC (2nd+ Offense) and Disorderly Conduct (2015CF001125).

- 16. On March 19, 2015, MPD responded to the intersection of 27th Street and Burleigh Street regarding a call for a shot spotter. MPD investigation revealed that a suspect discharged a firearm 6 times while running eastbound on the side walk south of All Star Food. Ali Aldarorah identified himself as the store owner. Aldarorah showed MPD the All Star Food video surveillance, which revealed several males subjects exit All Star Food at the time of the shots fired.
- 17. On March 25, 2015, MPD observed Darius Dolenshek within All Star Food. The MPD officer was aware as a result of the incident described above for March 5, 2015, one of the conditions of Dolenshek's bail was that he had no contact with any All Star Food owner or employee. As a result, Dolenshek was arrested and charged with Bail Jumping-Misdemeanor as a result of the March 5, 2015 charge from the aforementioned incident and Possession of THC. As part of a plea negotiation, the bail jumping was dismissed but read in and he was found guilty of possession of THC (2015CM001373).
 - 18. On April 16, 2015, MPD observed several subjects loitering in front of the "No

Loitering" sign at All Star Food. One of the subjects, Keiwaun Phillips, admitted to MPD that he had marijuana on his person and produced a sandwich-style clear plastic bag containing a green, leafy plant-like substance suspected to be marijuana. The green leafy substance tested positive for the presence of THC and weighed 5.139 grams.

19. On September 11, 2015, MPD arrested a subject for loitering in front of the All Star Food for nearly an hour. The subject, Travontae Scott, was found in possession of 15 clear plastic corner-cut baggies, which contained a green, leafy plant-like substance suspected to be marijuana. The green leafy substance tested positive for the presence of THC and weighed 6.12 grams. Scott was charged with possession of THC. He agreed to a deferred prosecution agreement, which includes completing community service (2015CV003705).

FOOD DEALER LICENSE VIOLATIONS

- 20. All Star Food, operated by its current licensee and past licensees, has a long history of food establishment and health code violations, including, but not limited to, violations related to food safety and storage, pest control, smoking cigarettes in the premises and general sanitation. The repeated nature of the violations, coupled with All Star Foods repeated failure to abate the violations, have necessitated numerous inspections. Because of the aforementioned nuisance activity, including violent and drug-related activity, attendant to All Star Food, the Health Department must employ the assistance of law enforcement in order to safely conduct inspections. This is a considerable drain on both the Health Department's and MPD's resources.
- 21. These repeated violations of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances have resulted in multiple suspensions of the licensee's food dealer license.
- 22. On November 10, 2008, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found five good retail practice violations related to chemicals being stored with

food products, raw meat stored in ice bags, food being stored on the floor, thermometers missing, a broken cooler and food debris on the meat slicer.

- 23. On June 9, 2009, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found one violation related to not having a food handler certification available to provide to the inspector. It also found ten good retail practice violations related to handling meat, food storage, not including a use-by date on food, having a filthy waste container, a broken faucet, not having soap, not protecting bulbs, a dead mouse, personal items where open food is handled and an improper restroom door.
- 24. On March 26, 2010 the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found thirteen good retail practice violations related to food handling, a cigarette butt by the food prep area, improper food storage, sanitation methods, commingling food, not including a use-by date on food, personal medication stored by food, bird feathers by food, mouse droppings on the floor by chest freezer, missing or broken tiles throughout premises and no soap in the employee restroom.
- 25. On February 23, 2011, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found two risk code factor violations related to cross contamination and an improper hold. It also found two good retail practice violations related to an improperly installed sink and sanitation issues.
- 26. On February 29, 2012, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found two risk code factor violations related to cross contamination. It also found three good practice violations related to lighting, rodent droppings and dust and construction debris.
 - 27. On April 16, 2013, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star

Food. It found a risk code factor violation for an improper hood. It also found a good retail practice violation for chipping paint.

- 28. On June 11, 2013, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found two good retail practice violations related to not including a use-by date on food and chipping paint.
- 29. On December 4, 2013, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found eight good retail violations related to cooking equipment, sanitizer solution, a dirty prep sink, dirty coffee pot, no soap in handwashing dispenser, hand drying towels in the dispenser, a dirty mop sink and a dirty handwashing sink.
- 30. On December 19, 2013, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found a good retail violation for one or more owner or employee not attending a training course in robbery prevention.
- 31. On April 8, 2014, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found two good retail violations related to foods and chemical products intermingled and a dirty restroom.
- 32. On April 16, 2014, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found eight good retail violations related to an employee not being aware of the food code, freezer burn, cross-contamination, using a use-by date, unlabeled canned goods, not having thermometers, chlorine content, and debris on the slicer.
- 33. On April 16, 2015, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found five good retail practice violations related to the hand sink in the meat area, no thermometer in food coolers, structural issues, state certification and one or more owner or employee not attending a training course in robbery prevention.

- 34. On April 20, 2015, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found a good retail practice violation related the hand sink in the meat area.
- 35. On May 8, 2014, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found a good retail violation for a dirty restroom.
- 36. On August 3, 2015, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found three good retail violations related to one or more owner or employee not attending a training course in robbery prevention, not having a certified food manager and not having a hand wash sink in the meat area.
- 37. On November 3, 2015, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found eight risk code violations related to cross contamination, improper hold, personal hygiene and unsafe sources. It also found eight good retail practice violations related to thawing procedures, nonworking thermometer, meat cooler being too warm, no test kits for chlorine, structural issues, five dead mice and numerous flies, large amounts of clutter and no hand wash sink in the meat area.
- 38. On November 23, 2015, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found one good retail practice violation for not having a full time employee that is a certified food manager.
- 39. On December 17, 2015, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found one good retail practice violation for not having a hand wash sink in the meat area.
- 40. On April 8, 2016, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found over twenty good retail violations related to not posting the state certificate for the certified food manager, the employees' lack of knowledge regarding food safety, pest control

and general sanitation, lack of sanitation, eigarettes butts in the service area, dusty food shelves, meat on the floor freezer, dirty prep sink, dirty deli slicer, hazardous foods not stored in the proper temperate, food not being deli marked, the operation of the cooler, no hand soap, paper towels or handwashing sign and a dirty toilet in the basement bathroom, mouse droppings in the service area, hazardous materials by the deli slicer, an unlicensed scale and structural issues. Based on the lack of sanitation, many critical and health code violations and rodent droppings throughout the store, the Health Department issued an Order to Suspend.

- 41. On April 12, 2016, the City of Milwaukee Health Department permitted All Star Food to reopen. During the inspection, additional mouse droppings were located and the licensee was ordered to provide effective pest control methods to eliminate pests.
- 42. On April 27, 2016, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found eight good retail practice violations related to the employees' lack of knowledge regarding food safety, lack of sanitation, food safety and other violations present, cigarette butts throughout the store, a dirty prep sink and deli slicer, improper dish washing, cooking food without a hood, a condenser leak, violations in the basement bathroom and mouse droppings throughout the store. Based on the mouse droppings throughout the store, the Health Department issued an Order to Suspend.
- 43. On April 29, 2016, the City of Milwaukee Health Department permitted All Star Food to reopen.
- 44. On May 12, 2016, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found five good retail practice violations related to the employees' lack of knowledge regarding food safety, lack of sanitation, food safety and other violations present, a condenser leak, the basement bathroom and mouse droppings throughout the store.

- 45. On July 6, 2016, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found a good retail practice violation related to mouse droppings throughout the store. Based on the mouse droppings throughout the store, the Health Department issued an Order to Suspend.
- 46. On July 27, 2016, the City of Milwaukee Health Department inspected All Star Food. It found a good retail practice violation for mouse droppings throughout the store. As a result of the inspection, the Health Department issued an Order to Suspend.
- 47. On August 1, 2016, the City of Milwaukee Health Department permitted All Star Food to reopen.

CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR

- 48. All Star Food has received a disproportionate amount of responses for police services that have reduced the amount of resources that may be dedicated to other police-related activity in District #5. As of the filing of the complaint, MPD has responded to at least 359 calls for police service since January 1, 2014 at All Star Food, including 73 calls for service in 2014, 206 calls for service in 2015 and at least 80 calls for service in 2016 as of the date of this filing. These totals do not include traffic stops or calls for service pinned to addresses other than 3100 N. 27th Street even though MPD responded to the area for activity associated with All Star Food.
- 49. Of those 359 calls for police service since January 1, 2014, many of the calls are related to loitering and drug activity in and around All Star Food, as well as business checks with the Health Department.
- 50. On July 10, 2016, around 10:00 pm, MPD responded to the premises for a shots fired complaint.
 - 51. On August 23, 2016, around 9:20 am, MPD responded to All Star Food for a

shooting inside All Star Food, in which an employee was shot. According to the employee/victim, two male suspects entered the store, looked around and proceeded to shoot at him multiple times striking him once in the hip. The employee/victim informed MPD that the suspects never made any demands. Investigation revealed the actors fired approximately 5 shots inside the store and another 5-6 shots while leaving the store. The employee/victim was armed at the time and returned fired prior to the suspects fleeing the scene. According to a co-worker, Haver Hickes, he and the employee/victim opened the store around 7:15 am that day. Hickes stated he and the employee/victim would check the store every morning for mouse droppings in response to the Health Department investigations. That morning, after checking the store, Hickes told MPD he went down the street *in order to purchase marijuana*, leaving the employee/victim alone in the store. While away, the shooting occurred.

52. All Star Food has been continuously used as a source of congregation for drug activity, loitering, fights, and shots fired necessitating an excessive amount of police resources.

- 54. All Star Food is a building or structure used to facilitate the delivery, distribution or manufacture of a controlled substance, via the Licensee and his agents, and is a location where those acts take place; therefore, it is a public nuisance.
- 55. All Star Food has had a substantial adverse effect upon the health, safety or convenience and prosperity of the immediate neighborhood.
- 56. The ongoing nuisance activity has causally and substantially impacted the premises and immediate neighborhood surrounding All Star Food, and the premises; therefore, is an unfit location for a future Class "A" Fermented Malt Beverage Retailer's license and Food Dealer Retail license to be issued at the premise.

BASED UPON the March 21, 2016 trafficking and sexual assault of a child, repeated drug activity associated with All Star Food, repeated violations of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances and Wisconsin Administrative Code regarding food license regulations and health provisions necessitating police support, firearm-related activity, excessive calls for service, repeated violations of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances regarding nuisance activity at All Star Food and the collusive operation of All Star Food by Ali Aldarorah and other individuals not licensed with the City of Milwaukee, which has cumulatively had a substantial adverse effect upon the health, safety or convenience and prosperity of the immediate neighborhood;

THE CHIEF OF POLICE, by his designee, respectfully requests the immediate revocation of the Class "A" Fermented Malt Beverage Retailer's license, Food Dealer Retail license and Cigarette and Tobacco license relative to the above-referenced Licensee and licensed premise, All Star Food, because:

- 1. Pursuant to MCO 68-21-9-c, the Licensee or any employee of the food establishment has violated multiple ordinances and state code related to food operation premises as adopted by MCO 68-3;
- 2. Pursuant to MCO 68-21-9-g, MCO 68-21-9-k and MCO 85-4-4-c, MPD is an interested party that alleges the operation of All Star Food has contributed to and been the source of congregation of persons which have resulted in one of more of the following: disturbance of the peace, illegal drug activity, prostitution, loitering and lewd conduct;
- 3. Pursuant to MCO 69-21-11-b, this written complaint seeks revocation based on reasons unrelated to unsanitary conditions;
 - 4. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. Sec. 125.12(2)(ag)1., the Licensee has violated Ch. 823,

Wis. Stats. and municipal regulations;

5. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. Sec. 125.12(2)(ag)2., the Licensee keeps or maintains a



These areas are put together by using criminal statistics and mapping out the areas where there are high volume of violent crimes i.e. shootings, shots fired, robberies and drug complaints. During roll call we are given briefs, updates, deployment areas and times to be in certain areas. We are also assigned to a team. Each team is responsible for certain areas in a particular District. We were assigned to Team 2, District 5. During this stop, we were assigned in the area of N. 25th St. to N. 30th St. and W. Townsend Ave. to W. Locust Ave. in the City and County of Milwaukee.

FIELD INTERVIEW OF SCOTT

At around 6:50pm, P.O. Orlando and I conducted a F/I stop on a black male subject, later on identified as Travontae D. Scott (M/B, 10-6-94) for loitering by the corner store of 3100 N 27th Street. P.O. Orlando was the contact officer and I was the cover officer. As P.O. Orlando was talking with Scott, I observed that Scott had a thousand yard stare and his body was in a tense position. Scott was then placed in handcuffs.

SEARCH OF SCOTT

I then conducted a search on Scott and noticed a hard object about the size of my palm by his waistband. In fear that it was a weapon, I lifted up his sweatshirt and observed a prescription bottle held in place by his waistband. I then removed the prescription bottle and observed that there were several plastic corner cut baggies that had green leafy plant like material in it, suspected to be marijuana. The suspected marijuana was later on conveyed to District 5 for processing. Squad 763 conveyed Scott to District 5 for processing.

INTERVIEW OF SCOTT

At District 5, I assisted with the booking process. I asked Scott if he would be willing to answer any questions regarding his arrest, he replied "yes." Scott was placed in the interview room at District 5.

This interview was audio/video recorded by the MediaSolv system. Before the interview began, I asked Scott if he was under any influence of alcohol/drugs. Scott stated he smoked marijuana two hours ago. Scott did not need any medical attention. I asked Scott if he believes he could answer questions intelligently, Scott replied "yes." I asked Scott if he was given any threats or promises to talk to me, Scott replied "no." Scott completed 11th grade in high school.

I gave Scott a copy of his Miranda rights and requested that he read them as I read them out loud. Scott stated he understood his rights and was willing to answer questions without a lawyer present. This report is just a summary of the interview. The following is a synopsis of his statement:

Scott first answer the questions form the PA-45A form. Scott was walking around the corner store at 3100 N 27th Street. Scott would hang out in front of the store and then walking around. Before the police stopped Scott, a black female came up to him requesting for a lighter. Scott was then stopped by the police for loitering. Scott knew that he was loitering and decided not to talk to the police. Scott just stood there and stands still because that is the way he always stands. The police found weed in a prescription bottle that Scott found earlier today. The bottle was in his drawers, which was sticking outside his shorts, above his belly button area. Scott purchased that weed for 80 dollars by the W. Vliet Ave. and N. 25th Street. Scott planned on smoking the marijuana and had 11 dollars left. He was going to purchase 2 bus tickets and some blunts with the rest of his money, then go home and smoke the rest of the day. Scott is a recreational marijuana smoker and smoke about an ounce a week and about 4 marijuana blunts a day. Scott was arrested for marijuana when he was 19 but did not get any charges for it. This concluded the interview. Scott was then returned to his cell.

TEST OF MARIJUANA/INVENTORY

I then tested the suspected marijuana. I submitted a sample of the suspected marijuana to the Nark II 05 field test. The result was positive for THC, which is the active ingredient for marijuana. There were 15 bags of marijuana in the prescription bottle for a total weight of 6.12g. This was inventoried with MPD, inv# 15032594, item 1. The prescription bottle was inventoried with MPD, inv# 15032595, item 1. I am a certified instructor of the Nark II field tests.

On Wednesday, April 9th, 2014, officers from the Milwaukee Police Department's Fifth District, license investigation unit, agent Alan Sheil from the State of Wisconsin Department of Health Services — Office of Inspector General, agents from the WI Department of Revenue Alcohol & Tobacco Enforcement unit, Department of Neighborhood Services and the Milwaukee County District Attorney's office conducted a multi agency operation within the City of Milwaukee, Police District Five boundaries.

Prior to today's operation, The Department of Health Services-Office of Inspector General, which monitors the WIC program in Wisconsin, conducted several undercover operations at two businesses, All Start Foods; which is located at 3100 N. 27th St., and Chuck's Mini Mart; which is located at 3416 N. Teutonia Ave. During the undercover operations, it was found that owners at both of the listed businesses have been purchasing and/or selling WIC checks illegally.

Alan Sheil is the Compliance Manager for DHS-OIG and had worked with Milwaukee ADA David Feiss to obtain search and arrest warrants for Chuck's Mini Mart, as well as two arrest warrants for persons associated with All Star Foods.

The Alcohol & Tobacco Enforcement Unit had previously investigated each business at least once in the past two years and each time tobacco products have been confiscated because they were purchased from an untaxed/unauthorized source.

Officers and agents responding to All Star Foods, 3100 N. 27th St. did locate and arrest two persons upon arrival to the location. Ali Y. Aldarorah W/M 02/26/87 was taken into custody for two felony counts of WIC – provide cash for drafts. Aldarorah is the main operator of the store at that location. Belkasim Moftah, who works as the main clerk at the location, was also taken into custody. He is charged with four felony counts of WIC – provide cash for drafts. Agents Erin Dorn and Mario Altuzar from the WI Department of Revenue Alcohol & Tobacco Enforcement unit confiscated multiple boxes of undocumented tobacco products from within the store. These items were confiscated for either not having proof of invoice or not having invoices specifically addressed to the store, All Star Food & Beer LLC. It should also be noted that officers at the location did locate a loaded firearm in the cash register area, which is blocked off to customers.

Department of Neighborhood Services Special Enforcement unit agents Jason Rusnak and Kim Lyons responded to both listed locations and wrote their respective interior and exterior orders for the locations.

As a result of this operation, persons at each respective business that were licensed to accept WIC products have been removed from the program until each case can be reviewed.



On Friday, March 25, 2016, at 7:30pm, Detective Steve Wells met Police Officer Christina Rutherford at the address of 3100 N. 27th Street regarding this incident. This address was the scene of a second degree sexual assault and trafficking of a child incident. One of the workers of the store was party to a crime of trafficking of a child and committed two counts of 2nd degree sexual assault of a child.


Detective Steve Wells processed this scene for any potential evidence. Once there Detective Steve Wells spoke to the store clerk, Kuldeeb Singh I/M 02-08-77. Detective Steve Wells explained to Kuldeeb that police were investigating an incident which occurred in the basement of this business. Detective Steve Wells told him that he wanted to search the basement of this business with his permission. He granted Detective Steve Wells permission and signed Consent to Search Form.


The scene of this incident 3100 N. 27th Street is a corner store with the name All Star Liquor. The building sits on the corner of 27th and Auer Ave. The entrance door to this store sits on an angle on the south east side of the store. After entering the store there is a cashier counter on the left. This cashier counter is enclosed in glass. In the rear of the store is a deli counter. Behind this deli counter in the back south east corner is a wooden stairwell leading to the basement.

The basement is where the victim states she was assaulted. This basement is very unkempt with dirt and trash everywhere. As you walk through the basement there is an open area at the opposite end. In the open area Detective Steve Wells found evidence consistent with the trafficking of a child and sexual assault investigation. 





- (7) MUNICIPALITY PROVIDING IDENTIFICATION SCANNERS. No municipality may provide, to any retail licensee under this chapter, any device capable of scanning an official identification card, as defined in s. 125.085 (1) (a) and (b).

- **125.10** Municipal regulation. (1) AUTHORIZATION. Any municipality may enact regulations incorporating any part of this chapter and may prescribe additional regulations for the sale of alcohol beverages, not in conflict with this chapter. The municipality may prescribe forfeitures or license suspension or revocation for violations of any such regulations. Regulations providing forfeitures or license suspension or revocation must be adopted by ordinance. Any municipality may, by ordinance, regulate contests, competitions, or other events for the exhibition, demonstration, judging, tasting, or sampling of homemade wine or fermented malt beverages.
- (2) REGULATION OF UNDERAGE PERSONS. A municipality or a county may enact an ordinance regulating conduct regulated by s. 125.07 (1) or (4) (a), (b) or (bm), 125.085 (3) (b) or 125.09 (2) only if it strictly conforms to the statutory subsection. A county ordinance enacted under this subsection does not apply within any municipality that has enacted or enacts an ordinance under this subsection.
- (3) ZONING. Except as provided in s. 125.68, this chapter does not affect the power of municipalities to enact or enforce zoning regulations.
- (4) REGULATION OF CLOSED RETAIL PREMISES. A municipality may not prohibit the permittee, licensee, employees, salespersons, employees of wholesalers issued a permit under s. 125.28 (1) or 125.54 (1); employees of permittees under s. 125.295 with respect to the permittee's own retail premises; or service personnel from being present on premises operated under a Class "A", "Class A" or "Class C" license or under a Class "B" or "Class B" license or permit during hours when the premises are not open for business if those persons are performing job—related activities.
- (5) FERMENTED MALT BEVERAGES ON COMMERCIAL QUADRICYCLES. (a) A municipality may, by ordinance, prohibit the consumption of fermented malt beverages by passengers on a commercial quadricycle within the municipality.
- (b) Notwithstanding sub. (1), an ordinance enacted before January 1, 2014, regulating the possession or consumption of open containers of alcohol beverages in public places may not prohibit the possession or consumption of alcohol beverages by passengers on a commercial quadricycle. An ordinance that is inconsistent with this paragraph may not be enforced.

Chapter 125 contemplates and expressly directs that regulation is to supersede competition in the retail sale of alcohol beverages. Private parties are eligible for antitrust immunity when they act in concert, in an anticompetitive manner, in direct response to pressure bordering on compulsion from a municipality. Eichenseer v. - (2) This section does not apply to civil forfeiture actions for violation of any provision of this chapter or any local ordinance in conformity with any provision of this chapter.

- 125.12 Revocations, suspensions, refusals to issue or renew. (1) REVOCATION, SUSPENSION, NONISSUANCE OR NONRENEWAL OF LICENSE. (a) Except as provided in this subsection, any municipality or the department may revoke, suspend or refuse to renew any license or permit under this chapter, as provided in this section.
- (b) 1. In this paragraph, "violation" means a violation of s. 125.07 (1) (a), or a local ordinance that strictly conforms to s. 125.07 (1) (a).
- 2. No violation may be considered under this section or s. 125.04 (5) (a) 1. unless the licensee or permittee has committed another violation within one year preceding the violation. If a licensee or permittee has committed 2 or more violations within one year, all violations committed within one year of a previous violation may be considered under this section or s. 125.04 (5) (a)
- (c) Neither a municipality nor the department may consider an arrest or conviction for a violation punishable under s. 101.123 (8) (d), 945.03 (2m), 945.04 (2m), or 945.05 (1m) in any action to revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew a Class "B" or "Class B" license or permit.
- (2) REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF LICENSES BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES. (ag) Complaint. Any resident of a municipality issuing licenses under this chapter may file a sworn written complaint with the clerk of the municipality alleging one or more of the following about a person holding a license issued under this chapter by the municipality:
- 1. The person has violated this chapter or municipal regulations adopted under s. 125.10.
- The person keeps or maintains a disorderly or riotous, indecent or improper house.
- The person has sold or given away alcohol beverages to known habitual drunkards.
- 4. The person does not possess the qualifications required under this chapter to hold the license.
- 5. The person has been convicted of manufacturing, distributing or delivering a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under s. 961.41 (1); of possessing, with intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under s. 961.41 (1m); or of possessing, with intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, or of manufacturing, distributing or delivering a controlled substance or controlled substance

analog under a substantially similar federal law or a substantially similar law of another state.

- 5m. The person has been convicted of possessing any of the materials listed in s. 961.65 with intent to manufacture methamphetamine under that subsection or under a federal law or a law of another state that is substantially similar to s. 961.65.
- 6. The person knowingly allows another person, who is on the premises for which the license under this chapter is issued, to possess, with the intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, or to manufacture, distribute or deliver a controlled substance or controlled substance analog.
- 6m. The person knowingly allows another person, who is on the premises for which the license under this chapter is issued, to possess any of the materials listed in s. 961.65 with the intent to manufacture methamphetamine.
- 7. The person received the benefit from an act prohibited under s. 125.33 (11).
- (ar) Summons. Upon the filing of the complaint, the municipal governing body or a duly authorized committee of a city council shall issue a summons, signed by the clerk and directed to any peace officer in the municipality. The summons shall command the licensee complained of to appear before the municipal governing body or the committee on a day and place named in the summons, not less than 3 days and not more than 10 days from the date of issuance, and show cause why his or her license should not be revoked or suspended. The summons and a copy of the complaint shall be served on the licensee at least 3 days before the time at which the licensee is commanded to appear. Service shall be in the manner provided under ch. 801 for service in civil actions in circuit court.
- (b) Procedure on hearing. 1. If the licensee does not appear as required by the summons, the allegations of the complaint shall be taken as true and if the municipal governing body or the committee finds the allegations sufficient, the license shall be revoked. The clerk shall give notice of the revocation to the person whose license is revoked.
- 2. If the licensee appears as required by the summons and denies the complaint, both the complainant and the licensee may produce witnesses, cross-examine witnesses and be represented by counsel. The licensee shall be provided a written transcript of the hearing at his or her expense. If the hearing is held before the municipal governing body and the complaint is found to be true, the license shall either be suspended for not less than 10 days nor more than 90 days or revoked, except that, if a complaint under par. (ag) 4. is found to be true with respect to a license issued under s. 125.51 (4) (v), the license shall be revoked.
- 3. If the hearing is held before a committee of a city council, the committee shall submit a report to the city council, including findings of fact, conclusions of law and a recommendation as to what action, if any, the city council should take with respect to the license. The committee shall provide the complainant and the licensee with a copy of the report. Either the complainant or the licensee may file an objection to the report and shall have the opportunity to present arguments supporting the objection to the city council. The city council shall determine whether the arguments shall be presented orally or in writing or both. If the city council, after considering the committee's report and any arguments presented by the complainant or the licensee, finds the complaint to be true, or if there is no objection to a report recommending suspension or revocation, the license shall be suspended or revoked as provided under subd. 2.
- The municipal clerk shall give notice of each suspension or revocation to the person whose license is suspended or revoked.
- 5. If the municipal governing body finds the complaint untrue, the proceeding shall be dismissed without cost to the accused. If the municipal governing body finds the complaint to be malicious and without probable cause, the costs shall be paid by the complainant. The municipal governing body or the com-

- mittee may require the complainant to provide security for such costs before issuing the summons under par. (ar).
- (c) Effect of revocation. When a license is revoked under this subsection, the revocation shall be recorded by the clerk and no other license issued under this chapter may be granted within 12 months of the date of revocation to the person whose license was revoked. No part of the fee paid for any license so revoked may be refunded.
- (d) Judicial review. The action of any municipal governing body in granting or failing to grant, suspending or revoking any license, or the failure of any municipal governing body to revoke or suspend any license for good cause, may be reviewed by the circuit court for the county in which the application for the license was issued, upon application by any applicant, licensee or resident of the municipality. The procedure on review shall be the same as in civil actions instituted in the circuit court. The person desiring review shall file pleadings, which shall be served on the municipal governing body in the manner provided in ch. 801 for service in civil actions and a copy of the pleadings shall be served on the applicant or licensee. The municipal governing body, applicant or licensee shall have 20 days to file an answer to the complaint. Following filing of the answer, the matter shall be deemed at issue and hearing may be had within 5 days, upon due notice served upon the opposing party. The hearing shall be before the court without a jury. Subpoenas for witnesses may be issued and their attendance compelled. The decision of the court shall be filed within 10 days after the hearing and a copy of the decision shall be transmitted to each of the parties. The decision shall be binding unless it is appealed to the court of appeals.
- (3) REFUSALS BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO RENEW LICENSES. A municipality issuing licenses under this chapter may refuse to renew a license for the causes provided in sub. (2) (ag). Prior to the time for the renewal of the license, the municipal governing body or a duly authorized committee of a city council shall notify the licensee in writing of the municipality's intention not to renew the license and provide the licensee with an opportunity for a hearing. The notice shall state the reasons for the intended action. The hearing shall be conducted as provided in sub. (2) (b) and judicial review shall be as provided in sub. (2) (d). If the hearing is held before a committee of a city council, the committee shall make a report and recommendation as provided under sub. (2) (b) 3. and the city council shall follow the procedure specified under that subdivision in making its determination.
- (3m) REFUSALS BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO ISSUE LICENSES. If a municipal governing body or duly authorized committee of a city council decides not to issue a new license under this chapter, it shall notify the applicant for the new license of the decision not to issue the license. The notice shall be in writing and state the reasons for the decision.
- (4) SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF LICENSES ON COMPLAINT OF THE DEPARTMENT, (ag) Complaint. A duly authorized employee of the department may file a complaint with the clerk of circuit court for the jurisdiction in which the premises of a person holding a license issued under this chapter is situated, alleging one or more of the following about a licensee:
 - 1. That the licensee has violated this chapter.
- That the licensee keeps or maintains a disorderly or riotous, indecent or improper house.
- That the licensee has sold alcohol beverages to known habitual drunkards.
- 4. That the licensee has failed to maintain the premises in accordance with the standards of sanitation prescribed by the department of health services.
- 5. That the licensee has permitted known criminals or prostitutes to loiter on the licensed premises.
- That the licensee does not possess the qualifications required under this chapter to hold the license.

7. That the licensee has been convicted of manufacturing, distributing or delivering a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under s. 961.41 (1); of possessing, with intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under s. 961.41 (1m); or of possessing, with intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, or of manufacturing, distributing or delivering a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under a substantially similar federal law or a substantially similar law of another state.

7m. That the licensee has been convicted of possessing any of the materials listed in s. 961.65 with intent to manufacture methamphetamine under that section or under a federal law or a law of another state that is substantially similar to s. 961.65.

8. That the licensee knowingly allows another person, who is on the premises for which the license under this chapter is issued, to possess, with the intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, or to manufacture, distribute or deliver a controlled substance or controlled substance analog.

8m. That the licensee knowingly allows another person, who is on the premises for which the license under this chapter is issued, to possess any of the materials listed in s. 961.65 with the intent to manufacture methamphetamine.

- (ar) Summons. Upon the filing of the complaint, the clerk of the court shall issue a summons commanding the licensee to appear before the court not less than 20 days from its date of issuance and show cause why his or her license should not be revoked or suspended. The summons and a copy of the complaint shall be served at least 20 days before the date on which the person is commanded to appear. Service shall be in the manner provided in ch. 801 for civil actions in circuit court.
- (b) Procedure on hearing. If the licensee does not appear as required by the summons, the allegations of the complaint shall be taken as true and if the court finds the allegations sufficient, it shall order the license either suspended for not more than 90 days or revoked, except that, for allegations under par. (ag) 6. with respect to a license issued under s. 125.51 (4) (v), it shall order the license revoked. The clerk of the court shall give notice of the suspension or revocation to the person whose license is suspended or revoked. If the licensee appears and answers the complaint, the court shall fix a date for the hearing not more than 30 days after the return date of the summons. The hearing shall be had before the court without a jury. If upon the hearing the court finds the allegations of the complaint to be true, it shall order the license either suspended for not more than 90 days or revoked, except that, if upon the hearing the court finds allegations under par. (ag) 6. to be true with respect to a license issued under s. 125.51 (4) (v), the court shall order that license revoked. If the court finds the allegations of the complaint to be untrue, the complaint shall be dismissed.
- (c) Effect of revocation or suspension. When a license is revoked or suspended under this subsection, the clerk of court shall notify the authority which issued the license. If the license is revoked, no other license may be issued under this chapter to the person whose license was revoked or to any person related to him or her as owner, lessor, bailor or lender, within the 12 months after the date of revocation and no other license may be granted for the premises covered by the revoked license within 60 days of the date of revocation. The findings and order of the court shall be filed within 10 days after the hearing and the order shall be final unless appeal is taken to the court of appeals. If an appeal is taken from a revocation, any period during which the order is stayed shall be added to the 12 months and 60 days, respectively. No part of the fee paid for any license which is revoked may be refunded. Whenever any court has revoked or suspended any license under this subsection, no further proceedings shall be commenced under this subsection except upon grounds arising after the original revocation or suspension.
- (5) REVOCATIONS OR SUSPENSIONS OF, OR REFUSALS TO RENEW, PERMITS BY THE DEPARTMENT. The department may, after notice and an opportunity for hearing, revoke, suspend or refuse to renew

- any retail permit issued by it for the causes provided in sub. (4) and any other permit issued by it under this chapter for any violation of this chapter or ch. 139, except that, for a violation of sub. (4) (ag) 6. with respect to a license issued under s. 125.51 (4) (v) or a violation of s. 125.535 or 139.035, the department shall revoke the license or permit. A revocation, suspension or refusal to renew is a contested case under ch. 227.
- (6) REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR WHOLESALERS' PERMITS FOR CERTAIN VIOLATIONS. (a) Any person may file a sworn written complaint with the department alleging that an intoxicating liquor wholesaler has violated s. 125.54 (7) (a). The complaint shall identify the specific legal basis for the complaint and sufficient facts for the department to determine whether there is cause to find that a violation has occurred. The department shall provide a copy of the complaint to any wholesaler against whom allegations are made, along with notice of the time period under par. (b) to show cause why the wholesaler's permit should not be revoked or suspended or to request a hearing.
- (b) Within 30 days of receiving a copy of the complaint under par. (a), any wholesaler against whom allegations are made may file a sworn written response or a written request for an evidentiary hearing before the department under s. 227.44.
- (c) Subject to pars. (d) 1. and (dm), if no request for an evidentiary hearing is made under par. (b), within 60 days of receiving any response under par. (b) or, if no response is made, within 60 days of the date on which a response or request for hearing is due under par. (b), the department shall make a written decision as to whether a violation has occurred and either dismiss the complaint or take action under par. (e). Any decision under this paragraph shall include findings of fact and conclusions of law and shall state all reasons for the decision. The department shall provide a copy of the decision to the complainant and to any wholesaler against whom allegations are made.
- (cm) Subject to pars. (d) 2. and (dm), if a request for an evidentiary hearing is made under par. (b), the hearing shall be conducted in the manner specified for a contested case under ss. 227.44 to 227.50, except that the hearing shall be conducted within 45 days of receiving the request for hearing under par. (b) and the department shall make its written decision, including whether a violation has occurred and whether the complaint is dismissed or action is taken under par. (e), within 15 days after the hearing. In addition to service of the decision as provided under s. 227.48, the department shall provide a copy of the decision to the complainant.
- (d) 1. If no request for an evidentiary hearing is made under par. (b), within 60 days of receiving any response under par. (b) or, if no response is made, within 60 days of the date on which a response or request for hearing is due under par. (b), the department may extend the time period for making a decision under par. (c) by an additional 60 days if the department provides notice within the time period specified in par. (c) that an additional 60 days is necessary for investigation.
- 2. If a request for an evidentiary hearing is made under par. (b), within 45 days of receiving the request for hearing under par. (b), the department may extend the time period for conducting the hearing by an additional 45 days if the department provides notice within 45 days of receiving the request for hearing under par. (b) that an additional 45 days is necessary for investigation.
- (dm) Within 45 days of receiving any response or request for hearing under par. (b) or, if no response or request for hearing is made, within 45 days of the date on which a response or request for hearing is due under par. (b), the department may elect to file a complaint in circuit court under sub. (4) that includes all allegations of the complaint under par. (a) for which the department determines there is cause to find that a violation of s. 125.54 (7) (a) has occurred. If the department files a complaint in circuit court as provided under this paragraph, the department shall not conduct a hearing under par. (cm) or make a written decision

under par. (c), but shall proceed with the matter as provided under sub. (4).

- (e) If the department finds the allegations under par. (a) true and sufficient, the department shall either suspend for not less than 10 days nor more than 90 days or revoke the wholesaler's permit, and give notice of the suspension or revocation to the wholesaler.
- (f) A revocation or suspension proceeding under this subsection is a contested case under ch. 227, except that ss. 227.44 to 227.50 apply to a proceeding under this subsection only if a request for an evidentiary hearing is made under par. (b).

Due process and equal protection rights of licensees are discussed. Tavern League of Wisconsin v. City of Madison, 131 Wis. 2d 477, 389 N. W.2d 54 (Ct. App. 1986). A license never should have been issued when a notice of application had not been

published as required under s. 125.04 (3) (g), and a license issued without publication is void under s. 125.04 (2). Selling liquor under a void license constitutes a violation of s. 125.66 (1). Under s. 125.12, a renewal licensee, if refused, is guaranteed a right to be heard by the municipality, and the municipality must show cause for refusal, but a new licensee, if refused, has no such guarantee. When an original license is void, the applicant is a new licensee. Williams v. City of Lake Geneva, 2002 WI App 95, 253 Wis. 2d 618, 643 N.W.2d 864, 01–1733.

Notices sent by the city did not violate the requirement in sub. (3) that the "council Notices sent by the city due not violate the requirement in sub. (3) that the council shall notify the licensee in writing of the municipality's intention not to renew the license" because they stated that "there is a possibility that your application may be denied." As the matter cannot be affirmatively decided before the hearing, it is of course only a possibility that the applicant's license will not be renewed at the time the notice is sent. Questions, Inc. v. City of Milwaukee, 2011 WI App 126, 336 Wis. 2d 654, 807 N.W.2d 131, 10-0707.

A town must renew a license, if the proper application is made and the fees are particulated in the procedure and

unless it revokes, suspends, or non-renews the license, following the procedures outlined in this section. Section 125.10 (1) does not give towns the authority to unilaterally modify the described premises in an individual license upon renewal of that license. A town must either pass a regulation or an ordinance under s. 125.10 or it must find grounds for revocation or nonrenewal under this section. Wisconsin Dolls, LLC v. Town of Dell Prairie, 2012 Wt 76, 342 Wis. 2d 350, 815 N.W.2d 690, 10-2900.

Acting upon a citizen complaint to revoke a liquor license that was not sworn, as required under sub. (2) (ag), constituted a fundamental error that deprived the licensing committee of jurisdiction over the matter. Park 6 LLC v. City of Racine, 2012 WI App 123, 344 Wis. 24 661, 824 N.W.24 903, 11–2282.

Certiorari is the correct standard of review for a court to apply when, pursuant to

sub. (2) (d), it reviews a municipal decision not to renew an alcohol license. Nowell v. City of Wausau, 2013 Wt 88, 351 Wis. 2d 1, 838 N.W.2d 852, 11–1045. Sub. (2) (a) 2.'s prohibition of operating a disorderly house was not unconstitution-

- ally vague as applied in this case. The statute's legislative purpose concerns the health and safety of the public and its enforcement is aimed at public health. There was no doubt that the conduct cited in this case was disorderly, riotous, indecent, or improper. Such behavior falls squarely within the ambit of the statute, particularly given the public health and safety concerns involved. Scott Hegwood v. City of Eau Claire, 679 F.3d 600 (2012).
- 125.13 Report of suspension, revocation or imposition of penalty. Whenever a municipal governing body or court revokes or suspends a license or permit or imposes a penalty on a licensee or permittee for the violation of this chapter, the clerk of the municipality or court revoking or suspending the license or imposing the penalty shall, within 10 days after the revocation, suspension or imposition of penalty, mail a report to the department at Madison, Wisconsin, giving the name of the licensee, the address of the licensed premises and a full description of the penaity imposed.

- 125.14 Enforcement provisions. (1) ARREST. Subject to s. 175.38, any peace officer may arrest without warrant any person committing in his or her presence a violation of this chapter or ch. 139 and may, without a search warrant, seize any personal property used in connection with the violation.
- (2) CONFISCATION; DISPOSAL. (a) Contraband. All alcohol beverages owned, possessed, kept, stored, manufactured, sold, distributed or transported in violation of this chapter or ch. 139 and all personal property used in connection therewith is unlawful property and may be seized by any peace officer. Any peace officer confiscating personal property under this section may proceed under this section.
- (c) Identification. Any person seizing alcohol beverages or personal property and electing to dispose of it under this subsection shall exercise reasonable diligence to ascertain the name and

- address of the owner of the alcohol beverages or property and of all persons holding a security interest in the property seized. The person shall report his or her findings in writing to the department.
- (d) Order. Upon conviction of any person for owning, possessing, keeping, storing, manufacturing, selling, distributing or transporting alcohol beverages in violation of this chapter or ch. 139, the court shall order part or all of the alcohol beverages or personal property seized to be destroyed if it is unfit for sale. Alcohol beverages and other personal property fit for sale shall be turned over to the department for disposition. Upon receipt of the confiscated property, the department shall exercise reasonable diligence to ascertain the names and addresses of all owners of the property and of all persons holding a security interest in the property. If a motor vehicle is confiscated, the department shall obtain the written advice of the department of transportation as to the ownership of the motor vehicle and shall make a reasonable search for perfected security interests in the vehicle.
- (e) Disposal. The department shall dispose of the alcohol beverages turned over to it by the court by either giving it to law enforcement agencies free of charge for use in criminal investigations, selling it to the highest bidder if the bidder is a person holding a license or permit issued under this chapter, or destroying it, at the discretion of the department. If the department elects to sell the alcohol beverages, it shall publish a class 2 notice under ch. 985 asking for sealed bids from qualified bidders. Any items or groups of items in the inventory subject to a security interest, the existence of which was established in the proceedings for conviction as being bona fide and as having been created without the secured party having notice that the items were being used or were to be used in connection with the violation, shall be sold separately. The net proceeds from the sale, less all costs of seizure, storage, and sale, shall be turned over to the secretary of administration and credited to the common school fund.
- (f) Sale. Any personal property, other than alcohol beverages, seized under par. (a) and fit for sale, shall be turned over by the department to the department of administration for disposal at public auction to the highest bidder, at a time and place stated in a notice of sale which describes the property to be sold. The sale shall be held in a conveniently accessible place in the county where the property was confiscated. A copy of the notice shall be published as a class 2 notice under ch. 985. The last insertion shall be at least 10 days before the sale. The department of revenue shall serve a copy of the notice of sale at least 2 weeks before the date thereof on all persons who are or may be owners or holders of security interests in the property. Any confiscated property worth more than \$100 shall be sold separately, and the balance of the confiscated property shall be sold in bulk or separately at the discretion of the department of administration. The net proceeds from the sale, less all costs of seizure, storage, and sale, shall be turned over to the secretary of administration. No motor vehicle or motorboat confiscated under this section may be sold within 30 days after the date of seizure.
- (3) RECOVERY OF CONFISCATED PROPERTY. (a) Application. Prior to sale under sub. (2) (f), the owner of confiscated property may apply to a court of record in the county where the property was seized for an order restoring the property to the owner. After the sale, the owner may apply to the court for a refund of the amount realized on the sale. After the sale, any holder of a security interest in the property may apply to the court for a refund of the sum realized on the sale of property subject to the security interest, but not more than the amount due under the security agreement.
- (b) Deadline. The application shall be made within one year after the sale of the property. A copy of the application and the order setting a hearing on it shall be served on the department at least 20 days before the date set for hearing.
- (c) Grounds. Relief shall be granted only after a showing by the applicant that he or she is the true owner or holder of a bona fide security interest in the property seized; that the violation which led to the confiscation was not with his or her knowledge,

- (b) Except as provided in sub. (5), no person may deliver a cartridge of nitrous oxide to another unless the packaging in which the cartridge is enclosed is marked with a label or other device that indicates the name and business address of the person delivering the cartridge of nitrous oxide.
- (5) Subsections (3) and (4) do not apply to a retail food establishment, as defined in s. 97.30 (1) (c).

- 134.65 Cigarette and tobacco products retailer license. (1) No person shall in any manner, or upon any pretense, or by any device, directly or indirectly sell, expose for sale, possess with intent to sell, exchange, barter, dispose of or give away any cigarettes or tobacco products to any person not holding a license as herein provided or a permit under ss. 139.30 to 139.41 or 139.79 without first obtaining a license from the clerk of the city, village or town wherein such privilege is sought to be exercised.
- (1m) A city, village, or town clerk may not issue a license under sub. (1) unless the applicant specifies in the license application whether the applicant will sell, exchange, barter, dispose of, or give away the cigarette or tobacco products over the counter or in a vending machine, or both.
- (2) (a) Except as provided in par. (b), upon filing of a proper written application a license shall be issued on July 1 of each year or when applied for and continue in force until the following June 30 unless sooner revoked. The city, village or town may charge a fee for the license of not less than \$5 nor more than \$100 per year which shall be paid to the city, village or town treasurer before the license is issued.
- (b) In any municipality electing to come under this paragraph, upon filing of a proper written application a license shall be issued and continue in force for one year from the date of issuance unless sooner revoked. The city, village or town may charge a fee for the license of not less than \$5 nor more than \$100 per year which shall be paid to the city, village or town treasurer before the license is issued.
- (3) Each such license shall name the licensee and specifically describe the premises where such business is to be conducted. Such licenses shall not be transferable from one person to another nor from one premises to another.
- (4) Every licensed retailer shall keep complete and accurate records of all purchases and receipts of cigarettes and tobacco products. Such records shall be preserved on the licensed premises for 2 years in such a manner as to insure permanency and accessibility for inspection and shall be subject to inspection at all reasonable hours by authorized state and local law enforcement officials.
- (5) Any person violating this section shall be fined not more than \$100 nor less than \$25 for the first offense and not more than \$200 nor less than \$25 for the 2nd or subsequent offense. If upon such 2nd or subsequent violation, the person so violating this section was personally guilty of a failure to exercise due care to prevent violation thereof, the person shall be fined not more than \$300 nor less than \$25 or imprisoned not exceeding 60 days or both. Conviction shall immediately terminate the license of the person convicted of being personally guilty of such failure to exercise due care and the person shall not be entitled to another license hereunder for a period of 5 years thereafter, nor shall the person in that period act as the servant or agent of a person licensed hereunder for the performance of the acts authorized by such license.
- (6) Any 1st class city may revoke, suspend, or refuse to renew any license issued under this section, as provided in sub. (7).
- (7) (a) Any duly authorized employee of a 1st class city issuing licenses under this section may file a sworn written complaint, supported by reports from a law enforcement agency, with the

- clerk of the city alleging at least 2 separate instances of one or more of the following about a person holding a license issued under this section by the city:
- 1. The person has violated s. 134.66 (2) (a), (am), (cm), or (e), or a municipal ordinance adopted under s. 134.66 (5).
- The person's premises are disorderly, riotous, indecent, or improper.
- The person has knowingly permitted criminal behavior, including prostitution and loitering, to occur on the licensed premises.
 - 4. The person has been convicted of any of the following:
- Manufacturing, distributing, or delivering a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under s. 961.41 (1).
- b. Possessing with intent to manufacture, distribute, or deliver, a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under s. 961.41 (1m).
- c. Possessing with intent to manufacture, distribute, or deliver, or manufacturing, distributing, or delivering a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under a substantially similar federal law or a substantially similar law of another state.
- d. Possessing any of the materials listed in s. 961.65 with intent to manufacture methamphetamine under that section or under a federal law or a law of another state that is substantially similar to s. 961.65.
- The person knowingly allows another person who is on the licensed premises to do any of the actions described in subd. 4.
- (b) Upon the filing of the complaint, the city governing body shall issue a summons, signed by the clerk and directed to any peace officer in the city. The summons shall command the person complained of to appear before the city governing body on a day and place named in the summons, not less than 3 days and not more than 10 days from the date of issuance, and show cause why his or her license should not be revoked, suspended, or not renewed. The summons and a copy of the complaint shall be served on the person complained of at least 3 days before the date on which the person is commanded to appear. Service shall be in the manner provided in ch. 801 for service in civil actions in circuit court.
- (c) 1. If the person does not appear as required by the summons, the allegations of the complaint shall be taken as true, and if the city governing body finds the allegations to be sufficient grounds for revocation or nonrenewal, the license shall be revoked or not renewed. The city clerk shall give notice of the revocation or nonrenewal to the person whose license is revoked or not renewed.
- 2. If the person appears as required by the summons and answers the complaint, both the complainant and the person complained of may produce witnesses, cross—examine witnesses, and be represented by counsel. The person complained of shall be provided a written transcript of the hearing at his or her expense. If upon the hearing the city governing body finds the allegations of the complaint to be true, and if the city governing body finds the allegations to be sufficient grounds for suspension, revocation, or nonrenewal, the license shall be suspended for not less than 10 days nor more than 90 days, revoked, or not renewed.
- The city clerk shall give notice of each suspension, revocation, or nonrenewal to the person whose license is suspended, revoked, or not renewed.
- 4. If the city governing body finds the allegations of the complaint to be untrue, the complaint shall be dismissed without cost to the person complained of.
- (d) When a license is revoked under this subsection, the revocation shall be recorded by the city clerk and no other license may be issued under this section to the person whose license was revoked within the 12 months after the date of revocation. No part of the fee paid for any license that is revoked under this subsection may be refunded.

- (e) The action of any city governing body in suspending, revoking, or not renewing any license under this subsection, or the failure of any city governing body to suspend, revoke, or not renew any license under this subsection for good cause, may be reviewed by the circuit court for the county in which the license was issued, upon the request of any applicant or licensee. The procedure on review shall be the same as in civil actions instituted in the circuit court. The person desiring review shall file pleadings, which shall be served on the city governing body in the manner provided in ch. 801 for service in civil actions and a copy of the pleadings shall be served on the applicant or licensee. The city governing body, applicant, or licensee shall have 20 days to file an answer to the complaint. Following filing of the answer, the matter shall be deemed at issue and hearing may be had within 5 days, upon due notice served upon the opposing party. The hearing shall be before the court without a jury. Subpoenas for witnesses may be issued and their attendance compelled. The findings and order of the court shall be filed within 10 days after the hearing and a copy of the findings and order shall be transmitted to each of the parties. The order shall be final unless appeal is taken to the court of appeals.
- (8) The uniform licensing of cigarette and tobacco products retailers is a matter of statewide concern. A city, village, or town may adopt an ordinance regulating the issuance, suspension, revocation, or renewal of a license under this section only if the ordinance strictly conforms to this section. If a city, village, or town has in effect on May 1, 2016, an ordinance that does not strictly conform to this section, the ordinance does not apply and may not

 - 1. A person specified under s. 139.30 (3).
 - 2. A person specified under s. 139.75 (4).
 - (c) "Identification card" means any of the following:
 - 1. A license containing a photograph issued under ch. 343.
 - 2. An identification card issued under s. 343.50.
 - 3. An identification card issued under s. 125.08, 1987 stats.
 - (d) "Jobber" has the meaning given in s. 139.30 (6).
 - (e) "Manufacturer" means any of the following:
 - 1. A person specified under s. 139.30 (7).
 - 2. A person specified under s. 139.75 (5).
- (f) "Nicotine product" means a product that contains nicotine and is not any of the following:
 - 1. A tobacco product.
 - 2. A cigarette.
- 3. A product that has been approved by the U.S. food and drug administration for sale as a smoking cessation product or for another medical purpose and is being marketed and sold solely for such an approved purpose.
 - (g) "Retailer" means any person licensed under s. 134.65 (1).
 - (h) "School" has the meaning given in s. 118.257 (1) (d).
 - (hm) "Stamp" has the meaning given in s. 139.30 (13).
 - (i) "Subjobber" has the meaning given in s. 139.75 (11).
- (j) "Tobacco products" has the meaning given in s. 139.75 $(12)^{-}$.
- (k) "Vending machine" has the meaning given in s. 139.30 (14).
- (L) "Vending machine operator" has the meaning given in s. 139.30 (15).
- (2) RESTRICTIONS. (a) No retailer, direct marketer, manufacturer, distributor, jobber or subjobber, no agent, employee or inde-

pendent contractor of a retailer, direct marketer, manufacturer, distributor, jobber or subjobber and no agent or employee of an independent contractor may sell or provide for nominal or no consideration cigarettes, nicotine products, or tobacco products to any person under the age of 18, except as provided in s. 254.92 (2) (a). A vending machine operator is not liable under this paragraph for the purchase of cigarettes, nicotine products, or tobacco products from his or her vending machine by a person under the age of 18 if the vending machine operator was unaware of the pur-

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- (am) No retailer, direct marketer, manufacturer, distributor, jobber, subjobber, no agent, employee or independent contractor of a retailer, direct marketer, manufacturer, distributor, jobber or subjobber and no agent or employee of an independent contractor may provide for nominal or no consideration cigarettes, nicotine products, or tobacco products to any person except in a place where no person younger than 18 years of age is present or permitted to enter unless the person who is younger than 18 years of age is accompanied by his or her parent or guardian or by his or her spouse who has attained the age of 18 years.
- (b) 1. A retailer shall post a sign in areas within his or her premises where cigarettes or tobacco products are sold to consumers stating that the sale of any cigarette or tobacco product to a person under the age of 18 is unlawful under this section and s. 254.92.
- 2. A vending machine operator shall attach a notice in a conspicuous place on the front of his or her vending machines stating that the purchase of any cigarette or tobacco product by a person under the age of 18 is unlawful under s. 254.92 and that the purchaser is subject to a forfeiture of not to exceed \$50.
- (cm) Im. A retailer or vending machine operator may not sell cigarettes or tobacco products from a vending machine unless the vending machine is located in a place where the retailer or vending machine operator ensures that no person younger than 18 years of age is present or permitted to enter unless he or she is accompanied by his or her parent or guardian or by his or her spouse who has attained the age of 18 years.
- 2. Notwithstanding subd. 1m., no retailer may place a vending machine within 500 feet of a school.
- (e) No retailer or direct marketer may sell cigarettes in a form other than as a package or container on which a stamp is affixed under s. 139.32 (1).
- (2m) Training. (a) Except as provided in par. (b), at the time that a retailer hires or contracts with an agent, employee, or independent contractor whose duties will include the sale of cigarettes or tobacco products, the retailer shall provide the agent, employee, or independent contractor with training on compliance with sub. (2) (a) and (am), including training on the penalties under sub. (4) (a) 2, for a violation of sub. (2) (a) or (am). The department of health services shall make available to any retailer on request a training program developed or approved by that department that provides the training required under this paragraph. A retailer may comply with this paragraph by providing the training program developed or approved by the department of health services or by providing a comparable training program approved by that department. At the completion of the training, the retailer and the agent, employee, or independent contractor shall sign a form provided by the department of health services verifying that the agent, employee, or independent contractor has received the training, which the retailer shall retain in the personnel file of the agent, employee, or independent contractor.
- (b) Paragraph (a) does not apply to an agent, employee, or independent contractor who has received the training described in par. (a) as part of a responsible beverage server training course or a comparable training course, as described in s. 125.04 (5) (a) 5., that was successfully completed by the agent, employee, or independent contractor. The department of health services shall make the training program developed or approved by that department under par. (a) available to the technical college system board, and that board shall include that training program or a comparable

SUBCHAPTER 2 FOOD DEALER LICENSE

- 68-21. Food Dealer License. 1. REQUIRED.
- a. No person, partnership, association or corporation may establish a food operation, manufacture, offer for sale, store, distribute or sell food within the city without first having obtained a food dealer license or license with conditions allowing temporary or seasonal operation of a food establishment. The license shall be required of any person selling or distributing food, with the exception that a license shall not be required of a person holding a food peddler license or temporary or seasonal food license issued by the commissioner.
- b. Only a person, association or corporation in compliance with the applicable requirements of this section shall be eligible to receive and retain a food dealer license.
- c. A food dealer license may not be transferred from one person or entity to another or from one premise to another except an individual may transfer a license to an immediate family member, as defined in s. 254.64(4)(1)2, Wis. Stats., if the individual is transferring operation of the restaurant. See s. 85-19 for additional provisions relating to the transfer of licenses.
- The commissioner or an authorized agent may grant a license with conditions for the temporary operation of a food establishment prior to the completion of orders and the issuance of a regular food dealer license, provided that the business is in substantial compliance with this section and the operation of the food establishment will not jeopardize the life, health and safety of the public and property, and the department of neighborhood services has approved an occupancy permit. The issuance of a license with conditions shall be revoked after 30 days, and the operation shall cease unless all conditions are met and a regular license issued. The regular license application shall be granted or denied before the license with conditions expires. The issuance of a license with conditions shall not apply to renewals.
- e. No person may sell food door-to-door, except for occasional sales by representatives of a religious, fraternal, youth, civic or patriotic organization, service club or church. In this paragraph, "occasional sales" means that food is offered for sale for not more than 3 days in any 12-month period.

- 2. LICENSE NOT REQUIRED. A food dealer license shall not be required for the following:
- A person selling only bottled or canned non-alcohol drinks that do not require refrigeration and no other food items.
- b. A stand, not connected with any temporary event as defined in s. 68-1-58, located on private property in a residential area operated by a child under the age of 14 who sells homemade beverages or food items not requiring heating or refrigeration.
- c. A community food program, provided all of the following conditions are met:
- c-1 All food is provided free of cost to persons in need or organizations serving persons in need.
- c-2. The community food program registers bi-annually with the department and pays the registration and inspection fees specified in s. 81-55.5.
- c-3. Upon initial registration with the department, a community food program submits plans in compliance with s. 68-11 for review and approval, and undergoes pre-inspection prior to operating.
- c-4. A community food program undergoes an annual inspection. Inspections or investigations where significant noncompliance is found shall be subject to additional fees as specified in s. 60-70.
- d. Any public or private primary and secondary school meal program, provided all of the following conditions are met:
- d-1. Food service is limited to students who attend the school or to children as part of a free summer meal program.
- d-2. All food preparation and service is performed by staff directly employed by the school.
- d-3. The school registers annually with the department at least 10 days prior to operating or prior to the first day of the school year and pays the registration and inspection fees specified in s. 81-55.5.
- d-4. Prior to initial operation, a school meal program submits plans in compliance with s. 68-11 for review and approval, and undergoes preinspection.
- d-5. A school meal program undergoes 2 inspections administered by the department per school year. Inspections or investigations where significant noncompliance is found shall be subject to additional fees as specified in s. 60-70.
- e. A food manufacturer that derives 25% or more of its gross sales from wholesale trade, has obtained a food processing plant license from the state, and does not serve meals to the public.

- f. A food distributor that derives 25% or more of its gross sales from wholesale trade, has obtained a food warehouse license from the state, and does not serve meals to the public.
- 3. APPLICATION. Applications for a food dealer license shall be made in writing to the office of the city clerk on forms provided by the city clerk and shall contain the following information:
- a. The name, address and date of birth of the applicant.
- b. The trade name and address of the food service establishment.
- c. Whether the applicant is a person, corporation or partnership.
- c-1. If the applicant is a corporation, the application shall contain the registered agent's name, address and date of birth, and verification that the corporation has been registered with the secretary of state as provided in ch. 180, Wis. Stats.
- c-2. If the applicant is a partnership, the application shall include the names and addresses of the partners.
- d. Such other reasonable or pertinent information the city clerk, commissioner or chief of police may require.
- 3.5. FINGERPRINTING. All applicants for food dealer licenses shall be exempt from the fingerprinting requirement provided in s. 85-21-1.
- 4. PROCEDURE FOR ISSUING NEW OR RENEWAL LICENSE. a. The commissioner shall issue a license to each applicant for a new or renewal license who meets all the requirements of this section and has paid to the city treasurer the fee specified in s. 81-55 unless there is an objection by the commissioner, the department of neighborhood services, the common council member in whose district the food establishment is located, or any person affected by the operation or proposed operation of the applicant.
- b. If either the common council member or the commissioner objects to an application, no license shall be Issued unless the applicant requests in writing an appeal before the licensing committee. An appeal shall be requested no more than 10 working days after the date on which the applicant was notified of the recommendation of the commissioner and the common council member. Appeals shall be forwarded to the licensing committee for its recommendation as to whether a license should be granted or renewed. The procedure for considering an appeal shall be as provided in sub 8.

- c. If there is an objection to the renewal of a license, the procedure for considering the renewal license application shall be as specified in sub. 7.
- d. The late renewal fee for a license issued under this chapter may not be waived unless definite proof exists that the delay is the fault of the health department or the city clerk.
- 5. POSTING. Each licensee shall post his or her license in a conspicuous place on the food establishment premises.
- 6. CHANGES TO BE REPORTED. a. A licensee shall notify the city clerk whenever there is a change in any information that is reported in the application form or renewal application form. The licensee shall make this notification in writing within 10 days after the change occurs. Changes in the food facility or operational plan submitted as part of a supplemental application shall be submitted in accordance with s. 68-11.
- b. The owner of any premises for which a license has been granted shall promptly notify the city clerk in writing of his or her intention to cease operations.
- c. An individual applicant or licensee who resides outside WisconsIn or who leaves the state for more than 30 days shall provide the commissioner or the commissioner's authorized agent with the name, address and telephone number of a responsible person or agent within the state of Wisconsin upon whom any process, notice or demand required or permitted under this section to be served upon the licensee may be served, and the commissioner shall notify the city clerk. Violation of this subsection may result in suspension or revocation of the license.
- 7. SUSPENSION FOR NONRENEWAL. The city clerk shall notify the appropriate city officials, and the commissioner shall order the immediate enforcement of this section in cases involving failure to renew a food dealer's license. The licensee shall be prohibited from manufacturing, offering for sale, distributing or selling food until a valid license has been applied for and obtained under this section.
- 8. PROCEDURE FOR DENIAL OR NONRENEWAL OF LICENSE. If there is an objection to an application for a new or renewal license, the application shall be subject to common council review and approval in accordance with the provisions of ss. 85-2.7 to 85-5.
- 9. CAUSES FOR COUNCIL DENIAL, REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION OF LICENSE. An application for a new or renewal food dealer license may be denied, or any license issued

under this section may be suspended or revoked, by the common council for any of the following causes:

- a. Failure of the applicant or licensee to meet the statutory and municipal license qualifications, except for failure to meet sanitary or other health-related qualifications or other circumstances specified in s. 68-69 as grounds for license revocation or suspension by the commissioner of health.
- b. A false or materially incorrect statement made by the applicant in his or her application.
- c. Violation of any provision of this section by the applicant, licensee or any employee of the food establishment.
- d. The conviction of the applicant or llcensee, his or her agent, manager, operator or any other employee for sale or possession with intent to sell any controlled substance or for any felony related to the licensed operation which, in the judgment of the common council, is pertinent to the license being applied for or renewed.
- e. A showing that the applicant or licensee has violated any state law or city ordinance prohibiting the sale of tobacco products to underage persons.
- f. The violation of any of the excise laws of the state.
- g. A showing that the licensed premises has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in one or more of the following:
 - g-1. Disturbance of the peace.
 - g-2. Illegal drug activity.
 - g-3. Public drunkenness.
 - g-4. Drinking in public.
 - g-5. Harassment of passers-by.
 - g-6. Gambling.
 - g-7. Prostitution.
 - g-8. Sale of stolen goods.
 - g-9. Public urination.
 - g-10. Theft.
 - g-11. Assaults.
 - g-12. Battery.
 - g-13. Acts of vandalism, including graffiti.
 - g-14. Excessive littering.
 - g-15. Loitering.
 - g-16. Illegal parking.
 - g-17. Loud noise at times when the licensed operation is open for business.
 - g-18. Traffic violations.
 - q-19. Curfew violations.
 - g-20. Lewd conduct.
 - g-21. Display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6.

- h. A showing that the premises proposed for licensing will be a convenience store as defined in s. 68-1-12, whether or not exempt as provided in s. 68-55-2, and that the proposed operation of the premises will tend to contribute to neighborhood incidents and conditions identified in par. g as the result of an over-concentration of food dealers licensed under s. 68-21 to offer for sale, sell or distribute food in the neighborhood. Evidence that a neighborhood is adequately served by existing retall food establishments may be considered in reaching a determination about whether granting a new license will result In over-concentration.
- The city clerk shall promptly inform the commissioner, the police department and commissioner of neighborhood services upon receipt of an application for a new food dealer license. The city clerk shall also promptly advise the common council member in whose district a new food dealer licensee proposes to operate licensed premises. The city clerk shall establish a written procedure for informing persons and parties neighboring the premises of a proposed new food dealer licensee intending to operate a convenience store within the definition of s. 68-1-12, whether or not the convenience store may be exempt under s. 68-55-2, and the persons and parties neighboring the premises of a licensed convenience store proposed for renewal if written objections to renewal have been received by the city clerk as provided in s. 85-3-3, and not considered in previous licensing proceedings.
- j. Any person has the right to object to a new or renewal food dealer license based upon any matter specified in par. g and, upon receipt of a written objection, the city clerk shall request that the licensing committee schedule a hearing upon the application. The procedures of ch. 85 shall apply to the conduct of the hearing and to common council consideration of the recommendations of the licensing committee, except that the applicant shall not have the right to be heard orally before the common council.
- k. A proceeding for revocation of a food dealer license may be commenced upon a sworn complaint to the city clerk by any interested party alleging that the operation of the licensed premises contributes to any of the conditions specified in par. g. If the common council finds that the licensed food dealer has contributed to any of the conditions or circumstances described in par. g, it may revoke the food dealer license or suspend the food dealer license for a period of not less than 10 days nor more than 90 days.

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- L. Nothing in this section shall affect the authority or responsibility of the commissioner of health to suspend or revoke a food dealer license whenever the commissioner finds unsanitary or other conditions in the operation of a food service establishment as provided in s. 68-69.
- 10. DISQUALIFICATION FOR LICENSE. Whenever any application is withdrawn, denied, or license not renewed, revoked or surrendered, the procedures for disqualification for license and change of circumstances provided in ss. 85-13 and 85-15 shall apply.
- 11. PROCEEDINGS TO SUSPEND OR REVOKE LICENSE. a. Reasons Relating to Unsanltary Conditions. Proceedings to suspend or revoke a food dealer's license for reasons relating to unsanitary or other health-related conditions or for serious or repeated violations of any of the requirements of this chapter shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of s. 68-69.
- b. Reasons Unrelated to Unsanitary Conditions. Proceedings to suspend or revoke a food dealer's license for reasons other than the grounds for suspension or revocation provided in s. 68-69 may be initiated by the licensing committee upon its own motion, upon sworn written charges made and filed with the city clerk by the chief of police or upon a sworn written complaint filed with the city clerk by any city resident.
- 12. PROCEDURE FOR REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION. a. Notice and Service. Whenever either sworn written charges or a sworn written complaint are filed with the city clerk setting forth specific charges against a licensee relating to any of the causes for revocation or suspension of a license set forth in sub. 9, the procedures for notice and service of notice provided in s. 85-3 shall apply.
- b. Committee Hearing. The licensing committee shall convene and hear the matter upon the complaint for revocation or suspension filed and noticed under par. a in the manner provided in s. 85-4-1 and 2 and shall prepare and submit a report as required by ss. 85-4-5 and 85-5-1. Grounds for revocation and suspension shall be those provided in sub. 9.
- c. Council Action. Written statements in response to the findings and recommendations of the licensing committee shall be filed with the city clerk in the manner provided in
- s. 85-5-2, and copies shall be provided to common council members in the manner provided in s. 85-5-3. The procedures provided in s. 85-5-4 shall

govern the conduct of the meeting of the common council.

- **68-23.** Shared Kitchens. 1. REVIEW AND APPROVAL. a. Anytime one or more food establishments proposes to operate out of the same commercial kitchen, the primary license holder shall notify the department of his or her intent to share kitchen space.
- b. If not previously approved by the department, the addition of other users sharing commercial kitchen space shall be considered a significant operational change requiring plan review and approval as specified in s. 68-11.
- c. The commissioner may place an operational restriction on a food establishment based on either size of the kitchen or the compliance history of the establishment prohibiting use as a shared kitchen.
- d. Unless operated by the same licensee, each shared kitchen user shall obtain his or her own food dealer license.
- 2. OPERATOR DUTIES. The primary license holder shall be referred to as a shared kitchen operator and shall:
- a. Ensure the physical facilities and all equipment provided by the operator in the shared kitchen are in compliance with all local, state and federal regulations, including compliance with all health and sanitation requirements.
- b. Ensure that any person engaged in food preparation or storage within his or her facility is properly licensed. Allowing an unlicensed operator to prepare food for sale shall be considered a violation and grounds for progressive enforcement including revocation of the food dealer license.
- c. Maintain records on site regarding the use of the shared kitchen for a period of 24 months from the date of entry and shall make the records immediately available upon request by the department at the time of inspection or investigation. Failure to maintain records or to provide required records to the department shall be grounds for the department to rescind approval to permit shared use of the kitchen. Each of the following records shall be maintained and made available by the shared kitchen operator:
- c-1. A list of all shared kitchen users and current contact information.
- c-2. For each such shared kitchen user, a copy of the following documents:
- c-2-a. Menu approved by the department for use by a shared kitchen user.

84-43 Miscellaneous Licenses

- b. Posting of Ordinance. The owner or operator of every parking lot shall post or cause to be posted a copy of this section, or a summary thereof, in a conspicuous place within said parking lot.
- c. Penalty. Any person violating par. a shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500 and in default of payment thereof shall be imprisoned in the county jail or house of correction for a period not to exceed 60 days.
- d. Exception. The provisions of pars. a and c shall not apply if the operators of theparking lot have not met the provisions of sub. 13-b.

84-43. Cigarette and Tobacco License.

- 1. DEFINITIONS. In this section:
- a. "Cigarette" means any roll of tobacco wrapped in paper or any substance other than tobacco.
- b. "Tobacco products" means cigars; cheroots; stogies; periques; granulated, plug cut, crimp cut, ready-rubbed and other smoking tobacco; snuff; snuff flour; cavendish; plug and twist tobacco; fine cut and other chewing tobaccos; shorts; refuse scraps, clippings, cuttings and sweepings of tobacco and other kinds and forms of tobacco prepared in such manner as to be suitable for chewing or smoking in a pipe or otherwise, or both for chewing and smoking; but "tobacco products" does not include cigarettes.
- 2. LICENSE REQUIRED. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation in any manner, or upon any pretense, or by any device, directly or indirectly, to sell, exchange, barter, dispose of or give away, any cigarettes or tobacco products without first obtaining a license therefor.
- 3. APPLICATION. License application forms shall be obtained from the city clerk and require the information specified in s. 85-12.
- 4. PLAN OF OPERATION. An application for a cigarette and tobacco license shall be accompanied by a completed plan of operation on a form provided therefor by the city clerk. The plan of operation shall include:
- a. The planned hours of operation for the premises.
- b. The number of customers expected on a daily basis at the premises.
- c. The legal occupancy limit of the premises.

- d. The number of off-street parking spaces available at the premises.
- e. Plans the applicant has to provide security for the premises.
- f. Plans the applicant has to ensure the orderly appearance and operation of the premises with respect to litter and noise.
- g. Any other licenses held by the applicant or attached to the premises.
- h. A description of any provisions made for clean-up of the premises.
 - i. A site plan showing:
- i-1. The locations of all entrances and exits. This shall include a description of how customers will enter and leave the premises.
- i-2. The locations and dimensions of any off-street parking and loading areas for customers.
- j. Such other reasonable and pertinent information the common council or the licensing committee may from time to time require.
 - 5. CHANGES TO BE REPORTED.
- a. Application. A licensee shall notify the city clerk whenever there is a change in any information that is reported on the application form or renewal application form. The licensee shall make this notification in writing within 10 days after the change occurs.
- b. Plan of Operation. If, after the license has been issued, the licensee wishes to deviate from the plan of operation that was submitted with the original application, the licensee shall file a written request with the city clerk which states the nature of the change. No change shall take place until the request is approved through issuance of a new license.
- 6. LICENSE FEE. See ch. 81 for the required license fee.
- 7. AGE QUALIFICATION. No license shall be issued to any person or any agent of a corporation or limited liability corporation who is not 18 years of age or older.
- 8. ISSUANCE. See s. 85-12.5 for provisions relating to the issuance of a license.
- 9. TRANSFER OF LICENSE OR CHANGE OF NAME. No cigarette and tobacco license may be transferred from one licensee to another or from one premises to another. The city clerk may, however, change the name of a licensee as provided in s. 85-19 upon receiving information that the name of the licensee has been lawfully changed by marriage, order of a court or administrative determination by the Wisconsin department of financial institutions.

- 10. RECORDS TO BE KEPT. Every retailer licensed under this section shall keep complete and accurate records of all purchases and receipts of cigarettes and tobacco products. The records shall be preserved on the licensed premises for 2 years in a manner to ensure permanency and accessibility for inspection and shall be subject to inspection at all reasonable hours by authorized state and local law enforcement officials.
- 11. SUSPENSION, NONRENEWAL AND REVOCATION. The city adopts s.134.65 (6), (7) and (8), Wis. Stats.
- 12. PENALTIES. a. Any person violating this section shall be fined not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 for the first offense or, in lieu of nonpayment or default of such fine, costs and disbursements, may be imprisoned as provided by law; and for a second or subsequent offense not less than \$25 nor more than \$200 or, in lieu of nonpayment or default of such fine, costs and disbursements, may be imprisoned as provided by law.
- If upon conviction of a 2nd or subsequent violation, the person violating this section is found personally guilty of a failure to exercise due care to prevent the violation, the person shall be fined not less than \$25 nor more than \$300 or, in lieu of nonpayment or default of such fine, costs and disbursements, may be imprisoned as provided by law. Conviction under this paragraph shall result in immediate termination of the license of the person convicted of being personally guilty of failure to exercise due care and the person shall not be entitled to another license under this section for a period of 5 years after conviction, nor shall the person in that period act as the servant or agent of a person licensed under this section in the performance of acts authorized by the license.
- **84-45.** Filling Stations. 1. PURPOSE. In order to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the community and environment and prevent potential harm and nuisance that could result from the location and operation of filling stations, the common council enacts the following regulations.
- 2. DEFINITION. In this section, "filling station" (gas station) means a place, building, pump or device maintained and used on private premises for the purpose of dispensing to the public gasoline or other fuels for use in motor vehicles of any kind.

- 3. LICENSE REQUIRED. a. No person, firm or corporation shall operate a filling station unless the person, firm or corporation possesses a valid license issued pursuant to this section. See s. 81-51.6 for the required fee.
- b. An additional weighing and measuring license fee specified in ch. 81 shall be paid for each pump or device used to establish charges for gasoline or other fuels.
- 3.5. SECURITY CAMERA REQUIRED. All filling stations open to customers on a 24-hour basis shall:
- a. Install, maintain in proper working order and operate during all hours the store is open to customers a security camera which can produce reproducible digital color images.
- b. The camera shall be placed to provide a clear and identifiable full frame of the filmed individual's face, either entering, exiting or at the cash register. Hanging displays shall not obstruct views of the individual's face.
- c. If a time-lapse digital video camera is operated, recorded images shall not be recorded at a slower speed than 24 hours.
- d. Recorded digital image files shall be kept for a minimum of 72 hours.
- 4. APPLICATION. License application forms shall be obtained from the city clerk and require the information specified in s. 85-12.
- 5. PLAN OF OPERATION. An application for a filling station license shall be accompanied by a completed plan of operation on a form provided therefor by the city clerk. The plan of operation shall include:
- a. The planned hours of operation for the premises.
- b. The number of customers expected on a daily basis at the premises.
- c. The legal occupancy limit of the premises.
- d. The number of off-street parking spaces available at the premises.
- e. Plans the applicant has to provide security for the premises.
- f. Plans the applicant has to ensure the orderly appearance and operation of the premises with respect to litter and noise.
- g. Any other licenses held by the applicant or attached to the premises.
- h. A description of any provisions made for clean-up of the premises.

permitted to present the applicant's own witnesses, subject to cross-examination.

- e. Committee members may ask questions of witnesses.
- f. The applicant shall be permitted a brief summary statement.
- 4. RECOMMENDATION. The recommendation of the committee regarding the applicant shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Probative evidence concerning whether or not the license should be granted may be presented on the following subjects:
- a. Whether or not the applicant meets the municipal requirements.
- b. The appropriateness of the location and premises where the licensed premises is to be located and whether use of the premises for the purposes or activities permitted by the license would tend to facilitate a public or private nuisance or create undesirable neighborhood problems such as disorderly patrons, unreasonably loud noise, litter, and excessive traffic and parking congestion. Probative evidence relating to these matters may be taken from the plan of operation submitted with the license application.
- c. The fitness of the location of the premises to be maintained as the principal place of business, including but not limited to whether there is an overconcentration of businesses of the type for which the license is sought, whether the proposal is consistent with any pertinent neighborhood business or development plans, or proximity to areas where children are typically present.
- d. The applicant's record in operating similarly licensed premises.
- e. Whether or not the applicant has been charged with or convicted of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the activity to be permitted by the license being applied for.
- f. Any other factors which reasonably relate to the public health, safety and welfare.
- 5. FACTORS NOT CONSIDERED FOR RECOMMENDATION. The recommendations of the committee regarding the applicant shall not be based on evidence presented at the hearing related to the type or content of any music, or the actual or likely financial or non-financial effects on actual or potential competitors.
- 6. Committee Decision. The committee may make a recommendation immediately following the hearing or at a later

- date. Written notice of the committee's decision will be provided if the decision is made at a later date or if the applicant was not present or represented. The committee shall forward its recommendation in writing to the common council for vote at the next meeting at which such matter will be considered.
- 7. DOCUMENT. If the common council grants the application for a license, the city clerk, or other city official or department authorized by the code to issue licenses, shall issue an appropriate document to the applicant confirming that fact. The document shall also contain any restrictions or conditions which the common council may place on approval.
- 85-3. Notice and Service. 1. NOTICE OF POSSIBLE NON-RENEWAL, SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION. a. Unless otherwise provided, the city clerk, or other city official or department authorized by the code to receive applications for licenses or permits, shall provide written notice of the possibility of non-renewal, or of suspension or revocation of a license or permit to the applicant addressed to the person or agent at the address most recently provided by the applicant.
- b. Written notice of possible non-renewal, suspension or revocation shall include:
- b-1. The date, time and place of a hearing to be held by the committee.
- b-2. A statement of the common council's intent to revoke, suspend or not renew the license or permit if objections, charges or allegations are found to be true.
- b-3. A statement of the specific reasons for revocation, suspension or non-renewal.
- b-4. A statement that an opportunity will be provided to respond to and challenge the reasons for revocation, suspension or non-renewal, and to present witnesses under oath and to confront and cross-examine witnesses under oath.
- b-5. A statement that the applicant may be represented by an attorney of the applicant's choice at the expense of the applicant.
- b-6. A statement that, if the applicant requires the assistance of an interpreter, the applicant may employ an interpreter at the expense of the applicant.
- b-7. A statement that, upon conclusion of a hearing before the committee, the committee will prepare a written report and recommendation to the common council, and shall provide a copy of the report and recommendation to the applicant.

- 2. SERVICE OF DOCUMENTS. Service of notices of meetings and service of other documents including committee reports and recommendations shall be made upon any party entitled to such notice and service by placing the same in the United States first class mail, postage prepaid.
- OBJECTIONS. a. How Made. Notice of an objection to the renewal of a license or in support of suspension of a license or permit by an interested party shall not be included in the notice of hearing if the objection has not been received by the city clerk within 45 days of the expiration of the license. Failure to timely submit an objection shall not be a bar to testimony or other evidence that relates to any matter actually identified in the notice of hearing as a basis for nonrenewal or suspension. An objection shall include information that could form the basis of a license nonrenewal or suspension and may be transmitted in writing or by electronic means. Any city official, or the official's delegate, shall forward an objection from an interested party, or from a resident as provided in s. 90-1-19, to the city clerk. The information provided by an official or the official's delegate to the city clerk shall include the name of the objector, contact information for the objector, and information known to the objector that may form a basis for nonrenewal or suspension. The submission by a city official or the official's delegate of a written summary of the objection to the city clerk shall be treated in the same manner as other objections. The city clerk is authorized to establish forms for the purpose of assisting persons wishing to submit an objection.
- b. Exception. If application for renewal is filed with the city clerk after the deadline for renewal application established by the city clerk and prior to the expiration of the license, an objection may be submitted in fewer than 45 days prior to the expiration of the license and may be considered at a regularly scheduled meeting of the licensing committee provided sufficient and timely notice is given.
- 85-4. Hearing Procedure; Non-Renewal, Suspension or Revocation. 1. AUTHORITY OF COMMITTEE. The committee shall conduct hearings with respect to the non-renewal, suspension or revocation of a license or permit pursuant to this section. The chair of the committee shall be the presiding officer.
- 1.5. MULTIPLE LICENSE TYPES. When the committee conducts a hearing relating to the possible denial, non-renewal, suspension

- or revocation of a business type license and the licensee holds one or more other types of licenses or permits issued by the city clerk for the same premises, the committee shall also consider possible non-renewal, suspension or revocation of the other licenses or permits at the same hearing. Notice of possible denial, non-renewal, suspension or revocation of the non-alcohol beverage licenses or permits shall be provided in accordance with s. 85-3.
- 2. COMMITTEE HEARING PROCEDURE. a. The chair shall advise the applicant of the right to proceed to a due process hearing represented by counsel with all testimony, both direct and cross examination, under oath or that the applicant may simply make a statement to the committee.
- b. The chair shall direct that oaths be administered and subpoenas issued upon request of any party.
- The chair shall ensure that an C. orderly hearing is conducted in accordance with the requirements of this section. The chair shall open the hearing with a statement that a notice was sent to the applicant, and, if the applicant appears, shall further inquire whether the notice was received. Unless expressly provided elsewhere in this code, the chair shall advise the licensee and parties seeking nonrenewal, suspension or revocation of the license that each side will be limited to 30 minutes for testimony and oral argument. This time may be extended by the chair, subject to approval by the committee, if additional time is necessary for a full and fair presentation of the facts and arguments. When permitted by the chair, questioning by committee members and relevant responses shall not count against the time limitation. In the event that the applicant does not admit receipt of the notice and also denies knowledge of the contents of the notice, the chair shall ascertain whether the applicant wishes to immediately proceed to a full hearing or whether the applicant wishes the matter to be held to the call of the chair or to a time certain. The decision to proceed or to hold the matter shall be made by the committee.
- d. The chair shall rule on objections to the admissibility of evidence. Any ruling of the chair shall be final unless appealed to the committee, and the committee shall reverse such ruling only upon the vote of a majority of its members.
- 3. RECORD. An electronic or stenographic record shall be made of all licensing proceedings before the licensing committee and the common council. An

electronic record shall audibly, accurately and completely reflect the testimony and statements made by participants in the proceedings. Recordings shall be maintained in a manner prescribed by the city clerk. An electronic record shall be made available for stenographic transcription or for transcription by other means at the expense of the person or party seeking the transcription of all or any portion of the record.

- 4. GROUNDS FOR NON-RENEWAL, SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION. The recommendations of the committee regarding the applicant shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of:
- a. Failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications.
- b. Pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employe or other agent of the applicant.
- c. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following:
 - c-1. Disturbance of the peace.
 - c-2. Illegal drug activity.
 - c-3. Public drunkenness.
 - c-4. Drinking in public.
 - c-5. Harassment of passers-by.
 - c-6. Gambling.
 - c-7. Prostitution.
 - c-8. Sale of stolen goods.
 - c-9. Public urination.
 - c-10. Theft.
 - c-11. Assaults.
 - c-12. Batterv.
 - c-13. Acts of vandalism including graffiti.
 - c-14. Excessive littering.
 - c-15. Loitering.
 - c-16. Illegal parking.
 - c-17. Loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business.
 - c-18. Traffic violations.

- c-19. Curfew violations.
- c-20. Lewd conduct.
- c-21. Display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6.
- c-22. Any other factor which

reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare.

c-23 Failure to comply with the approved plan of operation.

HEARING OFFICER. Where it i

s impractical for the committee to hold an evidentiary hearing, the committee may employ a hearing officer for the purposes of taking testimony and rendering recommended findings of fact and conclusions of law to the committee. When such hearing officer is employed, he or she shall prepare written findings of fact and conclusions of law which shall be simultaneously transmitted to the committee as well as to the applicant, the applicant's agent, manager, operator or any other employe of the applicant, and to the person bringing the complainant or The chair of the committee shall objector. schedule a hearing on the receipt of the report of the hearing officer in not more than 30 days from receipt of the report. Notice of the committee hearing on the report shall be given to all parties. The committee may take and reserve additional evidence at the time of said hearing. The committee may accept or reject the report of the hearing officer or make any changes to the warranted which are bν circumstances, the evidence presented and any arguments of the parties who appeared before the hearing officer and the committee. committee shall transmit its recommendation to the common council for action as provided in sub. 6.

6. COMMITTEE REPORT. The committee mav make a report and recommendations immediately following the hearing or at a later date. The committee may recommend that the license or permit be renewed, not renewed, suspended or revoked. In addition, if the committee determines that circumstances warrant, the committee may recommend that the license or permit be renewed conditioned upon a suspension of the license or permit for a defined period of time. When the committee elects to recommend that a license or permit be renewed with a period of suspension, the license or permit may be suspended for a period of not less than 10 days and no more than 90 days.

- 85-5. Council Action. 1. REPORT TO BE PROVIDED. Within 10 working days after it reaches a decision, the committee shall prepare and serve a report and recommendation upon the applicant and upon the complainant or objector, if any. The report and recommendations shall include specific findings of fact and conclusions of law made by the committee. A copy of the report shall be distributed to each member of the common council.
- 2. FILING WRITTEN STATEMENTS OR RESPONSES. Following a recommendation by the committee that the license or permit not be renewed, or that the license or permit be revoked or suspended, the applicant may submit a written statement including objections, exceptions and arguments of law and fact. When the proceedings have been commenced upon the complaint or objection of an interested party who has appeared and offered evidence, the complainant or objector may also submit awritten statement in response. statements shall be filed with the city clerk before the close of business on a day that is at least 3 working days prior to the date set for hearing by the common council.
- 3. COPIES TO BE PROVIDED TO COMMON COUNCIL MEMBERS. A copy of any statement in response to the report and recommendations of the committee that is timely filed shall be provided to each member of the common council at least 24 hours before any vote on the question is scheduled before the common council.
- 4. PROCEDURE AT MEETING OF THE COMMON COUNCIL. a. At a meeting of the common council following the receipt of the report and recommendations of the committee, the common council shall consider the report and recommendations. The city clerk shall notify the applicant, and the complainant or objector, if any, by United States first class mail, postage prepaid, 5 working days prior to the hearing before the common council, and shall also notify the city attorney, that the council will convene to act upon the report and recommendations.
- b. Each member of the common council shall be asked to affirm that he or she has read the report and recommendations of the committee. When a written statement has been timely filed by the applicant, or by a complainant or objector, each member of the common council shall be asked to affirm that he or she has read the statement. If members of the council have not read the recommendation and report of the committee and any statement in

- response that has been timely filed, the chair shall allocate time for the members to do so.
- c. Oral argument on behalf of the applicant, and oral argument by the complainant or objector, if any, shall be permitted only to those parties having timely filed a written statement. Oral argument shall be limited to 5 minutes. The city attorney shall also be permitted to make an oral presentation of not more than 5 minutes.
- d. Applicants shall appear only in person or by counsel. Corporate applicants shall appear only by designated agents or counsel. Partnerships shall be represented only by a partner or counsel. Limited liability companies shall be represented only by designated agents or counsel. Complainants and objectors shall appear only in person or counsel. Any person making an appearance before the council who requires the services of an interpreter shall obtain one at his or her own expense.
- e. The common council shall determine by a majority roll call vote of those in attendance and voting whether to adopt the recommendation of the committee. The city clerk shall provide written notice of the decision to the applicant, and to the complainant or objector, if any, including a written statement or summary of the reasons for the decision.
- Unless otherwise expressly provided, the revocation of a license or permit shall be effective upon service of the notice of decision upon the applicant or upon any person having charge or control of a licensed premises. Suspension of a license or permit in proceedings for revocation shall be effective upon service of the notice of decision upon the applicant or upon any person having charge or control of a licensed premises. Suspension of a license or permit in proceedings for renewal shall be effective on the date the common council takes action to suspend the license or permit, or on the date of the expiration of the license or permit, whichever is later. A license or permit may be suspended for not less than 10 days and no longer than 90 days.
- g. If a retail alcohol beverage license for a premises is suspended and the licensee also holds a public entertainment premises license for the premises, the public entertainment premises license shall be suspended for the same time period as the alcohol beverage license.

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90-12 Liquor and Tavern Regulations

- At the meeting of the common council, the chair shall allow oral argument by an applicant or complainant who has timely submitted a written statement in response to the recommendations of the licensing committee. The city attorney shall also be permitted a statement. Oral arguments shall not exceed 5 minutes on behalf of any party. Applicants shall appear only in person or by counsel. Corporate applicants shall appear only by the agent or by counsel. Partnerships shall be represented only by a partner or by counsel. Limited liability companies shall be represented only by the agent or by counsel. Complainants shall appear only in person or by counsel. Any person making an appearance before the council pursuant to this subsection and who requires the services of an interpreter shall obtain one at his or her own expense.
- d-3. Prior to voting on the committee's recommendation, all members of the council who are present shall signify that they have read the recommendation and report of the licensing committee and any written statements in response that have been filed thereto. If they have not, the chair shall allocate time for the members to do so. If they have read the report and recommendation, then a roll call vote shall be taken as to whether or not the recommendation of the committee shall be accepted. The applicant shall be provided with written notice of the results of the vote taken by the common council.
- 3. REQUEST TO SURRENDER A LICENSE. See s. 85-17 for provisions relating to the surrender of licenses and the return of surrendered licenses.
- 90-12. Revocation or Suspension of Licenses. 1. CAUSES. Any license issued under this chapter may be suspended or revoked for cause by the common council after notice to the licensee and a hearing. Such licenses shall be suspended or revoked for the following causes:
- a. The making of any material false statement in any application for a license.
- b. The conviction of the licensee, his agent, manager, operator or any other employe for keeping a gambling house or a house of prostitution or any felony related to the licensed operation.

- c. A showing that such licensee has violated any state law or city ordinance prohibiting the sale of intoxicating liquors or fermented malt beverages to underage persons, or to any person intoxicated or bordering on the state of intoxication.
- d. The violation of the provisions in ss. 90-7 through 90-10 and 90-13 through 90-31.
- e. The violation of any of the excise laws of this state.
- f. The licensed premises is operated in such a manner that it constitutes a public or private nuisance or that conduct on the licensed premises, including but not limited to loud and raucous noise, has had a substantial adverse effect upon the health, safety or convenience and prosperity of the immediate neighborhood; or
- g. If the licensee is a corporation or licensed limited partnership, the conviction of the corporate agent, officers, directors, members or any shareholder holding 20% or more of the corporation's total or voting stock, or proxies for that amount of stock, of any of the offenses enumerated in s. 125.12(2)(ag),

Wis. Stats., as amended.

- h. Failure of the licensee to operate the premise in accordance with the floor plan and plan of operation submitted pursuant to s. 90-5-1-c.
- i. For any other reasonable cause which shall be in the best interests and good order of the city.
- 3. STATE LAW APPLICABLE. Except as hereinafter provided, the provisions of ss. 125.12(2)(ag) to (c), Wis. Stats., shall be applicable to proceedings for the suspension and revocation of all licenses granted under this chapter.
- 4. COMMENCEMENT OF PROCEED-INGS. Suspension or revocation proceedings may be instituted by the licensing committee of the common council upon its own motion, or upon sworn written charges made and filed with the city clerk by the chief of police or upon a sworn written complaint filed with the city clerk by any city resident.
- 5. PROCEDURES FOR REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION. a. Complaint; Summons; Report.

- a-1. Whenever either sworn written charges or a sworn written complaint are filed with the city clerk setting forth specific charges against a licensee involving conduct which would violate statutes or ordinances that are grounds for revocation or suspension of a license, the city clerk shall issue a summons, as authorized by Wisconsin statutes, demanding that the licensee appear before the licensing committee, not less than 3 days nor more than 10 days from the date of issuance, to show cause why the license should not be revoked or suspended.
- a-2. A police officer shall serve the summons upon a licensee in accordance with Wisconsin statutes, and shall also serve a copy of the complaint with a copy of this subsection upon the licensee.
- The chief of police shall prepare a a-3. report with information relating to the allegations contained in the written charges or complaint. The report shall first state whether the chief of police has information relating to the allegations contained in the written charges or complaint. The report may be offered and made part of the permanent record of the hearing without motion. Information contained in the report shall be admissible and may be considered by the committee as a public record to the extent that the information in the report sets forth the activities of department personnel, or provides information about matters observed by police personnel under a duty imposed by law, or contains factual findings resulting from an investigation made under authority of law, unless the sources of information or other circumstances indicate lack of trustworthiness. A copy of the report shall be provided to the licensee at least 3 days prior to the time scheduled for appearance upon the summons and complaint.
- b. Committee Hearing. b-1. Upon receipt of evidence that the summons has been served, the licensing committee shall convene at the date and time designated in the summons for the purpose of taking evidence and making findings of fact and conclusions of law and a recommendation to the full common council in connection with the proposed revocation or suspension.
- b-2. If the licensee appears before the committee at the time designated in the summons and denies the charges contained in the complaint, an evidentiary hearing in connection with the revocation or suspension

- shall be conducted by the committee at that time. If the licensee does not appear, or appears but does not deny the charges contained in the complaint, the complaint shall be taken as true and the committee shall hear the arguments of the city attorney and the licensee in connection with the revocation or suspension.
- b-3. The procedure at evidentiary hearing shall be as follows:
- b-3-a. The chief of police or complainant shall first present evidence in support of the complaint. The chief of police or complainant may offer the report prepared under par. a-3.
- b-3-b. After the chief of police or complainant rests, the licensee may present evidence in opposition to the written charges or complaint.
- b-3-c. The chief of police or complainant and the licensee may subpoena and present witnesses. All witnesses shall testify under oath and shall be subject to cross-examination.
- b-3-d. The chief of police or complainant and the licensee shall each be limited to 30 minutes for testimony and oral presentation unless the chair, subject to approval of the committee, extends the time to assure a full and fair presentation.
- b-3-e. Questions by committee members and responses to members' questions shall not be counted against the time limitations.
- b-3-f. At the close of the testimony, the chief of police or complainant and the licensee shall be given a reasonable time to make arguments upon the evidence produced at the hearing.
- b-4. The chair of the licensing committee shall be the presiding officer. The chair shall direct that oaths be administered and subpoenas issued upon request of either side. The chair shall ensure that an orderly hearing is conducted in accordance with the requirements of this subsection. The chair shall rule on objections to the admissibility of evidence. Any ruling of the chair shall be final unless appealed to the committee, and the committee shall reverse such ruling only upon the vote of a majority of its members present and voting.
- b-5. At all stages of the proceedings before the committee or before the common council, the licensee shall be entitled to appear both in person and by an attorney.
- b-6. A record shall be made of all licensing proceedings before the committee and before the common council as provided in s. 85-4-3.
