1. On 07/15/12 at 1:30 am, Milwaukee police officers that were on foot patrol, observed a fight in front of Buckheads Saloon in the street. Officers broke up the fight and had four subjects in custody and one officer observed the doorman of the bar bleeding from the eye. The doorman was identified as Darrell Dixon and investigation revealed that an altercation took place inside the bar with the parties involved being kicked out. The fight continued outside with Dixon attempting to break it up but was accidentally being punched by one of the actors. Citations were issued to the four patrons for disorderly conduct with a battery citation being issued to the patron who punched Dixon.

- On 02/20/2015 Milwaukee police conducted a tavern check at Buckheads Saloon (1044 North Old World Third Street). The officer provided a packet containing tavern related ordinances and discussed procedures to prevent them from being violated.
- 10. On 02/26/2015 a 19 year old Milwaukee police aide, working in conjunction with Milwaukee police, attempted to gain entry to Buck Heads Saloon (1044 North Old World Third Street) but was turned away when she could not produce proof she had attained the legal drinking age of

11. On 05/10/2015 Milwaukee police were flagged down by the manager of Buckhead Saloon (1004 North Old World Third Street) who stated a patron had been hit with a glass and was bleeding badly. Investigation revealed a patron, Bryce Kratzer, of the business attempted to intervene in an incident involving a friend of his. Kratzer was hit in the face with an unknown object by an unknown suspect. Kratzer received over 100 stitches to his face as a result of this incident. Milwaukee police incident report #151300007 filed. During this investigation, it Kratzer was under the legal drinking age of 21. Kratzer was cited for possession of alcohol beverages by underage person and misrepresentation of age.

- 12. On 07/12/2015 Milwaukee police responded to an accident at North Old World Third Street and East Juneau Avenue. One of the involved parties, Alezandra Duarte whose birthday is 12/20/1994, identified herself as an employee of Buckheads Saloon and stated she had hit a bus. Duarte told the officer she had been drinking while working at Buckheads and was subsequently arrested for operating while intoxicated. On 07/16/2016, the officer went to Buckheads Saloon (1044 North Old World Third Street) and spoke to manager Michael Albanese. Albanese confirmed that Duarte had worked the night of July 11th to July 12th. The officer asked Albanese what the bars policy is for letting underage employees drink alcohol while working and was told they usually allow underage employees to have one or two drinks while they work. On 07/18/2015, the officer received a phone call from the applicant who fired as a result of this incident.
- 13. On 08/07/2015 a 20 year old Milwaukee police aide, working in conjunction with Milwaukee police, attempted to gain entry to 1044 North Old World Third Street (Buckheads) but was challenged at the point of entry and turned away when she could not produce proof she had attained the legal drinking age of 21.
- 14. On 01/16/2016 Milwaukee police were flagged down at 1044 North Old World Third Street by a subject, Cody Crangle, who stated he had been pepper sprayed by security staff at the Red, White and Blue tavern. Investigation revealed Crangle had been a patron at the bar and refused to leave the premise at bar close. After becoming argumentative and refused to leave when instructed by security. Security began to physically remove Crangle and began to physically resist security at which time Crangle was sprayed with pepper spray. Crangle left the location and came back. When he returned he began to pund on the door and threaten to time. Crangle received medical attention and was cited.

This report is written by PO Christopher MARTIN, assigned to District 1, Power Shift.

On Sunday, May 10, 2015, at approximately 12:45A, Sq. 1420 (PO Neil VERBURGT and I) was flagged down by the manager (Shaun A THOMPSON, W/M, 09-21-1982, 3248 N Knoil TR, Wauwatosa, WI 53222, PH# 414-333-7518) of Buckheads Saloon (1044 N Old World Third St.) who stated that a patron inside his bar was hit with glass and is bleeding badly inside the bathroom.

We proceeded to Buckheads Saloon and walked into the men's bathroom when I observed a W/M, later identified as Bryce E KRATZER (W/M, 06/25/94, 1434 N Humboldt Av, PH# 414-460-1713) holding a white towel to his face. I asked KRATZER to remove the towel, at which time I observed several severe lacerations to KRATZER's face, one on the bridge of his nose and one under his left eye. I observed several smaller lacerations on his face also. I called for medical attention for KRATZER.

I asked KRATZER what had occurred, he stated he saw his friend getting angry with another guy, at which time, he walked over to try calm him down and separate the two, when he was hit with a glass in the face. KRATZER stated he has no idea who hit him and was unable to give me a description of the actor.

I asked KRATZER for an identification card, at which time, he provided me his wallet. Prior to this, KRATZER did provide me with his first name of Bryce. I opened the wallet and observed a photo identification card of a person by the name of Joey A KNIGHT (W/M, 08/20/1990, 6102 W. Martin Dr, Wauwatosa, WI 53213). I looked at this photo and right away could tell this was not KRATZER. I continued to look through his wallet and located KRATZER's identification card in the back of his wallet behind credit cards. I asked KRATZER how old he was, and he stated that he was under the age of 21. I asked KRATZER if he had been drinking inside the bar, and he stated that he had a couple drinks.

I asked THOMPSON to show me the video from inside the tavern, at which time he took me into the back office and showed me the video. The video shows the suspect (W/M, 20's, LSW: a blue checkered shirt and dark khaki pants, with a light blue baseball hat with a dark brim) push another a white male. When that occurred KRATZER went towards the suspect, then everyone went out of camera range besides KRATZER's face. That is when KRATZER was hit with an unknown object, which caused him to start bleeding right away. THOMPSON allowed us to burn a copy of the video.

i asked THOMPSON to show me where this incident occurred, and he stated that his bar staff had already cleaned up the glass and put bleach down where the blood was. THOMPSON took me to where this incident occurred, and the scene was already cleaned up. This incident took place on the dance floor.

I placed the video on INV# 15016284

I placed the photo identification card that was most likely used to get into the bar on INV# 15016291

KRATZER received over 100 stitches as a result of this incident.

This report is written by PO Christopher MARTIN, assigned to District 1, Power Shift.

On Sunday, July 12, 2015, at approximately 2:49A, Sq. 1420 (PO Yanh LEE and I) responded to an accident at N. Old World Third St and E. Juneau Av.

Upon arrival to the accident, I observed the W/F later identified as Alexandra K DUARTE (W/F, 12/20/94) in the driver's seat of the vehicle with the vehicle still running. I asked DUARTE what happened at which time she stated that she hit a bus. I observed DUARTE to have blood shot eyes and talked with slurred speech. I advised DUARTE to turn the vehicle for off at which time she did. DUARTE stated that she works at Buckheads Saloon and had two drinks of 44 North. DUARTE stated that she had been drinking while working at Buckheads. Once I had Duarte step out of the vehicle I observed her to be very uneasy on her feet and swaying back and forth. I could smell a strong odor of intoxicants on her breath as we had a conversation.

I had DUARTE perform SFST and she failed. DUARTE was taken into custody for OWI.

On Thursday, July 16, 2015, I went to Buckheads Saloon located at 1044 N Old World Third St. and spoke to a Manager identified as (MIchael P ALBANESE (W/M, 09-01-92, 322 W State St., PH# 708-819-2232)) I asked him if DUARTE had worked on July 11th into July 12th and he did confirm that she had been working that night. I asked ALBANESE what is the bars policy for letting underage employees drink alcoholic drinks while working and he stated that they usually allow underage employees to have one or two drinks, while they work.

On Saturday, July 18, 2015, I received a phone call from Seth A DEHNE who is part owner of Buckheads. DEHNE stated that underage employees are not allowed to drink while working. DEHNE stated that he would be firing DUARTE as a result of this incident.

This report is written by Police Officer Mariolys Flores, assigned to District One, Late Power Shift.

On the evening of Friday, August 7, 2015 through the morning of Saturday, August 8, 2015 District One personnel performed an underage tavern enforcement initiative. There were three teams that were part of this initiative. Each team had an MPD Police Aide, a Police Officer, both of which were acting in a plainclothes capacity with a uniformed Police Officer or Sergeant monitoring from a short distance. The Police Aide for each team was under the age of 21. This was verified by their respective Wisconsin driver's license. Police Aide Laura Nirode (PS 024687, DOB 06/15/95), Police Aide Elizabeth Sauer (PS 024693, DOB 08/11/1994), PA Chelsey McDowell (PS 024685, DOB 08/16/94), PO Karlee Kennon (PS 021519), PO Dorian Andress (PS 019758) and PO Kira Williams (PS 019786) were in plainclothes while PO Mariolys Flores (PS 024325), PO Zachary Johnson (PS 022614) and Sergeant Thomas Ackley (PS 018520) were in full uniform.

Prior to attempting any checks of licensed establishments the Police Aides and Police Officers were given instructions. All plainclothes members of this initiative were advised they are not allowed to consume any intoxicating beverages. If asked about their age, the members were told to tell the truth. The Police Officers were directed to produce ID's, but the underage Police Aides were directed to not produce any form of identification. It was explained that the Police Aide was to order an alcoholic beverage. It was explained that at all times the plainclothes Police Officer should be in visual sight and observe the financial transaction for alcoholic beverages. All plainclothes members of this initiative submitted a sample of their breath to a PBT test before and after the Initiative. All members registered 0.0% BAC.

After the briefing, the teams conducted underage checks at multiple taverns and convenient stores located throughout the District One boundaries.

Police Officer Dorian Andress and Police Aide Laura Nirode attempted to gain entry to the class "B" licensed tavern, BuckHeads located at 1044 N. Old World Third St. Police Aide Nirode was challenged at the point of entry and turned away when she couldn't provide identification.

On Thursday, August 20, 2015, Police Officer Chritopher Martin informed Seth Dehne that they passed. While at the tavern, P.O. Martin asked Dehne if they had an ID scanner, at which time Dehne replied that they did not.

This report is submitted by P.O. Joshua POST, who is assigned to District One, Late-Power shift.

On Saturday, 01-16-16 at 2:32AM, Squad 1440 (P.O. Mariolys FLORES and I) was flagged down at 1044 N. Old World Third St. by a subject, who was later identified as Cody J. CRANGLE (W/M, 02-92).

CRANGLE informed me that he had just been pepper-sprayed by the security staff at the Red, White & Blue tavern at that location. CRANGLE complained of burning to his face and I requested medical attention to the scene for him. While awaiting medical, CRANGLE became increasingly upset and began acting in a loud and boisterous manner. CRANGLE began shouting obscenities at me, creating a disturbance on a public street. It was apparent that CRANGLE was under the influence of alcoholic beverage. Because of his demeanor, I detained CRANGLE by placing him in handcuffs. CRANGLE was then escorted into Bell 415 for treatment of his medical complaint.

I then spoke with Tactical Response Security Officer Jennifer L. TEUMER (W/F, 08-07-92). TEUMER stated that on today's date, at approximately 2:20AM, she was facilitating the removal of patrons at bar close. TEUMER stated that at that time, she identified CRANGLE as a patron in the tavern. TEUMER stated that CRANGLE was told that he needed to leave the tavern. TEUMER stated that CRANGLE argued and refused to leave. As such, TEUMER stated that it became necessary for her and other security personnel to physically remove CRANGLE from the tavern.

TEUMER stated that CRANGLE physically resisted being removed from the tavern and because of this, she administered a one-second spray of her equipped pepper-spray towards the ground. TEUMER stated that CRANGLE continued to argue as he was forcibly removed from the tavern. TEUMER stated that upon his removal, CRANGLE initially began walking away from the tavern, but then returned. TEUMER stated that upon his return to the front entrance doors of the tavern, CRANGLE began pounding on the door and calling her names like "cunt, bitch, whore and slut". TEUMER stated that CRANGLE then threatened to kill her. TEUMER stated that this caused her to fear for her safety. TEUMER stated that she re-initiated contact with CRANGLE and administered another one-second spray of pepper-spray towards the ground.

TEUMER showed me the pepper-spray that she used on CRANGLE and it was labeled as Pepper-Spray Fogger brand, Pepper Shot, SER#11109, 2 million scoville heat units.

P.O. FLORES spoke with Red, White & Blue Manager Jacob E. DEHNE (W/M, 02-18-77), who informed her that their surveillance cameras were not functioning at the time of this incident.

Upon returning to CRANGLE, he was still upset and argumentative. I observed that there was redness to his eyes and they appeared watery. However, CRANGLE refused to be treated by Bell 415. CRANGLE was informed that he would receive a citation via the mail and was subsequently released from the scene.



On March 29th, 2015 at apooximaltey 12:55AM, while assigned to Squad 1320, I was dispatched along with Squad 1331 P.O. Paul GEITTMANN, to meet Squad 1410 Sgt. Thomas ACKELY regarding a Fight

Upon arrival I observed squad 1411 (Sgt. Thomas Ackley) already on scene near the intersection on N. Milwaukee St. and E. Mason St. Sgt. Ackley appeared to have two females, later identified as Sherika J. Haynes (b/f 03-09-87), and Lisa B. HAYNES (b/f 08-23-65) in custody.

P.O. GEITTMANN then informed me that he spoke with the victim, Mohamed B. Taleb (W/M 6/20/88), told him that the two deatained females were using his credit card without his permission. TALEB stated that prior to police arriving he comfortmed the females inside Catch 22 about taking his debit card. TALEB stated that an argument started and continued outside. During this argument, a bartender at Catch 22 Thomas E. Zamjahn (W/M 6/17/85) observed the two females then attacked TALEB and start physically fighting on the sidewalk, until Police arrived.

TALEB further explained that while he was at Taylor's Bar, 795 N. Jefferson St. earlier in the evening. the two blacks females, approached him. He stated that they both put their arms around his waste and pulled him closer to them. He stated one of them, he could not remember which, said to him "baby why don't you come home with us?" TALEB stated that he told them that he was not interested and they walked away and immediately left the bar. TALEB stated that about ten seconds later he noticed that his wallet was missing out of his front right pocket and he suspected that the two females had taken the wallet.

TALEB stated that he saw the two females leave and followed them as they left, eventually getting to Catch 22 on N. Milwaukee St. TALEB stated that as he got there he saw one of the females about to use his credit card to pay for drinks but he did not remember which female he saw. He stated that he then went into the bar and told the staff that the females were using his credit card.

During the invesitgation,P.O. GEITTMANN spoke with the barthender at Catch 22, Alexander GROVE (W/M 11/24/82) who stated that the two females came into the bar and ordered two drinks. One of the females, whom he identified as Lisa HAYNES, handed him a credit card to pay for the drinks. He stated that he did swipe the card, which resulted in it being charged for the drinks, and handed it back to her. He stated that Lisa HAYNES then signed the receipt and gave it back to him. It was just after this that he was informed by TALEB that the credit card was actually his.

Lisa HAYNES and Sherika HAYNES were arrested and charges referred to the District Attorney. (ARS 15-088-0021, 15-088-0013)

There were three teams that were part of this initiative. The Police Aide for each team was under the age of 21. This was verified by their respective Wisconsin driver's license. Police Aide Laura Nirode (PS 024687, DOB 06/15/95), Police Aide Elizabeth Sauer (PS 024693, DOB 08/11/1994), PA Chelsey McDowell (PS 024685, DOB 08/16/94), PO Karlee Kennon (PS 021519), PO Dorian Andress (PS 019758) and PO Kira Williams (PS 019786) were in plainclothes while PO Mariolys Flores (PS 024325), PO Zachary Johnson (PS 022614) and Sergeant Thomas Ackley (PS 018520) were in full uniform.

All plainclothes members of this initiative submitted a sample of their breath to a PBT test before and after the initiative. All members registered 0.0% BAC.

After the briefing, the teams conducted underage checks at multiple taverns and convenient stores located throughout the District One boundaries.

Police Officer Kira Williams and Police Aide Elizabeth Sauer attempted to gain entry to the class "B" licensed tavern, Taylor's located at 795 N. Jefferson St. Police Aide Sauer was challenged at the point of entry and turned away when she couldn't provide identification.

On Wednesday, August 19, 2015 at 2:37 a.m., Police Officer Zachary Johnson informed Colin Philipps, assistant general manager that they passed. While at the tavern, P.O. Johnson asked Philipps if they had an ID scanner, at which time Philipps replied that they did not.

On Saturday December 12, 2015, P.O. Daniel O'CONNELL was assigned to Squad 1396, Municipal Court security. At approximately 3:23 am, the victim (Matthew A RUSCH) walked into the Municipal Court entrance to report a battery. Also present with RUSCH was his girlfriend, Amy J SCHULDT.

RUSCH stated that he was struck in the face at bar time while inside Taylor's, a bar located in the City and County of Milwaukee at 795 N Jefferson St, by Justin M MORALEZ. SCHULDT explained that MORALEZ had been pursuing a romantic relationship with her for approximately two years and was jealous of the romantic relationship between RUSCH and SCHULDT. SCHULDT stated the relationship between she and MORALEZ had never been anything other than a friendship.

SCHULDT explained that she and a friend had been at an event downtown and then went to Taylor's after the event had ended. SCHULDT and her friend arrived at approximately 12:30 am and happened to see MORALEZ along with a group of male friend's of SCHULDT's. SCHULDT explained that MORALEZ had become intertwined into her group of friends in the past two years and occasionally saw each other at gatherings. SCHULDT stated that she made small talk with MORALEZ and her friends after she had arrived at the bar.

RUSCH stated he arrived at Taylor's at approximately 1:30 am and immediately noticed MORALEZ outside of the bar. RUSCH remarked that MORALEZ appeared to be staring him down as he entered the bar. RUSCH stated that MORALEZ was jealous because RUSCH was in a romantic relationship with SCHULDT and MORALEZ wanted to be in RUSCH's position. SCHULDT explained that she told MORALEZ that she was meeting RUSCH here and wanted to spend her time with him only. SCHULDT remarked that MORALEZ appeared to be upset when she told him.

RUSCH explained that after he had arrived at the bar, he and MORALEZ had no interaction. RUSCH stated that at bar time, he began to exit the bar to meet SCHULDT outside to grab a ride home. RUSCH alleges that MORALEZ stopped him from exiting the bar and without saying a word; MORALEZ struck him in the face without his consent. RUSCH stated that as MORALEZ fled, he struck MORALEZ. MORALEZ then fled down the street to a cab and left in an unknown direction.

RUSCH stated that he and SCHULDT came to the district station to file a report regarding the incident. BELL 415 provided brief medical care to RUSCH's wounds. P.O. Jeremy LIMBERG took photos of the victim's wounds.

I (P.O. Daniel ZOLO) conveyed RUSCH and SCHULDT to Aurora Saint Luke's hospital. RUSCH was admitted to the hospital at 5:07 am and was treated by Dr. William Lieber. RUSCH received two stitches under the care of Dr. Lieber
