Pastor Joe H. Todd was born and raised in Pastoria, Arkansas. He received his formal education at Jackmon Elementary School and Sherrill Jr. High School. After leaving Arkansas in 1955, he moved to Chicago, Illinois and worked as a truck assistant for Clemens Cottage. He moved to Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 1956. From 1957-1959 he worked as a welder for the Falk Corporation. In 1965 he attended the Milwaukee School of Engineering where he received his credentials to become a Certified Welder. In 1959 he was employed by Crucible Steel as a welder until 1968.

In 1968 he worked as a welder for Caterpillar Tractor Company until his retirement in 1985.

After obeying God's call, he preached his first public sermon on April 8, 1979 and was ordained as a minister of the Gospel on November 8, 1980. On December 17, 1983 Ephesians Missionary Baptist Church was founded by Pastor Joe H. Todd. He currently serves as a spiritual leader for eight (8) other Pastors in the Milwaukee-Chicago area. Rev. Roy Hopgood, Mt. Horeb Missionary Baptist Church; Rev. Roy Watson, Monumental Missionary Baptist Church; Rev. Robert Redd, Christ Kingdom Missionary Baptist Church; Rev. George Jolly, Mt. Pilgrim Missionary Baptist Church; Rev. Odell Johnson, All Saints Fellowship Church; Rev. Andre Hopson, Greater Philippians Missionary Baptist Church; Rev. Chenier Alston, New Israelite Baptist Church, and Rev. Edward Thomas of Victory Missionary Baptist Church. He has preached the gospel both nationally and internationally.

Pastor Todd led members of his congregation to build a multi-million dollar campus on West Meinecke Avenue which also includes the Learning Center located at 2412 North 6th Street. Pastor Todd has always had a heart and natural compassion for individuals in need. He used his love for teaching and his heart to help and in 1988 he began counseling recovering addicts at the Renew Counseling and Harambee Center for five (5) years. While leading the Ephesians Missionary Baptist Church he has imparted his compassion for others onto his parishioners.

He has led those to impact many local entities, such as prisons, food banks, homeless shelters (Repairers of the Breach), Sunrise, Wells Springs and Golden Living Colonial Manor Nursing Homes, and monthly community outreach. Ephesians has also hosted an annual job fair, Angel Tree organization that gives gifts during the Christmas holiday to children of incarcerated parents. A food drive, clothing drive, a Thanksgiving and Christmas meal for the community, and a community fair which feature games, food, and a blood drive. In helping our community, we also focused our efforts on education by distributing book bags and school supplies to those in need and establishing the Rodney Cokes Scholarship Fund that gives a monthly stipend to college students.

In 2006 Pastor Todd envisioned an establishment that could provide quality childcare while employing those in the community. With this in mind he established the Kingdom Kids Childcare Center that held a capacity of 70 children with 12 employees. He has given those that were incarcerated the opportunity to rebuild their lives by giving them employment.

With more than thirty (30) years of service already provided, Pastor Joe H. Todd strives to enhance the communities of Milwaukee through his various works. He continues to counsel, instruct and uplift those who cross his path. Pastor Joe H. Todd is nearing his 79th birthday and he is still thriving and continuing to enhance the lives of others along with his wife Erma of 60 years through the grace of God.
