- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.



The guards stated they had detained two subjects who entered the tavern after being told they couldn't because the tavern was closed. The subjects had to be physically removed from the tavern and were detained outside of the bar. Officers issued trespassing citations to both subjects.

- 15. On 12/18/08 at 3:15 pm, Milwaukee police pulled up to the All Star Sports Club and observed an unknown subject who was at the front door run back into the tavern upon seeing police and locked the door. Officers looked through the windows but were unable to see anyone or get a response as they knocked on the door. Officers contacted DNS Inspector Matt Damma who responded to the location within 15 minutes. It was then that Jennie Nuell walked out from the bar and when asked who ran into the tavern when officers arrived, Nuell stated no one. Officers conduct a protective search of the bar when Marcus Nuell began walking down the stairs from the upper area of the bar. Police could smell a strong odor of burned marijuana. Upon further investigation, police checked the upper portion of the bar and found a subject trying to conceal himself in a bedroom. This subject was identified as Eddie Nuell. Also found in the bedroom were brown cigar wraps suspected to contain marijuana. The wraps were confiscated and later tested positive for marijuana. On 06/02/2016, Marcus Neuell and a Laticia Mccarver were sitting on the steps of All Stars Sports Bar (4001 West Fond Du Lac Avenue) when they were approached by two unknown subjects who displayed a firearm and demanded property. This report was written by P.O. Brian LaROQUE, assigned to District Seven, Late Power Shift. On 6/1/16 at 12:11am I responded to 4001 W Fond Du Lac Av, (All Stars Sports Bar) to conduct a tavern check. I was working with P.O. Douglas PAVLIK and Squad 7466 (P.O. Michael MARTIN and P.O. Tiara SHEETS-WALKER) and 7469 (P.O. Michael VALUCH and P.O. Matthew TERPSTRA) also responded to the location.

Upon making entry into the tavern I observed two black females being ushered to the upstairs apartment by a member of the security staff. One of the females, later identified as Lashaun Y JONES (B/F, 1/20/91), was completely nude and Alexis S THOMPSON (B/F, 5/9/93) was wearing pasties over her nipples. A third female, Jayla N DAVENPORT (B/F, 10/19/95) was located in the upstairs apartment. Upon speaking with DAVENPORT she informed P.O. VALUCH that they come to the bar and are required to pay the bar before they can perform for tips.

During the investigation I spoke with Marcus A NUELL (B/M, 6/17/85) who is the son of the owner Jennie M NUELL (W/F, 9/1/59). Marcus does not have a valid Class B Manager's License nor does he have a valid Class D Bartender's License. The bartender working was identified as Lazella N SNOWDEN (B/F, 6/27/83) and she informed me that she had a Class D Bartender's License but that it expired in 2014.

During the investigation I learned that there was not a responsible person with a valid manager or bartenders license on scene. The tavern was shut down at this point to complete the investigation. I also did not observe any posted sign with the taverns cover charge for the night. I was informed that the tavern was charging a cover charge of \$5.00.

## Phase 1 Observations outside the location

#### **VEHICLES:**

Vehicles were legally parked in the parking lot of the tavern and on the roadway of W Fond Du Lac Av.

I observed one patron outside of the bar seated on the steps at the time of our arrival.

I informed her on 6/2/16 during a separate incident that her son Marcus was promoting "Butt Naked Tuesdays" and that it was to occur every Tuesday.

Jennie stated that Marcus informed her of this on 6/1/16 but that she was not aware of the other postings regarding the "Butt Naked Tuesdays" promotions.

Marcus was on scene and I informed him that he was closed for the night due to the violations and of the violations I observed. I informed Marcus of the cover charge not being posted and he showed me his front sign where it appeared that they wrote "Cover Charge" in light colored ink or marker on the existing signage. I informed Marcus that it was not adequate and that he also needs to include the cover charge price. It should be noted that I informed Jennie of this requirement on 5/19/16 during a separate tavern check I conducted. During this visit the only violation I observed was the cover charge noted posted. I informed Jennie that they could post a piece of paper with the cover charge amount hand written on it to be in compliance. When leavening the tavern on 5/19/16 security waved a female past

On Friday, October 09, 2015, I was assigned to Squad 7490. At approximately 2:34am, on Saturday, October 10, 2015, my partner, PO Shannon CANNESTRA, Squad 7392 and I were dispatched to 4001 W Fond du lac Ave for a Shots fire complaint.

Upon arrival, I observed the victim, Quincy M PRICE, M/B, 3/27/77, walking south across Fond du lac Ave. with blood all over his face and chest area. I also observed several scratches on his chest and head area. I contacted medical via radio for PRICE. I spoke with PRICE, who seemed to be very intoxicated by alcohol due to his slurred speech. PRICE stated that at approximately 2:15am, he was existing from All Star Bar at 4001 W Fond du lac Ave when he heard a loud commotion of several people arguing. PRICE stated before he knew it, he was in between a fight with several men and women. PRICE stated that it was approximately four females and one male. PRICE was not able to give me a description of any of the actors. PRICE stated that he had pain to his chest and head area. Engine 13, Red Shift, Captain HOUSE, arrived on scene. My partner CANNESTRA followed PRICE to the St. Joseph's Hospital where he was admitted at approximately 3:21 am by Lisa HUBBARD and received twelve stitches to his face.

PO CANNESTRA also debriefed me that when she arrived to St. Joseph's Hospital with PRICE she was notified about a second victim, Aaron BRADY, M/B, 10/11/77, who was also very intoxicated and didn't remember how he got to the hospital. CANNESTRA stated that BRADY stated he got caught in between several men and women arguing and fighting. I was told by PO CANNESTRA that BRADY had a small laceration on his nose and a puncture wound on the rear right side of his head. BRADY received sixteen stitches to his injuries. I was informed by PO CANNESTRA that BRADY stated that his injuries were done without consent.

PO CANNESTRA took 27 photos. See her supplemental report regarding.

On October 16th, 2015, at approximately 8:10pm, I went to to All Star Bar and spoke with owner, Jennie M NUELL, F/W, 9/1/59, by phone who stated that she was working on the night of October 10, 2015. NUELL stated that business went as normal and that she locked her bar at approximately 2:00am. NUELL stated she did not observed any fighting. NUELL stated that I was not able to get the footage of the incident on October 10, 2015 due to the video space being recorded over since the incident happened seven days ago.

This report was written by P.O. Brian LaROQUE, assigned to District Seven, Late Power Shift. On Saturday, August 13, 2016 at 2:43 am. I responded to 4001 W Fond Du Lac Av (All Stars Sports Bar and Grill) regarding a shooting investigation.

Upon my arrival I observed that there were two individuals lying in the parking lot of the tavern just outside of the main entrance and it appeared that they both had been shot. There were several citizens in the area regarding this incident and they stated several times that they had been shot.

I observed that one of the victims was not breathing and did not have a pulse. I also observed that the other victim on scene had been shot to the chest. I began CPR on the victim who was not breathing and was later assisted by other officers and MFD. The victim died despite our life saving efforts.

The victim who was shot to the chest was transported to the hospital where he later succumbed to his injuries. There were an additional two shooting victims that were transported from the scene to the hospital prior to my arrival on scene. Both of these additional victims were in serious condition. It should be noted that upon review of the security camera footage it appears that the suspect in the shooting comes from inside of the tavern and does not go to a vehicle prior to drawing his gun and shooting four people. This leads me to the conclusion that the suspect was inside of the tavern with the firearm in his possession prior to the incident.

This is an ongoing investigation and for additional information please refer to the incident report.

I noted that the time I arrived on scene was 2:43am, which is 13 minutes past bar close. I also noted that there were several vehicles still in the parking lot at the time of my arrival. Several individuals were still inside of the tavern but I am not aware if they were employees or customers.

On Thursday 08/18/16 at 1:00PM, a meeting with the owner, Jennie NUELL, License Investigations Unit Sgt. RADEN, CLO PO D. PIERCE, CPU PO J. BELONGIA, City Attorney N. DeSATIO, Safe & Sound member, S. LABOTT held at District 7 Police Station conference room.

J. NUELL was very cooperative to the meeting and openly discussed the two shooting incidents that resulted in three individuals injured and two homicides. NUELL stated that she is placing the business up for sale and does not want to be involved any more with the bar. NUELL stated that she has an minimum age of 25 for her patrons and the average age is approximately 35 years old. NUELL stated that the former owner, a Mr. PARKER, is no longer affiliated with the business in any manner. NUELL stated that she purchased a four camera system and gave it to the church across the street to possibly have them placed on the building with some of the cameras pointed at bar.

NUELL stated that the busiest nights are Wednesday (Ladies Night), Friday and Saturday. In discussing how the bar determines if a patron is on the banded from the bar &, who retains that list. NUELL stated that she has no physical list or book but she remembers who was kicked out.

Sgt. RADEN, made a suggestion that perhaps she should consider a professional security company for outdoor security. NUELL seemed open to the idea of private security.

NUELL was issued a nuisance letter for the bar by PO PIERCE.

The meeting concluded at approximately 2:15PM.

Re: Notice of Nuisance Premises

Dear Jennie Nuell:

This letter is notice to you that the Milwaukee Chief of Police, by the chief's designee, the district commander, has determined that the premises located at 4001 W. Fond du Lac Avenue ("the premises") is a nuisance pursuant to Milwaukee Code of Ordinances ("MCO") § 80-10, Chronic Nuisance Premises.

The Milwaukee Police Department has responded to the following described nuisance activities at the premises on the corresponding dates, which qualify the premises as a nuisance:

- 1. On October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2015 at 2:35am a call was placed to the Milwaukee Police Department regarding a fight at 4001 W. Fond du Lac Avenue. Police officers were sent to the location and during the investigation it was determined that a patron was struck by unknown patrons while attempting to leave All Star Sports Bar. That patron received a laceration that required medical attention. This incident was given Milwaukee Police Incident Number #15-283-0022. This is a violation of MCO 80-10-2-c-1-k.
- 2. On July 21<sup>st</sup>, 2016 at 1:41am a call was placed to the Milwaukee Police Department regarding a shooting complaint at 4001 W. Fond du Lac Avenue. Multiple police officers were dispatched and upon arrival located a subject who had been shot in the torso. According to multiple witnesses shots were fired towards the premise and then subjects leaving the premise fired back. The subject who was the victim of the shooting was caught in the middle of crossfire as he was seated on his motorcycle. This incident was given Milwaukee Police Incident Number #16-203-0015. This is a violation of MCO 80-10-2-c-1-k and 80-10-2-c-1-L.
- 3. On August 13<sup>th</sup>, 2016 at 2:40am a call was placed to the Milwaukee Police Department regarding a shooting complaint at 4001 W. Fond du Lac Avenue. Multiple police officers were dispatched and upon arrival located multiple subjects who had been shot. Upon speaking to witnesses the victims had been standing outside of the premise when approached by a subject. This subject produced a hand gun and began to fire towards the victims. In total four victims had been shot, two died as a result. This incident was given Milwaukee Police Incident Number #16-226-0019. This is a violation of MCO 80-10-2-c-1-k and 80-10-2-c-1-L.

As a consequence, the premises may be subject to a special charge for the cost of future enforcement for any of the nuisance activities listed in MCO § 80-10-2-c that occur at the

premises. Residential rental properties may be subject to an inspection by the Department of Neighborhood Services for compliance with the building maintenance and zoning code pursuant to MCO § 200-53.

You are directed to respond to my office within 10 days of receipt of this notice with an acceptable, written course of action that you will undertake to abate the nuisance activities occurring at the premises, or file an appeal. You may appeal this nuisance determination to the Administrative Review Appeals Board. Any appeal must be in writing and a processing fee will be charged. Please contact the Office of the City Clerk at (414) 286-2231 for additional information.

If you elect to provide a written course of action, I shall evaluate it to determine if it is a reasonable attempt at abating the nuisance activity.

Prior to responding with a written course of action, it is highly recommended that you obtain records relating to police responses regarding the premises. You may obtain these records from the Computer Aided Dispatch System (CADS) at the Open Records Section of the Milwaukee Police Department (District Three Station, 2333 North 49<sup>th</sup> Street, Second Floor) between 8:00 AM and 3:45 PM. There is a cost of 25 cents per page for these records.

Once you are able to determine the type of nuisance activity occurring at the premises, please review the following examples of nuisance abatement measures that you may include in your written course of action to abate the nuisance activity. These suggestions are not exclusive, may not apply to the particular premises, and you may propose other nuisance abatement measures that would be appropriate under your particular circumstances.

- Participate in the Department of Neighborhood Services' Landlord Training Program and make a good faith effort to apply the knowledge from the course and attend refresher classes. Information on this training program may be obtained by calling (414) 286-2954.
- Exchange names and telephone numbers with the owners and operators of neighboring premises.
- Participate in a local block watch, neighborhood association, landlord compact and property management association.
- Attend the monthly crime prevention meetings conducted by the local Milwaukee Police District Community Liaison Officer who can be contacted at CLO Phone Number.
- Institute the use of written screening criteria that are provided to each applicant at the time each proposed adult resident receives a written application; and, conduct background checks of all prospective adult tenants and residents.
- Institute the use of a written lease for each adult tenant that include provisions relating to disorderly behavior, noise, garbage disposal, use of common areas, illegal activity, tenant responsibility for guest conduct, and the prohibition of sub-leasing and long-term guests. Timely enforce any lease violations.
- Review the tenancies of all the current residents in the property. This may include the termination of tenancies and reapplication by existing tenants for new tenancy.
- Regularly inspect the interior of the property to confirm that the residents are your tenants, confirm that the premises are actually used as a residence, and to determine if the

doors and windows have been fortified or the premises outfitted with surveillance or delivery mechanisms.

- Monitor the property for evidence of drug activity. This may include observation of clear corner cuts of baggies strewn about, excessive quantities of plastic sandwich baggies found in odd places, presence of numerous weight scales or communication devices and drug paraphernalia such as unusual pipes, empty cigar wrappers, burned hollow tubes, etc.
- Install "No Loitering" signs in the front and rear of the exterior of the property. This signage permits police to cite loitering individuals in the yard and sidewalk area.
- Install "No Trespassing" signs in the front and rear of the exterior of the property. This signage permits police to cite trespassers in commercial properties.
- Install a sign with your name and contact information in a common area requesting law enforcement contact you if they are responding to a call for service at the premises.
- Record all rental properties owned by you with the Department of Neighborhood Services as required by local ordinance.
- Participate in the E-Notify system for email updates regarding the premises.
- Regularly file open records requests for Milwaukee Police Department Computer Aided Dispatch System (CADS) reports regarding the property.
- Institute a standing complaint with the local Milwaukee Police district station that will allow the police department to remove any individuals loitering on the property.
- Draft and serve a no trespassing order against identified nuisance persons and provide the local police district station a copy of the served order.
- Provide the local police district station with an updated current tenant list.

If you propose a course of action which is rejected by me or fail to timely respond to this request, and a subsequent nuisance activity occurs on or after 13 days after receipt of this notice, the premises will be subject to placement of a special charge as a lien on the property by the Commissioner of the Department of Neighborhood Services for the cost of any police services and enforcement.

Once you have been billed for the costs of police services and enforcement for three or more separate nuisance activities within one year of the date of this notice of nuisance premises, the premises may be designated a chronic nuisance, pursuant to MCO § 80-10-6, and each and every subsequent incident of nuisance activity at the premises may be deemed a separate violation and result in a citation being issued to you for failure to abate the nuisance activity. Each citation would subject you to a forfeiture of not less than \$1,000.00 or more than \$5,000.00. Upon default of payment of a chronic nuisance citation you would be subject to imprisonment in the county jail or house of correction for a period of not less than 40 days or more than 90 days for each violation.
