## Department's Accomplishments by Year-end

- The department ran an on-going public education campaign relating to the changes in election law, most notably the photo ID requirement.
- The department will have entered or updated over 100,000 voter registrations.
- The department received 25,000 requests for "by-mail" absentee ballots.
- The department will have facilitated voting for approximately 75,000 "in-person" absentee voters.
- The department will have administered voting at over a dozen residential care facilities.
- The department will have trained over 3,000 election workers.
- The department will have managed all logistics related to the election day operations of nearly 200 voting sites.
- The department served as the filing agent for 67 candidates running for office and provided oversight of the campaign finance reporting requirements for nearly 90 filers.


## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The following information provides an update on important factors relating to the Election Commission:
Wisconsin Senate Bill 295
Senate Bill 295, enacted February 9, 2016, permits a qualified elector to register to vote electronically, eliminates the position and responsibilities of special registration deputies, and requires the Government Accountability Board (GAB) to enter into agreements with other state election administrators to share information related to the registration and voting of qualified electors.

## Special Registration Deputy Program

The Special Registration Deputy Program will be eliminated in 2017. The program achieved approximately 1,600 sworn Special Registration Deputies (SRDs) for the 2015-2016 term. SRDs support the department's efforts to register people without internet access, students, seniors, people living in poverty and first-time voters. SRDs conduct door-todoor registration, staff tables at festivals and street fairs, and work collaboratively in high schools, colleges, universities and nursing homes to register voters.

## Electronic Voter Registration

A qualified elector who has a current valid driver's license or identification card issued by the Department of Transportation may register to vote in an election electronically on a secure Internet site maintained by GAB. A qualified elector enters the same information that appears on the current registration from and authorizes DOT to forward a copy of his or her electronic signature to GAB. The authorization affirms that all information provided by the elector is correct and has the same effect as if the elector signed the form personally. The electronic registration must be completed no later than the $20^{\text {th }}$ day before election in order to be valid for that election.
