



Departmental Budget Appropriation Category







Net salary savings projected for 2017 resulting from eliminating 3 positions (49.6% of total savings).

Net salary savings projected for 2017 resulting from changes in base salaries of staff (37.9% of total savings).







Fringe Benefits Cost Increase

The 2017 Proposed Budget projects a \$127,137 (6.33%) increase in fringe benefit costs over the 2016 Adopted Budget resulting from an increase in the fringe benefit calculation rate from 41% of total net salaries to 45%.






Compensation for Closed 4th & Highland Parking Structure

Beginning October 7, 2016, the Milwaukee Bucks will pay the City each month an estimated "profit" lost by the City from the closing of the 4th & Highland parking structure until the new Arena parking structure is fully operational – projected to be September, 2017. The Bucks will promote parking at MacArthur Square and 1000 N. Water until its Arena structure is ready, and any increased "profits" realized by the City as part of this promotion will reduce the "profits" lost by the City by the closing of its 4th & Highland parking structure.

MacArthur Square Renovations

From 2011 through 2015 the Parking Fund spent approximately \$2.3 on renovations of its MacArthur Square parking structure.



Single-space, "Coin" Meter Replacement

The department issued an RFP in September, 2016, to purchase single-space, "smart" meters to replace the Fund's roughly 20-year-old inventory of 3,800 "coin" meters over the next 3 years. All purchases will be "smart" meters able to accept credit- and bank-card payments, but the department has yet to determine what portion will include "sensors" to detect if the parking space is in-use or empty.

Capital Spending

Total 2017 Proposed Budget capital spending of \$3,340,000 is down \$3,440,000 (51%) from the 2016 Adopted Budget, but is nearly 1½ times actual 2015 capital spending of \$1,353,606. Average actual capital spending from 2011 to 2015 was \$1,250,413 annually.

Credit Card vs. Coin – 2016 Meter Payments through August

- 55.8% of all meter revenues received through credit- or bank-card payments.
- 56.2% of LUKE meter revenues received through credit- or bank-card payments.

Current Ratio Remains Strong

Cash reserves were up 10% in 2015 from 2014 to \$17.4 million. LRB calculates the Parking Fund's current ratio (a measure of the department's liquidity and financial vitality) at 3.4:1 for 2015, while the Budget Office cites 3.6:1. Both calculations are well above the Budget Office's target of 2:1.

Parking Meter Revenue Decline

Projected 2017 parking meter revenue is down 7.5% to \$4,768,200 from the 2016 Adopted Budget. Average annual parking meter revenue from 2011 to 2015 was \$5 million.

Parking Compliance

Parking citation revenues may decline over time as the ease of parking regulation compliance improves through greater use of MKE Park, the acceptance of credit and bank card payments at meters increases and the benefits of "virtual" overnight parking stickers are realized.

Payment in Lieu of Taxes

In addition to its projected \$16.6 million transfer the General Fund, the Parking Fund will pay a PILOT for use of City facilities of \$1.6 million. The Fund's average annual PILOT payment from 2011 to 2015 was \$1,532,970.

Total Parking Fund Revenue Down

Total 2017 projected Parking Fund revenue of \$40,790,574 is down 3% from the 2016 Adopted Budget. Average annual total Parking Fund revenue from 2011 to 2015 was \$43,584,454.
