Key Aspects of Program Development

- Research; RFP development; proposals review and evaluation
- Contract development, negotiations, and execution
- Communication Plan
 - Program branding and educational support (logo, website, etc.)
 - Customer recruitment process & materials
- Customer management system
 - Invoicing, service requests, phone system
- Data management & reporting templates
- Carts procurement & starter kit development
- Contractor support (route & map creation)







RFP and Contract Phase

- 2 responses received
- Contract awarded to Compost Crusader
 - Materials delivered to Blue Ribbon Organics for processing







- Optional program for residents in pilot zone
- Provides a 3rd cart for the collection of organic items including food waste and yard debris
- Every-Other-Week winter collection
 Weekly collection spring, summer, and fall
- Service costs paid by residents
 \$12.75 per month (after \$1 credit)









How can you tell if a plastic bag is compostable? Look for the BPI logo.



COMPOSTABLE bags with BPI USSETTEETHE

Only plastic

Yes! These items belong in the bin.

Food waste must be bagged in a biodegradable bag (i.e. paper or compostable plastic.) Remove all stickers, wrappings, twist ties, and other non-biodegradable items.

Fruit and Vegetable Scraps

- Cooked and raw
- Scraps or whole fruit
- Seeds and stems are OK

Eggs, Protein, and Dairy

- Eggs-cooked and raw
- Egg shells
- Cooked meat—NOT RAW
- Cooked seafood-NOT RAW
- Bones
- Cheese
- **Nuts and Seeds**

Beverages

- · Coffee grounds and filters
- Tea leaves and bags





Bread and Grains

- Bread, including spoiled
- Cakes and sweet breads
- Pasta, cooked or raw
- Rice
- Grains

Other Food Materials

- Leftovers
- Spoiled Food
- Sauces are OK

Yard Waste

- Grass clippings
- Garden trimmings
- Weeds
- Diseased plants

Items

NO! These items do NOT belong in the bin.

Dangerous Waste

- Diapers
- Animal carcasses
- Animal waste
- Cat litter
- **Medical Waste**
- Hazardous Waste

Other Food Waste

- Raw Meat
- · Fats, Oil, and Grease
- Liquids

Non-Biodegradable **Packaging**

- Plastic bags
- Twist ties
- Fruit stickers
- Aluminum foil
- Plastic wrap



- Capitol Dr and Edgewood Ave is northern boundary




Southern Zone












Non-Interested Resident Survey 128 Respondents
