Subject: Opposition to Bus Stop Changes – 43rd/Oklahoma/Forest Home

I oppose the bus stop changes proposed for the intersection of 43rd/Oklahoma/Forest Home under File 161488 (#6 under bus stops to be eliminated, #5 under bus stops to be added) and request that the File be amended to delete these changes.

Current Bus Stop

- Overall attractive, park-like location, especially for a stop located at the intersection of 3 major streets.
- Attractive, existing shelter amenity for MCTS riders; adds to the functionality and appearance of the triangular "park" at 43rd/Oklahoma/Forest Home intersection.
- Shelter is also set back some distance from the curb improves safety for shelter and bus stop users.
- Very short walking distance for MCTS passengers transferring from westbound Route 51 (Oklahoma) bus. Also short transfer distance to eastbound Route 51.
- Traffic passing the bus stop is often slowing or stopped for the light on Oklahoma contributing to safety of MCTS riders who may be standing at the stop.

Proposed Bus Stop

- Desolate, inhospitable mid-block location between a bar and a used car sales lot.
- Small space precludes installation of a passenger shelter.
- MCTS riders will most likely be waiting at or near the curb less safe than existing bus stop. Stop would be squeezed between 2 driveways.
- Traffic passing the bus stop is typically accelerating from the signal on Oklahoma (safety factor).
- Much longer walking distance for passengers transferring from westbound Route 51 bus

 and much less safe if passengers cross Oklahoma from the stop at 45th Street, where there are no pedestrian signals.

Other Considerations

- MCTS proposes to "straighten" Route 14 by eliminating the turn at 43rd Street, thereby reducing the number of traffic signals a bus must pass through at 43rd/Oklahoma/Forest Home from 3 to 2. MCTS contends this will save travel time for Route 14 buses. However, buses will still have to contend with 2 signals, and the slight increase in speed does not outweigh the loss of amenities, convenience and safety for MCTS riders.
- Bus stop relocation proposal appears to put bureaucratic need for efficiency ahead of the interests of MCTS customers.
