Good Morning Tim,

Attached you'll find an updated drawing set that includes using a 1/8" thick 2 ply WOW (wood on wood) Mahogany that will be laminated to a 1/8" aluminum back ground plate.

The 2 ply Wood face will be pre-finished with a weather proof stain/finish.

We are also aware of the minimum 10' Clearance from the bottom of the sign to grade and will connect the sign into the exterior of the building at the mortar joints.

If you could please take a look at the drawing and send your approval to the City. (Harold McDonald currently has our permit on hold and is awaiting your final approval).

Mr. Flitcroft & Ms. Burton:

I would like to request some subtle changes to the proposed design. I would strongly prefer that the vinyl background not be printed in a wood tone. There is no general objection to vinyl background on an aluminum panel. Please revise the sign to this effect. If a wood effect is preferred, you may use a metal panel with a wood grain finish or real wood.

Please also note that we require that signs mounted to brick buildings have their attachments to the building be installed only in the mortar joints. You may need to design a few inches of "wiggle room" into the sign's measurements to achieve this.
