This report is written by Police Officer David NOVAK, assigned to the License Investigation Unit,

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

1. On 03/24/2016 at 8:30pm officers observed Milestone bar with patrons inside and security outside. The officer knew that there was no valid license for Milestone bar because the old license had expired and the applicant had not been approved for a new license yet. The officer found two bartenders serving alcohol. Neither bartender had a Class D operators license. One of the bartenders stated that Robert BOSTON was in charge but he was at the liquor store. BOSTON then walked in the bar. He stated he knew there was no license but he opened up because it was Milestones night to host a dart league. He stated that if he did not open, the new owners would be banned from belonging to the league. BOSTON was issued a citation for operating an unlicensed premise.

2. On 04/09/16 at 3:01 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 2978 N Mother Simpson Way, Good Times Bar, for uncooperative staff members during a Shooting investigation. An officer attempted to talk with the bartender, identified as Robert Boston, who was not cooperating with

the officer. A tavern check was conducted and officers checked the 2nd floor for patrons and observed a running generator. Police verified that a generator was running power to an electrical cord that ran downstairs into the bar's electrical box on the 1st floor. An officer turned off the generator due to the fumes and opened several windows to attempt to vent the fumes. Upon doing so, all of the electricity for the building immediately shut off. When police asked Boston why there was a generator running, Boston stated "The city shut the power off on 04/07/16 due to a water main break on the street outside". When asked further about it, Boston changed his story stating the electricity was off due to a lapse of payment on the electrical bill. It was later learned that WE Energies took out the electrical meter and the power lines were literally cut on the exterior electrical pole. Officers also found the raw sewage coming from a drain in the basement. There was a pair of rubber boots on the stairs leading back up to the bar which had dry sewage on them. At approximately 4:00 am, Police made contact with the licensee Agnes Boone regarding the tavern check and informed her of the violations and health code issues inside her tavern. Boone stated she was aware that the generator was running power to the entire building and that due to a lapse in bill payment; the electricity was shut off some time earlier in the week. She stated she didn't know what the issue was if the "inspector's already cleared the bar to be open." Officers informed her that the bar was cleared prior to the electricity and sewage issues. A police supervisor was on scene and ordered that the bar close until further notice and Boston was advised he may not operate. Boston stated that he did not care if police instructed the bar to be closed because, "I've got mouths to feed and if my lawyer says I can be open when I call him. I'm going to open." Photos were taken of all issues, including the licenses.

PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by PO Russell MACRAE assigned to District 5-LATE POWER SHIFT (Tavern Car).

On 03-24-16 at approximately 08:30pm, PO Jose RIVERA and I (SQ#5469) were on routine patrol in the 900 block of W Chambers Street. As we approached Mother Simpson Way I observed "Milestone Bar" with loud music, lights on inside, and numerous people inside the bar including a security person outside the front door.

On 03-03-16, I received an email from PO Laurel LAMMERS of the District 5 - Community Prosecution Unit stating that the licensee of "Milestone Bar" identified, as Laron S. WILLIAMS was not planning on re-newing her Class B -Tav License and that it was set to officially expire on 03-09-16. PO LAMMERS further stated that she was in contact with the City Attorney Nick DeSiato as well and the MPD License Investigation Unit whom stated that the City of Milwaukee had not approved the new licensee applicant for "Milestone Bar" Agnes D BOONE. The earliest that BOONE is permitted to be heard on the matter would be at the Common Council meeting on 03-29-16. This meaning that no one is permitted to be on the premises nor allowed to have patrons of any kind inside the bar before 03-29-16 due to no Class B Licensee approved for the location.

Upon walking inside the tavern, I observed patrons playing darts, and drinking alcohol at the bar. I counted approximately 28 persons inside the bar. There were patrons paying money for drinks as well as being served drinks. I walked over a man whom I observed take money and serve a beer to a patron. This bartender was identified by WI-DL as Ray A. EVANS (b/m 12-02-62). I asked EVANS who was in charge in the bar. EVANS stated, "Rob is." Rob being identified as Robert L. BOSTON (b/m, 12-19-68) the former bartender/manager during last licensee. I asked EVANS if he had a bartending license, he stated "No, but Rob does.. he just ran to the liquor store to pick some things up." I then observed a female bartending as well who was identified by WI-DL as Linda A WILLIAMS (b/f, 02-19-70). I asked WILLIAMS if she had a bartending license, she stated "yes, but it's at home." I informed both EVANS and WILLIAMS to stop serving alcohol.

At that time BOSTON walked into the bar and we walked into the employee room to speak on this situation. BOSTON stated that he was aware that no one was allowed on the premises until there was a new licensee for the bar. BOSTON stated that the reason people were in the bar was due to the city-wide dart/pool league that "Milestone Bar" is a part of. All of the bars that participate take turns to host a "Sponsor Night" at their bar. March 24th happened to be the night that "Milestone Bar" was assigned to host. BOSTON stated that he attempted to reschedule "Milestone Bar's" night, however the league stated that it was impossible to accomplish at this point in the end of the league season. The league informed BOSTON that if he did not host his assigned night that "Milestone Bar" would not participate in the league anymore, thus preventing the future applicants for the premises. BOSTON stated that he "invested a lot of money in the league and I don't want it to go to waste for the next licensees who would swoop in and take my place in the league."

I made contact with the league secretary identified by WI-DL as Tracy Y. HARRIS (b/f, 11-28-68). HARRIS stated that she was unaware that there was a license issue with the bar. HARRIS further stated that she did not want the dart/pool league itself to be responsible for the potential license violation issued for "Milestone Bar". At that time a man identified as Andre L. ELLIS (b/m, 08-13-60) approached me and stated that he was the "Community Liaison" for the surrounding area and wanted to know what the issue was. I explained the circumstances to ELLIS regarding the lack of a licensee and the inability for patrons to be on premises. ELLIS then stated that he was connected with Alderwoman Milele COGGS and that there should be a special exception to the rules for the night. I informed BOSTON, HARRIS, and ELLIS that without a licensee there are no exceptions.

At approximately 09:00pm, Sgt. Robert CRAWLEY (SQ#5414) arrived on-scene. Sgt CRAWLEY took 9 photos of the patrons inside the bar as well as the posted licenses on the wall. Citations were issued to BOSTON, EVANS, and WILLIAMS regarding and citations were mailed to their listed addresses.

Officers arrested four people for Disorderly Conduct, one person for Disorderly Conduct 7 Resisting An Officer and one person a warrant.

- 5. On 1-28-1996 officers were dispatched to Throttle Twisters regarding a fight in the tavern. A female caller stated that the place was going to be shot up. The police operator could hear what sounded like a fight in the background. When the police arrived theywere unable to locate the complaint, or anyone involved in the fight.
- 6. On 2-4-1996 police were dispatched to Throttle Twisters, 508 W Center St to check for someone wanted on a felony warrant. Unable to locate the suspect.
- 7. On 2-15-1996 at about 4:30pm police from the Gang Criminal Intelligence Division conducted a tavern check at Throttle Twister's for motorcycle gang members. Officers interviewed the bartender, Robert Bailey. The officers found a loaded 12 gauge shotgun concealed behind the bar which was accessible to the bartender. The licensee, Miley Howard, who was not on the scene, stated that he put the guns behind the bar for his bartenders to have accessibility to in case they have to protect themselves. Robert Bailey is a convicted felon and was charged with Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon.
- 8. On 2-18-1996 at about 1:50am police were monitering the area of 5th & Center when they observed a large group of women exiting Throttle Twisters, 508 W Center St. Several of the women began fighting and because of the number of people involved, officers called for backup. Two arrests were made for disorderly conduct. The fight had begun in the tavern.
- 9. On 3-2-1996 officers conduct a check at Throttle Twisters relative to a complaint of minors being served on the premises. Nine underage persons were found on the premise.

10. On 2-8-2004 at about 12:50am Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 508 W Center St, Throttle Twister Club House, for a shooting. Investigation revealed that a shooting had taken place inside the premises. Witnesses stated 2 people were arguing when a 3rd person (the victim) attempted to intervene and ended up being shot once in the upper abdomen.

11. On 06/10/07, Milwaukee police were dispatched to Throttles Lounge for an Armed Robbery complaint. Officers spoke to the victim who stated he left the tavern and walked to his auto that was parked in the lot just west of the tavern when he was pushed to the ground. The actor held him down and demanded the keys to his car. The victim stated he saw several actors with one of them holding a silver semi-automatic handgun. The victims eighty dollars and his cell phone were taken out of his pocket and the suspects fled in his auto. The victim stated he then walked back inside the tavern and called police. Officers spoke the bartender, Robert Grace, regarding this incident and no violations were found.

11. On 01/16/08 at 8:48 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 440 W Center for a Battery complaint. Officers spoke to the caller who stated she was in an argument with a friend of hers while at Twisters Tavern located at 508 W Center. The victim further stated her friend then hit her with a glass bottle across her lower lip causing her lip to bleed. A citation for Assault and Battery was issued to the suspect.

- 12.On 04/14/08 at 11:23 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 508 W Center for a Battery Cutting complaint. Investigation found two patrons got into a verbal argument inside the tavern and took it outside where the fight became physical. One subject pulled a knife on the other stabbing the victim three times to his chest, stomach and cheek. These wounds required stitches to close.
- 13. On 07/12/08 at 2:07 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 5th and Center for a Battery Cutting complaint. As officers arrived, they observed a large pool of blood at 508 W Center Street. Officers spoke to a witness who stated two rival bikers started to fight over a woman and that two people were stabbed. Investigation revealed two patrons were stabbed by another while fighting outside of the tavern. All subjects had been patrons of the bar prior to the fight. Both victims received medical treatment for their wounds. Officers spoke to the owner Miley Howard who stated the bar was closed at the time of the incident. Howard further stated he did not have his security cameras on at the time this stabbing occurred.
- 14. On 08/16/08 at 4:40 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 508 W Center for a Battery complaint. Officers spoke to the caller/victim who stated he was a patron of the Throttle Twisters tavern when he was approached by a subject who struck him the face twice causing a laceration to the bridge of his nose. MFD was on scene but the victim refused further medical treatment. Officers did speak to Miley Howard regarding this incident. It should be noted the victim did seek medical attention a week later and it was determined that the victim suffered a broken nose. A report was filed.
- 15. On 11/02/08 at 3:53 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3406 N 22nd Street for a Violation of Restraining Order complaint. Investigation revealed the victim had been at Throttles Twisters located at 508 W Center with some friends when her husband, who she is in the process of divorcing, entered the bar. The victim stated her husband approached her and told her to get outside. They both exited the tavern and her husband than began choking her until she couldn't breathe. He also began hitting her in the face. Officers observed several scratches and bruises on the victims face, hands, shins and knee. She declined medical attention. The victim was ordered in the DA's office regarding the battery charges. Officers conducted follow up at 508 W Center, which was found to be closed. Officers check the area of where the offense occurred and did locate the victims cell phone, which was returned to her.

- 16. On 02/17/09 at 1:01 am, Milwaukee police responded to an anonymous call of several males possibly armed with weapons fighting outside the Twisters Inn at 508 W Center. Police arrived and observed several subjects exiting the bar but no one fighting. Police spoke to the security guard Calvin Scott who stated a few guys were arguing inside the bar but that he put them out. He further stated he observed no one fighting outside the tavern nor anyone armed with a gun. Officers attempted to contact the caller for more information but received no answer.
- 17. On 11/15/09 at 1:57 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 508 W Center Street for a Battery complaint. Officers spoke to the victim who stated a known subject approached him while he was ordering a beer and punched him in the face causing the victim to fall to the ground. The suspect then struck him with a bottle, which caused a 2-inch laceration above his right eye. Officers also spoke the bartender identified as Elonzo Manning who gave a statement affirming what had occurred. Manning stated he stopped the suspect from attacking the victim and pushed him out of the tavern. The suspect was later arrested and charged with substantial battery.
- 18. On 01/30/10 at 1:32 am, Milwaukee police received a call from a citizen stating there was a fight at the bar located at 508 W Center. Officers responded and observed a few patrons yelling at each other but when they observed police, left the area without incident. As police attempted to enter the bar, found the front door locked. A male opened the door for officers who then spoke to the security guard identified as Calvin Scott. Scott stated that two females began to physically fight with one patron being escorted out of the bar. Scott stated this patron tried to re-enter and that is why he locked the door. Coleman was warned by officers to not lock the door. The licensee, Miley Howard, was not on scene but officers spoke with Howard later that day by phone who stated he was aware of what occurred.
 - 19. On 04/17/10 at 8:09 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to Sinai Hospital for a Reckless Use Of Weapon complaint. Police spoke to the victim who stated that she had been arguing with a friend while at the bar Twisters and that both left the bar and went to his auto and was talking. The victim stated the talking was going nowhere and that she got out of the car and that the friend attempted to grab her arm. The victim stated she stood in the intersection of 5th and Center and waited for her friend to leave when he started to drive and struck her with the front of his vehicle. The victim sustained a broken left kneecap. Officers attempted to contact the licensee Miley Howard via phone was received no answer.
 - 20. On 09/07/10 at 9:51 pm, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 508 W Center Street regarding a shooting that occurred outside the club on 09/04/10. Police spoke with Miley Howard who stated he was not working that night but gave officers the name of his nephew who was in charge of the bar that night. On 09/09/10, officers spoke with Elonzo Manning who stated that the night of shooting, around 11:45 pm, two females were fighting in the bar, where one struck the other in the eye. Manning stated a crowd began to form so he escorted one of the females out the back door and the other female was let out the front door. Manning further stated he closed the bar for the night and began to clean up. Manning stated that 10-15 minutes later, he heard 5 gunshots outside the bar. Manning stated he didn't go to the window and did not see anything. Manning could provide no further information.

21. On 09/17/10 at 11:24 pm, Milwaukee police conducted follow up at 508 W Center in regards to the shooting that occurred on 09/04/10. Officers were looking for Elonzo Manning who was to be arrested for obstructing an officer in regards to the investigation of the shooting that occurred previously. Officers found Manning in the bar who was taken into custody and conveyed to the district station for processing. He was given a citation and later released. Officers spoke with Miley Howard and explained the situation.

22. On 05/17/12 at 11:00 pm, Milwaukee police conducted a License Premise Check at 508 W Center Street. Upon entry, two patrons fled to the rear outdoor patio. Investigation found two underage patrons (ages 16 and 18) were inside the bar. Police spoke with the bartender Latara Brown who stated the two entered the bar and asked for a drink but that she refused them and told them to leave. Brown stated the two were inside the bar for 5 to 6 minutes prior to police arrival. Brown stated she didn't call police because she figured they would both leave. Brown was advised by police to call in the future if any problems arise. Attempts to contact the agent, Miley Howard, were unsuccessful. The underage subjects were cited.

Manning told officers that he had a valid bartender's license, but did not have it with him. PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by PO David LETTEER, assigned to District 5, late power shift, Tavern Squad.

On Friday November 11th, 2016 a 9:58 p.m. PO Jeffrey KRUEGER and PO Michael DRISCOLL, Sq. 5462 were sent to the location of 508 W. Center St., Throttle Twisters Bar, to check for a crime scene, regarding an Armed Robbery, for the primary squad, Sq. 5290, PO Gregory MEYER and PO Lucas POLZIN.

Upon arrival they observed the bar was closed and there were drops of blood on the sidewalk in front of the bar, which led them to the address of 534 W. Center St. Both addresses are located in the city and county of Milwaukee.

As DRISCOLL and KRUEGER were checking the scene, Elonzo MANNING Jr., (b/m 11-03-73) arrived at the scene to inform DRISCOLL that he was the bartender at Twisters Inn, who was the only bartender working the bar when this incident happened. MANNING informed DRISCOLL that he closed the bar and left just before the police arrived at this location. MANNING went on to tell DRISCOLL that there was a black male and black female who came to the tavern to meet someone else at the bar. After a short time of being at the bar, the black male and black female began to argue and became disruptive. MANNING stated he asked them to leave the bar and they complied. MANNING stated at 9:30 p.m., he went outside to the parking lot on the west side of the building, when he observed the black female on the sidewalk bleeding from the head. MANNING stated he did no observe the person who did this to the black female.

Another person who was at the bar also spoke to DRISCOLL, Calvin ANDERSON (b/m 10-04-64). ANDERSON stated the black female and black male came to visit "NADLE". The two began to argue over the black females Quest Card, when the black female went outside to smoke a cigarette. The black male then exited the bar out of the back door and was going to his vehicle, parked in the west side parking lot. He stated the black female then confronted the black male in the parking lot, by hitting him in the head with a bottle. The black male was then able to get the bottle and hit the black female in the head, causing a laceration to the females head.

It should be noted that when DRISCOLL was speaking with MANNING, DRISCOLL asked MANNING if he had his bartender's license. MANNING stated he had a license, but did not have it with him. I checked LIRA for MANNING and found that he had a renewal of a permanent Class D license 07-06-2011. I could not locate anything further since 2011. The owner or licensee of the bar, Miley HOWARD (b/m 03-03-42) was not present for this incident and was notified on 11-12-16 at 8:36 pm, by PO Russell MACRAE, who as doing follow-up at the bar. PO MACRAE also found MANNING to be bartending on 11-12-16. MANNING informed MACRAE he had a license, but could not produce proof as to having a Class D license.
