There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-2.7-4, probative evidence concerning whether or not a new license should be granted may be presented on the following subjects: whether or not the applicant meets the municipal requirements, the appropriateness of the location and premises where the licensed premises is to be located and whether use of the premises for the purposes or activities permitted by the license would tend to facilitate a public or private nuisance or create undesirable neighborhood problems such as disorderly patrons, unreasonably loud noise, litter, and excessive traffic and parking congestion. Probative evidence relating to these matters may be taken from the plan of operation submitted with the license application, if any, but shall not include the content of any music. Evidence regarding the fitness of the location of the premises to be maintained as the principal place of business, including but not limited to whether there is an overconcentration of businesses of the type for which the license is sought; whether the proposal is consistent with any pertinent neighborhood business or development plans, or the location's proximity to areas where children are typically present. The applicant's record in operating similarly licensed premises; and whether or not the applicant has been charged with or convicted of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the activity to be permitted by the license being applied for or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety or welfare may also be considered. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

Limited parking for persons attending meetings in City Hall is available at reduced rates (5 hour limit) at the Milwaukee Center on the southwest corner of East Kilbourn and North Water Street. Parking tickets must be validated in the first floor information booth in City Hall.

In light of deeper reflection and conversations with other community members, I would like to retract and recant my original statement in regards to the approval of a Class A Liquor License for National Food Mart, located at 530 W National Ave. Clearly, I was originally, as of yesterday, not in favor of issuing such a license to someone with such a

While clearly there is evidence of there being a higher risk for an unexperienced business owner and felon, who is not a resident of the Walker's Point community/neighborhood, to be given the permission and license to sell bulk amounts of wholesale alcohol near a high school, I do believe that Mr. Farrington should not, once again, be, "punished again" for crimes he has committed in the past.

I believe his intent is surely to increase revenues for National Food Mart, as every rational business owner surely shares this aim. I have also been informed of his excellent reputation, as of his first involvement with the business

So, with that being said, and while there is certainly and objectively more risk involved by licensing a Class A Liquor License to a felon with a violent criminal record, I do think the committee and members of Walker's Point owe it to him and the majority-minority population that National Food Mart serves the opportunity to allow his business to seek more revenues as a result of allowing the sale of alcohol. Our aim should be to advocate for a more diverse and inclusive neighborhood, as that is the history of Walker's Point and the City of Milwaukee that we as citizens have a moral Obligation and duty to honor.

If Mr. Farrington turns-out to have problems with the application of the license he applied for, if issued, then it can simply be taken away, or non-renewed. May this act as a vote for giving Mr. Farrington a chance at increasing his revenues and keeping the area and City diverse, and therefore, strong.

To the licensing review committee:

National Food Mart at 530 W National Ave has applied for a Class A liquor license.

I would like to submit that there are already a number of businesses selling liquor within a small radius. I patronize one of those places.

The proposed location, on busy National Avenue, is likely to present unwanted traffic and potential danger. My wife and I live less than a block away. The neighborhood is growing with families and apartment dwellers. There is no parking for customers at 530 W. National except for a few metered spaces on the street and the likelihood of more traffic stopping for alcohol does not portend a healthy situation. I think it behooves us to ask the police how many people are stopped in this area of National Avenue for speeding and other unlawful activities. I am not against the sale of alcohol in my neighborhood. The owners of the nearby nightelub Jinx have proved to be responsible and reliable neighbors, but I hasten to stress that they do not sell alcohol to all comers on a busy street largely inhabited by teenagers in transit and ballet dancers.

It is my impression that this store currently is mainly an outlet for high school students and bus patrons to buy snacks and cigarettes. Auto and truck traffic is already problematic without having who knows how big an uptick in people stopping to buy intoxicating substances from a shop owner who is a former felon who has reputedly been convicted of 1st degree reckless homicide, possession with intent to deliver and domestic violence. It is in my nature to give people a second chance, but in this case the odds seem to be against a positive outcome.

To the Licensing Committee,

I am writing to oppose a Class A Liquor and Malt License for the National Food Mart, 530 W National Ave (Andre T. Farrington).

A liquor store at this address would have profoundly negative impact on the safety, health and welfare of our neighborhood for the following reasons based on my 12 year residency in a neighboring business current convenience store:

this

- There already is a substantial liquor store on First Street in a more approriate transit strip mall so one is not needed here.
- Being on a busy thoroughfare, National Avenue, would promote constant stopping in front by people with no ties
 to good behavior. As it is we have several bars and nightclubs in the immediate vicinity who in good faith struggle

to control the outpouring of drunks - we don't need to return to having them on our doorsteps with a bottle in a bag.

- The over 70 immediate residents here on National between 5th and 6th Streets don't need this, in fact the lack of breadth of food stuffs offered now in the convenience doesn't make it convenient other than for cigarettes.
- Currently the high school students from Bradley Tech High School comprise a large portion of partrons of this store for snacks. The bus stop which is nearly in front is one of the busiest transit points for these students.
 Mixing alcohol with candy is dangerous.
- I greatly appreciate efforts to create new and creative businesses like a blues club, Brenner Brewing, Mobcraft, Fuel, Hamberger Mary's, artists/architects studios - the list goes on. They add to the the richness of the area while putting alcohol in a well considered and well regulated role. They build ongoing relationships with their clients and take responsibility for their behavior.
- Drive by business is a problem in an area which is struggling with improving what ahs been a history climare of prostitution and drug dealing - problems which go hand-in-hand with easy alcohol on the streets.
- Many younger children and parents frequent the Milwaukee Ballet which is right here. The neighborhood values
 the cultural presence of the Ballet and a liquor store would not give a good message to their clients, parents and
 students. There is a grade school only a little over a block away.

Therefore I am very strongly against this petition.

I recommend that the applicant think carefully about how they can make their business offer something unique and needed.



1. On 02/23/2002 the applicant was arrested by Milwaukee Police Department for Battery -Domestic Violence, No Further Information Available

2. On 01/01/2005 at 12:55 AM officers responded to the licensed premises at 1339 W Greenfield Av, La Carreta Vieja regarding a Battery Complaint. Investigation revealed that a patron, who was intoxicated, punched a security guard who had escorted the patron out of the tavern. The patron was still on the scene and causing a disturbance. The patron was cited for Battery and Disorderly Conduct. Incident Report Filed.

- 3. On 05/27/06 at 2:27 am, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to a shooting at 1339 W Greenfield. Investigation revealed that three tavern patrons were shot outside of the bar and were lying on the sidewalk. Once officers secured the scene and located witnesses, officers attempted to gain entry into the tavern and found the doors locked and unable to locate the owner/bartenders of the tavern. Officers eventually found the owner, Abel Santos, who was uncooperative and refused to let officers inside the tavern. A few hours after the shooting, Santos agreed to open the door for officers. The shooting resulted in four people shot with one homicide.On 05-28-06, Milwaukee Police conducted follow up regarding this shooting and spoke with Abel Santos. Santos allowed officers to view surveillance video regarding the homicide, which showed the suspects were patrons in the tavern and that the homicide occurred while the patrons were leaving the tavern. When asked why Santos took so long to make contact with police, he stated he wasn't aware that a shooting took place outside his tavern due to the "walls surrounding the building."
- 4. On 12/13/06 the applicant was cited in the City of Milwaukee for a Building Code Violation at 1325 W. Greenfield Ave.

- 5. On 10/27/07 at 2:42am, officers were dispatched to 14th and Greenfield and interviewed a man who stated he was at the bar at 1339 W. Greenfield. While in the bar he was approached by a woman Theresa Northern, who asked him if he would pay her for sex or a blowjob. When he declined an argument ensued, and the woman struck him in the mouth. The woman was cited for Assault and Battery and Soliciting.
- 6. On 01/14/08 at 10:15pm, officers were dispatched to a fight at 14th and Greenfield. According to the CAD, the caller stated one of his security guards was at the bar and requesting emergency back up for a fight. Officers went into the bar at 1339 W. Greenfield and spoke with the bartender who stated there was no fight. Officers located two patrons who are security guards for the bar, but were off duty. One of the security guards indicated a phone call he made to his boss moments earlier may have been miscommunication that they were involved in a fight. The security guard stated that he called his boss on his cell phone and made a joke that he and another co-worker were going to La Carreta Vieja and that they would need some backup because of the fights that occur at the bar. Officers found no evidence of a fight.
- 7. On 01/20/08 at 2:17am, officers were dispatched regarding at tavern violation at 1339 W. Greenfield Ave. The complaint was that there were juveniles entering the bar and drug dealing going on in the bathroom. Officers found no violations. Officers spoke with the applicant (Santos) who was on scene. Santos stated that he denied entry to a person and believes that that person called the police.

8. On 01/25/08 at 11:39pm, officers were dispatched to a subject with a gun inside the bar at 1339 W. Greenfield Ave. The named subject Juan J. Cerda, also had a valid warrant for Homicide. The business was checked and Cerda was not there. No tavern violations were found.

- 9. On 10/19/08 at 2:06 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1339 W Greenfield Avenue for a Subject With Weapon complaint. Upon arrival, officers were met by the caller and her mother who told police that the owner of La Carreta tavern, Abel Santos, had pepper sprayed them while they were inside the tavern. The victim admitted a fight had started in the tavern right before this occurred, but that they were not involved. Officers then entered the tavern and spoke to security officer Ronelle Schuster who stated a fight did break out in the dance floor with security attempting to break up the fight. Schuster admitted to using pepper spray one of the subjects involved. Police spoke to Abel Santos regarding the incident. Officers also spoke to Santos regarding patrons illegally parking their cars due to road construction. Santos said he was aware of the parking and told his customers to legally park but that they refused to. When asked why he didn't call police regarding, Santos was more concerned about a police report being filed regarding the parking troubles. As officers were leaving the tavern, they were approached by several subjects who wished to remain anonymous but told officers that every Friday and Saturday night the tavern allows underage people into the tavern, for a fee, through the back door.
- 10. On 12/13/08 at 11:13 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1339 W Greenfield for an Entry to An Auto complaint. Investigation found an intoxicated subject was refusing to leave the tavern. He was removed by security earlier in the night but the subject kept returning. The subject then entered an auto that did not belong to him. Police were called and removed the subject with no citations being issued.
- 11. On 01/31/09 at 8:25 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1339 W Greenfield Avenue for a Trouble With Subjects complaint. Investigation revealed two subjects tried to enter the tavern but were denied entry. The actors got made and began causing damage to autos that were parked on the street. The owner of one of the autos damaged confronted these subjects who then began hitting and punching the victim. Security officer Daniel Vasquez observed the beating and used pepper spray on both suspects. Police were called and while attempting to gain information as to what occurred, one suspect made threats "to get" the victim. Citations were issued for Disorderly Conduct, Assault & Battery and Vandalism. Another citation for Consumption of Alcohol by a Minor was issued after one of the suspects admitted to drinking a bottle of Tequila with his friends earlier that night. No tavern violations were found.
- 12. On 02/28/09 at 1:10 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1339 W Greenfield for a Property Damage complaint. Officers spoke security officer Rebbecca Schroeder who stated she escorted three patrons from the bar earlier in the night for being disorderly. She stated they later returned and broke out the windows on her personal vehicle. These subjects were later arrested and issued citations for vandalism. No tavern violations were observed.

13. On 12/14/09 at 12:40 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 14th and Greenfield for a Shots Fired complaint. Investigation revealed some patrons from La Carreta Vieja were fighting and someone broke a beer bottle in the tavern. The call of shots fired was made baseless and the call was advised.

14. On 03/13/11 at 6:28 pm, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 13th and Greenfield for a Fight complaint. Police spoke to a victim who stated he was assaulted in the bar. Police observed the victim to have a laceration above his right eye. The victim was conveyed to a nearby hospital by ambulance where he received 11 stitches to close the wound. Police identified the bartender as Norma Gamez-Gutierrez and found that the bar does have video but that it did not face the area of where the fight took place. The suspect was later found and arrested for substantial battery.

- 15. On 10/29/12 at 1:50 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 1339 W Greenfield for a Reckless Endangering Safety. Police spoke to Bryan Shepard who is head of security for La Carreta Vieja. Shepard told police that two patrons who were inside the bar became disorderly and were escorted out of the bar. Shepard further stated that the patrons became aggressive towards the owner and Shepard because they were removed from the bar. Shepard stated that at one point, one subject appeared to "square off" with him and that he felt threatened and deployed his pepper spray on both subjects. One of the subjects then ran to his car and retrieved a golf club and made threats towards Shepard and other members of security, but that both subjects returned to the auto and left only to return shortly after and threaten security again. Shepard stated he then called for police. Both subjects were later located and found to be highly intoxicated. They were arrested and conveyed to the police district where they were cited and released.
- 16. On 12/08/12 at 1:23 am, Milwaukee police investigated a Battery complaint that occurred at 1339 W Greenfield. Officers spoke with the victim who stated he had injured his ankle during an incident while inside the bar. The victim was treated at a nearby hospital for a fractured fibula to his left ankle. Officers spoke to Bryan Shepard who was head of security and who stated he was aware of the incident that involved the victim and one of his security guards. Officers spoke with the security guard who was involved and identified him as Rafael Chaidez. Chaidez stated that the victim was harassing a female patron and that the female patron pushed the victim away from her, which caused the victim to fall into Chaidez. Chaidez stated he guided the victim away from him and this upset the victim. Chaidez stated that the victim then raised a glass beer bottle to him and that he physically took the victim down to the ground. The victim then was removed from the bar. Chaidez stated he did not know how the victim sustained an injury during the incident. Police attempted to view the incident on surveillance but found it did not capture it.

17.On 05/27/2013 at 12:45am Officers were flagged down by security at LaCarreta Vieja at 1339 W. Greenfield Av for a trouble with subject. The investigation revealed that security had recovered a white powder substance from in the bathroom on top of the urinal. The security was unable to determine who had placed the substance there. The powder did test positive for cocaine. The cocaine was recovered and inventoried.

- 18. On 06/01/2014 Milwaukee police conducted a licensed premise check at 1339 West Greenfield Avenue (La Carreta Vieja). During this check, the officer observed the emergency exit was locked and blocked by a table. The applicant was told he could not lock nor block the exit.
- 19. On 11/22/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a battery complaint at South 14th Street and West Greenfield Avenue. The victim, Adrian Ramirez, told officers that he had been at La Carreta Vieja bar when a fight broke out. Mr. Ramirez said he was not a part of the fight, but was hit in the back of the head with a bottle and then escorted out by security. The applicant was co-operative with officers during the investigation. Milwaukee police incident report #143260009 filed.
- 20. On 01/04/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a battery complaint at 1339 West Greenfield Avenue (La Carreta Vieja). Investigation revealed security for the business used pepper spray to de-escalate a fight inside the business between two patrons. Milwaukee police incident report #150040011 filed.
- 21. On 01/17/2015 Milwaukee police spoke to the applicant about obtaining video evidence regarding a shooting that occurred at a separate location. The victim of that incident had walked to the business after being injured. The applicant was co-operative and provided officers with a copy of video relevant to the incident. Milwaukee police incident report #150170020 filed.
- 22. On 01/20/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a battery complaint at 1339 West Greenfield Avenue (La Carreta Vieja). Investigation revealed the victim of this offense, Jose Carrasquillo, works as security for the business. Carrasquillo told officers that a patron pepper sprayed him as he was being escorted out of the bar for creating a disturbance. Milwaukee police incident report #150210141 filed.
- 23. On 01/23/2015 Milwaukee police responded to an injured/sick person complaint at 1339 West Greenfield Avenue (La Carreta Vieja). A security guard for the business, Shawn Folck, told officers there had been a fight inside the business around 12:50am. In an attempt to deescalate the situation, Mr. Folck deployed pepper spray. Milwaukee police incident report #150230009 filed.
- 24. On 01/27/2015 the applicant met with Milwaukee police regarding the number of calls for service and aldermanic complaints at 1339 West Greenfield Avenue (La Carreta Vieja). Officers explained that the property was eligible to receive nuisance status based on a review of the calls for service. The applicant told officers he did not recall two of the incidents officers discussed, but he was aware of several incidents in which security used pepper spray to disperse patrons and break up fights. The applicant indicated he had met with his staff and told them not to use pepper spray so frequently to deal with disorderly patrons and that he would be submitting a written course of action. The applicant was told that he would be receiving a Notice of Mandatory Retail Establishment Security Measures Letter in the mail.
- 25. On 02/17/2015 the applicant, along with his attorney Vincent Bobot, met with Milwaukee police officers and Assistant City Attorney DeSiato to discuss the abatement plan for the property at 1339 West Greenfield Avenue (La Carreta Vieja). Each point of the abatement plan was discussed and the applicant was advised that all points of the abatement plan had to be implemented within 45 days. Additionally, the applicant was advised that if problems at the bar continued, a new abatement plan would be required. The applicant was advised to contact members of the Milwaukee police Community Prosecution Unit with any questions.

- 26.On 06/14/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a battery complaint at 1339 West Greenfield Avenue. Investigation revealed a patron of the bar pushed a security guard down some stairs as the security guard was escorting the patron out of the business. The patron was cited for disorderly conduct.
- 27.On 12/03/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a shooting at the intersection of South 14th Street and West Greenfield Avenue. The incident occurred at 1339 West Greenfield Avenue (La Carreta Vieja). The applicant told officers that several people were fighting and arguing inside the tavern. As he attempted to help security officers escort them out, a subject punched the applicant in the face. Once outside, the group of people was so out of control, that the applicant used pepper spray. Officers did not discover a shooting victim and no weapons were recovered. The subject that punched the applicant was cited for assault and battery.
- 28. On 02/26/2016 at 12:56am officers were dispatched to S. 11th St and W. Burnham St for a shooting complaint. The officers found the victim and found there was not a shooting but a battery complaint. The victim was uncooperative but did state he was at La Carreta Vieja Bar, 1339 W. Greenfield Av, with his sister who got into a fight. The victim attempted to intervene and was battered by unknown actors. The officers attempted to go to the bar to investigate but it was closed. The officers went back at 8:13pm and spoke with the applicant. He stated the subject was in the bar and was highly intoxicated. He had security escorted him out and the subject fell down the stairs. The applicant went to help and the subject punched him. He reacted and punched him back causing the subject to fall to the ground. When security attempted to help him up he became combative. The applicant advised security to leave the subject alone for their safety. The applicant showed the officer the security footage which confirmed his story. Milwaukee Police Department IR#16-057-0008 filed.
- 29. On 09/05/2016 at 1:06am an officer was dispatched to a trouble with subject call at 1339 W. Greenfield Av. The officer spoke with security who stated a subject had been in the business causing a disturbance and began yelling profanities outside. The subject had left in a car prior to the officer's arrival. The applicant was on scene and cooperative.
- 30. On 02/03/2017 at 8:17pm an officer conducted a business check on La Carreta Vieja Bar, 1339 W. Greenfield Av. No violations were observed.

This report is written by PO Eliel CONTRERAS assigned to District 2, Late Power Shift.

On Friday, 2-26-16, at approximately 12:56am Squad 2330 (PO Jose RAMIREZ and PO Francisco CARTAGENA) was dispatched to S 11th St and W Burnham St (CAD# 160570111). for a Shooting Complaint. Upon arriving on scene, it was determined to be an Aggravated Battery Complaint (IR# 160570008).

PO RAMIREZ observed that the victim, Jorge L CHICO (W/M 12-17-82), had blood in the back of his head with a 1-2 inch laceration. While investigating the incident, PO RAMIREZ observed that CHICO was highly intoxicated and had alcohol emanating from his breath and person. CHICO was being very uncooperative and combative with police, MFD, and Froedtert personnel who were trying to administer aid to him and his injuries.

The only information CHICO provided regarding his injuries was that he was drinking at La Carreta Vieja (1339 W Greenfield Ave) with his sister. While at the establishment, CHICO stated his sister was in a fight and intervened. CHICO then stated he was beat up by unknown individuals.

At approximately 2:00am Squad 2360 (PO Adam BOEHM and PO Oscar PICENO) Squad 2321 (PO Peter ULATOSWKI) and Squad 2310 (Sgt. THORNE) responded to La Carreta Vieja (1339 W Greenfield Ave) to locate a scene. Upon arriving on scene, police attempted to enter establishment but were not able to because it was close for the night.

On Friday, 2-26-16, at approximately 8:13pm I, Squad 2464, along with Squad 2231 (PO Julian Nunez) and Squad 2450 (PO Richard TOLENTINO and PO David CABRAL) responded to La Carreta Vieja (1339 W Greenfield Ave) to speak with the licensee, Abel SANTOS (W/M 7-30-68) regarding the incident. Upon arriving on scene, I spoke with SANTOS.

SANTOS stated he was aware why the police were there. SANTOS stated last night he had a patron, who was later identified as Jorge L CHICO, who was highly intoxicated. SANTOS stated he asked security to escort him out because they were not going to serve him any more. While escorting CHICO out, SANTOS stated he was informed by security that CHICO had lost his balance and fell down the stairs. Upon hearing this, SANTOS stated he went downstairs to help security with CHICO.

While trying to help CHICO, SANTOS stated CHICO swung at him and hit him in the face with a closed fist. SANTOS stated he instantly in self-defense hit CHICO back causing him to fall back and land outside.

SANTOS stated after hitting CHICO, he felt really bad and attempted to help CHICO again. SANTOS offered to get an ambulance for CHICO but CHICO got combative again and stated he did not want help from them. At that point to avoid any more trouble, SANTOS stated they he instructed his security to CHICO alone. SANTOS then stated as CHICO walked away he turned around and pointed his finger at security and stated he was going to come back for him. SANTOS then stated CHICO left and never came back.

I asked SANTOS why he didn't call the police and he stated he was honestly scared and thought he was going to get in trouble. I told SANTOS since he did not hit CHICO first it could have been explained especially if there was video footage. I then asked SANTOS if he had video footage to collaborate his story and he stated yes.

SANTOS then proceeded to take us to his basement where he kept his video recording system. SANTOS then showed us the video footage of the incident. After viewing the video footage, it was determined the video footage collaborated SANTOS' account of what happened.

The following is a brief synopsis of the video footage.

At approximately 12:28am CHICO is observed sitting at a bar stool when security approach him and escort him out of the establishment.

At approximately 12:33am CHICO is observed falling down the flight of stairs and landing at the bottom of the stairs. The footage then depicts security following behind and attempting to help CHICO up. The footage then shows one of the security guards walk up the stairs to get SANTOS. The footage then shows SANTOS walking down the stairs and attempts to help CHICO get up.

At approximately 12:39am CHICO punches SANTOS in the face and SANTOS reacts and punches him back causing CHICO to fall back and land outside. The footage then shows SANTOS and security trying to lift him up.

This concludes my brief synopsis of the video footage.

SANTOS did have cameras on the outside of the establishment facing the main entrance but stated they were not working.

One of SANTOS' employees was able to down load the video footage for us. SANTOS was given a PP-33 form receipt.

While on scene, I did conduct a license premise check. I did not observe any visible violations while conducting the license check. I informed SANTOS I would be filing a license premise report regarding the incident.

Before leaving the establishment, I informed SANTOS that he needed to call the police whenever he had an incident regardless of the outcome. SANTOS stated he would.
