Build to match dimensions of existing failed stoop. Re-evaluation by Historic Preservation is required if stoop is to be enlarged for any reason. No masonry involving brick the cladding is approved by this document.

All work must be done in a craftsman-like manner, and must be completed within one year of the date this certificate was issued. Staff must approve any changes or additions to this certificate before work begins. Work that is not completed in accordance with this certificate may be subject to correction orders or citations.
