Proposal Applicant has resided the east wall with knotty cedar. Applicant was given

permission to create a test area of the east wall where knots would be sanded down and infilled with spackle to create the smooth surface that could meet the intent of

the regulation.

Additional work on the front porch was done in full compliance with the guidelines

and was approved by staff.

Staff comments This is a modest and relatively new (1905) Brewer's Hill cottage with some fine

detailing on the front and porch. It has been in this family since at least the 1960s.

Staff inspected the sample patch where the owner's son sanded down and spackled knots and painted over the wood and the work is indeed presentable. Its longevity is

somewhat in question, but is likely to be satisfactory.

Staff must recommend denial based on both preservation guidelines and recent

precedent elsewhere in Brewer's Hill. Approximately two months ago, the

Commission ordered the removal of knotty cedar on a rear cottage on N. 2nd Street.

The Commission may take into consideration their determination of the quality of the work in the test area of painted siding and any other factors they find relevant within the bounds of the ordinance. The work also has the support of two neighbors within

the 200-foot radius who received notice.

Recommendation Recommend HPC Denial

**Conditions**Any approval must be with the condition that it not set precedent for the following

reasons: The applicant sufficiently compensated for the use of knotty cedar with copious work to create an acceptably surface smooth surface that is equal to the use of smooth cedar. This was only realistically possible using family labor. Additionally the extra staff time to verify the quality of the work, which involved multiple site visits and will require at least one further site visit, is beyond the capacity of staff to grant

to applicants on a regular basis.
