They look like what children would put in a scrapbook, but the colorful stickers showing up in Alberta may be delivering deadly doses of fentanyl. Alberta paramedics are warning their colleagues of a possible new ingestion route for fentanyl after harmless looking stickers were found in the pockets of a suspected overdose victim in Calgary. The person's discolored saliva matched the colors of the stickers. The stickers haven't yet been tested to confirm the presence of fentanyl, or any other illicit drug. However, police in Ontario and Manitoba have seized fentanyl "blotters" — paper tablets similar to LSD "tabs."
