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




The number of establishments cited with one or more critical violations during a routine inspection (31% of total routine inspections); 8% above the 5 year average.

Percent of children in 2016 found with high lead levels in their blood. In 2003, the rate was 37.9%.





The number of homes made leadsafe in 2016. 432 were performed in 2015. 300 homes are targeted in 2018.

10,905 were administered in 2014 10,561 were administered in 2015.

The number of water filters distributed in 2016. Nearly 3,000 are targeted for distribution by the end of 2017.

#### **Office of Violence Prevention**

The ReCAST grant is a 5-year federal grant, currently in its 2<sup>nd</sup> year of funding, with a goal for community entities to work together in ways that lead to improved behavioral health, empower residents, and create sustained community change through evidence-based violence prevention and community youth engagement programs.

#### **Health Department Lab**

Generating over 75,000 test results in 2016, the lab will begin testing for bacteria-resistant gonorrhea (only 1 of 9 labs in the U.S. to perform this test), rapid 3<sup>rd</sup> generation HIV, and garden soil for nutrients and lead in 2017. The department upgraded the Lab Information System for efficient electronic data sharing with local, state and federal partners.

#### **Trauma Informed Care SPA**

\$180,000 for 2018: The program began full operations in mid-2015. Police districts 5 and 7 are making referrals to assist youth who witnessed violence. 503 referrals were made since the program's inception in 2015. 483 cases have been closed and 20 are still active.
