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



Departmental Budget Appropriation Category






The number of citizen complaint hearings that were held in 2016.







Number of community meetings held in 2016; up 17% from 2015. This number does not include the 180 community meetings attended.




Revenue

Budget Increase

Most of budget increase is attributed to:

- New Program Assistant I (\$40,501),
- The increased number of tests and corresponding background checks in 2018,
- The additional promotional exams in both the fire and police departments.

Fire Cadets/Police Aides/CSOs

The number of Fire Cadets remains at 52 in the 2017 Proposed Budget.

The number of Police Aides remains at 66 in the 2017 Proposed Budget.

The 14 new Community Service Officers graduated in October, 2016.

Formal Complaint Resolution

The number of days to resolve a formal citizen complaint increased from 140 days in 2015 to 182 in 2016 due to the 160% increase the number of formal citizen complaints. The increase in the number of complaints is due to the new, easier-to-use complaint-reporting process established by the FPC in conjunction with citizen input.

Vacancies

The FPC administrative office currently has no vacancies.

There are 2 vacancies on the Commission Board awaiting nomination by the Mayor. State Statute allows for either 7 or 9 members on the Board, and the Mayor approved 9 positions in the 2017 and 2018 budget. The 2 vacancies have not been filled.

Additionally, 3 current commissioners are on the last year of their current terms.

Testing

In 2017, the Fire and Police Commission plans to provide testing for:

- Police Aides
- Fire Cadets
- Police Officers
- Fire Fighters

Additionally, promotional exams will be administered for police lieutenant and captain as well as fire lieutenant and captain. No sergeant exams are scheduled for 2018.
