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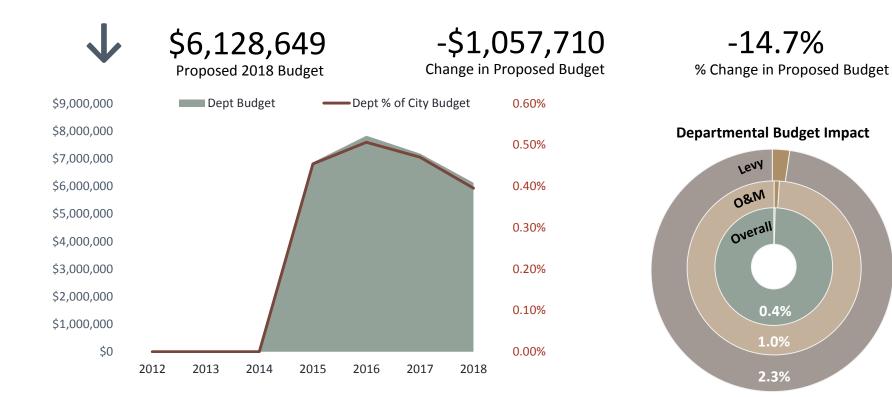

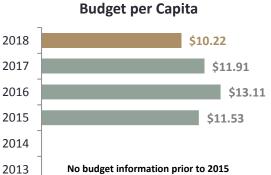

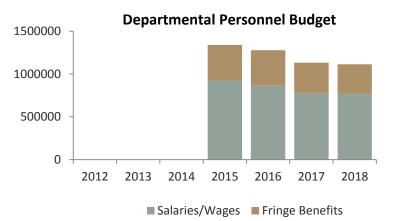
Change in RACM's personnel costs (salaries and benefits), 2017-2018, a decrease of 1.7%.

Retirement Eligible





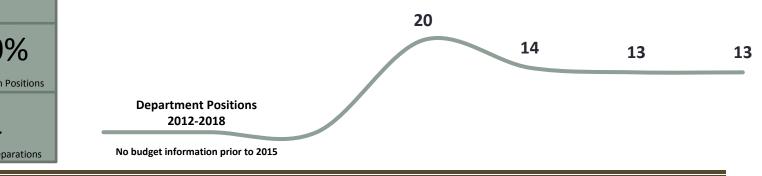

Staffing Update

- While the number of RACM positions is unchanged, the 2018 Proposed Budget provides no funding for the Senior Environmental Project Coordinator.
- This position has been vacant since 11/16.
- Workload has been reassigned to other staff, but RACM seeks to retain position authority in case workload increases.

Personnel Funding Sources

- In 2017, 8.2% of RACM's personnel costs were CDBG-funded. In 2018, only 2.5% will be.
- In 2017, 19.9% of personnel costs were funded by other grants. In 2018, 16.7% will be.
- 3.0 FTE positions will be supported by City capital or TID funding in 2018.

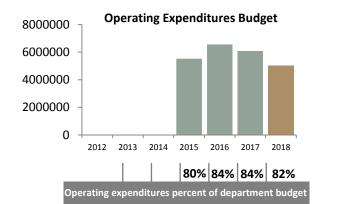
Decrease in CDBG funding for RACM, 2017-2018, due to end of 30th St. Corridor funding and elimination of Brownfields funding.

Decrease in RACM's Property Services expenditures, related primarily to lower *in rem* property maintenance costs.

Change in RACM's non-CDBG grant proceeds, 2017-2018, a reflection of completion of multiyear grants and reductions in EPA grants.

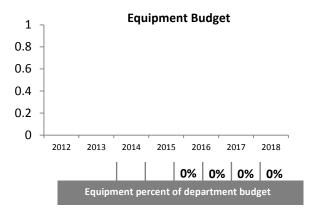
