1. Description of Grant Project/Program (Include Target Locations and Populations):

The Milwaukee Police Department will purchase the following equipment CTECH Cop box secure Storage, Lights and sirens, IT-Laptop, Cellebrite UFED 4PC (forensics), Steiner T42 Binoculars, and Bushnell Night Vision Binoculars. MPD will be responsible for recording and tracking equipment within MPD through an inventory system for audit inspection at the request of the DOJ and FBI. This equipment will aid in investigation child CETF abductions, non-ransom, domestic, and international parental kidnapping, sexual exploitation related to domestic child prostitution and online network enterprises, possession, distribution, and trafficking of child pornography. Equipment purchased by MPD and reimbursed through the FBI will be consistent with the MPD asset management process.

2. Relationship to Citywide Strategic Goals and Departmental Objectives:

It is the mission of the department to decrease child exploitation within the city of Milwaukee. The grant will allow the Milwaukee Police Department to obtain the equipment needed to further the mission and track criminals, which will disrupt child exploitation and trafficking locally as well as nationwide.
