From January 1 – November 15, 2016-2017, homicides have decreased by 20% citywide. In addition, robberies decreased by 11% from 2016 (2,893) to 2017 (2,564) year-to-date. The increase in aggravated assaults is the result of an increase in domestic violence and firearm related aggravated assaults. In 2017, domestic violence related aggravated assaults increased 32% and firearm related aggravated assaults increased 7% from 2016<sup>1</sup>.

The data shown in the table below counts distinct drug arrests by MPD from January 1—November 15, 2016-2017. From 2016-2017 total drug arrests remained stable and nearly all other drug charges saw an increase, including cocaine arrests (34%) and heroin arrests (25%). However, there has been a decline in marijuana arrests (7%) from 2016 (2,091) to 2017 (1,945).
