Per your request, this memo lists the number of teenage girls age 17 and younger reported to the Milwaukee Police Department as missing from 2012 to 2017. All data come directly from MPD.

The Sensitive Crimes Division of the Milwaukee Police Department continues to maintain the vast majority of girls reported as missing are runaways, rather than kidnappings or human trafficking incidents perpetrated by unknown actors. No data has been provided to support this claim.

The Sensitive Crimes Division further reports all missing girls reported missing from 2012 through 2016 were returned, and 1,421, or 94%, of girls reported missing in 2017 had been returned as of January 17, 2018.
