- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.

This report is written by Police Officer KUKOWSKI, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 03/25/2008 the Wisconsin Department of Transportation revoked Daryl Carter's driver's license for 6 months for Operating While Intoxicated. Daryl Carter is listed on the application as 50% shareholder.
- 2. On 04/19/2011 the Wisconsin Department of Transportation revoked Daryl Carter's driver's license for 2 years for Implied Consent. Daryl Carter is listed on the application as 50% shareholder.
- 3. On 07/18/2011 the Wisconsin Department of Transportation revoked Daryl Carter's driver's license for 13 months plus 50 days for Operating While Intoxicated. Daryl Carter is listed on the application as 50% shareholder.

4. On 05/27/17 at 11:40 pm, Milwaukee Police were dispatched to 2221 N Humboldt for a trouble with subject complaint. The caller, a nearby neighbor, stated there were customers outside smoking marijuana and being loud. Officers spoke with the owners of Tha Circle Bar (Daryl and Christina Carter) and advised them why they were there. Daryl became upset stating police are always coming to his bar first regarding complaints when the problem is the patrons from After Gallery located just north from his bar. While police were talking with Daryl, there were people who were being loud and yelling as they were walking south on Humboldt towards Garfield. Officers observed these people as Daryl pointing out that these people were not patrons of his establishment, but most likely part of the place just north to him. Daryl further stated he keeps people from congregating in front of his bar and in the parking lot. Officers conducted follow up at

the After Gallery located at 2225 N Humboldt. Police spoke with Lloyd Johnson who stated he was having a gathering at the location and officers advised him of the noise complaints police were receiving. Johnson was also advised that the establishment at 2221 N Humboldt had been receiving noise complaints most likely due to his customers and and that Johnson needs to monitor his business both inside and outside of the establishment. Officers also advised Johnson that people were smoking marijuana and that this needs to stop.

- 5. Between the dates of 11/19/17 and 11/27/17, Milwaukee police received several email complaints regarding loud music coming from Tha Circle Bar from Annette Scott, a nearby resident. Investigation found that on a few of those nights where she heard loud music, Tha Circle Bar was in fact closed. The music was apparently coming from another establishment near-by. The owners of Tha Circle Bar, Christina and Daryl Carter, have had text communication between Annette Scott when she has heard loud music and advised Annette on a few of those occasions that their bar was closed. Police have also checked on a few of those complaints and found that the business was closed or that there was no loud music. Christina has stated that changes were made about speaker placement in the establishment after the last complaint was made. She further stated that the After Gallery has people outside smoking, yelling and drinking, and that it is not a licensed premise, but does host parties and plays very loud music, which could be mistaken as coming from their establishment. An email was sent to Scott by an officer who explained what was done regarding her complaint and other options she would take to try and remedy any further issues.
- 6. On 12/03/17 at 12:42 am, a call was received from Christina Carter, the licensee for Tha Circle Bar, located at 2221 N Humboldt. - 7. This report is written by PO David LETTEER, assigned to District 5, Late Power Shift, Sq. 5469, along with PO Russell MACRAE.

On 05-27-17 at 11:40 p.m., we were dispatched to the location of 2221 N. Humboldt Ave., in the city and county of Milwaukee, for a trouble with subject. This location is Tha Circle Bar, a licensed premise in the city of Milwaukee.

The caller stated there were customers outside and they were smoking marijuana and being incredibly loud, all over the sidewalk. Upon arrival, we were met by Daryl Carter and Christina Carter, the owners of the bar. We met them in the parking lot, just south of the patio deck attached to the bar. There were between 5 to 10 people on the patio and we could smell marijuana in the air, but could not establish where it was coming from.

We spoke with the Carter's and informed them that a neighbor called and complained about the noise and marijuana smoking. Daryl became upset with us, venting to us that everytime there is a problem, we (the police) come to his place first. Daryl stated he is always outside policing the front and back of his bar, keeping people from standing in front of the bar and in the parking lot that his patrons park in. He went on to tell us that the people from the Gallery come to his bar and use his bathroom, which he put a stop to, as well as coming in and buying drinks.

He stated that the After Gallery, located just to the north of his bar was having an event as well. As we were speaking with Daryl, there were people who were being loud and yelling as they were walking south on Humboldt Ave. towards E. Garfield Ave. As we were watching these people, Daryl was telling us that those people were not part of his bar, but most likely part of the place just to the north of his place. He again stated that he is keeping people from congregating from in front of his bar and in the parking lot.

Daryl was again upset, due to the same two or three neighbors that keep calling on him. He stated all his neighbors come into his bar throughout the day and they do not complain to him about the bar being open. He did state that the people who come out on the patio do talk and they maybe loud, but that he tries to make sure there are no problems on the patio. We coninued to speak to Daryl and Chirstina about why we were at the bar and they ultimately understood that the same people are going to call on the bar and if it was the weekend, that we would come to speak with him, as well as the people at the After Gallery. Daryl stated he wants to run a good establishment, but with the police constantly at his bar, that drives his customers and money away.

We then went to the After Gallery and spoke again to Lloyd JOHNSON (b/m 08-14-87), who stated he was having a gathering at the loction. He stated that after our last coversation with him, that he is getting all his licenses in order with the city. We informed him why we were there and that he as the person who runs the After Gallery, he needs to come together with Daryl and Christina and come to some kind of agreement as far as the calls for service we are getting. We informed him that his gatherings at the Gallery are having an impact on the bar. When we arrived there was music that was being played and it was loud. There were also people, like the persons we observed before leaving the Gallery being loud and congregating infront of Tha Circle. We informed JOHNSON that he needs to police his business, monitor the people in front of the location who are talking and smoking. We informed him that if people are smoking marijuana, that he needs to put a stop to this. While we were speaking to JOHNSON, the building owner was also there listening to us. We informed JOHNSON that this was our second courtesy conversation. We informed him that we would start citing if we observed or heard anything coming from 2225 N.Humboldt Ave.

I also informed our CLO, PO Laurel LAMMERS of the problem we are having, so she is aware of the problem.

This report is written by PO David LETTEER, assigned to District 5, Late Power Shift, Sq. 5469 Tavern Squad. At this time I am limited duty on desk duty.

On 11-19-17 I received an email from Annette Scott, a resident who resides in the 1000 block of E. Garfield Ave., which is near the license premise called "Tha Circle Bar", located at 2221 N. Humboldt Ave., in the city and county of Milwaukee. Scott emailed me to inform me that on 11-18-17 she was listening to screaming coming from the bar and could hear the people screaming even wearing ear plugs. She went on to inform me that on 11-19-17 she was woken once again to a DJ blasting music and yelling. Her email went into more detail at 12:50a.m., on 11-19-17. She informed me that the bar was noisy again tonight and that the bass was thumping. People continued to walk in and out of the back patio door, creating peaks where it is incredibly loud. She went on to inform me that there are people yelling back and forth at each other outside. SCOTT has been in contact with Daryl, the husband of the agent Christina Carter. SCOTT would text Daryl about the noise and get a response. Now it SCOTT feels that it is not worth her time to text Daryl, due to a "Texing Argument" because he did nothing to address her concerns. SCOTT informed me that she is hesitant on calling the non-emergency number because we (the police) call back a long time after, making her stay up late waiting for a squad. She believes that the law protects the bar, more than the people around the bar who are inconvenienced by the noise or problems.

I did check the CAD and there was only one other complaint that was called in recently, which was SCOTT calling on 11-19-17 at 8:37 a.m., informing the telecommunicator that the DJ was playing music, creating bass shaking her walls, people screaming profanities. Two squads were dispatched and there is no mention of wanting a citation issued in the CAD. It does appear that one of the squads makes contact with Daryl CARTER (b/m 02-24-75). It appears that the squad advises CARTER.

On 11-24-17 SCOTT emailed me again to inform me that both the bass and the music were loud again. She again emailed me on 11-25-17 to again inform me that the music and bass were loud. She informed me that the last couple nights she could hear the music and the bass. She stated when the rear patio door is open, it sounds like a speaker right outside of her apartment. She also stated that it does not appear that the door is being propped open, just that the music is louder when the door opens and it is a nuisance. She did also inform me that on 11-26-17 in the morning; it again appeared that there was a DJ playing music very loudly. I asked the late shift squads to conduct checks of Tha Circle, to see if the music after 7 a.m., was loud or could be heard away from the bar. On 11-20-17 at 7:11 a.m., the officer could not hear any music from the front or back of the bar and checked the bar two more times, again the officer did not hear anything.

On 11-21-17 at 7:42 a.m., there was no music playing and the bar appeared to be closed. 11-25-17 an officer went to the bar, the officer did not hear any music from the front or back and the bar appeared to be closed. The officer did speak to a worker from the Dialysis Center (2203 N. Humboldt Ave.) and asked about the music in the morning. The worker informed the officer the only time music was heard was on Friday (11-24-17) due to some kind of Black Friday event that was at the bar. The worker also informed the officer that Lakefront Brewery was also having an event, so there were a lot of people in the area. On 11-26-17 an officer again went to the bar and found one person in the bar and did not hear any music from the bar, even when the front door was opened.

On 11-27-17 I spoke to Christina Carter via the telephone. I informed her of the complaints that I have been getting from Annette via email. Christina stated she was aware Annette's complaints. Christina stated that her husband Daryl has been open to any concerns that the neighbors have had regarding the bar. Christina stated Daryl has been going back and forth with Annette and has accommodated her when she has texted about the music and the noise. Christina informed me that there were recently two occasions that the bar was closed and she and Daryl have been home, when they received a text about the music from the bar. They text Annette back and have had to inform her that the bar was closed and the music could not be coming from the bar. Christina stated that a lot of times, their music is not loud, but coming from the After Gallery, located just to the north of their bar at 2225 N. Humboldt Ave. I asked Christina what hours the bar keeps. She stated when they open;

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they open at 7:00 p.m. till normal bar close. She stated they are open on Monday nights if there is a football game, then close after the game. Tuesdays and Wednesday nights they are closed; open Thursday thru Saturday, again at 7:00 p.m. Christina stated they have a juke box playing most of the time, with the exception of Fridays and Saturdays from 11:00 p.m. to close, they have a DJ. She stated her DJ has recently been bringing in a decibel meter to measure the loudness of the music. She stated when the DJ is not there, the jukebox cannot play at a volume that cannot be very loud. She stated they try to keep their music at a level that if two people cannot talk to each other in the bar, then it is too loud.

Christina went on to tell me that they are catering to Annette and her calls. She stated after I came in and spoke to Daryl about speaker placement regarding the music coming from the back door. She stated the speakers have been moved towards the east side of the bar, facing the front door, not the back door. Christina stated that they are usually not open in the morning between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. and believes that when Annette hears music that it has to be the bar. She again referenced the two texts when they were closed, when they told Annette that they were closed, they received a reply saying she was sorry for the text. Christina stated she would be willing to meet with Annette and discuss this situation with Annette, showing good faith and working with the neighbors' concerns, if Annette having contact with Daryl was not sufficient. Christina did tell me that the After Gallery has people outside smoking, yelling and drinking. She stated the After Gallery, which is not a licensed premise, does host parties and plays very loud music, which could be mistaken as coming from the bar.

I did email Annette back with what was discussed with Christina and myself. At this time she is unhappy about how the bar is being handled. In a prior email I informed her of the steps she needed to take, calling the police, contacting Alderwoman Coggs, filing a complaint, as well as working with the owner or licensee. I also informed both Annette and Christina that the license to the bar is up for renewal on 02-06-18 and that both parties could present their concerns at the meeting.

In a previous conversation with Christina, she informed me that the DJ starts around 11:00 p.m. The email includes a screen shot of the bar having a DJ on 12-07-17 starting at 8:00 p.m.

PO Russell Macrae attempted to call Scott back, but she never answered her phone. PO Macrae left her a voice mail to call us back. He also informed her that she would need to be a complainant, contact her Alderwoman, file a complaint and show up to the upcoming license committee meeting for the renewal of the bar.

I called for a squad to go to the bar, just before 1:00 a.m. on 12-08-17. The squad informed me that there were only 2 cars in the parking lot of the bar and the bar did not have any lights on and appeared to be closed.

GREER was located inside of Mother's Food Store (2438 W. Hopkins St), behind the front deli counter. GREER was conscious and breathing and was later conveyed to Froedtert by MFD.

I assisted securing the scene and several witnesses. I spoke with a store employee, identified as Yasir A. GHANI (W/M, 2-1-88), who stated that he was at the location at the time of the incident. He stated that he did not witness the incident, but explained that he did hear a single gunshot and then saw several subjects running out the front door of the location. GHANI told me that he observed the subjects enter a gold colored Chevy Trailblazer, which was parked on N. 24th Pl across the street from the store. He stated the vehicle then fled from the location. GHANI told me that he believed the first three numbers of the vehicle's plates were "747". I immediately broadcast this information over my radio.

I was met at the above location by Detective Gilbert CARRASCO and advised him of the information I had obtained.

The agent Yasir Ghani who was on scene was advised of the incident and also advised that I would be sending out a letter to enroll in the M.A.R.T.S. program.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.





The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 3. On 03/05/08 at 1:45 pm, Milwaukee police observed several subjects loitering in front of Green Ring II located at 3305 N MLK Drive. As police approached these subjects fled and ran into the Green Ring II store. Police proceeded inside and observed two open bottles of liquor, which were half full sitting on a counter in the rear of the store. Police also located another half full bottle behind some boxes near the front of the store. Officers attempted to speak with Isaac Ragsdale who refused to come from behind the counter. Ragsdale stated to police that he did not know what was going on. Police advised Ragsdale that subjects were not allowed to drink alcohol in the store with Ragsdale becoming uncooperative with police. Ragsdale stated he wasn't doing anything wrong and was tired of police messing with him.

Investigation revealed inspectors had not been out to inspect the property and officers advised Ragsdale he needed to close until inspectors approved the work done.

As officers conducted field interviews, they could smell freshly burned marijuana. Some of the subjects were found to be in possession of marijuana. Officers also observed the owner Isaac Ragsdale by his pick-up truck parked in front of the store. Police observed a 24 Oz can of "Four Maxed 10% alcohol malt beverage on his truck bumper. JOHNSON B/F 12/1/99 2633 N. 23rd St. JOHNSON is 17yo and not of legal age to purchase tobacco.

At approximately 11:40A, JOHNSON entered Green Ring II, located at 3305 N. Martin L. KIng Dr., and purchased a 2 pack grape flavored Swisher Sweets Cigars. JOHNSON described the cashier as B/M wearing a brown shirt, bald head. I entered the store and identified the cashier based on the description given. The cashier/agent was identified as: Isaac T. RAGSDALE B/M 9/3/71. RAGSDALE admitted to the sale and apologized. I advised RAGSDALE I would be mailing out enrollement forms for M.A.R.T.S.

As of 9/21/2017, the agent did not enroll in the M.A.R.T.S. program, therefore, a citation for the initial violation was mailed.

- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.
