started to yell at him. Police were then called and there were no longer anyone on scene when officers arrived.

On 3/1 of '08 at 9:37 p.m. Milwaukee police conducted a tavern inspection or investigation at 3235 West Scott. Officers from the Anti-gang Unit received information from a confidential informant that The Last Chance tavern was known to have a high volume of gang members from the C14s conducting gang activity. The informant also stated that the tavern owner's son operates the tavern and is also a known gang member. Officers entered the tavern and advised the bartender that they would be conducting a tavern investigation, and the bartender stated she understood. Officers were then approached by a subject who identified himself as Joseph Mendez, and officers requested to see the tavern's license. Investigation found a patron to be in possession of cocaine, and he was arrested and charged with possession of cocaine. Another patron became disorderly and started to yell profanities, and the subject was issued a citation for disorderly conduct. During this

The Last Chance tavern. On 4/4 of '08 at 7:05 p.m. a bartender identified as Santiago Valdez Gomez offered to sell undercover officers eight ounces of cocaine for 120 dollars and told officers to call him back later to make the drug deal. This verbal drug deal took place while Valdez Gomez was bartending at The Last Chance tavern. At 8:40 p.m. Valdez Gomez instructed another subject who was in the tavern to sell 1.67 grams of cocaine for 120 dollars to the undercover officer.

It should be noted that during the months of March and April on several occasions surveillance was done at this bar during the late afternoon and evening hours, and officers observed on a daily basis several known gang members entering and exiting the tavern. Gang members were identified as members from the Latin Kings and C14s. Officers have made several attempts to locate and arrest Joseph Mendez and Santiago Valdez Gomez and to notify Vickey Mendez about this case, but the bar was found to be closed. In reference to that, Mr. Valdez Gomez was deported. That case was dismissed, and it was dismissed only because he was being deported.

The following incidents were reported during an undercover investigation of drug sales being conducted inside The Last Chance tavern. On 3/8 of '08 at 6:25 p.m. an undercover Milwaukee police officer was able to purchase .43 grams of cocaine from the bartender at The Last Chance bar located at 3235 West Scott Street. The bartender was identified as Joseph Mendez. This drug transaction took place while Mendez was bartending at the bar. On 3/12 of '08 at 9:15 p.m. an undercover Milwaukee police officer was able to purchase .28 grams of cocaine from the bartender at The Last Chance bar located at 320 -- 3235 West Scott Street. The bartender was identified as Joseph Mendez, and the buy was conducted while Mendez was bartending. It was learned that Mendez lives in the upper residence above the bar with his mother, Vickey Mendez, who is the tavern's licensee.

On 3/14/08 at 6:25 p.m. Joseph Mendez, while bartending, again delivered .19 grams of cocaine to an undercover officer who was inside There is another subject mentioned here, Mr. Joseph Mendez. There is an open felony warrant for manufacture and delivery of cocaine.

On 4/18 of '08 at 9:44 p.m. Milwaukee police were dispatched to complaints of loud music at 3235 West Scott Street. Officers were about one block away and could hear loud music. Officers found the music to be coming from The Last Chance bar and spoke to the licensee, Vickey Mendez. Mendez stated there was a wedding reception in the back room and that the music was not loud. Officers found the level to be an unacceptable level and advised Mendez that it does disturb her area neighbors. Mendez was instructed to tell the DJ to lower the music level and keep it at an acceptable level for the rest of the night. On 10 - - At 10:50 p.m. officers were again dispatched to 3235 West Scott for a loud music complaint. Police could hear the music being played from over 50 feet away. Officers spoke to Vickey Mendez again and cited her for noise nuisances. That case was dismissed without prejudice.

Police also spoke to Vickey Mendez, who stated she was with her husband all evening and no threats were ever made to anyone.

On 1/1 of '09 at 3:17 a.m. Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3225 West Scott Street, Last Chance tavern for a fight complaint. Officers arrived and observed a male patron bleeding from the head and observed he had a swollen left eye. Police also observed several broken pool cues strewn about the bar. Officers spoke to the victim who stated he observed two patrons going from the public bar into a private party room, and that the private party patrons asked the two others to leave. The two patrons left the tavern only to return a short time later

fined 356 dollars.

On 8/23 of '08 at 2:18 a.m. Milwaukee police conducted a licensed premise check aß235 West Scott Street, The Last Chance bar. As officers approached the tavern they were about 50 feet away and could hear music being played from inside the tavern. Officers entered the tavern and spoke with Vickey Mendez regarding the loud music. While officers were speaking to Vickey Mendez, her husband, Manuel Mendez, approached officers and began to argue with them. Manuel Mendez continued to obstruct officers as they were attempting to conduct their investigation. Manuel Mendez was cited for restricting, obstructing an officer, and Vickey Mendez received a citation for noise nuisance. As to Vickey Mendez, the noise nuisance citation is set for trial on 2/9 of '09.

On 9/20 of '08 at 12:50 a.m. Milwaukee police were dispatched to 3201 West Scott for a call for police. We spoke to the caller who stated she - - he was at The Last Chance tavern around 11:30 p.m. having some beers when the owner of the tavern, Manuel Mendez, started talking to him and an argument started. This is

with several other subjects who approached the private party patrons, which were now playing pool. The victim stated that one of the subjects threw a beer bottle at one of the guys playing pool, only the bottle struck the victim and a big fight ensued. Reports were filed.

13th, I observed a trailer in front of The Last Chance moving in very large speakers. There was very loud music that night, the day after the revocation.

Okay. On the 13th I also observed public urination. It was still daylight hours, at 6:30 p.m. There was a silver Jeep. I have their license number here. I had a friend helping me re-deck my front porch, and at approximately 6:30 a male Hispanic with a white and blue checkered shirt, jeans and cowboy hat was standing at the curb between the open front door of the passenger side, - - and the car, and as I was approaching the front of his car to cross the street to move my car, there is a sleeping boy in the front seat. He wasn't in a car seat at all. And as I approached, the man tried turning his back to me, and I challenged him saying, "Hey, what are you doing?" And I saw he was trying to quickly zip up his pants. I put my car in the garage and I came back out to check the front yard. And that same man was carrying the young boy into The Last Chance tavern. Okay. On Saturday, September 20th at

I talked to the 6th District Captain, that I was pretty shaken up about my safety.

Okay. On October 11th at 8:15 p.m. I observed the following event. I looked outside, because there was some loud shouting. And it was still light outside, and there was a group of five to six males loitering outside The Last Chance tavern front door. The crowd of people moved to my side of the block. So I went outside on my front porch as the argument escalated. Vickey and Manny Mendez came outside after a minute and Manny crossed the street. One young lady, she was probably in her 60 - - Sorry - - in her 20s was shouting at her male friend, let's go before the cops come. So I went inside and called the Milwaukee Police Department at 8:27 p.m. And then I go on to talk to who I talked to at the 6th District. They actually transferred me, when I told them that I needed an immediate dispatch to 33rd and Scott for a possible fight and loud noise, the 6th District female PO transferred me to the non-emergency number. And that operator stated they were busy, and they would have a PO call me back, and I got no response from the Milwaukee Police Department

And I observed Vickey Mendez was in an upstairs window watching the patrons leave. And for the record, I don't see any security outside there helping out with noise in the neighborhood in front of the bar.

The next morning on October 12th, I'm - - I'm always picking up beer bottles. I pick up beer bottles, and I put it right on their patio. They have a stone patio that's made of bricks. I pick up all the beer bottles that I

can find in front of my house, every time they're open. I'm sure they got quite a collection.

Okay. Loud music and a car sitting outside in front of the - - the door of The Last Chance. This was on a Wednesday, October 5th at 10:27 p.m. The Last Chance, a passenger from the car went inside and came out approximately 12 minutes later, while that music was playing. And this is also a school night. We have a lot of children in our neighborhood that go to Doerfler School. And a lot of these incidents are during the week or on Sunday night.

November 12th, loud music, patrons in the bar. They can't even hear their car alarms going off that are annoying the neighborhood. And that music is so loud that they come out of the bar shouting. You know when you go to a concert and your - - your hearing is temporarily gone, that's, I think, is part of the issue. That's my assumption, my opinion.

Okay. I previous went to Manny Mendez about patrons parking. They have no off-street parking. The parking is all on the street, and The Last Chance patrons park anywhere they want. Our neighborhood is pretty good about parking on

morning to go to school, and they kick them in the street, and the cars hit them, and they shatter. And I'm out - - sometimes I'm out in the street, sweeping glass up. I have num - numerous, numerous pictures.

I also have pictures of some car tires down my sidewalk. In front of my house on my sidewalk there's a tree between the street and my sidewalk. Why would there be tire tracks down my sidewalk? There's also one sign on our side of the street that says, no parking 3:30 to 5:30, because of school buses on school days. That -- That sign has been hit so many times it's not even there anymore.

So I do - - did want to talk about that we had a neighborhood watch after the revocation, a block meeting, with our liaison, Jesus Gloria. He came and we had the meeting in The Last Chance bar, which I did not think was a - - a neutral location for some of the neighbors that object to the bar. There's a school down the street. We could have had it in another church. But it was mostly a neighborhood block party - - I mean, block party - - block meeting for getting to know each other. We weren't addressing the problems

the correct side of the street for parking and snowplowing. I only park on the street when the snow is so deep I can't get up the alley and get in the garage. So as you know, the snow falls and the streets get narrower. Well, this particular night a snowplow came down a street and came to the front of The Last Chance tavern, and the driver of the plow couldn't get through, and he couldn't back up, so he laid on his horn for ten to 15 minutes. Now, this is 1:30 in the morning. Eventually some patron came out and moved their vehicles. And I have pictures of how narrow our streets are when it snows, and you're welcome to look at these pictures.

And the last one I have here is this week, as a matter of fact. I came home from a conference in Sheboygan this past Saturday afternoon to find a tequila bottle - - bottle sticking out of a snowbank in front of my house. I mean, the litter is just ridiculous. I don't know if they're letting the carry - - their patrons carry it out, which is illegal, or - - or what the answer is there, but I have numerous pictures. And the reason I pick up the beer bottles is because the kids come by in the

So I believe, and - - And these officers, they're here at my request. I wanted to be able to handle anything that - - that came forward. But it's important that we, as a community, stand up and back these officers in what they're going through, too, and - - and make a statement. Because I feel it's the absolute wrong statement to renew this license, given the evidence of gang and drug activity. What is that telling this community? Thank you.
