I am e-mailing you to update you on the Administration's efforts related to the Stimulus Package the President recently signed into law. As most of you may know, the Mayor asked me to lead a Stimulus Working Group to ensure the City acts quickly in accessing stimulus dollars. Over the past few weeks, meetings have been held with representatives from various City Departments including the Departments of Administration (DOA), City Development (DCD), Public Works (DPW) and Health. The Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee (HACM) and Milwaukee Area Workforce Investment Board (MAWIB) have also been actively attending. President Hines and Alderman Murphy have also attended meetings to ensure that the Common Council is kept abreast of these activities.

The Working Group comprises five teams:

- 1. Crime and Public Safety
- 2. Energy and the Environment
- 3. Infrastructure
- 4. Poverty, Work and Opportunity
- Tax Relief

The Working Group has been tasked with:

- 1. Identifying all funding opportunities contained in the Stimulus Bill (due this week)
- 2. Prioritizing and linking City projects to all available funding opportunities (due next week).
- 3. Creating a Work Plan to seize every opportunity to secure stimulus dollars and hold City Departments accountable (due mid March)

We will, of course, be seeking input from the Common Council (an in particular Committee Chairs) as we move forward. We will also be working closely with federal government officials and other key stakeholders. As you know, there are other entities that will be receiving stimulus dollars directly (such as MPS and the State) and we want to influence the expenditure of those dollars as best we can.

I'm attaching two Common Council files approved by Steering and Rules last week on Thursday, February 19, 2009. These files were approved with the input of DOA. One file (#081442) creates a Stimulus Task Force. Just so I don't confuse you, I want to clarify that this task force is not tied to the Working Group. It has been formed to address legal, administration and policyordinance changes we may need to address to ack swiftly to ensure we get stimulus dollars. The Working Group will decide what those issues may be. The other file (#081478) allows City Departments to apply for stimulus funding as soon as it becomes available. The text of both files is highlighted below.
