Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by PO Penny Brown assigned to the License Investigation Unit.

On Saturday, June 17, 2017, I was assigned to work the Wisconsin WINS Youth Tobacco Initiative, which checks area vendors for age compliant tobacco sells. Assisting in this assignment was: Lila JOHNSON B/F 12/1/99, 2633 N. 23rd St., Milwaukee, WI 53206. JOHNSON is 17you and not of legal age to purchase tobacco.

At approximately 10:25a.m., JOHNSON entered Family Food Market located at 2803 N. 35th St, and purchased a 2 pack White Grape flavored White Owl cigar. JOHNSON described the cashier as a A/M wearing a black toshirt with curly hair. I entered the store and immediately identified the cashier (Osyed S. SALEM A/M 12/23/97) based on the description. SALEM admitted to the sale and stated he did not request an id. I advised SALEM I would be mailing an enrollement packet to the agent to enroll in the M.A.R.T.S. program.

Due to the fact this is a Class A establishment, I requested to see SALEM's Class D Operators License. SALEM stated he did have one, however, it was not on his person. A later check with LIRA (License Infromation Reporting Administration System) revealed SALEM did not have a Class D Operator License.

I contacted the agent (Naser A. ASAD) to advise him of the situation and that he would be receiving a citation for the violation, however, received a voicemail and left him a message advising him of the situation.

As of 9/21/2017, the agent did not enroll in the M.A.R.T.S. program, therefore, a citation for the initial violation was mailed.

If you wish, you may provide testimony at the hearing regarding the request; see below for further information. You are not required to attend the hearing. Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing. Please review the information below and if you have further questions regarding this process, please contact the License Division at (414) 286-2238.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.

7. On 04/03/11 at 2:00 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4001 W North Avenue for a Fight complaint. Police spoke with Connie Leland who stated a group of females started fighting in the bar and that one of them threw a glass at the security guard, identified as Ricky Trotter, striking him in the head. Leland stated the patron is a frequent customer at the bar, but that she didn't know her name. Police obtained other witness statements regarding this incident. Trotter was conveyed to an area hospital where he was treated for cut to this forehead and the interior part of his right eye. Trotter received an undetermined amount of sutures. A copy of video surveillance was obtained and inventoried.

Leland, Connie M

8. On 12/20/12 at 3:00 am, Milwaukee police investigated an Armed Robbery that took place just outside of Connie's Nite Life bar. Investigation revealed that the two suspects were outside the tavern near closing time with the intent to rob patrons within. The suspects were armed with guns and wearing masks and when the security guard exited the bar from the rear door; the two men approached the guard and attempted to force him back inside the tavern, but the rear open faced security door had locked after the guard walked out so he and the suspects could not get back inside to the bar. While outside, the one suspect demand and removed money from the guard as the other discharged his handgun several times, striking Williams in the knee. A pit-bull that had come running down the stairs from an upper apartment above the bar was also shot 5 times by one of the suspects. A second security guard, who was still inside the bar, opened the tavern exit door and was shot at by one of the suspects, with the round striking the women's bathroom door. Both suspects then fled on foot through an alley. Surveillance video was obtained and placed on police inventory. The licensee, Connie Leland, was notified of the incident.

- 9. On 01/24/13 at 1:35 am, Milwaukee police were dispatched to 4001 W. North Avenue for a Trouble With Subject complaint. While police were en-route, the call was upgraded to a Shots Fired. Officers arrived on scene and spoke to Connie Leland who stated that she originally called the police because she and her security were having trouble controlling a known patron, who was in a verbal altercation with another patron in the bar. Security was escorting the subject out of the bar when the subject grabbed a glass and threw it at the known patron. Once the subject was outside, security locked the front door, however, the subject began banging on the front door calling for the known patron to come outside. Leland stated she kept the known patron inside and called police. Leland stated the subject left the area in an auto and approximately 10 minutes later, the subject returned and stood outside the front door area of the bar, where he shot a firearm into the air one time. Leland has a functioning surveillance system, which did capture the incident on tape. A copy was provided and placed on police inventory. Reports were filed.
- 10. On 02/28/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a battery cutting at 4001 West North Avenue (Connie's Nite Life Lounge). Investigation revealed a patron was injured while inside the business when her ex-boyfriend threw a glass at her. Milwaukee police incident report #140590003 filed.

11. On 04/17/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a recklessly endangering safety complaint at 4001 West North Avenue (Connie's Nite Life Lounge). Investigation revealed that around 12:00am two subjects approached the business together, one of these subjects was denied entry because during a pat down it was discovered that he was carrying a handgun on his person. This subject went to an auto, placed the handgun inside and returned to the business. He was then allowed entry. Around 1:00am, these same subjects left the business together. Minutes later, one of these subjects returned to the bar and told security to call 911 because he had been shot. The victim, who was treated at Foredtert Hospital for a gunshot wound to the face, reported that the subject he had been at the business with earlier had shot him. Milwaukee police incident report #141070019 filed.

- 12. On 04/21/2014 a meeting attended by members of the Milwaukee police department, the applicant and one of the applicant's security guards was held at Milwaukee police district #3 regarding the shooting described in item #11. During this meeting, the business's security practices were discussed. Officers suggested that if a weapon was discovered on someone attempting to gain entry, that person should be banned from the property. The applicant discussed current security arrangements with officers and agreed to take steps to make some corrections.
- 13. On 06/21/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a battery complaint at 2466 North Teutonia Avenue. The victim, Latrice Peoples, told police she had been at 4001 West North Avenue (Connie's Nite Life Lounge) earlier when she overheard a male "cussing out" a female. Peoples attempted to intervene to help the female. A short time later, Peoples was approached by a couple outside of the bar. The female argued with Peoples and then struck her several times in the head with an unknown object. Peoples was later treated at Froedtert Hospital where she received two stitches to her right ear. The applicant told police she was aware of a disagreement inside the bar, but that it didn't seem too serious. Additionally, the applicant stated that when she became aware of the fight outside, Peoples told her she did not want to involve the police. The establishment's video wasn't working at the time of the incident. Milwaukee police incident report #141720035 filed.
- 14. On 10/30/2014 Milwaukee police, while on patrol, heard a gunshot in the 2200 block of North 40th Street. Security and citizen's from Connie's Nite Life Lounge told officers that the person who fired the shot had fled southbound in a dark color SUV. Security and witness's from the business told officers they had observed a fight in the middle of the street, and that one of the combatant's had fired at least one shot from a handgun into the ground. Neither the person who fired the shot, nor the other party involved was located by police. The establishment's video cameras were not operational during this incident. Milwaukee police incident report #143030012 filed.
- 15. On 11/06/2014 Milwaukee police observed a fight outside of 4001 West North Avenue (Connie's Nite Life Lounge). Investigation revealed there had been a fight inside the business and that the involved parties continued outside. The establishment's video cameras were not operation during this incident. The applicant stated they have been waiting on a part for the cameras for approximately 8 months. Four patrons were cited for disorderly conduct.
- 16.On 11/06/2014 Milwaukee police observed that there was no Maximum Occupancy Placard visible inside Connie's Nite Life Lounge (4001 West North Avenue). The applicant was cited.

- 17. On 02/12/2015 Milwaukee police were flagged down by a security guard, Steven Thompson, at Connie's Nite Life Lounge (4001 West North Avenue) regarding a fight. Thompson told officers that he barred entry to 4 males who appeared to be under the age of 25. One of the males returned a short time later, pointed at Thompson and said "he's the one from Wal-Mart get the gun". No weapons were recovered and no one was arrested.
- 18. On 03/06/2015 at 1:20am officers responded to several calls of shots fired at 4001 W. North Av. The investigation revealed the victim was inside Connie's Nite Life Lounge since about 11:00pm. He had an argument with other patrons and at about 1:15am was kicked out by security, at which point a fight with security and other patrons occurred. The fight ranged from 10-20 individuals. After the fight the victim was walking to his car and several shots were fired. At his car he was approached by an unknown subject who asked if he was okay. While talking with this person another subject walked up and shot him in the chest. The victim stated the subject who shot him was not one of the security guards he had been fighting with inside. There were casings recovered from two different caliber guns.
- 19. On 03/11/2015 the applicant attended a meeting at Milwaukee police district #3 regarding a shooting incident involving Connie's Nite Life Lounge (4001 West North Avenue). The applicant stated on the night in question, 80% of the patrons were new people. Additionally, she stated she does not have complete trust in her staff and that they do not always know the best way to talk to people to keep a situation from escalating. It was suggested that she should start with an employee she can trust, train her staff to know what her expectations are and add an ID reader.

- 20. On 10/18/2015 Milwaukee police responded to the subject with a gun complaint at 4001 West North Avenue (Connie's Nite Life). The call came from a patron of the business who stated a subject had threatened her and was in possession of a gun. Investigation revealed the subject had come to the business and was outside yelling that he wanted to get his wife prior to pushing his way past security to gain entry to the premise. This subject was ultimately apprehended by police and issued a citation for Disorderly Conduct. No firearm was discovered.
- 21. On 05/17/2017 at 12:05am officers were dispatched to a shooting at N. 40th St and W. North Av. The incident occurred at 4020 W. North Av with the victim sitting in a car that the suspect shot into. There were patrons in line waiting to get into Connie's Night Life, 4001 W. North Av. None of the people in line saw anything and the security guard stated he heard the shots but did not see anything. The officers checked the video surveillance but found the system unable to record because the hard drive was full.

22. On 08/16/2017 at 2:08am officers observed a large crowd outside Connie's Nite Life, 4001 W. North Av. The officers observed two crowds, one in the street surrounding a fight and another around the business. The suspect in the fight was taken into custody and another disorderly subject was arrested. The officers looked at the video system but found the system was full and unable to record.

- 23. On 09/03/2017 at 2:14am officers were dispatched to a shots spotter call at 4005 W. North Av. The officers observed a large crowd outside Connie' Nite Life, 4001 W. North Av. There were cars blocking the intersection with several people fighting in the street. The subjects fled the scene when the police arrived. There were no callers regarding this incident.
- 24. On 09/15/2017 at 1:19am officers conducted a tavern check at Connie's Nite Life, 4001 W. North Av. The officers observed 25-30 people outside the premise. They then counted patrons as they exited. There were 102 people, including employees, inside the business. The official placard stated the business had an occupancy limit of 80 people. The applicant was cited for being over occupancy.

- 25. On 09/22/2017 at 12:59am officers were dispatched to a fight at N. 40th St and W. North Av. The officers observed 25-30 people outside Connie's Nite Life, 4001 W. North Av. The security guard stated there was a fight between two groups of females but they had left. The caller stated this was an ongoing problem
- 26. On 10/10/2017 there was meeting held at District 3 regarding incidents at Connie's Nite Life, 4001 W. North Av. The applicant stated she had armed security but had to let them go after a homicide. She now has unarmed security but they have come complacent and are often smoking cigarettes with the patrons. She stated she no longer has a patio which is causing patrons to smoke outside the front. This is causing problems because people in line are getting angry when they are not let inside because of capacity issues. It was suggested that she have rope line put up outside and limit the number of people waiting to get inside. She was advised she would be receiving a nuisance letter and that officers would contact her regarding a CPTED of the premise.
- 27. On 12/20/2017 at 1:06am officers responded to a shot fired complaint at Connie's Nite Life, 4001 W. North Av. The applicant stated that one of her bartenders was in a verbal argument with a customer. The customer, Eric LEE, was kicked out and he continued to make threats to harm the applicant and shot up the bar. LEE stated as he was attempting to leave someone fired shots at his car striking it. LEE was cited for Disorderly Conduct.

When the groups began walking to their cars security came back inside and a shot was heard outside. The officers checked the video surveillance system but found it full and had not recorded since 09/14/2017.

On Wednesday, May 17, 2017 at 12:05am, Milwaukee Police Officers were dispatched to the area of N. 40th St./W. North Ave. for a Shooting. Connie's Nite Life Tavern was located at 4001 W. North Ave. during this incident.

The incident occurred at an approximate address of 4020 W. North Ave. During the incident, an unknown suspect while armed with a handgun, recklessly discharged several shots causing bullet strike to a black vehicle. The vehicle was occupied by the victim who sustained injuries from glass fragments.

On Wednesday, August 16, 2017 at 2:08am, Milwaukee Police Officers were on patrol, and came upon a large crowd outside of Connie's Nite Life Lounge (4001 W North Av).

The officers witnessed a large crowd surrounding the location, at "bar close." Another crowd was in the road and it appeared that multiple subjects were kicking someone lying on the ground. As the officers pulled closer, they noticed a person lying on the ground on his/her back, and a female (suspect 1) was hitting the person who was not moving. The suspect was placed in custody. The victim was later treated at a local hospital for a head injury (concussion). The victim lost consciousness during the incident.

As officers were calling for medical attention for the victim, the large crowd moved towards them. Suspect 2 threatened to shoot the officers, and disobeyed several lawful orders to stand back. Suspect 2 continued to approach the officers and were physically stopped by officers. Suspect 2 use loud and profane language, and got into a "boxer's stance." Officers attempted to place Suspect 2 in custody, but he continued to refuse orders. An officer deployed his Taser at Suspect 2, and officers were able to place him in custody.

During the incident, Suspect 3 used loud and profane language which assisted in drawing the crowd closer to the officers. Suspects 3 was detained, and later released with a future court date.

The licensee allowed us to view the video surveillance cameras. I attempted to view the video, but the computer's hard drive was full and unable to record. The licensee stated she would call the installer of her security system to fix the equipment.

On Friday, September 15th, 2017, at approximately 1:19am, the Milwaukee Police Department conducted a Tavern Check at Connie's Nite Life Lounge (4001 W. North Ave.).

This report is submitted by P.O. Lyndsey PETERS assigned to District Three, Modified Early Shift. On Tuesday, October 10, 2017, at 1pm, a meeting with the owner's of Connie's Nite Life Lounge and an attorney was held in District Three's Conference room regarding incidents of concern that have occurred at the location. Connie LELAND made it clear that she is having issues with hiring and maintaining effective security during hours of operation at the location. LELAND stated up until July 9th, 2016, she had armed security through a company, however, they were involved in a Homicide so they had to be let go. Since then she has been hiring unarmed security by application and stated the people she's hiring will be ok for a month or two and then become complacent. She stated she will check on them and they are outside just smoking cigarettes with everyone. She stated she is constantly hiring and firing security. She believes the issues started when her patio was shut down. The patio was utilized for people to smoke, but now they have to stand outside the front of the business to do it. When asked why the patio was taken away from her she stated because she didn't have adequate lighting. She stated she didn't want to upset neighbors by putting lights in the patio. LELAND stated she has thirteen employees staffed during hours of operation, four of which are security guards. The security is there from open (9pm) until close. Two are outside and two are inside during hours of operation. There is an age limit requirement of 25 years of age and older only. There are six or seven cameras at the location, one of which is covering the exit / entrance. LELAND stated there is a counter to check people coming into the business and a hand held counter that should be checking people leaving, however, the security guards seem to get confused often. It was suggested that she use a double counter to ensure an accurate count of people on premise during hours of operation to make sure not to go over capacity. Another suggestion was to train security hired for security purposes at the location. As of now there isn't a structured plan to hold security accountable. Another recommendation was to create a line by roping off a section and limiting the number of people in line based on the number of security guards working (safe ratio for security to be capable of handling). LELAND stated a lot of fights ensue when patrons believe they are getting turned down due to capacity when they still see people coming and going, however, Connie stated that patrons are smoking and coming back in. She expressed her frustration with how disrespectful people will get when unable to enter. LELAND was informed she will be receiving a nuisance letter regarding the property and also that we will be following up with her to conduct a CPTED survey of the premise. Sgt. RADEN, Assistant City Attorney Patrick LEIGL, Special Enforcement Inspector Matt RZEPKOWSKI from DNS, Captain BOSTON-SMITH, Sgt. CANIFF, P.O. ANDERSON, P.O. FINKLEY, P.O. STAHL, P.O. WHITTENBERGER and myself were present for this meeting.

This report was submitted by P.O. Scott WIETING, assigned to District 3, Late shift.

On Sunday, February 11, 2018, at approximately 2:29 A.M., I began responding to the intersection of N 40th St and W North Av, regarding a shooting complaint. Upon my arrival, I observed Squad 3340 (P.O. Antonio OBREGON and P.O. Adam GONZALEZ) on-scene, attending to a subject who had been struck by gunfire in the leg. The subject was sitting down on the Northeast corner of N 40th St and W North Av.

Through the investigation, it was determined the suspects and victim of the shooting incident had all been patrons at the bar located at 4001 W North Av (Connie's Nitelife Lounge). The initial story was a group of approximately 7 individuals were asked to leave the tavern after a verbal altercation inside. The second group, which was involved in the altercation, was kept inside, while the first group left the immediate area outside of the bar.

Once the second group left, a physical fight started outside of the tavern, between the two groups. The security team attempted to separate the two groups. Once the groups began walking to their vehicles the security team went back into the tavern.

A shot was heard by multiple patrons, who stayed in the bar.

The subject survived the shooting, and had been taken to Froedtert hospital by the Milwaukee Fire Department.

It should be noted, upon a check of the video camera system, it was discovered the system was full and had not made a recording since September 14, 2017. Inside of the establishment were two dart boards, five separate gaming machines, and an AMI music jukebox. Behind the bar was one flat screen television and one tube style television. A sign posted behind the bar from the City of Milwaukee noted the occupancy limit for the tavern was 80 people.

No arrests were made on the date of this incident regarding the shooting investigation.
