There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-2.7-4, probative evidence concerning whether or not a new license should be granted may be presented on the following subjects: whether or not the applicant meets the municipal requirements, the appropriateness of the location and premises where the licensed premises is to be located and whether use of the premises for the purposes or activities permitted by the license would tend to facilitate a public or private nuisance or create undesirable neighborhood problems such as disorderly patrons, unreasonably loud noise, litter, and excessive traffic and parking congestion. Probative evidence relating to these matters may be taken from the plan of operation submitted with the license application, if any, but shall not include the content of any music. Evidence regarding the fitness of the location of the premises to be maintained as the principal place of business, including but not limited to whether there is an overconcentration of businesses of the type for which the license is sought; whether the proposal is consistent with any pertinent neighborhood business or development plans, or the location's proximity to areas where children are typically present. The applicant's record in operating similarly licensed premises; and whether or not the applicant has been charged with or convicted of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the activity to be permitted by the license being applied for or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety or welfare may also be considered. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

Limited parking for persons attending meetings in City Hall is available at reduced rates (5 hour limit) at the Milwaukee Center on the southwest corner of East Kilbourn and North Water Street. Parking tickets must be validated in the first floor information booth in City Hall.

- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.



You are also welcome to retrieve the complaints geared towards their illegally parked vehicles for sale with the Milwaukee parking enforcement.



Honorable Alderwomen and Aldermen of the Licenses Committee,

I'm here today to speak to you about the impact that the Family Dollar located at the corner of North Avenue and 55th Street has had on my neighborhood, my property, and the safety of my family. My wife and I live in our home at with our 6-year-old daughter. Our home is immediately north of the Family Dollar parking lot. The Family Dollar, though it provides valuable retail services, places a serious nuisance and safety burden on the surrounding neighborhood.

Twice in the past five days, suspected shoplifters have raced out Family Dollar's rear emergency exit into the alleyway located between Family Dollar and our home. Friday night, the individual entered my back yard by climbing a six-foot wooden fence. When the person saw me through my kitchen window, he climbed the fence in to the neighbor's yard and disappeared behind their garage. My wife called the police to report the incident. The entire time the security alarm at Family Dollar was sounding.

Then, just last night around 8:45, another suspected shoplifter fled into the residential properties to the north of Family Dollar. This time, the suspect hid out in my neighbor's back yard where police located him and took him into custody.

These two incidents are not the only suspected thefts that I have witnessed, In mid-April, during the middle of a weekday, I watched a young man run down the alley rolling a garbage can filled with retail merchandise and pile into an SUV with no license plates that was waiting on 54th street. The back door to the Family Dollar was wide open. And on Sunday evening I was in the Family Dollar waiting in the checkout line listening to the cashier explain to a co-worker that a "young fat kid" had just stolen a bunch of candy. The cashier said the next time the youth comes in he plans to "slap him around."

These incidences of shoplifting and theft are far too common. When a suspect flees out the back of the store, I fear that a member of my family or my neighborhood will be in harm's way, whether from a suspect who is carrying a gun, or a get-away car that is speeding off.

My second area of concern straddles the line between being a public nuisance and a public health issue. The Family Dollar grounds, including the parking lot, dumpster site, and landscaping, is regularly covered in garbage including food waste, packaging and wrappers, dog feces, and broken glass. On windy days, these wrappers blow on to adjacent properties, while the food and animal waste attracts pests including rats and gulls. The grounds are not regularly cleaned by employees. The litter that fills the parking lot at night is still there the next day, and again the next evening. The store has been cited by the city on multiple occasions for property violations such as these. These citations prompt the Family Dollar

management to respond to the specific complaint, but their pattern of behavior continues to be problematic.

When a property is left in poor condition, it attracts problem behavior. It sends a message that the owners do not care about what takes place on and around their property. I have witnessed mobile to mobile drug deals in the alley north of the Family Dollar as well as along 54th street east of the Family Dollar. I have seen men drinking alcohol in their car and tossing the bottles and cans out their window into the parking lot, and men urinating against the fence along the north side of the parking lot. As I said at the outset, the Family Dollar, though it provides valuable retail services, under its current management is a blight on the local neighborhood. I respectfully request that the Licenses Committee consider this testimony when deciding on the relicensure of the Family Dollar.

Rob Theunis,

As I was pulling into the alley, after picking my 7-year-old up from school, I had to stop because a man was peeing next to my neighbor's garbage cans. If I had pulled into my garage, my daughter would have had a direct view of the man. And the man, faced with a stopped car in the alleyway, simply watched us as he continued to urinate in the alley. Afterward, he pulled up his pants and walked down the alley toward 55th. I pulled into the garage, disgusted and frustrated - I couldn't confront him, with my daughter in the car, and so we were stuck, waiting for him to finish peeing on our neighbor's trash cans. At dinner that night, my daughter talked about how she thought "that man" was letting his dog pee in the alley but then she saw him "you know (makes shaking motion with her hand)." Yes, I had to listen to my child talking about a strange man shaking his penis in our alleyway, not 15 feet from our garage/backyard, and know that this is just one more example of why the last homeowner eventually sold her home of 10 years; too many frustrations and not enough action is the problem here.

To keep the file up-to-date, there continues to be broken glass in the alley, near the dumpster area. I know because my tires crunch over it every day when I back out of my garage. There is also garbage from people who walk and drive through the alley - wrappers, cans, cigarettes, etc. The alley pavement is broken and full of potholes, and it sure makes private snow removal and garage access damaging in the winter. In short, Family Dollar is not maintaining "their half" of the alley, much less being a good neighbor. This would not be tolerated from a private citizen on our block, so why is a business allowed to neglect property without consequences? Meanwhile, I drive through the stretch of alleys to our east, and they are clean and the pavement is in great condition.

Where are we with the alley vacating approval?

Your response is overdue.

I would agree with your assessment, and it has been my experience, that Family Dollar are terrible corporate citizens. Although their current manager appeared to be willing to work with the neighbors at first, he has since become unresponsive like all the previous district managers.

For the past few weeks, I have been attempting to contact Mr. Theunis. I have not been successful in speaking with him and his voicemail box has been full.

As of tomorrow, I will be sending out a drafted certified letter from my office formally notifying Family Dollar of my concerns and the neighborhood's requests. In addition, the letter will inform them of possible neighborhood objections that will be placed on file and need to be addressed at their next renewal.

I will continue my attempts to contact Mr. Theunis and notify you immediately of any developments.

The lack of communication on this matter from Family Dollar is infuriating. I take Mr Theunis at his word that he has attempted to contact corporate real estate on multiple occasions. Unfortunately, this seems to have generated no response.

Six months ago, I attended a city license committee meeting and listened to a number of complaints about other Family Dollar locations. My neighbor and I also stood up and lodged a complaint about this location. We were assured by your then-assistant that the store manager, Mr. Theunis, had a plan in place which would allow Family Dollar to be more responsive to the needs of the surrounding community. As a result of that plan, you supported re-licensing this location, though a formal letter of warning was to be included in the store's license file.

To his credit, Mr Theunis took the time to meet with a group that included yourself, my neighbor, and me, to discuss future plans for the alley. At that time he left his support to the plan. A short time later, he added signage to the alley to discourage littering and loitering. Sadly, Family Dollar has take no further action to help move us toward an MOU.

The maction appears to be due to a corporate structure that pays little attention to local matters that affect the community. The fact that Family Dollar locations around Milwaukee, including this one, have a lengthy record of complaints from neighbors including shoplifting and theft, littering, and loitering does not appear to be coincidental. It appears to be the corporate business model. This alley issue is about safety. Family Dollar's corporate inaction on the matter is a clear signal that the company has no real interest in the needs of the community in which it does business.

Since then, we have heard nothing from Rob Theunis or anyone else regarding moving this alley vacation toward a successful conclusion.

In the past year, a Family Dollar business license was renewed despite complaints from its neighbors. The understanding was that parking lot cleanliness and area security would be addressed in order for that license to be upheld and renewed; where is the improved security so that our families are safe and can use our own garage/"driveway" spaces without fear of lurking or speeding cars, due to FD thefts? Our proposed solution was to vacate the alley and all parties at the literal table agreed to this course of action. In subsequent emails, support has continued for this solution, but we are no closer to owning and closing off that alley than we were in early summer.

In response to Ald. Murphy's request for a cost estimate to vacate the E-W alley in the between W Meinecke Ave, W North Ave, N 54 th St & N 55 th St (Family Dollar) below are the estimated costs received.
There is one alley light located within the vacation area. The petitioner is to deposit \$400 to remove the existing alley light.
Electrical service for the signal at W North Ave and N 55 th St comes from a WE Energies pole located in the alley. If WE Energies is requested to move a separate service fee would be required to move traffic

facilities. No fee calculated at this time. If traffic services remain, an easement would be required. The petitioner would be required to deposit \$600 for the cost to prepare and record one easement.

The City will convey one catch basin to the petitioner. The petitioner must reimburse the City for the remaining useful life of the catch basin at a cost of \$400.

(Have not received an estimate yet. The following is based on a 2014 estimate of \$7,700 for one alley approach closure)

The petitioner is to deposit \$15,400.00 to remove the alley approaches on North 54th Street and North 55th Street. The petitioner can choose to undertake this work provided that their contractor secures the necessary DPW permits. Once the City accepts this work, the \$15,400.00 will be refunded. The petitioner can choose to have the City undertake this roadway work and use funds on the deposit to cover the cost. This is an estimate, so any unused funds will be refunded, conversely if the work is more costly, the petitioner will be required to make up the shortfall. If the petitioner chooses to use the alley approaches on either North 54th Street, North 55th Street or both as driveways, a Department of Public Works "Out of Program Permit" must be obtained for each driveway to be retained.



PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by P.O. Joseph BINTER, assigned to District 3, early shift.

On Monday, May 1, 2017, at 7:50 p.m., while on patrol, squad 3251, P.O. LaCarlin DAVIS and I were dispatched to 5428 W. North Ave (Family Dollar) for an armed robbery. Upon arrival we located witness and employees inside of the store who stated that the actor had fled the store. We obtained a preliminary description of the subject and broadcasted information on District 3 talk group. We reported this information to District 3 acting Lt., Sgt. A RILEY and stood by for the detective bureau. Detective Michael SLOMCZEWSKI (Squad 9220), Detective Stephanie RAMSKUGLER arrived on scene, I briefed them along with Sgt. A PERRY and the detectives took over the investigation. Detective SLOMCZEWSKI and RAMSKUGLER were informed that US currency was taken and that it contained a GPS tracker. The GPS tracker was tracked to 2475 N. 54th Street in the city and county of Milwaukee.

Detective RAMSKUGLER interviewed victim cashier Sarah C PHILLIPS (b/f 09-24-1956), 1613 W Vine St., Milwaukee, WI 53205, cell: (414) 559-6009. In detective RAMSKUGLER's supp regarding this interview she reported that PHILLIPS stated that she has been working for the Family Dollar as a cashier for approximately three years and that she's never been the victim of a robbery before. PHILLIPS stated that on today's date, 5/1/2017, her work hours were from 2:00p.m. until 9:30 p.m., however her normal working hours are typically 8:00a.m. to 4:00pm.

PHILLIPS stated that just prior to the robbery, she was checking out a lady at her register when she noticed a black male subject walk into the Family Dollar Store. PHILLIPS described this individual as the following:

SUSPECT DESCRIPTION: black male, 25- 26 years old, 5'06"-5'07", medium to heavy build, unknown weight, medium to dark complexion, brown eyes, wearing a black skull cap on his head, a black hooded sweatshirt without the hood on, that had a zipper that was zipped all the way up in the front, blue jeans, unknown styled shoes, armed with a black gun which was held in the suspect's left hand

PHILLIPS stated that when suspect walked through the front entrance door, he was alone and that she did not see him on a cell phone. PHILLIPS stated that the suspect immediately walked toward the register area where she was checking out a female customer. PHILLIPS stated that as the suspect approached her register station, using his left hand, he retrieved a black-colored handgun from the front waistband area of his pants and pointed it at her. PHILLIPS stated that at this time, the suspect told PHILLIPS "Give me everything you got." PHILLIPS explained that she cannot get into the cash register without an actual transaction occurring, and therefore she had to call her assistant manager, "Laurie", to come to the front of the store so that she could open the drawer.

PHILLIPS stated that when "Laurie" came to the front of the store, "Laurie" opened and unlocked the cash register drawer. PHILLIPS stated that the suspect continued pointing his handgun at her, but that he then began pointing the gun at "Laurie." PHILLIPS stated that at this point, the suspect turned to the other customers, who she described as the lady that she had been checking out, and two other black male customers, and stated "Y'all leave cuz this has nothing to do with you". PHILLIPS stated that the lady that she had been checking out grabbed her items and exited the store along with the other two customers that were standing near the cash register area.

PHILLIPS stated that she began taking the money out of the cash register drawer and putting it on the counter in front of the register when the suspect told her "Put it in the bag". PHILLIPS stated that she then retrieved a white plastic "Family Dollar" bag which had red writing, and began placing all of the money, including all of the coinage from the register, into the bag. PHILLIPS stated that she also placed a GPS tracker in the bag, and then handed the bag full of money and the tracker to the suspect. PHILLIPS stated that after she was done

putting the money in the bag, the suspect asked her "Is that all of it?" PHILLIPS told the suspect that it was, and this is when the suspect left the store with the bag full of money. PHILLIPS stated that the suspect turned around and left the same way that he came in, walking out of the store and heading westbound on W. North Ave. PHILLIPS stated that she did not see the suspect get into a vehicle after he left the store.

PHILLIPS stated that she did not recognize this suspect as being a regular customer and stated that she had never seen him before. PHILLIPS stated that she would recognize this suspect again if she was to see his face. PHILLIPS explained that she was fearful of the suspect the entire time the robbery was occurring because he kept his gun pointed towards both her and "Laurie."

While at the residence of 2475 N 54th St, Officers set up containment on the house and a black male wearing blue jeans and a black hooded sweatshirt walk down the steps from the kitchen toward the back door and then turn and run back up the stairs and to the North, out of view. A short time later, Officers observed the same male return to the kitchen windows at the South wall of the house and look out. The male then ran back North, out of the Officers view and did not return.

P.O. Matthew VANDRISSE reported (MPD IR#171210141 supp#0004) at approximately 7:56 p.m. he arrived and entered the rear yard of 2479 N. 54th St. from the north and walked southbound to the backyard of 2475 N. 54th St. for rear containment. While on rear containment I discovered a cash tracker with a red blinking light in the rear yard of 2475 N. 54th St. near the northwest corner of the residence. The cash tracker was later recovered from the yard.

The following subjects were occupants of the home and were arrested:

- 1. Danicolis D. LITTLE (m/b, 06/19/1991). LITTLE matched the physical description of the suspect involved in the robbery, and was wearing shoes and pants that also matched the description of the shoes and pants worn by the suspect.
- 2. Rodney GRANDBERRY (m/b, 11/13/1996). GRANDBERRY was arrested regarding a warrant for CCW.
- 3. Andre L. THARPE (m/b, 09/24/1988). THARPE was arrested on a municipal warrant.

LITTLE admitted to robbing the Family Dollar during a interview with detectives. LITTLE was also picked out of a photo array by the victims at the Family Dollar as the suspect that committed the robbery.

On arrival we spoke with the manager Lori N GOODWIN who stated that a w/m, late 30's, 5"9, 150-160lbs, last seen wearing a baseball hat with red trim, short sleeve tan t-shirts, blue jeans with a scruffy beard entered into the store. He then walked around the store and produced his own plastic bag and placed pampers and white t-shirts in his bag. He then walked out past the last point of sale with these items. She stated that she and a worker Terrance M DONALDSON left the store in an attempt to get the merchandise back. She stated that she walked outside the front door and told him don't return back to the store. At this time, he was about 20-25ft away and he produced a knife in his right hand on the side of his leg, but continued walking away. When she told him that she was not scared of his knife, he stated, "back up off me."She stated that DONALDSON continued following him from the premises into the alley. DONALDSON stated that when he entered into the alley, he asked the male to give him back the merchandise. DONALDSON stated that the male produced a knife from his right pocket and popped it open to his side. DONALDSON stated that he continued walking away and never said anything back. Both times this male pulled out his knife, he continued to walk away and never turned toward the staff pursuing him.



The store employees notified the I-Verify system which triggered an audible voice to announce that employees were aware that shoplifting was occurring. At that time, one of the black male subjects (Subject 1) quickly exited the store. Subject 1 then immediately returned into the store and attempted to argue with and distract the store employees near the register as Subject 2 fled the store with a plastic bag filled with Tide pods valued at \$157.50. The subjects then fled in an unknown direction. I reviewed the store surveillance video of the incident. The surveillance was not clear enough to be utilized in making an identification of the actors involved.

SANCHEZ stated that Subject 1 frequents the store and this is an on-going problem. SANCHEZ was advised to contact the police immediately upon seeing either of the subjects so that police can identify the subjects. SANCHEZ was advised to call into police any suspicious persons or any persons who they have previously advised not to return to the store.



Once the Licenses Committee makes its recommendation, this recommendation is forwarded to the full Common Council for approval at its next regularly scheduled hearing. Please review the information below and if you have further questions regarding this process, please contact the License Division at (414) 286-2238.

Important details for those wishing to provide information for the Licenses Committee to consider when making its recommendation:

- 1. The license application is scheduled to be heard at the above time. Due to other hearings running longer than scheduled, you may have to wait some time to provide your testimony.
- 2. You must appear in person and testify as to matters that you have personally experienced or seen. (You cannot provide testimony for your neighbor, parent or anyone else; this is considered hearsay and cannot be considered by the committee.)
- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.


