Program Goals

In efforts to support the continuation of the Beat Patrol grant, MPD was selected as a recipient of the Beat Patrol—Overtime grant. This funding provides overtime funding to support police personnel for community police work or beat patrols targeting specific local crime issues/areas, and to employ additional law enforcement officers whose primary duty is beat patrol. The potential benefits include a decrease in criminal activity in the designated areas. Currently, the purpose of the Beat Patrol grant is to work with residents, business improvement districts (BIDs), block watches, and other community groups to identify threats impacting the quality of life in the City of Milwaukee.

Programmatic Summary

The City of Milwaukee is one of the 10 communities in the State of Wisconsin with the highest rates of violent crime index offenses in the most recent calendar year for which data is available under the Uniform Reporting System of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Milwaukee was identified as an eligible city to receive this grant funding based upon crime data reported to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reporting System that occurred in the 2016 calendar year.
