To Whom It May Concern:

I write today in response to a decision made by Robert Overholt, and Investigator Adjuster with the city of Milwaukee. I wrote to make the city of aware of a pothole which resulted in the complete destruction of a tire on my mother's car on the date of December 26, 2008 at the intersection of East Ogden Ave and North Broadway. The pothole resulted in \$235.74 worth of damage to my mom's car, as two of her tires needed replacement.

We received a reply from the city stating that "[t]he winter weather has hampered the repair work and the ability of the patch materials to remain in the repairs." As I recall, that day I was wearing no more than a fleece, as the weather wasn't cold and there was no snow or other weather that would have prevented the Infrastructure Services Division from fixing the pothole. In fact, a repair would have resulted in the prevention of another citizen, who was stranded on the side of the road at the same time as I was because of the same pothole, from facing the same problem of a popped tire like I did (not to mention the loss of the many hubcaps I saw on the side of the road).

I find it very disheartening that the City of Milwaukee will not take responsibility for these charges. The pothole was huge; I could have stepped down into it. I understand the difficult task of repairing potholes during the winter, but there was no weather preventing the repair of such a road hazard. I have worked for the government in Minnesota for four years. As an employee of the House of Representatives, I understand the tough economic time our nation is currently facing; however, the complete disregard and obvious excuse the City of Milwaukee is using to avoid paying retribution is disgusting, and I find it appalling.

I am unavailable to travel to Milwaukee for an appeal hearing, as I am immersed in a very busy legislative session. However, I would like my case to be reconsidered, as it's the responsibility of the government, whether city, state or federal, to work for and with the people, not to take advantage of them.

On December 26<sup>th</sup>, 2008 at around 11:30am, I was driving my mom's car west on Ogden. As I reached the stop sign, the right front tire popped. I took a right on Broadway and pulled over. At the same time I was pulled over, there was another woman in a station wagon on the side of the road that walked over to me and asked if my tire had also popped. After I answered yes, she walked me over to the corner of Ogden and Broadway and showed me a pothole that I had driven over, which I was unable to see and avoid while driving because it wasn't very large, but it was very deep. She had driven over the pothole as well and her tire had instantly popped. While waiting for help, she collected at least five hubcaps in the vicinity, all of which had most likely come from individuals driving over the pothole. This is obviously a pothole that the city neglected to repair, and because of this I feel that compensation should be provided.

Following the incident, I went to three different tire shops, all of which told me that the tire could not be repaired. Because of this, both front tires on my mom's car were replaced, as it's unsafe to replace only one. The total cost for these two tires totaled \$235.74. The invoice is enclosed.
