It would be helpful if you could let the committee know approximately how close you reside, if you are in close proximity - - close proximity to the licensed establishment where a license is being sought here. The last thing that I will say is, is we have taken a tremendous amount of testimony. If we get to the point where we are - - we are being substantially redundant in our testimony, it would be helpful if you would just indicate at some point where we - - we start hitting the repetitive note over and over again, that I substantially agree with the concerns that are being expressed about A, and B and C, and my name is this, my name is that. I'm in favor or I'm opposed to the license. Because I will just let members know, we've taken tremendous testimony. It is not a contest to see who shows more people. It is literally an issue that is decided on the merits. And the merits aren't about repeating

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yourself over and over again. Before we begin this, as well, too, we do have a crowded room.
