**Description of work** Replace 1960s abstract art glass windows in the two chancel windows and four westernmost sanctuary windows, and rose window (identified per attached diagrams) with historically sensitive new designs within the existing openings. Windows of the 1960s era will remain in the steeples and upper (small) rose window. This is part of ongoing rehabilitation program.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 320-21 (11) and (12) of the Milwaukee Code of Ordinances, the Milwaukee Historic Preservation Commission has issued a certificate of appropriateness for the work listed above. The work was found to be consistent with preservation guidelines. The following conditions apply to this certificate of appropriateness:

- 1. Submit a new application for staff approval of the remaining eight window designs before assembly and installation. (completed with this amendment)
- 2. Salvage pieces from previous windows are to be called out by a light acid treatment on the caming for subtle identification.
- 3. Provide photo documentation of existing windows (completed)
- 4. Install a plaque in a publicly accessible area of the property (interior) indicating the date of installation. Location can be discreet, such as the stairs to the choir loft. Wording is expected to express only the dates that the window replacement occurred (approx. 2017-2019).


All work must be done in a craftsman-like manner, and must be completed within one year of the date this certificate was issued. Staff must approve any changes or additions to this certificate before work begins. Work that is not completed in accordance with this certificate may be subject to correction orders or citations. 

Current east façade conditions





Typical 1960s window











Chancel windows






Abstract 1960s art glass in steeples and upper rose window to remain
