SPS 361.03(5)(a) (a)

<u>SPS 361.03(5)(a)1.</u>**1.** Except as provided in par. (b), pursuant to s. <u>101.02 (7)</u>, Stats., no city, village, or town may enact or enforce an additional or more restrictive local ordinance that establishes minimum standards for constructing, altering, or adding to public buildings or buildings that are places of employment.

PS 361.03 Note **Note:** 2013 Wisconsin Act 270 established a uniform commercial code. Municipalities with ordinances enacted before May 1, 2013 and approved by the department shall remain in effect.
