up into both units on the evening of 07/17/18 and thru out the night into the following afternoon of 07/18/18 before the water main was cleared of obstruction.

This incident began in the evening of 07/17/18 when we received a call from Nichelle Hopkins who resides at 9611 W Bradley Rd. We were informed there was a puddle of water in the center of their basement near the laundry area which was not there a couple hours earlier when they were doing laundry. I asked her to monitor the water and see if the wash machine overflowed. Later that evening Ms Hopkins called again and said there is more water and she is no longer washing. Ms Hopkins then contacted the City Water Dept and was told some one will come check the water main. Ms Hopkins received a call from the city, approximately at 2am that morning of 07/18/18 and was told there was obstruction and needed equipment to repair which would not arrive until later that morning. We received a call from Ms Hopkins early in the am and was told what the city stated to her. At this point both households are upset and not able to rest. I informed Ms Hopkins I would be there as early as possible and was told she has to get up at 5:30 in the morning, to get herself together for work and a toddler ready for day care. I arrived at the property before 7am. The time Ms Hopkins has to leave the house. She is visibly upset. Once I went inside the fumes are overwhelming and the basement has 3-4 inches of wastewater over 80% of the floor...a painful scene!

Mrs. Norris-Johnson is at home making some phone calls and internet searches and I'm out going to rent a water vac. I'm not able to contact the tenant at 9613 W Bradley Rd. and could not enter the property without her knowledge.

I soon returned to the property and began the wastewater removal at 9611 W Bradley Rd.

Later in the morning my wife, Mrs. Norris-Johnson informed me that our property insurance company:(Neckerman Insurance) considered the basement NOT a living space and had no coverage. Also, the agencies that were contacted for recovery were very expensive and at the earliest someone could come out after hours and asset the disaster for a fee of \$125.

I was able to contact Ms Nicole, the tenant in 9613 W Bradley Rd that afternoon and found her basement 80% covered in wastewater.

I worked throughout the day, my wife worked all afternoon and I hired one day laborer who worked for a few hours. It wasn't until the afternoon of 07/18/18 when the City of Milw. cleared the water main from obstruction. We also helped both tenants, who are single parents remove damaged property that hindered the cleanup.

I have followed the instructions I received from the City Clerk for filing a claim which includes:

A document stating the circumstances of this claim

The address of were the incident took place along with a detailed description

Three estimates for recovery cost with the average being \$2586


