There is a possibility that your application may be denied for one or more of the following reasons: The recommendation of the committee regarding the application shall be based on evidence presented at the hearing. Per MCO 85-4-4, unless otherwise specified in the code, probative evidence concerning non-renewal, suspension or revocation may include evidence of the following: failure of the applicant to meet municipal qualifications, pending charges against or the conviction of any felony, misdemeanor, municipal offense or other offense, the circumstances of which substantially relate to the circumstances of the particular licensed or permitted activity, by the applicant or by any employee or other agent of the applicant. If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. See attached police report or correspondence.

Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

Proof of warrant satisfaction or payment of fines must be submitted at the hearing on the above date and time. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in a delay of the granting/denial of your application.

Failure to appear at this meeting may result in the denial of your license. Individual applicants must appear only in person or by an attorney. Corporate or Limited Liability applicants must appear only by the agent designated on the application or by an attorney. Partnership applicants must appear by a partner listed on the application or by an attorney. If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

This report is written by Police Officer David NOVAK, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- 1. On 02/18/2014 a Milwaukee police officer responded to 5007 West Center Street (Uptown Café) in an attempt to retrieve video regarding a burglary. After several failed attempts by phone and in person to contact the applicant, the officer gave up and no video was obtained regarding Milwaukee police incident report # 140460041.
- 2. On 04/27/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a shooting at 5004 West Center Street. Two subjects were struck by gunfire. These subjects told officers they were in the area to patronize Jay's Uptown Café, but they were shot prior to entering the business. Additionally, a vehicle owned by a patron of Jay's Uptown Café was struck by gunfire. Milwaukee police incident report #141170023 filed.
- 3. On 11/09/2014 Milwaukee police responded to a subject with a gun complaint at 5007 West Center Street (Jay's Uptown Café). Chuck Brady, the head of security, stated there was a fight inside the premise. Brady stated two of the subjects that were fighting were kicked out and they were armed with guns. Brady believed the subjects retrieved the guns from their cars. Brady further stated a security guard was taken to the hospital. James Perry was interviewed at St Joes Hospital. Perry stated a fight broke out and when he attempted to help other security guards he was knocked to the ground by an unknown subject. While on the ground he felt a poke to the left side of his head. Perry than used his mace and sprayed the crowd. He then felt someone bite his ear. Perry received 30 stiches to the back of his head, 4 staples to

his right hand, 4 stiches to his right ear and 3 stiches to a puncture wound. The agent was on scene but did not witness the fight. No video was available for this incident. Milwaukee police incident report #143130014 filed.

- 4. On 03/29/2015 Milwaukee police responded to a shots fired complaint in the area of North 50th Street and West Center Street. Police received calls from citizens about shots being fired in the area as well as Shotspotter activity in the same area. After the initial call for shots fired, officers were dispatched to St. Joseph's hospital to meet a shooting victim. The victim told officers he had been at Jay's Uptown Café around 11:20pm. When he exited the business around bar close and returned to his car. The victim decided to urinate outside of his vehicle when he observed an unknown subject fire numerous shots in his direction from a long gun. The victim suffered 11 wounds as a result of this incident. Officers later discovered 15 spent casings in the area of the shooting and that the victim's car sustained damage from 15 gunshots. The agent stated there was a large crowd that night for his birthday but there were no problems inside the tavern. Milwaukee police incident report #150880024 filed.
- 5. On 08/23/2015 Milwaukee police were dispatched to 5007 West Center Street for a shooting and fight complaints. While at that location, officers were informed a victim had gone to St. Mary's hospital indicating he had been shot in a tavern in the area of North 49th Street and West Center Street. The victim stated he left the business with other patrons when he heard 7-8 gunshots. The victim later realized he'd been shot and was taken to the hospital. The victim suffered a gunshot wound to the foot during this incident. A total of 17 casings and 2 bullet fragments were recovered from the shooting scene. Milwaukee police incident report #152350026 filed.
- 6. On 01/03/2016 Milwaukee police responded to a battery complaint at St. Joseph's Hospital. One witness told officers she believed the victim had been involved in an altercation at a bar named "Jays", but she could not provide a location. The victim had a laceration to his head, and indicated there had been an incident at an unknown bar on the south side. The victim declined to make any other statements. An officer determined the only tavern in the city of Milwaukee named "Jays" is Jays Uptown Café (5007 West Center Street). An officer conducted follow up on 01/06/2016 at Jays Uptown Café. The officer viewed video from inside the business on the night of the incident. The officer observed nothing on camera indicating an altercation had occurred on the premises. The applicant indicated he was on scene the night of the incident and reported no problems that night. Milwaukee police incident report #160030027 filed.
- 7. On 01/30/2016 a Milwaukee police officer observed patrons arguing and pushing each other while exiting Jay's Uptown Café (5007 West Center Street). The disturbance ceased when the officer activated the squad's lights and siren.
- 8. On 03/06/2016 Milwaukee police were dispatched to a battery complaint at 5007 West Center Street (Jay's Uptown Café). The caller told officers she was with a group of females who caused disturbance and were asked to leave. When she refused, a security guard removed her from the premise. The caller told police she was mad because security did not have to put his hands on her.

- 9. On 06/11/2016 Milwaukee police responded to a theft complaint at 5007 West Center Street (Jay's Uptown Café). There had been an altercation inside the business that was broken up by security. One of the involved parties dropped some personal property and another person picked it up with the intent of depriving the owner. Milwaukee police incident report #161630020 filed.
- 10. On 06/12/2016 Milwaukee police were dispatched to a subject with a gun complaint in the area of North 50th Street and West Center Street. Investigation revealed there had been an altercation involving patrons inside Jay's Uptown Café and this altercation moved outside the business. A security guard from the business intervened, drawing his firearm. The security guard was arrested for endangering safety by use of a dangerous weapon. Milwaukee police incident report #161640023 filed.
- 11. On 06/30/2016 Milwaukee police were dispatched to a battery cutting at St. Joseph's hospital. The victim told officers that around 2:15am there were 20-25 patrons on the sidewalk outside Jay's Uptown Café (5007 West Center Street). One person was knocked out and another person suffered a laceration on their ankle. Milwaukee police incident report #161820022 filed.
- 12. On 07/03/2016 Milwaukee police were dispatched to a trouble with the subject complaint at 5007 West Center Street (Jay's Uptown Café). Officers were told that 4-5 subjects were causing a disturbance. Police were unable to locate the subjects causing the disturbance.
- 13. On 08/28/2016 Milwaukee police conducted an investigation regarding patrons of the premise parking between construction barrels on West Center Street in front of the premise. Officers taped off a section of the street to prevent vehicles from moving prior to being cited. A security guard went under the police tape and entered the applicant's vehicle. Officers needed to physically remove the security guard from the vehicle and escort him out of the taped off area. Patrons became upset while officers cited the parked cars and additional squads responded. A total of 12 parking citations were issued for obstructing the roadway.
- 14. On 10/30/16 Milwaukee Police responded to a subject with gun call at 5007 W Center (Jays Uptown Café). Officers spoke with the agent and explained to him they had received a call that a subject wearing specific clothing was in the business and possessed a firearm. The agent was cooperative and stated he did not observe anyone matching the description. He allowed officers to check the business and they did not locate anyone matching the description.
- 15. On 11/03/16, at 1:56am, officers responded to a shot spotter call at 5001 W Center. They also received an additional call that someone was shooting inside of Jays Uptown Café. It was later determined no shots were fired from inside the establishment. Officers did locate vehicle that was struck and a casing at 4917 W Center.
- 16. On 11/06/16 a Sergeant observed a large crowd gathered in front of Jays Uptown Café(5007 W Center). She then observed a fight between multiple people break out on the sidewalk. Multiple squads arrived and were able to disperse the crowd. A bouncer stated a fight between multiple females began inside and made its wat to the front of the tavern until police arrived.

17. On 11/27/2016 at 1:57am officers were monitoring the area of Jay's Uptown Café at closing. They observed a subject in the street at 4925 W. Center St firing a gun in the air. They attempted to pursue the auto the subject got into but canceled the chase due to high speeds. Security stated the subject was upset because he was turned away at closing.

- 18. On 01/10/2017 a meeting was held at District 3 with the applicant. The applicant state he has 5-6 security personnel and 8 cameras. He has an ID scanner but does not use it for every patron. He stated all patrons are wanded at the door. The applicant was advised to use the ID scanner for all patrons, improve his camera system and to call the police before incidents became larger problems.
- .19. On 01/22/2017 at 2:10am security from Jay's Uptown Café called to report 2 males with guns and females fighting in the alley. The subject had left prior to the officers arrival.
- 20. On 02/04/2017 at 1:08am security from Jay's Uptown Café called 911 stating there was a fight and there were now 3 subjects with guns outside the premise. The officers spoke with security who stated they were at capacity and people became upset when they could not enter the tavern. Security had used pepper spray then observed three people with guns. The subjects were gone when the police arrived.
- 21. On 02/19/2017 at 1:47am officers responded to a Shotspotter call at 4933 W. Center St. The officers located two victims with graze wounds at N. 50th St and W. Center St. The witness stated all parties in the shooting were drinking at Jay's Uptown Café just prior to the shooting.
- 22. On 03/25/2017 at 1:18am officer were dispatched to Jay's Uptown Café, 5007 W. Center St for a subject with gun complaint. The officer observed a group of females being kicked out of the tavern. One female was requesting her property from inside. The applicant stated they could not locate the property. When the officers came back out the females were gone. No one approached the officers about a subject with gun.
- 23. On 04/22/2017 at 1:59am officers responded to Jay's Uptown Café, 5007 W. Center St, for a subject with gun complaint. The officer spoke with the applicant who stated there was no problem and the call was for his armed security guard escorting someone to their vehicle.
- 24. On 05/14/2017 at 10:58pm an officer observed a group of 100-150 people standing near the entrance to Jay's Uptown Café, 5007 W. Center St. and cars cruising the area. The officer observed the entrance to the bar was blocked and the bar was not letting any more patrons in the bar. The applicant was advised to have his security clear the crowd. The crowd refused and more officers responded. The large police response resulted in a back log of calls for service.
- 25. On 05/21/2017 at 11:25pm officers responded to a noise nuisance complaint at Jay's Uptown Café, 5007 W. Center St. The officer advised the premise to keep the music down and the caller was satisfied with that resolution.

26.On 02/04/2018 at 2:08am officers were dispatched to shots fired at 5007 W. Center St. The officers interviewed the caller by phone who stated one of the security guards pulled out a gun and discharged it several times. The caller was advised to return to the scene but she never returned. The officers interviewed security who stated there were two groups of females who were arguing and told to leave. None of the guards pulled a gun or discharge any rounds. There were no reports from "shotspotter" and the officers determined the call to be baseless.

- 27. On 02/08/2018 officers were conducting a tavern check at Jay's Uptown Café, 5007 W. Center St, when security flagged them down. The security guard stated a subject became upset at being denied entry because of capacity. The subject reached towards his waist band and threatened the security guard. The subject ran when police attempted to stop him and he was taken into custody a few blocks away.
- 28. On 03/03/2018 at 1:42am officers were dispatched to Jay's Uptown Café, 5007 W. Center St, to investigate the tavern possibly being over capacity and illegally parked cars. When the officers arrived the patrons were leaving because the tavern was closing. There were cars stopped on W. Center St, picking up patron, block traffic. The officers provided traffic control until the crowd left.
- 29. On 03/25/2018 at 11:10pm officers observed a large group of people and vehicles in front of Jay's Uptown Café, 5007 W. Center St. The people were blocking the front door preventing the door from opening. The officers and tavern security made announcements to clear away from the door, but the people continued to block the door. At one point security did kick out two groups of females who then started to fight outside the tavern. Additional squads were called and the business was closed for the night because security could not control the growd.
- 30. On 05/20/2018 at 1:26am officers were dispatched to three shotspotter calls in the area N. 50th and W. Center St. There were also numerous calls for shots fired with the callers referencing Jay's Uptown Café. When officers arrived they observed people running and casings in front of the business and more at the rear of the business. They also located a vehicle parked directly in front struck by a bullet. No one able to provide a description due to the number of people in the area. The business's security cameras were not functioning during the incident.
- 31. On 07/25/2018 at 1:24am officers observed a fight outside of Jay's Uptown Café, 5007 W. Center St. The officers called for addition squads to clear the crowd. The applicant closed early because of the fight and advised his security to clear the patron from the area. An additional fight occurred as people were walking to their cars. Officers had to us O.C. Spray to stop the fight and several people were arrested.

This report is written by P.O. Samuel RODRIGUEZ assigned to the Third District, Late Shift.

On Sunday, February, 4, 2018, at approximately 2:08 am, Squad 3320 (myself and P.O. Gerald KRAKER) was dispatched to a "subject with gun/shots fired" call (CAD #180350306) at 5007 W. Center Street, Jay's Tavern. Upon arrival P.O. KRAKER called the caller who stated that security at the location had pulled a gun on her and her friends and discharged it several times, not striking any members of her party. P.O. KRAKER asked the caller to return to the scene so we could interview her, the caller hung up and never came to the scene. I interviewed (security) James A. PERRY (b/m, DOB: 11/27/75) who stated that around closing time, two groups of females began arguing with each other. PERRY approached the groups and stated, " You got to get up out of here." Both groups then left the bar. One group argued with security as they made their way out, before leaving for the night. PERRY stated that at no point did he or any of his security staff pull out their firearms or discharge any rounds. There were no recorded discharges from Shot Spotter in the area. The assignment was issued a C9.

The security guard stated a patron reached towards his waist, and threatened bodily harm after he was refused entry due to the tavern's capacity. The security guard stated he was not armed during the incident.

The suspect was observed crossing the street, and officers attempted to stop him. The suspect ran from a officers, who were in full Milwaukee Police Department uniforms. The officers were also driving a fully marked Milwaukee Police Department squad car.

Following a foot pursuit, the suspect was taken into custody behind 2726 N. 47th St.

This report was written by P.O. Miles KOWALIK, assigned to District 3, Late Power Shift, Squad 3465.

On Sunday, March 25, 2018 at approximately 11:10 p.m., P.O. Ryan DOMBECK and I, Squad 3465, responded to 5007 W. Center St., in the City and County of Milwaukee, State of Wisconsin, for an establishment known as Jay's Uptown Café, after squad 3220, (P.O. CHOVANEC and P.O. RODRIGUEZ), observed large groups of vehicles double parking and blocking the normal flow of traffic, while stopping in front of the establishment.

Upon our arrival, I observed a large amount of patrons waiting outside to enter the establishment. P.O. CHOVANEC attempted to make several announcements over her squads P.A., speaker however these patrons refused to follow any order. While monitoring the area, I was able to hear the security shouting numerous times to move people away from the door, so they would be able to open it, however at this time the crowd was awaiting to get in and continued to move towards the only entry point, subsequently blocking the door shut.

While monitoring the tavern, I could hear one of the security guards of the establishment, start to shout, "Clear the door, clear the door," and as it opened two different females were removed from the establishment. After several minutes of monitoring the area, P.O. DOMBECK and I, observed these groups of female engage into a fight, almost immediately after being removed from the establishment security. This fight occurred between two groups as one occurred in the street as the other occurred on the sidewalk in front of the establishment.

I then requested for additional squads to respond on scene, at which time I informed Sgt. Wade GRUBICH, (3410), that the establishment security was unable to monitor the exterior premises and the crowd-gathering continued to rush the door multiple times, making it hard for patrons or security officers to exit. The establishment had approximately 100 patrons and employee's inside, as well around 40 patrons waiting to get inside.

Sgt. GRUBICH then requested additional squads to arrive on scene to shut the establishment down for the night, at which time, I spoke to David R. ROSE, (m/b, 1/16/81), who identified himself as the manager of the establishment, and explained to him the reasons of the establishment being shut down for the night.
