The Water Centric City initiative showcases Milwaukee's global leadership on managing water in a sustainable and resilient way. This initiative outlines seven principles defining what it means to be a Water Centric City, including a need for water leadership and green infrastructure. Grant funds will allow the Environmental Collaboration Office to fund interns and one full-time employee to support these specific principles through water policy outreach and education. The Water Centric City initiative is a continuing project, but was previously funded by the Brico Fund.

In September of 2018, the Milwaukee Common Council passed a Green Infrastructure Plan Framework and ordinance requiring green infrastructure on all large development projects, thus meeting one of the principles of a Water Centric City and a key deliverable of the City's *ReFresh Milwaukee* sustainability plan.
