This report is written by Police Officer David Novak, assigned to the License Investigation Unit, Days.

The Milwaukee Police Department's investigation regarding this application revealed the following:

- On 12/03/2016officers received an anonymous call of a shooting at Milwaukee Nights Pub, 3830 W. National Av. The officers arrived on scene and determined the call was not legitimate.
- 2. On 02/07/2017 at 12:15am officers were dispatched to a noise complaint at Milwaukee Night Pub, 3830 W. National Av. The officers arrived and found the music inside was at a reasonable level but did increase when patrons opened the front door. The officer advised the bar to lower the music to fix this problem.
- 3. On 04/15/2017 at 2:11am officers responded to shots fired in the area of S. 38<sup>th</sup> St and W. National Av. Milwaukee Nights Pub was closed when officers arrived but the applicant was on scene and interviewed. She stated she told by her security that something was happening outside and she should close. She closed down but is not aware of what happened outside. Her security stated he was outside when he heard what sounded like two gun shots coming from around S. 39<sup>th</sup> St. The officers found no witnesses or evidence of shots being fired.
- 4. On 05/04/2017 officers conducted underage tavern enforcement in District 2. An underage Police Aid attempted to gain entry to Milwaukee Nights Pub, 3830 W. National Av. The Police Aid was turned away by security when she could not provide ID.

5. On 05/15/2017officers were dispatched to a noise complaint at Milwaukee Nights Pub, 3830 W. National Av. The officers arrived and did not find the noise level to be excessively loud. They spoke with Steven ESTRADA who agreed to turn the music down because he did not want any problems. He stated the neighbors have his phone number and will text when the music is loud and he will turn it down. The staff was cooperative with the officers.

6. On 02/10/2018 at 2:44am officers were dispatched to 3830 W. National Av for a battery complaint. The investigation revealed a fight occurred between two male patrons, who were fighting over a female patron. The male patrons both had stab wounds to the abdomen and the female had a cut to her wrist. The bartender, Dominique EWAN, got hit in the mouth by a bottle while attempting to break up the fight. The officers found 6 people in the bar after hours who were not employees. The business has cameras but they do not record. The applicant was cited for Class B Allow Patron After Hours.

- 7. On 02/27/2018 a meeting was held regarding the incident on 02/10/2018 at Milwaukee Nights Bar. Present at the meeting was the applicant's husband, Steven ESTRADA, because the applicant was her day job. The officers stated they had concerns about the employees being uncooperative with the investigation and that no employees called to notify police about the incident. ESTRADA stated the employees no longer work at the bar, and he has brought back security on the weekends. He also stated he will fix the cameras so they record and will look into enrolling in the Pivot Program.
- 8. On 05/16/2018 officers were dispatched to Milwaukee Nights Pub, 3830 W. National Av, for a battery complaint. The officers located the victim who stated he was stabbed in the hand at the tavern. The officers interviewed the applicant and several witnesses who stated the subject was being disorderly and fell while walking out the door. The officer stated the injury was consistent with a fall. Steven ESTRADA stated there are no functional cameras at the location.
- 9. On 06/03/2018 at 2:08am officers were dispatched to Milwaukee Nights Pub, 3830 W. National Av, for a battery complaint. The officer spoke with the security guard, Raul PEREZ, who stated there were two large groups in the bar. A female from one group threw a drink on some one. In order to prevent a fight PEREZ put the female out of the bar and locked the door, preventing anyone from leaving until the female was gone. The officer did not observe anyone that was injured.

#### PA-33E Narrative

This report is written by PO Benjamin SPITZER, Assigned to District Two, Late Power.

On Saturday, February 10th, 2018 at approximately 2:44AM while assigned to SQ 2464 (PO GOLLUP and I) were dispatched to 3830 W. National Ave. regarding a battery cutting complaint that occurred at the Milwaukee Nights Pub. SQ 2320 (CLIFFORD/URBAN) were dispatched to St. Luke's to meet with the first victim of the incident.

On arrival we were met at the door by the husband of the owner, identified as Steven ESTRADA (W/M, 01-06-79), who stated that he received a phone call from one of his employee's, later identified as Dominique S. EWAN (W/M, 06-27-92), that there was an altercation inside of the tavern, and he sustained a minor injury. ESTRADA stated that he did not believe a stabbing had occurred at the tavern. While speaking with ESTRADA I did observe large amounts of blood on the floor. Another employee, identified as Stevenson HARRIS (B/M, 11-23-56), identified himself as the janitor of the tavern was attempting to mop up the blood, and disregarded verbal commands from officers several times to stop attempting to mop up the blood. After the scene was secured, and additional squads responded to help with the scene, we then began to identify all of the employees and patrons within the tavern. ESTRADA stated that EWAN was an employee. I observed blood on EWAN'S hands, and he had a busted lip. EWAN was uncooperative and refused to provide me with his information. EWAN had to be placed into custody in order for him to be successfully identified. While speaking with the bartender, identified as Teresa A. MATTHAEUS (W/F, 12-17-73), she was initially uncooperative and also did not want to provide an account of what had occurred. Officers spoke with six subjects who were not working at the tavern, and should have not been present there after bar closed at 2:30AM, they are identified as follows:

1- Joann R. ACOSTA (W/F, 07-13-81), who stated that she bartended from 5:00PM to 9:00PM, and was a patron.

2- Alejandro RAMIREZ (W/M, 03-31-81), stated his wife is one of the bartenders, and was also a patron.

3- Vyronica CAVAZOS (W/F, 09-20-80), stated her boyfriend was the DJ, and was also a patron.

4- Jonathan R. JONES (B/M, 03-28-89), stated EWAN called him after the incident, and that he was inside the tayern for moral support.

5- Christian A. SANCHEZ (W/M, 05-25-91), stated he was a patron at the tavern, and observed the fight. 6-Dominique J. EWAN (W/M, 06-27-92), several subjects identified him as a guest bartender. A check of records revealed he did not have a class D bartender's license, and should not have been present in the tavern after close. Citation issued to the owner Samon L. MCCANN (W/F, 02-2684) regarding.

None of the employees at the tavern called 9-1-1 to report this incident. When interviewed by Detective SCHIMMELS, SANCHEZ stated that a female identified as ACOSTA, may have known the subjects involved in the fight was telling everyone to leave, and should have called the Police. When interviewed by Detective LEES, ACOSTA stated she believed she did not need to call Police because it was just another typical bar fight.

The investigation was handed over to Detectives BOECK (SQ 9364), LEES (SQ 9366), PAJOT (9369), and SCHIMMELS (9363). After initial interview of victims and witnesses it was determined that a large physical altercation ensued between two patrons identified as Richard LOPEZ (W/M, 02-14-90) and Brett R. DANE (B/M, 01-08-90), over another female identified as Michelle L. GUZMAN (W/F, 08-15-86). While EWAN was attempting to stop the fight he was struck by a bottle resulting in a busted lip. LOPEZ sustained a stab wound to his mid abdomen, DANE a stab wound to his left upper abdomen, and GUZMAN a laceration to her left wrist. LOPEZ and GUZMAN were both arrested for 1st Degree RES. This case was later no processed by ADA SHELDON. There are three live feed cameras within the tavern, that do not record according to ESTRADA.

This PA-33 is written by PO Matthew DIENER, assigned to District 2, early power shift, squad 2266. On Tuesday, February 27, 2018, at approximately 1:00pm, a meeting with the husband of the licensee for Milwaukee Nights Bar was held at District 2, regarding the battery-cutting. The husband, Steven ESTRADA (w/m, 1-6-79), appeared to represent his wife, Samona MCCANN, who is the actual agent/licensee. ESTRADA stated that MCCANN could not appear because of her day job. Also present was Ald DONOVAN, Capt RAMIREZ, Sgt MARTIN, and ACA HOUGH.

We discussed the issues regarding the night of the battery-cutting, which occurred on 2-10-18. The issues discussed we're several subjects inside the premise after hours, the general uncooperativeness of the employees during the investigation, and the fact that nobody from the tavern notified police regarding the stabbing. We asked ESTRADA if his wife, MCCANN was present, which he stated that neither MCCANN or ESTRADA were present during the incident. Ald DONOVAN asked ESTRADA who runs the day to day operations for the bar, when ESTRADA stated that MCCANN is only at the bar 1-2 days a week, and he handles the day to day operations for the premise. It was mentioned to ESTRADA that if he is mostly operating the tavern, he should strongly consider applying for a manager's license or taking over as the licensee himself.

Sgt MARTIN spoke with ESTRADA back in August 2017, after an incident where a subject armed with a rifle ran inside the bar. MARTIN asked ESTRADA if the cameras record, when he stated that they do not and that he was going to fix them so that they do record. Sgt MARTIN then asked if the cameras record now, when ESTRADA stated they do not. ESTRADA stated that the security guard, Dominique EWAN, no longer works their due to the way he handled the incident. He also stated that Stevenson HARRIS, who was detained by police for cleaning up the crime scene after police ordered him to stop several times, no longer works there. ACA HOUGH expressed several concerns regarding his employee's personal views of "not cooperating" with police, especially since once of his bartenders viewed the incident as "just another bar fight", when in fact a violent felony occurred at the premise. ESTRADA stated that he brought back security on the weekends, understands that he "has to do better", will fix the cameras to record, and will look into enrolling in the PIVOT Program.

On Wednesday, May 16th, 2018 at 9:52PM while assigned to SQ 2464 (PO ESPITIA and I) were dispatched to 3830 W. National Ave, Milwaukee Nights Pub, to assist SQ 2441 (PO GUTIERREZ) with a battery cutting complaint.

West Milwaukee PD was dispatched to 3817 W. National Av. for an intoxicated subject who was bleeding from the hand. This subject was identified by West Milwaukee PD to be Lee A. ZEMKE (W/M, 01-06-73), who stated he was stabbed in the hand by a known actor at the Milwaukee Nights Pub. ZEMKE refused medical attention, and was not held by West Milwaukee PD until our squads were able to respond.

On our arrival we spoke with a patron of the pub, identified as Laree K. WILLIAMS (W/M, 07-23-82), who stated there was a highly intoxicated white male within the pub who was being disorderly. WILLIAMS stated that the white male left the establishment, and tripped outside of the front door. WILLIAMS stated that he observed the W/M subject had sustained a scrape injury to his hand. While we were speaking with WILLIAMS a W/M came walking behind the apartment buildings on the other side of the street. WILLIAMS advised us this was the same subject who had fallen earlier.

I went and spoke with the subject, identified as Lee A. ZEMKE. ZEMKE was highly intoxicated, and stated that he was stabbed at the pub across the street. I looked at ZEMKE's right hand and located a minor scrape to the palm of his hand consistent with him having fallen, and not being stabbed. ZEMKE was uncooperative and entered his apartment complex.

I spoke with Samona MCCANN who was present, and cooperative. MCCANN stated the subject, identified as ZEMKE, was within the tavern. He was acting disorderly and left under his own power. MCCANN stated the subject fell as he was exiting the tavern, and was never stabbed. I spoke with two patrons Rachael J. GONZALEZ (W/F, 02-23-83) and Nikki KEOTA (W/F, 11-04-92) who both stated the subject identified as ZEMKE tripped and fell, and was never stabbed.

I spoke with Steven ESTRADA (W/M, 01-06-79) who stated he still does not have functioning cameras for the business.

The battery cutting was deemed to be unfounded and baseless. No tavern violations observed.

This report is typed by PO Oscar ESPITIA assigned to District Two, Late Power Shift and Tavern Squad 2464.

On Sunday June 3, 2018 at approximately 2:08 AM I was dispatched to 3830 W. National Av. (Milwaukee Nights Pub), to investigate a Battery complaint.

Upon arrival my partner PO SPINATO and I spoke to the security guard who identified himself with a Wisconsin driver license as Raul V. PEREZ. PEREZ stated they a bachelorette party and a birthday party come in to the bar. PEREZ stated while exiting the bar an unknown female subject through a alcohol beverage onto another female that was from the birthday party. PEREZ stated before a fight took place he pushed the female from the bachelorette party outside and locked the entrance door. PEREZ stated he didn't allow anyone exit or enter the bar until the female from the bachelorette party left.

I entered the bar and did not observe anybody injured.

I spoke to the bartender who identified herself as Amber L. ZACHOW (W/F, 09/28/90). ZACHOW stated she made last call for alcohol at approximately 2:00 AM. ZACHOW stated she doesn't know who were the two females fighting but she did observe large group of people trying to leave the bar at the same time.

ZACHOW presented to me a valid bartending license (BART-0224503)

End of ZACHOW statements...

I spoke to a second bartender who identified himself with a Wisconsin driver license as Christian A. SANCHEZ who stated he didn't observe the incident take place because he was busy closing patrons tabs out. SANCHEZ stated he doesn't know the names of the two females involved in the fight.

SANCHEZ presented to me a valid bartending license (0222823).
