

## 2019 Filter Distribution City of Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) and Milwaukee Water Works (MWW)

Program Eligibility:	<ul> <li>The top priority for filter distribution includes the following individuals and locations, with or without a lead service line (LSL), in the City of Milwaukee: <ul> <li>Infants who are bottle-fed</li> <li>Children with reported elevated blood lead levels greater than 20 μg/dL</li> <li>State of Wisconsin Licensed or Certified childcare facilities</li> </ul> </li> <li>The second priority for filter distribution will be the following populations living in the City of Milwaukee served by a LSLs are determined by MHD: <ul> <li>Children with reported blood lead levels greater than 5 μg/dL</li> </ul> </li> <li>Pregnant women or women who may become pregnant</li> <li>Breastfeeding women</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>One filter pitcher to the customer(s) at a property when a LSL will be replaced by the City or one of its contractors per Milwaukee Code of Ordinances Ch. 225-22.5.</li> <li>One voucher to the customer(s) at a property, to be exchanged at the customers' discretion, for one filter pitcher, in the following construction situations in which a lead service line will not be replaced: <ul> <li>A planned or emergency water shutoff affects a property with a LSL.</li> <li>A DPW sewer replacement or street reconstruction is proximate to a property with a LSL.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Overview of Changes:	MHD will be offering a free filter replacement program! City of Milwaukee residents who have already received a POU filtration device are eligible to receive one additional replacement cartridge.	<ul><li>Program in place since 2017 construction season began.</li><li>MWW Distribution purchases the filter pitchers and cartridges in bulk as needed.</li></ul>
Distribution Method:	<ul> <li>MHD engage a network of community partners to distribute filters via existing programs that reach the target populations: <ul> <li>Milwaukee County WIC Programs</li> <li>Social Development Commission</li> <li>Sixteenth Street Community Health Centers</li> <li>City of Milwaukee Department of City Development</li> <li>Habitat for Humanity</li> <li>City of Milwaukee Head Start Programs</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	In-person delivery of filter pitchers and vouchers by MWW Distribution and Meter Services staff, and vouchers by DPW Infrastructure Services Construction staff. Customer(s) can redeem the voucher at Distribution Headquarters, 3850 N 35 <sup>th</sup> Street; Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. or MWW Customer Service Center, 841 N Broadway; Monday – Friday, 7:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.
Data Collection:	MHD will provide partner agencies with data collection and report forms. This information will be entered into an Excel Spreadsheet creating a master list of POU filtration devices distributed.	MWW Distribution Section maintains records of property addresses where filters and cartridges were distributed. This information is shared with MHD.



Point of Use Devices:	<ul> <li>Aquasana Claryum Countertop (filters 450 gallons) Model</li> <li>Aquasana Clean Water Machine Pitcher (filters 320 gallons) Model</li> </ul>	• ZeroWater 10-cup Pitchers (filters 15 gallons of water) Model and replacement filter cartridges
	<ul> <li>DuPont Faucet Mounted (filters 100 gallons) Model</li> </ul>	Customer(s) are directed to use the filter pitcher for a minimum of 30 days and to replace the cartridge according to the manufacturers' instructions.
	All filtration devices come with replacement cartridges for approximately a years' worth of filtration depending on the household's water usage.	Customer(s) can return to MWW to pick up one replacement filter cartridge.
	All filtration devices are certified to remove lead and other metals by NSF/ANSI Standard 53.	This filtration device is certified to remove lead and other metals by NSF/ANSI Standard 53.
