WHEREAS, *In addition to her years of service to her sorority, Carolyn Bolton became the first African-American teacher in the Beloit, Wisconsin public school system and later became the first African-American guidance counselor at Beloit Memorial High School; and*

WHEREAS, *Carolyn Bolton and her family moved to Milwaukee, where she was an MPS guidance counselor at both Washington and Marshall High Schools, retiring in 1981; and*

WHEREAS, *Carolyn Bolton, mother of four children, grandmother of eight, and great-grandmother of nine, continues to give back to the greater Milwaukee community and the local Epsilon Kappa Omega chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha, Inc. through her volunteer work; now, therefore, be it*
