2019 Capital Projects

Rail Grant - \$750,000

 Serves as a 20% match for a Wisconsin Department of Transportation Grant and provides funding to supplement existing rail track upgrades.

ADA Improvements - \$225,000

 2019 budget provides funding for ADA projects, which will include accessible entrance signage, restroom renovations, parking signage, and ADA compliant hardware.

Rail Track Upgrades - \$275,000

 Funding will be utilized for additional improvements to address safety and service load requirements. These ongoing improvements, in conjunction with other facility improvements, will make the Port more attractive to potential tenants and enhance its competitive advantages.

Pier, Berth, and Channel Improvements - \$200,000

 2019 budget provides funding for ongoing maintenance and improvements to the City's heavy lift dock, mooring basin, and the outer harbor. The State Department of Transportation provides 80% of the cost associated with this program.

2018 Revenue

Revenues

- The majority of Port revenues are derived from a combination of facility rentals and the Summerfest lease.
- 2019 budgeted revenues total approximately \$5.0 million.



Dry Bulk	1,718,894	1,299,181	1,038,820 (20% decrease)	Salt mine shut down in Goderich, Ontario in mid-2018 has affected global salt availability. Tonnage expected to recover by early 2019.

 and New Technologies


