

Mobile Integrated Healthcare

 With community partners, the MFD's proactive approach to address the needs of at-risk patients prior to their need to call 911, utilizing existing resources to provide *Better Care*, *Better Health, at Lower Costs*.

Community Risk Reduction Jan-Sept 2018

- FOCUS visited 26,896 residences, installing 2,078 smoke alarms.
- SURVIVE ALIVE celebrated its 25th Anniversary! 12,052 students have visited.
- MISC. COMMUNITY INTERACTIONS 10,359 events, reaching 718,343 people, including activities such as festivals, block parties, and firehouse tours.

□ FIREFIGHTER HEALTH AND WELLNESS

- The addition of an athletic trainer reduced the number of members needing to go to the emergency room for evaluation by 100, at an estimated workers' compensation savings of \$5,000 per member for a total savings of \$500,000.
- Added 15 new peer fitness trainers to the Peer Fitness Team.

□ Fire Cadet Program

- Not only are cadets trained in firefighting and EMS, they earn 70 college credits through a robust partnership with MATC, are trained in cultural competency and life skills, as well as volunteer at events, including working with Milwaukee Big Brothers Big Sisters one day a month to mentor other young people of the city.
- This refurbished program is closing out its 6th year, and of the 88 that have graduated in that time, 52% were women and/or people of color.

□ Fire Recruit Training

 This firefighter class of July 30 is the first with applicants from the new firefighter list; the first new firefighter list in 9 years!

Junior Fire Institute

 140 registered students aged 14-20, under the supervision of extremely dedicated volunteers, learn firefighting, leadership, and life skills at monthly meetings, as well as volunteer at community events, all of which guides them toward a successful future.

- MED Units
- Heavy Apparatus
- Auxiliary Generators
- **Facility Upgrades**

- Managing training requirements with the needed in-service resources to protect the City, and keep response times as low as possible.
- Building and expanding our *Health and Wellness Program* to continue reducing injury leave, and to create a healthier workforce.
- Continuing recruitment of diverse candidates for the MFD Fire Cadet Program and general firefighter testing.
- Continuing to engage our citizens with the *Community Risk Reduction Program.*
- Expanding Shared Services joint resourcing, including integrated dispatch.
