


Departmental Budget Appropriation Category

There are 16 authorized positions, the same as authorized in 2018. The number of O & M FTEs (13.75) remains unchanged.


Staffing Update - Reclassifications

Two positions are proposed for reclassification:

- Policy Planning Coordinator to Policy and Adm. Manager.
- Mayor's Office Communications Dir. to Dir. Of Comm. & Public Engagement.

One position of Housing Policy Dir. Is proposed for elimination.

One position of Community Outreach is added.






Revenue

I. Mayor's Office Initiatives and Programs in 2019

The Mayor's Office plans to undertake or continue the following initiatives and programs in 2019:

- Continue to manage the operations and executive functions of City government.
- Continue to advocate for an increase in State shared revenue as well as a local option sales tax for the City of Milwaukee.
- Lead Milwaukee's effort to host the 2020 Democratic National Convention.
- Launch service for The Hop streetcar, and promote its use and expansion.
- Host dozens of neighborhood walks for Mayor Barrett's Walk 100 Miles initiative.
- Raise funds for the Mayor's Earn & Learn program, giving thousands of Milwaukee youth summer jobs and a start on their career path.
- Handle tens of thousands of constituent and media requests, correspondence, proclamations, appointments, and communications to and from the Mayor.

II. Accomplishments so far in 2018

So far in 2018, the Office has:

- Hosted 22 Walk 100 events throughout Milwaukee.
- Led an effort to promote Milwaukee as a host for the 2020 Democratic National Convention.
- Reviewed and signed over 700 Common Council actions.
- Raised \$700,000 for the Mayor's Earn & Learn program.
- Handled nearly 30,000 emails, over 100 board and commission appointments, and 30 open records requests, as well as thousands of pieces of correspondence to and from Mayor Barrett.

III. Challenges in 2019

Challenges facing the Office in 2019 include:

- Maintaining a high level of responsiveness to constituent requests and outreach needs.
- Securing the 2020 DNC convention for Milwaukee.
- Ensuring a successful launch and inaugural year for The Hop.
- Managing higher workloads and demands for the Mayor's time within proposed staffing and operating budgets.
- Increasing economic development and jobs in all city neighborhoods to achieve greater income and racial equity.
