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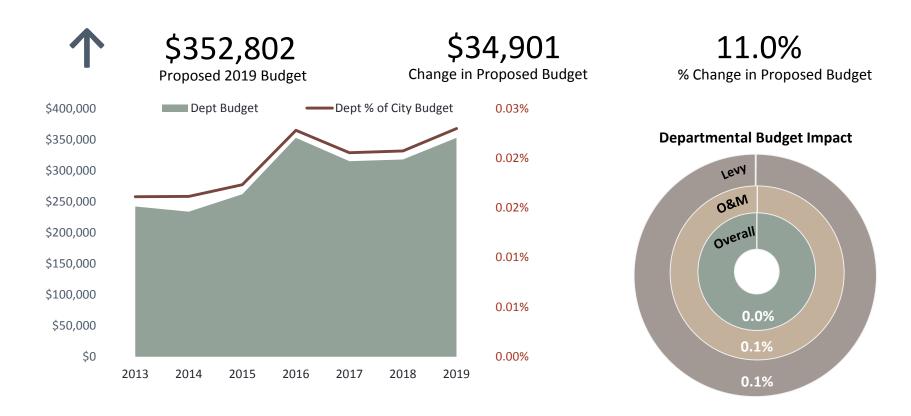

Departmental Budget Appropriation Category





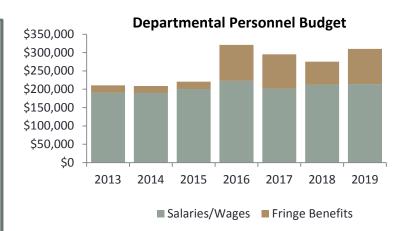
Increase in the department's fringe benefit expenses, 2018 to 2019 (+54.1%). 2019 figure is in line with actual 2017 expenditures.

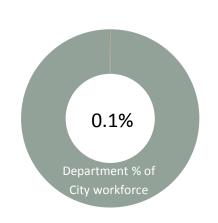

Staffing Vacancies

- The department's Office Assistant IV position –
 one of 3 full-time positions is vacant. It was
 also vacant last October, at the time of 2018
 Budget review.
- The filling of this position has been approved by the Finance and Personnel Committee.

City Staff vs. Board Positions

- While the Board of Zoning Appeals has 11 authorized positions, 7 are actually members of the Board, not O&M-funded regular City employees.
- Of the 4 regular, non-Board positions, one is actually a half-time position (Office Assistant III).

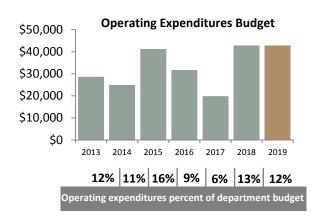
Percentage of Board decisions made with just one hearing so far in 2018, similar to the 2017 full-year figure of 76%.

Percentage of 2017 special use permit applications that were applications for renewal; in 2015, 53% were renewals.

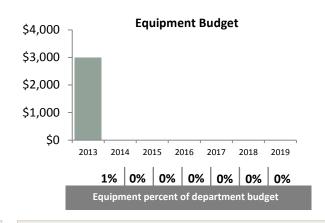
