On behalf of the Wisconsin Public Health Association (WPHA), thank you for your thoughtful consideration of budget priorities. During this important planning process, we request you to prioritize an increase in the City of Milwaukee Health Department (MHD) budget.

We want to see investment at all levels of government to address pressing public health issues. We work with many local health department leaders from all over Wisconsin, as well as across sectors to address social determinants of health – housing, income stability and employment, criminal justice reform, early childhood education, and much more, all of which need local health department leadership and public health support. All of these are real issues that many of Wisconsin State Citizens are facing, but especially those in the City of Milwaukee.

We at the Wisconsin Public Health Association were excited to see Dr. Jeanette Kowalik chosen to lead the City of Milwaukee Health Department. She was a previous member of WPHA's before heading to Washington DC, and many of our members, colleagues and friends have worked with her. We also recently had her as the featured presentation for the WPHA Southeast Regional Event and received wonderful reviews. Under Dr. Kowalik's competent and optimistic leadership, we have high hopes for MHD's ability to improve health outcomes for Milwaukee's citizens, particularly with adequate staffing and fiscal resources.

It is necessary to restore some of the 89 positions that have been cut over the past 14 years. We acknowledge the reality of tightening state support resulting in austerity measures for all city departments. However, it is time to reverse this trend. Please invest in MHD to help Dr. Kowalik and her additional management staff and team succeed.

### CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM

Increase treatment alternatives and diversion program (TAD) funding for mental health and substance abuse issues.

Increase funding allocated to counties for juvenile justice services to fund all costs associated with bringing 17-year-old first time juvenile offenders back to the juvenile justice system.

# INCOME STABILITY & EMPLOYMENT

Supporting and expanding Paid Family Leave.

Increase Earned Income Tax Credit and move from one time to monthly payments.

Establish tax credit for family caregivers.

Increase workforce training/ transitional jobs.

#### HOUSING

Expand low income housing tax credits for developers and rental assistance vouchers for renters.

Funding for programs to eliminate / abate lead paint, soil and pipes, including but not limited to a statutory provision requiring that lead remediation dollars be used for that dedicated purpose.
