If the activities of the applicant involve a licensed premises, whether the premises tends to facilitate a public or private nuisance or has been the source of congregations of persons which have resulted in any of the following: disturbance of the peace; illegal drug activity; public drunkenness; drinking in public; harassment of passers-by; gambling; prostitution; sale of stolen goods; public urination; theft; assaults; battery; acts of vandalism including graffiti, excessive littering, loitering, illegal parking, loud noise at times when the licensed premise is open for business; traffic violations; curfew violations; lewd conduct; display of materials harmful to minors, pursuant to s. 106-9.6; or any other factor which reasonably relates to the public health, safety and welfare, or failure to comply with the approved plan of operation. Notice for applicants with warrants or unpaid fines:

If you wish to do so and at your own expense, you may be accompanied by an attorney of your choosing to represent you at this hearing.

You will be given an opportunity to speak on behalf of the application and to respond and challenge any charges or reasons given for the denial. No petitions can be accepted by the committee, unless the people who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify. You may present witnesses under oath and you may also confront and cross-examine opposing witnesses under oath. If you have difficulty with the English language, you should bring an interpreter with you, at your expense, so that you can answer questions and participate in your hearing.

You may examine the application file at this office during regular business hours prior to the hearing date. Inquiries regarding this matter may be directed to the person whose signature appears below.

- 3. On 03/29/2019 at 4:08pm officers were dispatched to a Trouble with Subject at Quick Pantry, 3332 W. Lincoln Ave. The officers interviewed the applicant, who stated there was a customer that was upset stating the ATM took his \$10 and he wanted it back. The subject was threatening to burn down the store or "shoot it up" if he didn't get his money. The officers placed the subject in custody and he was cited for Disorderly Conduct. In order to diffuse the situation the applicant did give the subject \$10 and asked that he not return to the store.
- 4. On 04/09/2019 officers along with agents from the WI Department of Revenue conducted a licensed premise check at Quick Pick Food Mart. The inspection was due to a complaint the store was selling K2. No K2 was found but the Department of Revenue agents were unable to locate invoices for tobacco products. The un-invoiced products were seized. The applicant was cooperative and stated he would purchase tobacco from a wholesaler.

This report was written by PO Vance SCOLLIN, District Two, Early Power Shift. On 3-29-19 at 4:08 PM, while assigned to Sqd 2221 with PO SZYMBORSKI, we were dispatched to a trouble with subject at 3332 W Lincoln Av. This location is a convenience store called Quick Pantry. The caller (later identified as Scott J LONG III (b/m 10-19-93, 3703 N 14th St) stated the ATM at the location stole \$10 from him and the employees at the store were not helping him and if they did not give him \$10 he was going to burn the building down and/or somehow shoot employees. The 911 operator for the City of Milwaukee informed LONG that he was on a recorded line and he stated that he did not care. This entire incident was recorded on PO SZYMBORSKI's and my personal body cameras.

Upon arrival, PO SZYMBORSKI and I located LONG inside of the business yelling at the owner (Gurmeet S ARORA i/m 3-24-67, 715-892-2886), demanding his \$10. LONG refused to calm down and listen to PO SZYMBORSKI and I as we attempted to explain to him how to contact his bank and they would credit his account. We attempted to reason with LONG outside the main doors of the store for a few minutes before he said he was getting his money back or there would be issues as he reentered the business. PO SZYMBORSKI and I placed LONG into police custody for disorderly conduct and placed into the back of our squad car.

LONG stated he put his card in the ATM 3-4 times and requested \$200 each time and every time the transaction was denied and he got no receipt but the machine charged him a total of \$10 in fees and he wanted that \$10 back.

PO SZYMBORSKI remained with LONG and I spoke to ARORA inside the store. ARORA stated he came to the store after his employee (clerk- Harvinder OBEROI i/m 3-28-64) called him and told him a customer was there demanding \$10 that the ATM did not give him. ARORA stated once on scene he attempted to find out what exactly the ATM transaction was and what the issue was from LONG but he just yelling and making threats as he demanded \$10. ARORA stated other customers inside became fearful and left the store and just before our arrival he thought LONG was going to hit him because he kept approaching him in an aggressive manner while yelling. ARORA stated he wanted no further issues with LONG so he gave me \$10 cash which I gave LONG. ARORA stated LONG was no longer welcome in his business and wanted him to be issued a citation.

PO SZYMBORSKI and I took the handcuffs off of LONG and he was let out of the squad as I explained that he was getting a citation for disorderly conduct. The citation number was 61568010. LONG stated he understood and he then asked for a ride home which we gave him. I mailed the citation to LONG due to a high call volume in District Two.

This report is written by P.O. Kevin VODICKA assigned to District Two, Early Power Shift, Community Prosecution Unit. On Tuesday, April 9, 2019, at 1:36 PM, I assisted Wisconsin Department of Revenue Agent Georgeann KING with an inspection of "Quick Pick Food Mart", located at 3332 W Lincoln Av., and was accompanied by A.C.A. Heather HOUGH. I was in full uniform and equipped with a body-worn camera.

The inspection was due to a recent complaint that the premises openly sold "K2" or synthetic marijuana.

Agent KING and I entered the premises and spoke with an employee, Meetu OBEROI, who was unaware of such sales. I did not observe any synthetic marijuana offered for sale but did observe several cartons of expired eggs in a refrigerator that were available for purchase. OBEROI was advised to remove the items.

Agent KING then conducted her inspection, eventually speaking with the licensee, Gurmeet ARORA on the phone and later in person. ARORA was unable to provide sales invoices for numerous tobacco items, which were then seized by Agent KING.

ARORA was cooperative during the investigation and vowed to purchase tobacco products only from licensed wholesalers.

- 3. No letters or petitions can be accepted by the committee (unless the person who wrote the letter or the persons who signed the petition are present at the committee hearing and willing to testify).
- 4. Persons opposed to the license application are given the opportunity to testify first; supporters may testify after the opponents have finished.
- 5. When you are called to testify, you will be sworn in and asked to give your name, and address. (If your first and/or last names are uncommon please spell them.)

- 6. You may then provide testimony.
- a. Include only information relating to the above license application.
- b. Include only information you have personally witnessed or seen.
- c. Provide concise and relevant information detailing how this business has affected or may affect the peaceful enjoyment of your neighborhood.
- d. If by the time you have the opportunity to testify, the information you wish to share has already been provided to the committee, you may state that you agree with the previous testimony. Redundant or repetitive testimony will not assist the committee in making its recommendation.
- 7. After giving your testimony, the members of the Licenses Committee and the licensee may ask questions regarding the testimony you have given or other factors relating to the license application.
- 8. Business Competition is not a valid basis for denial or non-renewal of a license.

Please Note: If you have submitted an objection to the above application your objection cannot be considered by the committee unless you personally testify at the hearing.





#### **Executive Summary:**

Juniors Cocktail Lounge is part of the Bars and Nightclubs industry, the industry is still expected to grow at an annualized rate of 1.1% to \$24.4 billion over the five years to 2023. Industry revenue is expected to increase 0.3% in 2018, as per capita alcohol consumption and disposable income rise, permitting people to spend more of their pay at bars and nightclubs.

Bar and nightclub operators have attempted to respond to volatile growth and increased competition by diversifying new concepts such as wine bars, cocktail lounges and brewpubs to attract new demographics. New operators are consistently entering the industry to satisfy new consumer trends. As a result, the industry has become more fragmented because drinking establishments are catering to a larger range of niche markets. Many of the remaining establishments have adapted their menus and entertainment offerings to accommodate consumer tastes. While per capita expenditure on alcohol is expected to rise at an annualized rate of 0.4% over the five years to 2018, several consumers are increasingly drinking packaged beverages at home rather than alcoholic beverages at nightclubs or bars.

Over the five years to 2023, the industry is projected to continue contending with competition from in-home alcohol consumption and non-industry establishments that also serve alcohol, such as restaurants. Despite these factors, the industry's financial performance is forecast to remain relatively steady as the economy improves and consumer spending increases. Bars will also continue to introduce healthier upscale products like craft beer and organic food to their menus to appeal to consumer tastes. Over the five years to 2023, industry revenue is forecast to increase at an annualized rate of 0.6% to \$25.2 billion.

#### **Business Description:**

Juniors Cocktail Lounge will provide good food, and drinks in a relaxed setting where safety and security are provided.

Industry experts have identified the following keys to success:

- Having a loyal customer base: It is important to ensure a high level of regular customers who spread good word-of-mouth recommendations to others.
- Ability to quickly adopt new technology: Establishment operators should have appropriate levels of technology in areas such as stock control, which is a major cost area.
- Ability to control stock on hand: Operators must have control over stocks, particularly stock losses, and have sufficient stock in line with expected demand.
- Effective cost controls: Having effective cost controls and systems in place is essential because this is a relatively low profit margin industry.
- Must have license: Operators are required to have the appropriate licenses to operate and always meet the conditions of the licenses.
- Access to niche markets: It is important to have a very good understanding of the markets

serviced by your location and customers' changing needs.

#### **Company Background:**

Juniors Cocktail Lounge was founded February 1, 2018. I the owner, Edward R Calloway Jr., have 5 years of restaurant management and bartending experience, and have also attended the West Allis bartending academy school where I received my certificate for being a qualified mixologist. I will draw on that experience to successfully own and operate my business.

#### **Products/Services:**

Juniors Cocktail Lounge will provide food and drinks in a comfortable, safe, and relaxed setting.

The following is an overview of what is sold in the industry.

#### Sales of liquor, wine and beer

The overwhelming majority of industry revenue stems from alcoholic beverage sales, accounting for 76.7% of the total. IBISWorld estimates that distilled spirit sales account for 35.4% of total revenue, while beer and ale account for 33.6% of sales. Wine accounts for 7.7% of sales. Sales of packaged alcohol account for less than 2.0% of revenue. Over the past 10 years, there has been a general decline in the proportion of alcohol-related revenue derived from beer and ale, though this trend has been offset by increasing consumption of wine, distilled and mixed spirit drinks. Over the past 10 years, high-end cocktail bars have become a more conventional venue for many consumers drinking outside of the home. In lieu of the traditional pub that offers merely straight pours and a range of beer on draft, the rise of the cocktail bar has also eschewed a style, decor, and disposition to making drinks that values quality ingredients, fresh produce (such as freshly squeezed citrus) and cutting-edge techniques to make quality beverages for consumers. Much of the success behind this premiumization of distilled spirits lies in the fact that many of these techniques are difficult to replicate at home. With carbonated cocktails and infused liquors becoming more of the norm in these venues, consumers gladly increase their spending on alcohol outside of the house to experience the spectacle. As a result, distilled spirit sales have increased over the period.

Wine, similarly, has also surged ahead in recent years, primarily as a result of it being a comparable beverage offered at high-end cocktail bars, while also maturing into the centerpiece of entire bars as well. Wine bars have become increasingly popular over the past 10 years, as consumers who wish to partake in libations but opt for a healthier choice, such as wine, is becoming increasingly popular. For consumers looking for a rare vintage, or a hard-to-find bottle, are able to visit wine bars and partake in the curated offerings available to them. In a similar vein, hard cider has also increased in popularity over the period, as dedicated hard-cider bars have cropped up in major metropolitan areas, such as New York City and Los Angeles, offering a unique and diverse array of offerings that is hard to replicate at home. This segment is expected to

increase over the next five years, as wine and cider continue to increase in popularity among health-conscious consumers, as well as individuals looking to find unique alcoholic offerings outside of the norm.

This segment is highly sensitive to economic factors that affect the on-premise consumption of alcohol. Over the past five years, consumers became more selective about how they spent their disposable income. Consumer spending declined and discretionary leisure activities like visiting bars, nightclubs and drinking establishments were reduced or cut out. Some consumers opted to drink in their homes instead of visiting bars. Consumers who continued patronizing drinking establishments tended to visit them less, spent less when they did go out and often chose more affordable establishments.

#### <u>Other</u>

Food and meals, largely for consumption on the premises, and sales of nonalcoholic beverages, account for 14.1% of sales. This segment can include prepackaged food, appetizers and even full meals. The number of bars serving food has increased over the past five years because consumers are increasingly time poor and want to go to establishments that are a one-stop shop for their eating and drinking activities. Revenue from cover charges and admissions to bars and nightclubs represents 2.6% of total industry revenue. Other revenue is derived from sales of cigars, cigarettes and from slot machines.

#### Technology:

The Bars and Nightclubs industry is subject to a low level of technological change. In general, small business owners do not have a strong incentive to invest heavily in new technology due to the

nimited economies of scale available. The industry relies on a night level of personalized service provided by bartenders, waiters, servers and managers. The degree of personal service provided by a bar is normally crucial to the establishment's performance and can often be the reason patrons are enticed to return. Moreover, many owner-operators rely heavily on their own labor or extended family and friends, usually at relatively low hourly rates. Consequently, the main incentive to increase the use of technology, which is to reduce a reliance on physical labor, is not as prevalent for this industry, particularly at the small-scale end of the industry.

#### Business efficiency

Technology can be used by bar and nightclub operators to improve internal business processes, such as ordering inputs and all other back-of-house functions. Back-of-house operations have become more efficient due to technology. Steam cooking ovens and super ovens that cook items much faster than conventional ovens are beneficial to diners that are expected to offer fast and efficient service. These improvements can deliver a competitive advantage against competitors, which is especially important given the fierce level of industry competition. Computer software is also available to assist bar and nightclub operators to monitor and control labor costs, inventory control and cash management. Front-of-house booking systems are also used as portals for venues to manage patrons and enable guests to seamlessly make reservations through their smartphones.

#### **Smartphones**

The ubiquitous use of smartphones throughout society has had a minimal effect on the industry. Social networking sites are now mainstream and can be used by bars and nightclubs as a sales and marketing tool. Bar and nightclubs that have been the most successful to-date essentially enable patrons to market for them through sharing photos of the establishment on social networks like Instagram or Facebook. The next smartphone trend that is likely to play a role in the industry is near-field communication that enables phones and other devices to talk to each other. This technology permits customers to order additional bottles of wine or make payments directly through their phones without the use of a bartender or server.

#### Markets:

Our main target market will be working male and female professionals in the 21-45 age range. Over 90.0% percent of the total revenue earned by bars, nightclubs and drinking establishments is derived from households. The biggest spenders on alcohol per capita, according to the US Census Bureau, are those aged 34 years and younger. However, due to the size of the population aged between 45 and 54, this segment is the industry's largest single market. Older consumers also tend to spend more on additional items such as food. Alcohol consumption tends to decline substantially once a person reaches 65 years of age.

According to a survey by Centers for Disease Control, about 56.0% of those aged 18 to 45 are current regular drinkers, compared with 50.0% of the total population. Given these findings, customer demographics will vary according to whether the establishment is located in a college

town or elsewhere, and depending on the concept, which could be a neighborhood bar, an onpremises beer-brewing tavern, a sports bar, a wine bar or a nightclub.

Some revenue is derived from the private sector, such as businesses that may seek to rent conference rooms or other facilities for a special function or occasion. These occasions may include a product launch or a seasonal staff function. The major markets for this industry have remained relatively stable over the five years to 2018. Older consumers account for a growing percentage of industry sales due to the ageing demographics.

#### Marketing:

We will leave business cards with nearby businesses, promote happy hour, utilize the local media and heavily advertise the grand opening. The most powerful and effective means of generating new business is word-of-mouth. People turn to trusted friends or colleagues for recommendations regarding product or service providers. Because word-of-mouth referrals are free, you can't beat the return on investment that a positive referral can generate. To stimulate word of mouth, we will actively ask customers for referrals and recommendations. The driving force behind consumers' desire to share positive stories about organizations is the trust they have in the products, services and people associated with those entities. We will strive to build that trust with every interaction we have with a customer.

We will also use an internet based strategy. This is very important as many people seeking local services now use the Internet to conduct their preliminary searches. We will register with online portals so that potential customers can easily reach the business. The Company will have its own website showcasing the Company's services, preliminary pricing information, and relevant contact information.


Google+, Stumble Upon, and Facebook all allow consumers to share valuable content with others in their network. Research shows people are more likely to trust content shared from people they know, so a share is akin to a 4 star rating.

We can also use the power of Facebook to advertise. Facebook's pay-per click advertising is very effective and can help the business reach its target audience. More than 1.4 billion people use Facebook to connect with what matters to them, and more than 900 million visit every day. When we run a Facebook Ad, we can choose the audiences that see it by location, age, interests and more. More than 700 million people visit Facebook every day on their phones and tablets—and when they do, they see Facebook Ads along with stories from family and friends. Because Facebook Ads are placed in the stream of information people view on Facebook, they're more likely to see our ads and take action.

We are catering to a more elite crowd of professionals. The Bars and Nightclubs industry is highly competitive, with competition coming from both within the industry (internal competition) and from operators in similar industries (external competition). This owes to the relatively low barriers to entry associated with opening a bar or nightclub. There are a large number of small business establishments and the industry is highly fragmented.

Price is an important competitive factor. Operators that can serve food and beverages at the most value will normally attract and retain patrons, even during times of anemic economic growth. Location is another important competitive factor for a bar or nightclub. Establishments are usually located in areas where people congregate for entertainment purposes and businesses are prominent. Bars and nightclubs also take advantage of agglomeration, meaning they will usually benefit from being located within proximity to competitors.

Service is one of the most important competitive factors for bars and nightclubs, especially those with a high-end focus. Upscale bars and nightclubs need to provide world-class service to guests that expect a seamless and enjoyable visit. Front-of-house staff like bartenders and wait staff are trained to be professional, courteous and accommodating and to portray concern for the well-being of patrons. It has become increasingly common for operators to chase higher earning patrons by renovating venues and providing higher quality beverages and menus. Within the changing alcohol consumption market, bars have moved toward providing cocktails and providing high-quality food in unique environments.

On Saturday, October 20, 2018 at approximately 3:25 AM, I responded to the address of 3431 W. Lincoln Ave (La Pica Carr #3 bar) to investigate a shootingincident. At approximately 2:25 AM,Mt. Sinal Hospital called stating they had a shooting victim, who was later identified as Edgar ROSARIO (W/M, 02/08/90). ROSARIO had one gunshot wound to the leg. ROSARIO stated he was shot inside La Pica Bar.

Our investigation revealed that the victim Edgar A. ROSARIO-ALVARADO (W/M, 02/08/90), was shot by his friend Catherine REYES-ROBLES (W/F, 03/01/94). REYES-ROBLES was inside the bar and was taking her ATM card out of her purse. In her purse she had a .40 caliber Smith & Wesson handgun which discharged striking ROSARIO-ALVARADO in the leg. REYES-ROBLES along with other patrons walked ROSARIO-ALVARADO to her vehicle and then she drove him to Sinia Hospital where police was called.

At the time of the investigation, no one had called police from the scene. The first call was when the victim showed up at the hospital.

Upon arrival, La Pica Bar was closed, no one answered the door and all of the lights were off. I called the owner, William RiVERA on his cell phone and no one answered. I went to his home address, all lights were off and no one came to the door.

In the morning, a squad knocked at RIVERA'S residence and he answered the door. RIVERA took the officers to the bar and opened it. Officers on scene stated it looked like the bar was closed in a rush the night before. Officers stated the bar was a mess with half drank beer bottles still on top of the bar.

RIVERA allowed officers to view the surveillance video. Officers were unable to see any video because the cameras are currently not recording. RIVERA told officers he was not aware that the cameras were currently not working and was unable to tell officers how long they have not been working.

I conducted follow up and spoke to RIVERA directly at La Pica on Saturday night. RIVERA stated he doesn't know how a gun got past his security guards as everyone is supposed to get patted down for weapons as they enter the building. RIVERA has two security guards at the door; one of them is armed. RIVERA stated he did not call police because he thought someone else called.

RIVERA stated he left before police arrived on scene because he was afraid of getting in trouble. RIVERA stated when he renewed his license; he received a warning, that if another major incident occurred at La Pica Bar, he could lose his liquor license.

I observed RIVERA did not have his liquor license posted in a visible area and I issued a citation (CIT# J9815S26TM).

RIVERA was originally uncooperative with the investigation as he failed to call police when a patron was shot inside the bar. RIVERA instead closed the bar and didn't answer his cell phone or the door at his residence, when police attempted to contact

RIVERA became more cooperative during the follow-up investigation and told me he would provide any information needed. A tavern check at La Pica on Sunday, October 21, 2018 revealed that RIVERA had corrected the liquor license posting issue and did have it posted in a visible location.

Prosecution Unit. On Thursday, November 15, 2018, at 11:30 AM, Captain Alexander RAMIREZ, Sergeant Chad RADEN, A.C.A. Heather HOUGH, A.D.A. Ann LOPEZ, P.O. Oscar ESPITIA, and I met with the licensee of La Pica Carr 3 regarding a recent shooting that occurred inside of the premises and in order to notify the licensee that the premises was being declared a nuisance property pursuant to MCO 80-10.

The meeting began with a recap of the incident and included the point that the investigation had revealed that the incident occurred inside of the premises during business hours. The licensee stated that he had been present during the incident, had heard a gunshot inside of the premises, did not notice any injuries or evidence (blood), panicked, closed the bar for the night without calling for police, and left his phone inside of the bar.

The licensee was reminded that during a previous battery incident in which a "bouncer" had been stabbed and cut by a patron, the licensee stated he had also panicked and not called for police services and that during a subsequent meeting at district two the licensee was reminded how important it is for a business owner to call for police services when they are needed.

The licensee was served with the 80-10 nuisance designation and provided a list of items that he had already set into place to help abate some of the activity. I suggested that he review the designation and submit a formal plan that would abate the specific items as well.

The licensee stated that there is a "zero weapons policy" and attendees stressed that security for the premises has to check every patron, including females. SGT RADEN suggested having one security guard for every fifteen to twenty patrons.

The licensee stated that the cameras for the premises still do not work, but that he plans on having them repaired.

The licensee later submitted an abatement plan that was reviewed and accepted by Captain RAMIREZ.




