Morning Tim,

The south façade work is underway this week. My contractor has the scaffolding up and has looked at the condition of the "bump out" in greater detail and thinks there is more damage to the wood than originally thought: "There are a lot of 'checks' and cracks in the wood not only on the ends but also throughout the center portions of the wood. The sill is in pretty bad shape and the joints are separating in many places. I am proposing to replace the vertical and horizontal boards to the sides of the windows and below them. The shingles would stay in place and the wood and trim above the windows would stay in place." Attached are pictures.

I'm not sure if these changes require an amendment to the issued COA. He would like to clear vertical grain wood as opposed to plain sawn. What is allowed? Questions?
