Statement for Street Naming: Don Sykes A Lifelong Human Services and Workforce Champion

Don Sykes was one of Milwaukee's most prominent citizens, well-known for leading the Social Development Commission for two decades (1968 – 1988) as he built Milwaukee County's largest anti-poverty agency. He achieved national success and returned to Milwaukee to create an indelible imprint on Human Services and Workforce Development. The two organizations that greatly benefitted from his tremendous talent were the Social Development Commission, located at 1758 W. North Ave. and Employ Milwaukee, located at 2342 N. 27th Street. For this reason, we are requesting W. North Avenue, between 17th Street and 27th Street be named in honor of Don Sykes.

Don married Geraldine Kirksey in 1960 and they had two sons David and Dennis. In 1968, the opportunity arose for Don to join President Lyndon Johnson's war on poverty, in the form of the executive directorship of Milwaukee's Social Development Commission (SDC), Don moved his wife and young family to Milwaukee. Sykes led SDC for the next two decades. During his tenure, SDC grew into Milwaukee County's largest anti-poverty agency.

In 1993, Donald was appointed to serve as the director of the Department of Health and Human Services Office of Community Relations for President Bill Clinton in Washington, DC. There, he worked for the next seven years on the development of nationwide welfare and anti-poverty programs.


Sykes' prestigious accomplishments included managing the development of a nationally recognized employment program and welfare and anti-poverty demonstration programs. He provided expert leadership to DHHS in its collaboration in the establishment of HUD and USDA's Empowerment Zone/Enterprise Community program and DOJ's Weed and Seed program. Additionally, he provided guidance and support to the department's initiative to address the concerns of minority staff and the communities served. Sykes played a major role in DHHS's Partnership for Rural Opportunities. At the federal level, he initiated several major programs to fight poverty and expanded the reach of others and facilitated the development of a national information and reporting system for the over 1,000 Community Action Agencies funded by the Community Services Block Grant.

In 2007, Donald returned to Milwaukee to assume leadership of the Milwaukee Area Workforce Investment Board, a public/private partnership that coordinates employment and training programs for adults and youth in Milwaukee County. He announced his retirement in 2014, concluding a career of working tirelessly on behalf of low-income people and the community as a whole.

Sykes served as the President and CEO of the Milwaukee Area Workforce Investment Board (MAWIB) from 2007 to 2014, now known as Employ Milwaukee. He created a workforce development strategy that allowed for resource diversification to acquire funding to maintain quality workforce development programs, employed

technology to strengthen service and program performance, and worked with community partners for contracted service delivery. Each action was taken to revitalize Milwaukee's neighborhoods and improve the quality of life for its residents. He was especially committed to young people, the future workforce, working hard to provide both summer employment opportunities and year-round employment, taking great pride in connecting young people to their first job.

Don Sykes was a trailblazer and larger-than-life personality He will be forever remembered for his outstanding contributions to human services and workforce. His vision for Milwaukee's workforce system was unprecedented.
