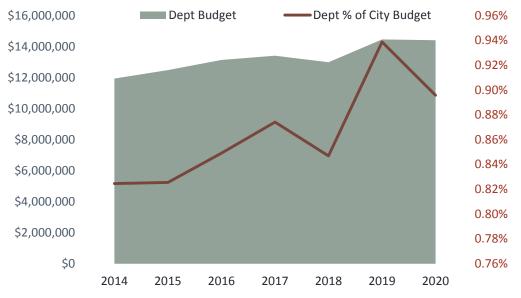

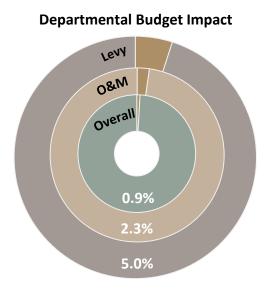

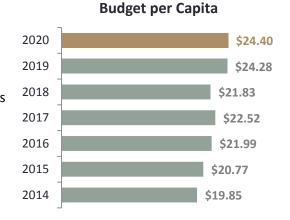

#### **Departmental Budget Appropriation Category**



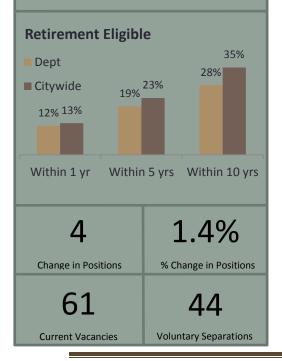


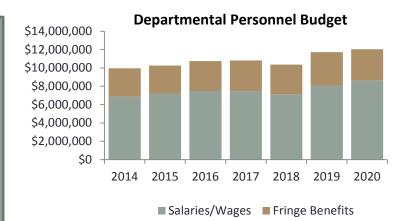


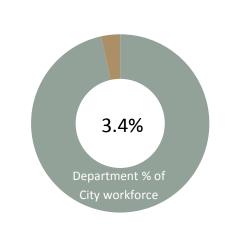
Net increase in 2020 projected net salary cost over 2019 Adopted Budget.

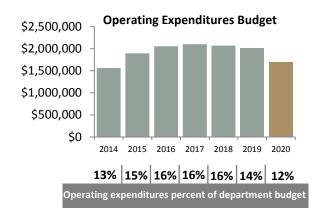

#### **Improved Lead Hazard Remediation.**

**Interim Controls** such as HEPA vacuuming of paint dust or chip and duct taping are performed immediately upon discovery and during follow-up until permanent remediation measures are initiated.
